

Dental unit updates field training

Brigade Service Support Group's 24th 21st Dental Company at MCAS Kaneohe Bay, conducted five days of field training in their own backyard adjacent to the Naval Regional Medical Clinic, Kaneohe Branch. The nine dentist and 19 dental technicians set up tents and equipment March 2 and began treating patients in their ready-made field environment March 3.

With steam sterilizers, medical instruments, field dentist chairs, equipment mount-out boxes and cabinets for rapid deployment, the dentists and dental techs treated an estimated 175 retired and active duty Marines per day from March 3 through 5.

WITH THE exception of performing oral surgery, they held routine sick call and normal preventive dental care treatments for the exercise. They also kept dental health records intact.

"I think some of the Marines are a little surprised to see and know that our dental company can function in the field as well as we do. The idea of being treated in tents is the most surprising part," said Ensign David Wellen, 21st Dental administration officer.

ACCORDING TO O'Neal, "Actually, a lot of the dentists prefer using the field equipment. The sterilizers operate on water and generators and can be deployed with our equipment, enhancing

our ability to perform day or night in the field."

He continued, "Although 21st Dental can function in the field self supportingly, normally we would be located with a battalion aid station during combat."

"If we were actually tasked with setting up a field dental clinic for combat, our manpower would increase to 24 dental officers and 38 enlisted technicians. Because we are a part of the 1st Marine Brigade, we would be set up with Company A, 1st Dental Battalion and it would only take us approximately 24 hours to set up."

FOR BRIGADE Marines, this means they are getting a three-fold clinical treatment and preventive service. They include treatment at the air station, at sea or in extended training exercises.

The health and readiness of the combat Marine and his Navy comrades is unmistakably the total mission of the 21st Dental Company as the "Molar Menders" of the 1st Marine Brigade.

Reagan honors veterans

WASHINGTON, D.C.—The President of the United States honored an entire generation of Americans who had served bravely in Vietnam, during a ceremony at the Pentagon when he awarded the nation's highest medal for valor to an American soldier, Feb. 24.

With the words, "... A nation grateful to you and all your comrades living and dead..." President Ronald Reagan presented the Medal of Honor to retired Army MSgt. Roy P. Benevisez.

The award came about 13 years after then SSgt. Benevisez had risked his life repeatedly to save surviving members of a special forces team, caught under withering enemy fire in a battle near Loc Ninh, Vietnam in May 1968.

Directing his remarks to Benevisez and to all those American fighting men who obeyed their country's call and fought as bravely and well as many Americans in our history, the president lauded the courage and the compassion of the almost forgotten veterans of the Vietnam War.

Reagan said, "They came home without a victory not because they'd been defeated, but because

they'd been denied permission to win.

"They were greeted," he said, "with no parades, no bands, no waving of the flag they had so nobly served. There's been no thank you for their sacrifice. There's been no effort to honor and, thus, give pride to the families of more than 57,000 young men who gave their lives in that far away war."

The president continued, "There's been little or no recognition of the gratitude we owe to the more than 300,000 men who suffered wounds in that war."

But fighting a war thousands of miles away from home was not and is not the only thing Vietnam veterans can be justly proud of. The Vietnam veteran was also a humanitarian. Reagan recalled what Kenneth Y. Tomlinson wrote in 1970 about conduct above and beyond the call of military duty in Vietnam: "a Marine from Texas, on his way in at dawn from an all night patrol, stopped to treat huge sores on the back of an old Vietnamese man."

Continuing the president added, "None of the recent movies about that war have found time to show those examples of humanitarianism. In 1969 alone, the Army volunteers helped construct 1,253

schools and 597 hospitals and dispensaries, contributing \$300,000 from their own pockets.

"Marines from the III Marine Amphibious Force helped build 268 classrooms, 75 dispensaries, 78 churches, temples and pagodas.

"Marines contributed \$40,000 to insure an education for 953 children."

The president recalled other instances of humanitarianism. Some 16,000 children were treated in one year at Hoa Khanh Children's Hospital, built and financed with money raised from combat Marines. "An 11-year-old boy burned over three quarters of his body was one of those saved. He interrupted the game he was playing with visiting Marines to say 'All my life I will never forget this place and these healing people. Some way I will repay them.'"

