Pass in Review

Easter Sunrise Service

The annual Easter Sunrise Service, a traditional worship experience for most of Christendom, will be held 6:30 a.m. Sunday at MCAS Kaneohe Bay's Rifle Range. The ecumenical service will be conducted under the auspices of the station chaplains. All military people and their families at Kaneohe Bay are encouraged to attend. In case of inclement weather the service will be moved to the station chapel and will begin at 8:30 a.m.

Proposed summer pay raise

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Deputy Secretary of Defense Frank Carlucci and Secretary of the Navy John Lehman have urged congressional passage of the administration's request for a 5.3 percent pay raise this summer. Carlucci said the raise is needed to attract and retain people required to man the military forces. During a press conference Lehman said that both he and the chief of naval operations believe the 5.3 percent pay raise proposed for July has the highest priority in the fiscal year '82 defense budget. Carlucci, in his statement April 8, asked Congress to join with the administration "in sending a clear signal that our nation intends to restore the capability to defend its vital interests wherever these interests may be challenged."

National Cancer Month

Cancer is a year-round enemy and during April, National Cancer Control Month, special emphasis will be placed on the severity of the killer disease. The American Cancer Society, Hawaii Division, is launching an intensive publicity campaign to make people aware of cancer's symptoms, causes and control. Dr. Edward Scanlon, professor of surgery and director of surgical oncology, Northwestern University, Evanston, Ill. will speak at all the campaign kick-offs in Hawaii. Between May 4 and 8, 14,000 Cancer Society volunteers will be delivering cancer literature house-to-house and accepting donations for the fight against cancer. According to Tony Pelle, public information director for the American Cancer Society, Hawaii Division, the April goal is \$1,700,000. They hope to collect \$375,000 of that amount through the door-to-door drive.

Foundation Scholarship

Navy and Marine Corps officers in Year Groups '76 and '79 may be eligible for an Olmstead Foundation Scholarship. The scholarship provides for two years of graduate education in foreign universities for qualified officers with regular commissions. Additional information is available in the March 19 Secretary of the Navy Note 1520.

CHAMPUS eligibility

WASHINGTON (NES) — Retirees, spouses and children of retirees, as well as spouses and children of deceased service members (active duty or retired) lose eligibility for CHAMPUS when they become entitled to Medicare's Hospital Insurance (Part A). CHAMPUS eligibility continues for any active duty member dependent who becomes entitled to Medicare, but Medicare becomes primary (first) payor and CHAMPUS secondary payor. Medicare is the Social Security Administration's health insurance program for people 65 years of age or older and for some people under 65 who have a disability or chronic kidney condition. It has two parts: hospital insurance (Part A) and medical insurance (Part B). Medicare's hospital insurance is for people entitled to Social Security cash benefits. Eligibility is automatic and there is no premium. Also, unless one is the spouse or child or an active duty member, CHAMPUS eligibility is lost. Medicare's medical insurance (Part B) covers physicians' services and other expenses not covered by the hospital insurance, but there is a premium. Anyone entitled to Part A is automatically signed up for medical insurance unless the individual notifies Social Security, in writing, that this part of Medicare is not desired. If a person does not sign up for medical insurance when initially eligible, he or she may enroll during the annual open enrollment period; however, there is a premium penalty. If you or a member of your family expect to become entitled to Medicare soon, you need to know how you will be affected and what Medicare benefits will be. Unit earns prestigious award

"This award recognizes this air station's Crash, Fire and Rescue as the best in the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps."

COL MEL SAUTTER, commanding officer, MCAS Kaneohe Bay, made that comment as he presented the Alan G. Ogden Competitive Award to CWO-2 James Currie, officer-in-charge of the Crash, Fire and Rescue branch of Station Operations and Maintenance Squadron. The Ogden award, dedicated to the improvement and advancement of fire prevention and protection, acknowledges crash crews and fire stations in the Department of the Navy based on their training, education, public relations, civic actions and department programs and operations.

Currie, declining personal credit for the award, stated, "This award was given to all of the crash crew personnel. One man cannot win it alone. It was the pride and motivation of all my Marines pulling together in a joint effort that made this award possible."

