## Program fortifies station ranks

Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay is looking for a few good Marines. More specifically, the Marines sought are already stationed here. They belong to the 1st Marine Brigade.

Under the Fleet Assistance Program, not only can brigade Marines expand their technical skills and in essence aid in the support of their parent commands.

**THE FAP IS** a set of formal procedures in which personnel are temporarily provided by the Fleet Marine Force commander to assist the supporting base commander in the accomplishment of his mission.

Some Marines, because of prior training in certain occupational fields, automatically qualify for the FAP. They receive orders to duties in the joint brigade/station offices upon arrival. However, FAP personnel remain chargeable to the parent commands and are immediately returned to their units if required to deploy under actual operational contingencies.

The commanding general has the primary responsibility of determining that portion of station personnel requirements to be supported by the FMF, but it takes a joint effort to make it work.

**THE ACTUAL** mix by grade and military occupational specialty of FMF personnel

assigned to the FAP is determined and published periodically by a separate brigade station bulletin in the 1300 series. It is normally based on the actual FAP requirements and the current brigade strength.

The current FAP order, Brigade Order 1300.3P/Station Order 1300.12D with change one, explains that personnel who are assigned to the station for training or retraining will receive Temporary Additional Duty orders for that purpose. Personnel cannot be considered FAPed until fully qualified in the respective MOS. Several jobs require on-the-job training.

**SELECTED** personnel are assigned for a period of six to 12 months. Assignments of less than six months are considered inadequate for productive OJT continuity and are not accepted.

FAP requirements vary from MOS to MOS. For example, FAP Marines assigned to duty with the military police and rifle range must be retrained for a minimum period of nine months since specialized training is required prior to assignment to actual duties. In addition, personnel desiring MP duty through FAP assignment must be interviewed and accepted by the station provost marshal.

Marines enlisted under the Ground Enlisted Options Program must be assigned duties in their prospective MOS for a minimum of two years before they can be accepted for assignment to the program.

**ALL MARINES**, regardless of MOS at the time of their assignment to the FAP, must be in a full duty status. They can have no disciplinary action pending, punishment in progress, or substantive medical treatment underway or pending. Personnel with histories of disciplinary problems, such as special court-martial or three non-judicial punishments or NJP/ Courts-Martial within 60 days of being FAPed won't even be considered.

Keeping current FAP quotas filled is the brigade unit commanders' responsibility. The brigade/station order states, "Failure to comply may seriously limit the station's ability to provide required support/services to FMF units."

**AS AN AID** to unit commanders, the station is required to screen presently assigned FAP personnel to determine those with rotation dates falling within the upcoming month. After screening, a letter is prepared and sent to the brigade personnel officer within the first five days of each month identifying those rotating and

requesting "one for one" replacements.

Unit commanders must then submit nominations for the FAP to the brigade personnel officer no later than 30 days prior to the desired effective date of assignment. This allows ample personnel planning time for both brigade and station units.

**THE STATION** commander takes charge of all administrative and operational requirements of FAP personnel assigned to the station. This includes, but is not limited to, promotions, proficiency pay, messing and billeting, health and welfare, personal affairs, maintenance of service records, all pay matters, assignment of conduct and proficiency marks, general military subjects proficiency, physical fitness testing, education, casualty reporting, annual and emergency leave, liberty, reenlistment and related interviews.

**ANOTHER WORLD** of Marine Corps skills exists to be found and applied in support of the station commander to accomplish the mission of providing tactical support and recreational services at the air station. Marines interested in applying for the FAP program should consult their unit career planners for more details and information.

### Application deadline set

## Education board convenes in June

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Officers have until May to get their applications here for either the Special Education Program (SEP), or the Advanced Degrees Program (ADP).

A combined board to consider these programs will meet here June 2-5, according to ALMAR 006/81, which announces this year's programs. The application deadline for SEP is May 1, and for ADP, it's May 11.

The ALMAR lists the following disciplines, in order of priority, of the Marine Corps' current need for graduate schooled officers:

Command, Control and Communications (SEP only); Computer/Data Systems Management (SEP or ADP); Operations Research (SEP or ADP); Electronics Engineering (SEP or ADP); Operations Research (SEP or

ADP); Electronics Engineering (SEP or ADP); Computer Science (SEP or ADP); Nuclear Engineering (SEP or ADP); Mathematics (ADP only); Public Affairs (ADP only); Industrial Engineering (SEP or ADP); Aeronautical Engineering (SEP or ADP); Nuclear Engineering (SEP or ADP); International Relations (ADP only); History (ADP only); Financial Management (SEP or

ADP); and Management (SEP or ADP).

The ALMAR points out that the priority of this list could change with changing needs of the Marine Corps between now and June. Also possible, according to the ALMAR, is that some disciplines could be cancelled if requirements are met through other sources.