Recalling yet other instance, Reagan said, "Army combat troops began sacking enemy food they had captured and shipping it back on returning helicopters. They found cots in a salvage dump, repaired them and soon children (who had been sleeping on a school floor) were sleeping in beds for the first time.

"One day a cup was passed. Marines earmarked 10 percent of

all poker winnings and by the end of the year, the orphans were in a new building."

Near the end of his speech, commenting on the humanitarian efforts of our GIs in Vietnam, the president said, "It is time to show our pride in them."

In the book "The Bridges of Toko-Ri," James Michener wrote of the heroes who fought in the Korean conflict. The president recalled, "In the book's final scene, an admiral stands on the darkened bridge of his carrier, waiting for pilots he knows will never return from this mission. And as he waits, he asks in the silent darkness, 'Where did we get such men?'"

"Almost a generation later, I asked that same question when our prisoners of war were returned from savage captivity in Vietnam. Where did we find such men?"

The president answered his own question, saying, "We find them where we have always found them, in our villages and towns, on our city streets, in our shops and on our farms."

And at that point in the ceremony, Reagan commented that he had one final Vietnam story, at which time he introduced a proud and deserving Vietnam veteran, MSgt Roy Benevisez—United States Army retired.

Engine increases fire fighting capabilities

Fire Station obtains new weapon

The Federal Fire Department's Fire Station 8, at MCAS Kaneohe Bay, recently added a new weapon to its fire fighting arsenal.

THE ADDITION is a new 1980 fire engine which replaces one of the fire station's outdated 1966 models and increases the station's fire fighting capabilities.

According to Lance Ahulau, a station firefighter, the old fire engines are still functioning well, but no longer meet the needs of the air station's more than 14,000 residents.

Ahulau added that the new engine can carry 500 gallons of water to the fire scene, has pre-connected hoses for faster operation and can pump 1,000 gallons of water per minute. The old engines only have 240 gallon tanks, no pre-connected hoses, and pump only 750 gallons of water per minute.

ANOTHER advantage of the new fire engine is its 60 gallon foam tank. "We use Aquarius Film Forming Foam for some

fires," said Ahulau. "With the old trucks we have to carry the foam in separate containers then mix it during the operation. The new truck can mix the foam straight from the tank."

The old engines have five speed clutches, manual transmissions, and manual pumps, but the new truck has a three-speed automatic transmission and an electric pump for smoother driving and greater efficiency.

In addition, the new fire engine has a four-

man cab which permits the fire team to sit and discuss their plan of approach while they race to the scene of the blaze with the older model, two fireman had to stand.

THE ENGINE also carries fire fighting

equipment such as axes and pikes, a CO2 fire extinguisher, a chemical extinguisher, five air tanks and a 3,000-watt generator to power rescue lights.

"Fire Station 8 is in the process of replacing its two other 1966 fire engines with newer

equipment," related Ahulau. "The old trucks will not be put out to pasture, but will be kept in reserve."



Leatherneck tackles suspected jewel thief

The dictionary defines a hero as "any man noted for feats of courage or nobility of purpose." Cpl Juan Capote, Weapons Company, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines, 1st Marine Brigade, displayed the stuff heroes are made of when he helped apprehend a suspected jewelry thief in Waikiki the evening of Feb. 20.

"I WAS WALKING with a friend in the vicinity of the Hilton Hawaiian Village when I heard someone screaming 'Stop him! Stop him!'" stated Capote. The Marine armorer said he saw a young man running in his direction carrying a purse-like object.

Capote said as the man moved closer, he noticed an older man in pursuit.

"A crowd of people watched, but no one bothered to help," he commented. "He ran

into me as I stepped in front of him and took him to the ground."

"The man attempted to get on his feet and that's when I noticed it wasn't a purse. Instead, it was a tray of jewelry," said Capote. "I found out later that the jewelry had been taken from the ABC Gift Shop in Waikiki and was valued at about \$6,000."

The corporal said he forced the man back to the ground and by that time, the older man had caught up to help subdue the thief.

MEANWHILE, a man driving down the street stopped his car, jumped out and assisted Capote and the older man, who was later identified as the storekeeper of the gift shop.

"While I held him down, the thief insisted it was all a mistake," Capote said. "We held him there until a hotel

security guard arrived and detained him until a police officer got there."