CURRIE'S UNIT EARNED their nomination after an inspection by the Naval Safety Center in July 1980. The inspection team stated that the Crash, Fire and Rescue unit was the most efficient and best trained they had seen in all of naval aviation.

That notation got the ball rolling. A folio depicting the year's events, exercises and statistics was submitted for evaluation by the competitive committee in Memphis, Tenn. After careful deliberation they selected this crash crew as the most outstanding in category four — large airfields.

The folio listed off-duty events members participated in such as the oil refinery fire of Aug. 15, 1980, where crash crewmen, acting on their own, responded to a disaster call, issued by the Honolulu

firefighters. In another event, three crash crew Marines revived a youngster who fell into a swimming pool. The Marines' quick action and knowledge of first aid saved the young boy's life.

OTHER AREAS highlighted were the "Crew of the Quarter" program, the instruction of other units in safety and fire fighting, letters of appreciation and meritorious masts individuals have received. Photographs of classroom training, maintenance and repair and community relations projects were also noted.

An inscription on the back of the trophy tells of the award's history: "In 1973, at the second annual meeting of the Navy Fire Protection Association, the quartermaster general of the Marine Corps challenged the NAVFPA to establish a program of combined physical and technical competition by Navy and Marine Corps fire fighting organizations."

ALLEN G. OGDEN, on behalf of NAVFPA accepted the challenge and, until his death in 1978, provided the inspiration and leadership to ensure the success of

the program. Ogden described the challenge as an opportunity to improve the fire fighter, fire officer, the fire department, the fire service and ultimately, the Navy and Marine Corps Fire Protection Association.

Selected six times during 1980 as being the "Military Area of the Month," the CFR facility is striving to set examples for the units aboard the air station. According to LCpl Don Stagg, that is why morale in the unit is high. "We are the best crash crew and the award proves it. I'm proud we got it and I'm proud to be a member."

Marines uphold responsibilities

Joint exercise enhances Corps' training

TAEGU, Korea — Tent cities have sprung up throughout Korea to house some of the large numbers of U.S. military personnel participating in Team Spirit '81. While the tent city at Taegu might look like all the others, the mission of the 550 Marines from the Marine aircraft group supporting units here is very distinctive.

"WE'RE HERE to accomplish two main

tasks during the Team Spirit, both of which were given us by the Marine aircraft wing," said Col. Sam Brucher, commanding officer.

"First," he said, "we're here to fly missions with the Air Force in support of the Army's field training exercise."

"However, our main assignment is to uphold our responsibilities as the air combat element of the Marine amphibious

force by flying missions in support of the amphibious exercise," he added.

UPHOLDING these responsibilities has required the Marine aircraft here to fly as many as 30 close air support and interdiction missions a day.

The squadrons flying these missions are flying A-4M Skyhawks, A-6Es and EA-6B aircraft.

In direct support of the tactical squadrons are Marines from a headquarters and maintenance squadron, a Marine wing support group detachment and a combat service support element. "We're totally self-supporting only because of the hard work of these Marines," said Brucher.

Marines began arriving here Feb. 20 and became fully opera-

tional when the tactical aircraft arrived March 8.

Deploying to Korea has benefited the Marines in many ways.

FIRST, THIS exercise has enhanced our capability for rapid deployment to a distant area by giving us a chance to train in preparing and executing plans for an actual deployment," said Brucher. "Secondly, it has

given the Marines the opportunity to train in a cold weather environment which is just the opposite of our previous exercise in the Philippines last fall," he continued.

"Last, but certainly not least, Team Spirit gave us the opportunity to train and coordinate joint/combined exercises with United States and Korean forces," concluded Brucher.

Animal nuisances violate regulations

Because of the increase in numbers of stray dogs aboard MCAS Kaneohe Bay and violations of station regulations concerning leash laws, base residents are reminded to heed the following measures.

ALL DOGS must be on a leash while in the owner's yard when not accompanied by the owner or when outside the owner's yard and in control of a responsible person.

Owners are responsible for the daily removal and sanitary disposal of their pet's droppings from any site on the air station.

Pets are considered to be a nuisance when they become offensive to the senses of others. Owners must keep pets under control at all times. Proper control means that unattended animals should be kept indoors, enclosed in a fenced area (with approval of fence and

permit by Station Housing Office) or attached to a leash.