This year's SEP selectees will attend either the Naval Post-

graduate School, Monterey, Calif., or the Air Force Institute of Technology, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Dayton, Ohio. Selectees will receive full pay, allowances and certain expenses while in school. Following graduation, officers will normally serve a tour where they can practice their graduate discipline.

Under the ADP, officers receive grad-

uate training at civilian schools only. Selectees receive full pay and allowances, but pay their own education costs. As with SEP, selectees are normally assigned a tour where they can practice their schooling.

## Privileges

### System cuts down benefit misuse

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The word DEERS is something all Marines, active duty and retired, and their dependents should know about. DEERS is an acronym for the Defense Enrollment/Eligibility Reporting System; a system designed to improve the overall effectiveness of benefits to military members and their dependents.

In 1974, the Department of Defense was tasked by Congress to implement a program which would assist planning future benefit programs and estimating the cost of those benefits. Also, DOD was tasked to reduce the amount of undetected fraud, abuse and misuse of military benefits by ineligible people.

The DEERS planners believe the system will determine how many people in each community qualify for military health care and benefits; enable better estimates to be made on the number of doctors, nurses and technicians needed; and quickly verify the individual's eligibility for military health care through telephone-computer links at either Monterey, Calif., or Alexandria, Va.

Active duty and retired servicemembers are automatically enrolled in the DEERS program based on existing service records.


Dependent enrollments are the responsibility of the sponsor. Active duty sponsors will enroll their dependents at the military facilities where they work. Retired members should receive a letter from their parent service instructing them how to enroll their dependents in DEERS.

The DEERS program divided the United States into 14 areas. The program will be phased into different areas over a three-year period which began in November 1979. Active duty and retired servicemembers and their dependents living in North Carolina, Oregon, southeastern Virginia, northern California and northern Nevada are already enrolled in DEERS. The program is currently being phased into South Carolina, Georgia, southern California, southern Nevada and southwestern Arizona. The remaining states in the continental United States and the District of Columbia will be implemented into the DEERS program by September 1982.

Planners of the program hope to eventually include exchange and commissary privileges in the system, thus cutting down the number of people illegally using military benefits.

## Safety program adopts Marine Corps helicopter

MCAS CHERRY POINT, N.C. — A CH-46E helicopter left the Naval Air Rework Facility, here, recently to become a prototype aircraft for the Navy's H-46 Safety, Reliability and Maintainability Program at Boeing-Vertol Corporation in Ridley Park, Pa.

**THE PROGRAM** provides the Navy and Marine Corps with the capability to accomplish present mission requirements until 1990-1995 or beyond. It is also designed to achieve a significant reduction in the cost of operation, maximize safety, and correct

items that will improve reliability and maintainability.

Significant improvements in several components, including the main landing gear, flight controls, wiring generators, and forward and aft transmissions are outlined as part of SR&M. There will also be considerable improvement in the rotary wing head and the rotor brake.

Once the prototype aircraft is completed by Boeing-Vertol, it will undergo testing by the Navy and the contractor. If testing is successful, the Department of Defense will

contract with the manufacturer of the aircraft to provide modification kits for 364 helicopters, including selected H-46As, H-46Ds, and CH-46Es which are scheduled for the SR&M Program.

**UNDER THE** present proposal, the Naval Air Rework Facility here will receive the first verification kits and, after successful verification of the changes, the facility will begin installation of the SR&M kits. The program is scheduled to be completed by the late 1980s.

# C-ration chef spices up ho-hum dining

**REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES** — For Marines in the field, chow time usually means combat rations time, and few Leather-necks look forward to that "ho-hum" dining experience.

**BUT NOT** Sgt Wayne Carson, non-commissioned officer-in-charge of Brigade Service Support Group-9's Engineer Detachment, while operating on remote Mindoro Island.

Although supervising 30 Marines is Carson's primary responsibility, he takes on an entirely different role when it comes time to chow down.

Carson's credentials

are noteworthy and tend to support his self-proclaimed title of "C-Rat Chef Extraordinaire." He has more than four years experience eating C-rats, and has pursued his hobby in such far-away places as Jamaica, Japan, Puerto Rico and the Dominican Republic.

"THROUGHOUT my travels in the Corps, I've finally learned the key to chow time satisfaction," Carson began.

"I call it 'supplemental creativity,' since there's only so much you can do without supplements, except mix and heat plain C-rats in various combinations," he explained.

Carson takes a large selection of C-rat supplements whenever he goes to the field.

"I usually bring as much stuff as I can carry, without fail," continued Carson. "I always bring hot sauce and a big jar of peanut butter, but try and bring store-bought canned food, too."