According to Capote, he became involved in the situation because it appeared no one else would.

"It was obvious he (the thief) had stolen something and yet, all those people just stood around. It was as if they didn't care."

Capote's involvement in apprehending the thief hasn't gone unnoticed or unappreciated.

DETECTIVE Ronald Matsura of the Honolulu Police Criminal Investigation Department, who is presently working the case commented, "We need more people like him to get involved in matters such as these. If it hadn't been for Capote, the thief would have probably gotten away."

Field chefs keep on cooking

In order to feed 350 hungry Marines and sailors in the field it takes 10 cooks, seven messmen and six M-59 field ranges to prepare meals. During the Headquarters Company 1st Marine Brigade command post exercise Feb. 25 through 27 at Bellows Air Force Station, those requirements were met in full heat.

communications Support Company, 7th Communications Battalion and cooks from several of the Brigade units operated at Bellows from tents. Using field ranges, VacCans for transporting and maintaining hot and cold foods and two generator powered refrigerators, they ensured the Marines and sailors received two hot meals per day for the duration of the operations.

THE MESSMEN, members of Headquarters Company, 1st Marine Brigade, Com-

service technician. "The menu for this operation was prepared a month in advance. After we planned what to serve, the foods were requisitioned and delivered to us for preparation.

"THE DAY OF delivery is when the cooks process the food for cooking. Approximately three hours before serving time is when the food is actually cooked in the stove."

According to GySgt John Ray, brigade food The Headquarters Company members

expressed that meals were good, and unlike a box of Combat Rations, worth the day's work. The evening meals were hearty and consisted of meatloaf, Polish sausage with sauerkraut and, beef stew with steamed rice. The final night in the field, the Marines were served shrimp cocktail, beef steak and baked potatoes.

Each meal's end was only the beginning for the field cooks and messmen according to Ray. "After a meal was served, the messmen washed pots, pans and utensils in big hot water tubs while the cooks prepared for the next day's meals."

THE JOB OF handling the large pots is tedious. The messmen


first scrape the pots and then soak them in a prewash solution. This loosens food particles before washing. "Incidentally, before cooks use any piece of equipment, it must be rinsed twice," Ray pointed out.

He concluded, "Though it looks like the cooks began work just before each meal, this is a 24-hour job."



Theater presentation receives four-star rating

Audience participation is one of the factors that made the Koolau Players presentation of "Only An Orphan Girl" a success Saturday evening at the Commissioned Officers' Club. Another was the outstanding performance by the cast.

UNDER THE direction of Peggy Graham with assistance from David Daignault and Mary Corcoran, this melodrama is complete with a despicable villain and a saw mill.

Before the first act and during intermissions, the audience can purchase villain-type mustaches to wear and popcorn to eat or throw at the villain. Meanwhile, the Olio Chorus keeps the ball rolling as they lead audience sing-alongs of old favorites including "The Band Played On," "By the Light of the Silvery Moon" and "In the Good Old Summertime."

The drama opens with Swam Perkins (Bob Farley) counting money he has made by selling his crops. His fall harvest has produced enough for him to pay off the mortgage on the farm, with some left for savings.

HIS DAUGHTER Lucy (Tracy Douglas) falls prey to the villain, delightfully vicious Capt Harry Steever. The scene closes with mother (Sandy Witt) and Nellie the orphan

girl (Megan Buehl), father and Lucy brooding over the theft of the mortgage money.

Dick Perkins, the clean-cut hero played by Jose Rivas, sees this as a chance to try for Nellie's hand, and heads for the city to earn the rent money before the dreadful villain forecloses on the property.

The antagonist, upon learning Nellie is worth a million dollars, purchases the mortgage from Amos Appleby, (Ted Baker) in an attempt to win Nellie's hand in marriage.

ENTER ETHEL Rutherford, the villain's long-lost wife, played by Kate Corcoran. Seductive Ethel, disguised as a boarder

in the Perkins home, plants a dress in Nellie's room to lead her parents into believing Nellie has taken the money. The unforgiving father, throws Nellie out of the house into a raging snow-storm.

Does the hero return in time with the rent money? What happens to poor ol' Nellie? Is the real thief caught? For the answers, attend one of the next performances.