SOME EXAMPLES of animal nuisances are: generating offensive odors, unprovoked vicious temperament, excessive noise or barking, scattering of trash and garbage, soiling of premises or other persons or public places and damaging shrubbery or flowers.

State laws hold pet owners liable for any and all damages caused by their pets. Depend-

ing on circumstances, civil court action can be initiated against the pet owner.

When violations of regulations occur pet owners will receive a letter of warning from the station commanding officer via the commander of the individual involved. In serious cases where the health or safety of station residents deem it necessary, immediate removal of the animal will be required.

MILITARY police will pick up any

unlicensed stray or lost animal on the station. If an owner no longer wishes to keep a pet, the owner may call the military police to have the animal picked up and delivered to the Hawaii Humane Society.

Observe the following eight rules of kindness to pets:

1. Make sure your pet has fresh clean water at all times.
2. Feed your pet an appropriate diet of healthful, nutritious food.
3. Make sure your pet

4. Neuter your pet so it does not contribute to animal overpopulation.
5. Take your pet to the veterinarian regularly for shots and checkups.
6. Spend some time with your pet each day, playing, exercising and training it.
7. Pet and praise your animal daily.
8. Make your pet's life as interesting and happy as possible. A bored pet can be destructive.

Magistrate court

Air station enforcement includes Federal citations for traffic violations

True or false? All moving traffic violations committed by military and civilian personnel at MCAS Kaneohe Bay come under the jurisdiction of a civilian judge.

If your answer was false, read on, there's a lot you don't know.

If it was true, chances are you've encountered the Federal Magistrate Program.

IN ANY CASE, the

following information can dispel the myth that it's easy to get away with on-base traffic offenses.

Under the Federal Magistrate's Program, offenders who choose to do so can appear before Judge Thomas Young, the U.S. Federal Magistrate for this district.

Generally, when an individual is cited by a military policeman for a moving vehicle

offense, the individual decides whether to go to court or make payment by mail under the Bail Forfeiture Act. Certain offenses such as drunk driving or driving 25 mph over the speed limit require a court appearance.

IN CERTAIN CASES, a court date is not assigned, and the ticket can be paid by mailing the amount of forfeiture to the magistrate's clerk in Honolulu. The indi-

vidual isn't required to make a court appearance but may contest the citation by informing the clerk of a desire to do so. He then receives a court date.

WHEN MILITARY duties prevent an individual from making a court date, a new court date can be scheduled by contacting the court clerk at the Federal Building.

Trials are conducted in the Federal Building,

300 Ala Moana Boulevard in Honolulu. Procedures are simplified and defendants are not required to be represented by an attorney.

Persons cited at the air station attend Magistrate's Court held the second and last Wednesdays of each month.

Every citation issued at the air station is screened by Capt Kip Naugle of the Staff Judge Advocate's Office.

Naugle is a Special Assistant U.S. Attorney and has the same discretionary powers as the U.S. Attorney to dismiss offenses when he believes there is insufficient evidence to prosecute.

IN CASES OTHER than traffic offenses, such as shoplifting and trespassing, the lawyer detailed as Special Assistant U.S. Attorney coordinates with the U.S. Attorney in Honolulu to decide

whether the offense will be prosecuted. These offenses rate a maximum penalty of six months in jail and a \$1,000 fine.

Military criminal jurisdiction is retained over military personnel charged with serious traffic offenses, for instance manslaughter. Military members so charged are subject to trial by courts-martial. Administrative procedures like traffic court, assignment of points for violations, remedial driver school

assignments and revocation of driving privileges remain in effect in addition to the Magistrate's Program. Juveniles (under 18 years of age) who receive magistrate's tickets are automatically referred to the Hawaii State Family Court. A parent or guardian must appear in court with them. The time and date of appearance is provided by letter.

HERE ARE THE options available for Magistrate's Court.

Bail Forfeiture — Mail check or money order for the amount listed on the ticket in the envelope attached to the ticket. No stamp is required.

Voluntary Appearance — Request court date by checking Box 2 on the citation and mail it in the envelope attached to the ticket.