**WHILE MOST** Marines are chowing down with deliberate precision, one can at a time, Carson is often at the brink of a creative spree.

"Nothing has to go with anything, it all depends how you feel at the time," emphasized Carson. "With a little imagination, a box of C-rats and a few extras, the sky's the limit!"

Like all creative chefs, Carson has a favorite dish.

"Just thinking about tuna and turkey loaf mixed with my macaroni and cheese makes my mouth water."

Carson exclaimed. "But everyone has their personal tastes, and it's definitely out there for them if they just keep experimenting."

Advice to would-be C-rat chefs?

**"REMEMBER,"** Carson concluded, "bring supplements, be creative, don't be afraid to try anything, and at least your chow will be what plain C-rats definitely aren't, exciting!"

## Retirement insurance

The Civil Service Commission continues to receive complaints from employees and

retirees who claim they are unaware of requirements to continue health benefits upon retirement.

Some employees about to retire or just retired are dismayed to learn that they are not eligible to continue their health benefits into retirement.

The Federal Employees Health Benefits law allows a retiree to continue health benefits into retirement if his or her retirement is: On an immediate annuity.

After 12 or more years of service or under the disability provisions of the retirement law.

After enrollment (or coverage as a family member in a health plan, not necessarily the same plan) under the program during the five years of service immediately preceding retirement, or all

service since the first opportunity to enroll.

Careful consideration should be given to

these requirements if the retiree is not enrolled in a plan or is considering cancellation of an enrollment.

# Courts Martial Report

## EDITORS NOTE:

The information contained in courts-martial reports is compiled by the Joint Legal Services Center and is published as a source of information for all station and brigade Marines.

LCpl David A. Hatch, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of wrongful possession of marijuana and of fraudulently altering a check payable to himself.

He was sentenced to confinement at hard labor for three months, forfeiture of \$250 pay per month for three months and reduction to private.

Sgt Samuel P. Jones III, MACS-2, MAG-24, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of assault with a means of force likely to produce grievous bodily harm and assault consummated by a battery.

He was sentenced to confinement at hard labor for two months, and reduction to Lance Corporal.

LCpl Ludwig Gilglen, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of unauthorized absence from May 5, 1980 until Jan. 2, 1981.

He was sentenced to confinement at hard labor for three months, forfeiture of \$100 pay per month for three months, and reduction to private.

Cpl Ronald E. Risinger, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of the wrongful sale of 3.55 grams of marijuana and the wrongful possession of 1.53 grams of marijuana.

He was sentenced to confinement at hard labor for six months, forfeiture of \$370 pay per month for six months and reduction to Private First Class.

PFC William B. Baumgardner, Jr.,

H&MS-24, MAG-24, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of unauthorized absence from July 28 until Aug. 9, 1980, and from Dec. 2 until Dec. 12, 1980, of unauthorized absence from appointed places of duty on October 17, 1980 and of wrongful appropriation of \$285 in currency from a fellow Marine.

He was sentenced to confinement at hard labor for three months, forfeiture of \$150 pay per month for four months, reduction to

private and a bad conduct discharge.

Sgt George M. Dilley, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines, was convicted at trial by general

court-martial of assault with intent to inflict grievous bodily harm and unlawful entry.

He was sentenced to

confinement at hard labor for thirty months, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, reduction to private and a bad conduct discharge.

# Physician assistants enhance health care quality

In July 1972 the Navy decided to train physician assistants to compensate for the shortage of primary care medical officers. The main objective of the program is to enhance the quality of primary health care to the military public.

The Naval Regional Medical Clinic, Kaneohe Branch, has two PAs, Chief Warrant Officer-2 Vito Almaraz and Chief Warrant Officer-3 Robert Yelken.

signed to military sick call and administers to health problems ranging from colds to orthopedic ailments.

Yelken works in the pediatrics clinic diagnosing and treating health problems in children.

"In pediatrics I see children from six months to teens," said Yelken. "The illnesses I treat can vary from colds and rashes to ear infections. I don't treat anyone with chronic problems such as cerebral palsy or learning disabilities."

Although Almaraz and Yelken work in sick call and pediatrics, their knowledge and experience go beyond that.

PAs attend a two-year school, which involves two phases. The first covers the basic sciences of medicine with emphasis on most of the diseases they might encounter in their practice.

"THE FIRST phase of school is very intensive book work," said Almaraz. "We learn not only how body organs work, but

also why they work as they do."

Yelken related, "While I was attending school I wondered what part the medical theory would play in working with people. But now that I have been a PA for four years, I can see how the theory works."