The musical accompaniment by Second Lieutenants Mary Lieutowski and Jane Kimmel on the piano and drums respectively, adds to this extraordinary production. The audience receives their cues from the character themes

and boos, hisses and throws popcorn when the villain appears and cheers when the protagonist enters.

Cash Sales

Two major changes have taken place at cash sales outlets according to Marine Corps officials.

Dependents may now purchase items for their sponsor at cash sales outlets by presenting their Uniformed Services Identification and Privilege Card.

Officials recommend that only items not requiring test-wearing should be purchased by dependents since Marines themselves may have to exchange the uniform item later.

Another major change is that privates through lance corporals no longer need a sergeant or above to accompany them to cash sales when purchasing outer uniform clothing. However, witnessing officers are still required when recruits and officer candidates are issued clothing.

The changes were announced in Marine Corps Bulletin 10120 of Jan. 16, 1991.

Composite scores

Compiled numbers determine Marines qualified for promotions

Composite scores or cutting scores, call them what you like. They are the numbers Headquarters Marine Corps uses to determine whether or not you'll get promoted.

They are used for two purposes: to ensure the Marine Corps meets its needs for junior Marines in every Occupational Field, and that only the most qualified Marines in a given OF get promoted.

PRIVATEES AND privates first class should not worry about cutting scores, since composite scores are not used to determine promotions to either

private first class or lance corporal.

HEADQUARTERS Marine Corps directs commanders to submit composite scores on their lance corporals and corporals quarterly. While this is being done, the Manpower Plans and Policy Division there goes into the Manpower Management System — a computerized pool — to determine how many promotions are needed for a particular rank to fill the needs of each OF.

Once the composite scores are submitted into MMS, Code MP then extracts from

MMS those composite scores from the highest score in a particular OF, down to the lowest. If, for example, in OF 01, the Marine Corps needs to promote 100 corporals to sergeant, and a composite score of 1,500 represented the 100th Marine on the list, 1,500 would then be the minimum cutting score needed for promotion to sergeant in OF 01.

ONCE THIS information is determined for each OF, minimum cutting scores are published in a bulletin and sent throughout the Marine Corps.

To determine composite scores, commanding officers use a standardized procedure. The formula listed in conjunction with conversion tables from MCO P1400.29B (Promotion Manual), is used.

Composite scores are computed each quarter on all lance corporals and corporals who are eligible, qualified and recommended for promotion. Lance corporals can expect their composite scores to be computed and entered into MMS during March, June, September and December. Composite scores of corporals are entered during February, May, August and November.

THE MARINE Corps promotes by OF, therefore, promotions

are dependent upon peculiar trends within each OF.

Maj. David Bice, an MP official, explains: "For example, some of our highly technical OFs routinely have a faster promotion flow because these Marines are in skills that are in high demand on the civilian market so that we have lower retention rates among them. Since these OFs tend to become vacant quicker, the Marine Corps needs to fill them and cutting scores in these OFs are usually lower than in others."

"If you look at cutting scores, lateral movement orders and Selective Reenlistment Bonus bulletins, you find a correlation," continues Bice. "The lowest scores generally are in the OFs that are 'short.' That's why we try to move Marines out of these 'overloaded' OFs into ones that have vacancies. We try to give our OFs a better balance — and Marines a better chance for promotion."

"FIRST TERM" Marines thinking of reenlisting or making a lateral move into a new MOS should at least look at what the promotion flow is in the OF they're in or may want to enter," Bice said.

So you're in the second year of a four-year enlistment as an administrative clerk,

and you've been doing a good job but for some reason you're not getting promoted. Your composite scores never seem to be quite high enough for your OF. You can't reenlist for at least another year, and you don't want to be a two-year lance corporal.

What can you do?

"It's very important for Marines to ensure," Bice said, "that they strive to raise their scores to enhance their chances for promotion."

"MARINES CAN do this," he said, "by self-improvement to raise rifle range qualification, Physical Fitness Test and Essential Subjects Test scores, and can take off-duty education in high school, college or Marine Corps Institute courses. By working harder, Marines can improve their proficiency and conduct marks."

Bice added that when Marines complete any type of course, they should ensure transcripts, diplomas or certificates are recorded in their Service Record Books. Commanding officers can use them to compute composite scores, and Marines will get credit for extra things they've done.