Mandatory Appearance — Appear at time and date indicated on ticket. The place to appear is the Federal Building, 300 Ala Moana Boulevard, Honolulu.



Consumer's Choice

EDITOR'S NOTE: Consumer's Choice is a column designed to bring subjects of interest to consumers' attention. Articles range from grocery shopping to home buying.

WASHINGTON (NES) — The most effective defense against fraudulent business practices is an alert and informed customer. The following guidelines are tips on how to avoid consumer fraud.

Beware of the "give-away." Only a non-profit or charitable organization can afford to give things away. The so-called "free gift" usually has conditions attached.

Be suspicious of "surveys." The person who calls at your home asking questions about your family, your reading habits, or other personal matters is

usually a salesman, trying to peddle his goods.

Don't be rushed. Door-to-door salesmen frequently use the pressure tactic of telling the consumer that he or she must purchase the item the same day as the visit since company policy does not permit the salesperson to return to complete the sale at a later date. Should you buy an item of \$25 or more from such a salesperson, a Federal Trade Commission rule gives you the right to cancel the contract within three days.

Unordered merchandise. Free samples and merchandise mailed by a charitable organization asking for contributions are the two kinds of merchandise that can be sent legally through the mails to a person without his or her

consent. Unless the merchandise is specifically addressed to someone else, you may take the unordered merchandise as a gift. You do not have to pay for it.

Comparison shop. Compare prices of other sources with the same merchandise. Discount sales at established stores frequently feature greater savings than that which a door-to-door salesperson can offer.

Read what you sign. If you decide to buy, check the fine print first. Carefully note the amount you obligate yourself to pay and never sign a blank or incomplete contract.

Get it in writing. Ensure that any promise or representation is put in writing before signing anything. If you are uncertain about any

promise, or about your rights and obligations under any sales agreement, seek legal advice before signing.

The "bait and switch" game. In this illegal scheme, a merchant will advertise a certain product at a bargain price. When the customer arrives at the store, he or she is

deceitfully told that the product is sold out. This is done with the intent to sell the customer a similar product at a higher price.

Speak up! If you feel that you have been the victim of consumer fraud, report it immediately to the Better Business Bureau, the local Consumer Protec-

tion Agency, and to the Armed Forces Disciplinary Control Board.

Seek legal advice. If you have questions about a consumer problem and are unable to resolve them, contact your local legal assistance office. (Courtesy Naval Legal Service Office, Norfolk)



Easter Feast

Marine Corps' cooks concoct hearty meals for hungry Devil dogs

"To many creatures there is but one necessary of life... Food"

—Henry David Thoreau

For most of us, like Thoreau's creatures, holidays are for eating. Food on a holiday is the core around which all activities revolve. The weather may be miserable, the entertainment poor, and the kids noisy or downright obnoxious. But if the food is good, most will consider the holiday a day to remember.

THE Marine Corps recognizes the importance of food and stocks its huge refrigerators with veritable mountains of the stuff. It might stagger the

mind of the average cook to learn just how much food is required to feed Marines on a daily basis, not to mention a holiday. The housewife who breaks out in a cold sweat while planning an Easter dinner for 10 would surely get nervous planning that same dinner for 750 hungry Marines. The sheer numbers associated with feeding that many people is astonishing.

THE SELECTIONS for Easter dinner at Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay is vast by almost everyone's criteria. The traditional Easter ham is the main course and, for those who prefer, fried chicken will also be served. Both will be

ordered in 200-pound portions.

Making the raisin sauce for the ham requires more ingredients than five average housewives have in their larders; 35 tablespoons of cloves, 15 quarts of brown sugar and ten and one half quarts of vinegar complete the recipe.

In addition, 175 pounds of baked potatoes, 80 pounds of candied sweet potatoes, 80 pounds of canned green beans and 120 pounds of sweet corn will subsidize the main course.

BESIDES THE main entrees, three types of salad, fruit cups, fresh fruit, relish trays, desserts, and beverages will be

available for the Easter feast.

Just to prepare the strawberry shortcake slated for dessert will require more than 65 pounds of strawberries and 35 pounds of frozen whipped topping. And for those Marines still able to hoist a spoon or a glass to their lips after completing the meal, 16 gallons of ice cream, 13 gallons of hot coffee and 60 gallons of chilled milk are expected to be consumed.