The second phase of the school is a clinical rotation where the PAs, working under the direct supervision of a doctor, actually treat people. "Once we graduate and are at duty stations, we are responsible to a doctor but, we don't work under his supervision,"

explained Almaraz. "Also, the school is not a stepping stone to becoming a doctor."

PAs do not specialize in a particular field of medicine, but they may work with patients concerning most illnesses. "We must use common sense plus our medical experience," said Almaraz. "If a problem is beyond the scope of a PA's medical knowledge or there is a complicated medical problem, then he would refer the patient to a specialist in the particular field."

"Each PA must know his limitations," said Yelken, "and must be professional enough to know when to refer a patient to a doctor."

ALTHOUGH A PA can diagnose, treat and follow a patient in medical care, there are limitations placed on what they can do. "The main limitation we have," explained Almaraz, "is the medications we can prescribe. PAs can not prescribe narcotics. Besides, if someone needs a type of narcotic they shouldn't be seeing me, they should be seeing a specialist."

Yelken finds that the guidelines set for prescribing medicines, based on the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee Meeting and approval of the commanding officer, do

not affect him much. "Working with children, the only time I would really have to worry about the prescribing guidelines would be with cold syrups. Some of them might have codeine, which is a narcotic," said Yelken.

While physician assistants have knowledge in all aspects of medicine they do not work in a specific hospital ward.

"PAs are a part of the health care team," said Almaraz. "We are here to enhance the medical accessibility to the population."

BOTH ALMARAZ and Yelken are presently working in areas where they have an interest.

"At my last duty station I did not work in pediatrics, which is what I wanted to do. When I arrived here and was told there was a chance I could work in this area, I jumped at the opportunity, and I love it."

"I like to take the time to completely explain to parents just what is wrong with their children, and what medications I am prescribing for them. Along with this I make sure they understand when to give the medication," explained Yelken.

ALONG WITH his love for children, Yelken feels there is one extra advantage to working in pediatrics.

With Almaraz, the enjoyment he finds in

his job is related to a pastime he enjoys. "I see a lot of sports related problems," remarked Almaraz. "I enjoy running, so when I work with someone who has shin splints or

some other sports-related problem, it interests me. I also feel the obligation to help fellow active duty people and am glad I can do it by virtue of my training."





# Repairs

## Shop issues maintenance equipment for fixed-wing squadron

Before Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 212's maintenance shops can begin work on aircraft, they must first obtain the necessary equipment.

So where does this equipment come from? The Ground Support Equipment Shop.

"We have 22 types of equipment to issue for maintenance work," said Cpl Gary Wasson, a GSE man.

"There's equipment for electrical problems, hydraulic malfunctions, apparatus used to start aircraft engines and material for aircraft repairs."

The shop is particular about the upkeep and use of its equipment.

Before Marines can check out gear from the GSE shop they must show operator's licenses for the equipment. The licenses are obtained by attending classes given by GSE.

When the squadron reviews its safety procedures, the GSE shop uses that time to review the operation of the equipment.

Marines found guilty of improperly using or abusing GSE materials are put on report. The report is forwarded to

their officer-in-charge, who has the option of revoking their GSE licenses, or fining them dollar amounts.

"The Marine can also receive office hours if the case is taken to the aviation maintenance officer and he feels it is necessary," explained Wasson.

In addition to checking equipment out to maintenance shops, and ensuring its proper use, the GSE Marines must perform maintenance checks on their materials every morning. This includes checking fuel, oil, tires


and starting each piece before it is checked out.

People in the maintenance shops are not allowed to fix ground support equipment. It must be returned to Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 24's GSE for repairs. "We usually have one piece of gear break down with a minor problem about every two or three days," explained Wasson, "and about every three or four months something major happens to a piece of equipment."


According to Wasson

the GSE job is learned mainly through experience at the squadron level. "There is no GSE school, but we are required to attend a nine-week course on different engines at Naval Air Station Memphis, Tenn.," said Wasson.

Although the GSE man's job is not a complicated one, his function in the squadron is important as Wasson explained. "Without GSE the squadron couldn't complete its mission, for we supply equipment for repairs to keep the airplanes flying."


# Intelligence Brief

The newest armored personnel carrier in the Soviet inventory is the BTR- (bronetransporter) M197; also known as the BTR-70.

This model BTR is also believed to be equipped with a collective CBR system similar to the BRDM-2 and with the same designed firing ports as a BMP, to allow troops to fire weapons without disrupting the CBR protection.

This newer model BTR is believed to be the successor to the BTR-60 with the major modifications being an improved motor and drive train, thicker armor protection, and it is both longer and wider.

Armament on the new BTR consists of a 14.5mm turret mounted machinegun and a 7.62mm coaxial machinegun.

going to win, but the judges thought differently," claims Ferguson. "He stayed close and kept crowding me so I couldn't throw any punches."