Like all enlisted promotions — whether to corporal or sergeant major — the individual

Marine has a direct impact on his or her opportunity for promotion. Marines do not have to wait for their composite scores to increase only through time in service and time in grade. There are several means available to enable you to raise your score, but the work is up to you.

Officials announce officer promotion boards

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Officer promotion board schedules for 1981 and 1982 have been announced by officials here.

Two 1981 board dates — to captain and major/limited duty officer — were shifted to accommodate the Defense Officer Personnel Management Act, which takes effect Sept. 15. The major/LDO selection board, originally scheduled for Sept. 9, will convene June 16; and the captains' selection board, originally scheduled for Oct. 6, will meet June 22.

Dates were changed, an official here explained, so that all 1981 officer selections will be made under existing laws. Had they not been changed, the 1981 captain and major/LDO boards would have been subject to new DOPMA selection procedures.

The 1982 boards to select for these two ranks will convene approximately nine months later — the majors' board on March 9, 1982, and the captains' board April 20, 1982.

The 1981 boards to select regular officers for promotion to major general and brigadier general have already adjourned. The following list contains the remainder of officer selection board schedules for 1981 and the schedules for 1982.



Year in review:

Summary cites facts and figures for Corps' role in national defense

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following is the second installment of a two-part article written by the Research Writer for the Media Branch, Division of Public Affairs, HQMC.

Marines Around the World—Fighting ability is still the Marines' forte. The Corps' combat strength is concentrated in the Fleet Marine Forces, with major units strategically located on the East and West coasts of the United States, and deployed in the Western Pacific.

It is Marine Corps policy that the Fleet Marine Forces normally will be employed as integrated air-ground teams. Over the years, the Corps has developed, and consistently demonstrated the value of, its totally integrated concept of operations.

This unique capability is fully demonstrated in the Corps' ability to task-organize the various elements of the Marine air-ground team to respond to a wide range of contingencies. The result is a Marine Amphibious Unit, Marine Amphibious Brigade or Marine Amphibious Force, tailored in size, assets and striking power to fit any situation.

The Corps' three active division/wing teams are task-organized as Marine Amphibious Forces.

I MAF, headquartered on the West Coast, consists of:

—the 1st Marine

Division (Camp Pendleton, Calif.);

—the 3d Marine Aircraft Wing (El Toro, Calif.); and

—the 1st Force Service Support Group (Camp Pendleton).

II MAF, headquartered on the East Coast, consists of:

—the 2d Marine Division (Camp Lejeune, N.C.);

—2d Marine Aircraft Wing (Cherry Point, N.C.); and

—the 2d Force Service Support Group (Camp Lejeune).

III MAF, headquartered on Okinawa, consists of:

—the 3d Marine Division (Okinawa and Hawaii);

—the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing (Okinawa and Iwakuni, Japan); and

—the 3d Force Service Support Group (Okinawa).

In other areas of the world, the Marine Corps maintained two Marine amphibious units afloat. During the year, the 6th Fleet's Mediterranean Amphibious Ready Group and the 7th Fleet's 31st Marine Amphibious Unit both deployed twice to the Indian Ocean. The Marines of the 6th Fleet deployed to the Indian Ocean via the Suez Canal, a new experience for these east coast-based Marines.

In addition the Marine Corps maintained detachments aboard 23 Navy ships and 43 Marine Barracks, and provided

security at 119 embassies and consulates in 104 countries last year.

Mission—In a letter to Marine commanders last year, the commandant affirmed the Corps' amphibious mission and its indispensable value to this maritime nation. He noted also the Corps' versatility in mission and method of operation, and spoke of the "lesser included capabilities" of the Marine air-ground team.

"It is in the exploitation of these 'lesser included capabilities' that we need to demonstrate our flexibility in order to be even more useful to this Nation," the commandant concluded.

New Initiatives—Among the major new initiatives in which the Marine Corps participated were:

—the development with the other services of a rapid deployment force capability to respond to non-NATO contingencies;

—the Maritime Prepositioning Ships concept;

—the Near Term Prepositioning Ships program; and,

—the formation of the 7th Marine Amphibious Brigade for possible contingency deployment under the RDF concept.