Even the big eaters will probably have to slow down for a couple

of days after completing it.


ALL OF THE salad, shortcake and bread products and main course items will be prepared in the stainless-steel kitchen, or galley. There are no microwave ovens in the dining facility.

Chefs and bakers will work nearly around the clock to prepare food for the 750 Marines anticipated. Bakers will arrive at work at 6 a.m. and work till 6:30 p.m. making shortcake, rolls and pastries. At 5 a.m. the pastry chef will

begin to create his magic mounds of fluff and calories, and at 6 a.m. the chefs who prepare the dinner will begin their day.

All of this food will be served by 30 servers who work from dark to dark serving the tons of food to the hungry Marines.

IF YOU ARE one of those cooks who doesn't know how to cope with a few dinner guests on Easter, take heart. Those Marines at the dining facility have a slightly bigger challenge.



Cancer statistics reflect grim odds

Since April is National Cancer Control Month now is an opportune time to bring up some important statistics on this deadly disease.

FACTS AND FIGURES can be boring, so let's look at it this way: People enjoy gambling right? Well, for those interested in the odds on getting cancer here's the situation.

Your chances of getting cancer are one in four. If you smoke the odds narrow to two in three.

For every 100 Americans who die, 21 die of cancer.

If you get cancer this year, chances are you'll die in three years.

Of every four people who die of cancer, one might have lived had the disease been diagnosed earlier.

If you are going to die between ages 25 and 44, cancer is more likely to be the cause than heart disease, the number one killer. After that, the averages reverse in favor of cardiovascular disease.

IF YOU THINK THOSE odds are bad, they get even worse when dealing with tobacco users.

Cigarette smokers are 10 times more likely to get lung cancer than nonsmokers. Cigarette smoking causes nine of every 10 lung cancer cases.

Ten years after quitting, the death risk of

an ex-smoker is about the same as that of one who never smoked.

Among American women, more than 20,000 get lung cancer each year. Since 1964, lung cancer has climbed from fifth place to the third leading cause of death for women.

In 1900, 65 of every 100,000 Americans died of cancer. By 1960, that proportion had more than doubled, to 150 in 100,000. The difference is due in large part to the increase in life expectancy. However, the longer you live the more likely it is you will die of cancer.

In an average American city of 50,000 people, 75 will die from cancer this year.

BY NOW YOU HAVE the idea. Cancer in all its terrible forms can strike anyone. The statistics are grim. They are also very real.

So what can you do in the fight against cancer? Well, your own backyard is an excellent starting point. For example, when is the last time you had a checkup?

If you're a woman, when is the last time you had a pap smear test? Do you check your breasts once a month for lumps or other changes?

Perhaps the best daily protection is to heed the seven cancer warning signs.

1. Change in bowel or bladder habits.
2. A sore that does not heal.
3. Unusual bleeding or discharge.
4. Thickening or lumps in breast.

5. Indigestion or difficulty in swallowing.
 6. Obvious change in wart or mole.
 7. Nagging cough or hoarseness.
- When discovered in its early stages cancer can be cured.

AWARENESS OF ITS causes, symptom and controls can be invaluable. One final, happier statistic is when the war against this killer is finally over, it will add two and one-half years to the life expectancy of the average newborn child.

Superstitions

Indian curse appears to follow presidents

Voodoo priests, witch doctors, medicine men, satanists, sorcerers and wizards — do they exist?

Hexes, curses, whammies, spells, evil eyes, black magic — are they effective?

Seven United States presidents would probably say yes if they were alive to do so. William Henry Harrison, who was elected in 1840; Abraham Lincoln, 1860; James Garfield, 1880; William McKinley, 1900; Warren Harding, 1920; Franklin D. Roosevelt, 1940; and John F. Kennedy, 1960, were all presidents elected in a year divisible by 20. Incidentally, they all died while still in office.

Legend has it that an Indian curse was put on Harrison that would also affect any U.S. president elected after him in a year ending with a zero.

Harrison, the first probable victim of the curse, was appointed governor of Indiana Territory by President John Adams in 1801. His job was to protect the

rights of Indians, while secretly taking their lands to expedite white settlements.