Under the RDF plan, the four services in the Department of Defense were called on to provide a flexible, central "reservoir" of

forces to be identified and available for deployment on short notice. The Marine Corps, as a force in readiness, readily accepted the challenge.

The Fleet Marine Forces, the commandant stated, were capable of providing Marine Air-Ground Task Forces of varying sizes as major components of the Rapid Deployment Joint Task Force.

March 1, 1980, the RDJTF was activated as the command element for the employment of rapid deployment forces, with Marine LTGen Paul Kelley designated as its first commander. The RDJTF headquarters is at MacDill Air Force Base, Tampa, Fla.

Although no new forces were added to the military force structure under the RDF plan, the concept and its implementation entailed intensive, continuing individual service efforts and multi-service coordination. At the same time, the Corps worked on a number of related initiatives to improve

strategic mobility, in particular, the Maritime Prepositioning concept.

This major, long-range "mobility enhancement initiative" was announced by the Secretary of Defense in December 1979. It provides for approximately 15 multi-purpose cargo ships, capable of supporting up to three Marine Amphibious Brigades, to be constructed and introduced into the fleet by the mid-to-late-1980s. Maritime prepositioning will enable a Marine Air-Ground Task Force to be flown by strategic airlift and link up with combat supplies and heavy equipment prepositioned on cargo ships located in remote, potential crisis areas.

To fill the need until the new ships could be built, an interim plan was developed and the Marine Corps was assigned a major role in the new mission. The Near Term Prepositioning Ships program came into existence early in 1980. By using existing, available commercial cargo ships, the United States

was able to establish an interim seven-ship prepositioned flotilla in the Indian Ocean. The ships—three RO/ROs, two break-bulks and two tankers—arrived on station at Diego Garcia in August, and are capable of supporting a Marine Amphibious Brigade. Equipment and supplies came primarily from Marine assets in storage at the Corps' logistics bases in Albany, Ga., and Barstow, Calif., and supplies drawn from the active force structure and reserve training allowances. Marines were involved in a whirlwind of activity, loading the NTPS fleet and preparing the ships for embarkation from East and West coast facilities.

While the NTPS program was taking shape, the Marine Corps formed the 7th MAB from existing Marine units based on the West Coast. Composed of specially trained and organized air and ground units, and complete with tanks and artillery, the new brigade is head-

quartered at Twentynine Palms, Calif., and collocated with the Marine Corps Air-Ground Combat Center/Combined Arms Command.

With the announce-

ment, in July 1980, that the new unit was formed, trained and ready to go, the 7th MAB's 12,000 Marines became the first brigade to be organized and trained for deploy-

ment as part of the RDJTF. In addition to the 7th MAB, a composite Marine Amphibious Force, formed from Marine Amphibious Units afloat and



Truck rental opens

Banyan Tree International Inc., a truck rental service now operating out of five locations around Oahu, was recently contracted by Marine Corps Exchange officials to set up shop in conjunction with the car rental service already in existence here.

THE ONE YEAR contract went into effect Monday as Banyan Tree opened for business. But,

according to CWO-2 David Bringer, assistant exchange officer, "Banyan Tree will remain at the air station as long as customer load is enough to make it profitable to bring trucks over from the other side of the island." But he says, "They've already rented out quite a few trucks in just the first few days."

Initial contact with the truck rental service

came about last spring when Bringer attempted to both clarify existing contracts and scout for new and better services.

BANYAN TREE was already doing a booming business over at the Pearl Harbor Navy Exchange and with the number of Marines they were trying to accommodate in addition to Navy personnel, they contacted Bringer and suggested a small expansion at

MCAS Kaneohe Bay. Bringer had previously put out the call for trucking services, but was about to abandon the idea due to lack of response when Banyan Tree came to the proverbial rescue. The company knew of the air station's needs since they were already serving Marines, but they simply could not meet all of Bringer's original requests for the type and number of trucks available. They needed a new fleet of trucks.

but interest rates were soaring and the purchase was postponed indefinitely.

THEY DID manage to put together a smaller fleet of small trucks and were awarded the contract.

"Large trucks such as one-ton trucks with lifts and flat beds are available," says Bringer, "but only on a 24-hour notification basis." The rest are available on a walk-in basis. According to Bringer,

the new service are really below average civilian prices and are much more convenient. Under the contract, trucks provided by Banyan Tree must be in good mechanical condition as well as neat and clean at all times. None of the trucks are more than five years old and all have current State Safety Inspections.

Anyone desiring to rent a truck must be at least 21 years of age and possess a valid driver's license.

ALTHOUGH anyone renting a truck may use his or her own insurance, proof of insurance must be made before the truck can be rented. If not, insurance is available to those persons wishing to see the contractors' insurance coverage.

Legislation

Personnel management act resolves difficulties within promotion system

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following article is the finale of a three-part series written by LtCol J.M. Dwyer and reprinted by permission from the MARINE CORPS GAZETTE.

A comparison of tenure provisions under current law, and those which come into effect on Sept. 15, 1981, is shown in figure 3. The major changes involve five issues.

Brigadier generals tenure is changed to five years in grade and 30 years of commissioned service. This will also apply to the new one star Navy grade (commodore admiral). All current brigadier generals, and those colonels on a selection list on Sept. 15, 1981, are under a grandfather clause which requires their mandatory retirement under current law (two promotion failures).

Lieutenant colonels tenure is increased to 28 years of commissioned service. Once again, a grandfather clause keeps all current

lieutenant colonels, and selectees to that grade on Sept. 15, 1981, under the current 26 year rule.

Upon approval of Secretary of the Navy, lieutenant colonels and above can be kept on active duty for up to five years after their mandatory retirement date. This provision will apply to all lieutenant colonels and above as of Sept. 15, 1981.

Lieutenant colonels twice passed-over for promotion, colonels with four years in grade, and general officers with four years in grade can be subjected to involuntary retirement before their mandatory date. This would require board action and, in the case of lieutenant colonels and colonels, the board could only select for involuntary retirement 30 percent of those who are considered.

This provision allows the Secretary of the Navy to create vacancies in the higher grades if there is some stagnation in the

promotion flow. There is no grandfathering of this provision. There are no indications of stagnation in the foreseeable future, which would justify its use by the Marine Corps.

The last, and possibly most widely applicable point under tenure, is that all majors and above must have three years in grade in order to retire in the grade in which they are serving — there is partial grandfathering here.

For all those officers on active duty in the grade of lieutenant colonel or above, or on a selection list to one of those grades on Sept. 15, 1981, the minimum time in grade will be two years. However, if selected and promoted after that date, the three year rule will apply. This provision can only be waived by the president, and that authority cannot be delegated below that level.

Voluntary retirement, without the minimum time in grade, will result in

retirement in the next lower grade to include the retired pay of the lower grade.

By far, the most dramatic change in DOPMA is the effect the law will have on women officers. The law eliminates the different treatment in appointment, accountability, promotion, separation and retirement.

Criteria for officer appointments will not reflect any difference based upon sex. The principal impact on the Marine Corps will be to allow women to compete for appointment under our Limited Duty Officer program on the same basis as male officers.

Women officers will no longer be a separate category. They will count against our grade tables and will be placed on the same lineal list (called an active duty list under DOPMA) as male officers. Women officers now on active duty will be placed on the lineal list in accordance with their date of rank. The method of

determining seniority among their male counterparts with the same date of rank will be established by the secretary of the Navy.

Women officers will no longer be a separate competitive category, and will compete for promotion with their male counterparts. There is no sex distinction in the new law, and all promotion laws concerning women are repealed.

On separation and retirement, the same laws will apply to male and female officers without distinction. All women serving in the grades of first lieutenant or captain on Sept. 15, 1981, who subsequently become twice passed-over, have the option of being discharged under the new law or the current law.

Current law allows continued service to seven years commissioned service for twice passed-over lieutenants, and 13 for twice passed-over captains. Under either option they will receive separation pay. The

minor differences in retirement laws are also abolished by DOPMA.

Changes in the law for women officers will not affect their promotion timing. The current promotion policy provides that women and male officers enter the primary zone for consideration at the same point based upon date of rank.

There are several management changes which require action at Headquarters Marine Corps to ensure smooth transition and compliance with new methods. Many directives must be created at Department of Defense, Secretary of the Navy and Commandant of the Marine Corps levels to implement the new law.

DOPMA will standardize the streamline many areas which have caused concern and confusion for many years. And, most importantly, DOPMA prescribes in law the standardization among and quality within the services.