In their plight, the Indians combined forces with the British in the War of 1812.

Harrison, then a major general, recaptured Detroit from the British and in October 1813, defeated them and their Indian allies, led by the Shawnee chief Tecumseh and his brother, the Prophet, in the Battle of the Thames, in Canada.

Tecumseh died in that battle and the Prophet who was the Shawnee medicine man put a curse on Harrison.

The curse, sometimes known as "The Indians' Revenge," said that all future U.S. presidents, starting with Harrison, who were elected in a year whose last digit was a zero, would die in office.

The March 30 assassination attempt on President Ronald Reagan's life would have brought the curse full circle and into the present... had John W. Hinckley been successful.

Although Reagan's reign has just begun, his powers may be those needed to neutralize the curse.

Leathernecks ask "why"?

The single most dreaded question staff noncommissioned officers hear from Marines is "why?"

MANY SENIOR MARINES have difficulty comprehending this phenomenon. After all, back in the old days, it was unthinkable to question superiors. The philosophy was, "Mine is not to question why, mine is but to do or die."

Today however, these old-timers are faced with young Marines who "don't" always accept everything they are told. Because of this, many seasoned veterans feel today's Marines don't match up to their forebearers.

The issue could be argued forever but the fact is, anyone waiting for the "good old days" to return is in for a long wait. Americans today have been brought up asking questions, even embarrassing ones that only 20 years ago were considered taboo.

TIMES HAVE CHANGED and to be effective, leadership must reflect this change. Veteran Leathernecks must accept that or suffer a loss of credibility.

Despite what some say, Marines in 1981 are just as eager for leadership and guidance as those in the past. They just tend to be more inquisitive. They refuse to accept everything they're told as gospel. Considering some of the distorted information we're subject to, I can't believe that is a bad practice.

The Marine Corps as a whole has shown it recognizes the changes that have occurred. Nowhere is this new leadership more apparent than in recruit training. Modern day boot camp proves that today's Marines will react to positive guidance.

IT'S UNNECESSARY FOR recruits to suffer the physical and mental abuse of the past to prove themselves. The proof is in the positive statistics available for study in recent years. Look at the drop in the number of recruits who fail to complete boot camp. Look at the plunge unauthorized absence rates have taken.

Another area to consider is education. There's been a 28 percent increase in the number of high school graduates in the Corps since 1976. One of the consequences of enlisting smarter, quality recruits is that Marines are now more inclined to ask questions.

Old beliefs die hard. Thus many old-timers say, "In war, there's no time to explain why every time something has to be done." Of course not.

TODAY'S MARINES AREN'T stupid. Why do they ask questions now? Ever consider it might be because there is no time for questions in combat? When the chips are down, they will respond as Marines always have — to the best of their ability.

It's time to stop paying lip service to the principle of "the only dumb question is the one that remains unasked."

A new, exciting age has dawned on the Corps. It's time we all accept that.



Rick's Review

There were only a few movies that enjoyed critical acclaim within the past year. 1980 was a dry, sparse year in terms of quality film-making.

ONE EXCELLENT film that went relatively unnoticed is *Tribute*, a movie starring Jack Lemmon.

Lemmon was nominated for best actor for his performance, but has received surprisingly little fanfare for his brilliant portrayal of Scotty Templeton. Perhaps this is due to all the attention paid Robert DeNiro for his powerful portrayal of

Jake LaMotta in *Raging Bull*.

In any case, the absence of the usual Oscar hoopla does nothing to dampen the character Lemmon plays. His performance easily ranks with those he has become famous for, including such films as *Some Like It Hot*, *Days of Wine and Roses*, *The Odd Couple*, *Save The Tiger* and *The China Syndrome*.

THE TALE IS familiar, a Hollywood formula of a father and son becoming close due to the father's discovery he's dying from a fatal disease.

Templeton is an irrepressible, irresponsible, fun-loving character faced with the unappealing prospect of an early grave. He is terrified of his impending death as he explains to his ex-wife,

"When someone you know dies, you lose a friend. When you die, you lose all your friends."

NONETHELESS, he wants to leave something of himself to

his son Judd (Robby Benson). The two are paradoxes; the son is as sour and somber as his father is reckless and filled with the joy of life.

Despite what appears to be irreconcilable

differences, they desperately try to find a common level of understanding. The result is a great deal of anger, pain and jealousy. It also explodes in zany, compassion, laughter and love.

Dreaded disease displays puzzling symptoms

According to the American Social Health Association, more than a quarter of a million Americans will experience a bizarre and puzzling disease.

Herpes Simplex Virus Type 2, an unusual venereal disease, is now demanding more attention than it ever has before. April is National Venereal Disease Awareness Month and an important question is: "Just how aware are U.S. citizens of this dreaded disease?"

HERE ARE some of the facts about Herpes Simplex viruses.

Herpes is the common term for two viral infections currently existing at epidemic levels in the United States. Herpes Simplex Virus Type 1 infection is the medical term for the condition characterized by cold sores or fever blisters.

Herpes Simplex Virus Type 2 is the term for the condition known as genital herpes which causes painful sores on, or around, the sex organs.

HSV-1 and HSV-2 are different diseases caused by different

viruses. HSV-1 generally affects the upper portion of the body from the waist up and usually appears on or around the lips. HSV-2 almost always occurs below the waist usually located in, on or around the sex organs.

THE BIZARRE fact of the different viruses is that, in a small percentage of cases, medical scientists have reported finding the two viruses located in opposite areas on the bodies of some patients. Another important difference is that HSV-2 is now regarded by experts as a venereal disease meaning it can be spread from person to person by sexual relations the same way as syphilis and gonorrhea.

As complex as it is, there are also many differences between HSV-2 and other venereal diseases. The differences range from incubation periods, symptoms, long term effects and more. However the single and most important difference is that HSV-2 cannot be cured as can syphilis and gonorrhea.

UNLIKE syphilis and gonorrhea, which are caused by bacteria that can be killed by antibiotics such as penicillin, HSV-2 is caused by a virus. This means it cannot be killed by presently known antibiotics. Once a person is infected with herpes, he or she may have recurrences throughout life.

Approximately two to 20 days after exposure, the first symptoms may be minor rashes or itching in the genital area. The symptoms then commonly develop into one or more painful blister-like, fluid-filled lesions or sores. Reports state that clusters of these lesions are quite common when afflicted.

THESE LESIONS are often accompanied by swollen lymph glands, fever, aching muscles and a general sickly feeling. These sores will eventually dry up and disappear, usually within a week to a month's time. The accompanying symptoms disappear as well. However, this apparent spontaneous cure is

actually not a cure at all. Even though the symptoms have disappeared the disease has not. The virus remains alive inside the body.

It must be stressed that the symptoms just described apply to external sites of HSV-2 infection. A person with an internal case, which usually occurs in women, may notice only some and perhaps none of the typical symptoms. Women with internal HSV-2 infection are noted to have the virus within the cervix area or vagina.

IF THE VIRUS, whether it be internal or external, becomes inactive, there are great chances of a reactivation of those same symptoms.

Medical scientists report that only 30 percent of all active cases of HSV-2 are new infections. The rest are recurrences in individuals who have had the disease before. The duration and frequency of the recurrences vary within the individual and may be triggered by physical or emotional stress.

Herpes can be a dangerous infection with the possibility of secondary infections in addition to the active HSV-2 infection. Because the blisters of HSV-2 are breaks in the skin, there is also the possibility that other germs may enter the exposed area and cause infections that may be more serious than HSV-2.

THE SECOND is in the case of pregnant women having HSV-2. The herpes virus, if transmitted, can be fatal to the fetus or newborn infant.

Thirdly, medical scientists suspect a possible relationship between HSV-2 in women and cervical cancer. While no cause and effect relationship has yet been established, scientists report that women with HSV-2 of the cervix are eight times more likely to develop cervical cancer than women with no history of HSV-2.

If a person suspects the possibility of having herpes viruses the first thing to do is to get medical attention as soon as possible while the symptoms are active.

What may be suspected as herpes may not be that at all, however, only a doctor can make the diagnosis.

As with all venereal diseases, HSV-2 included, sexual habits and

patterns greatly influence the likelihood of exposure and infection. The general rule is, the more frequently a person engages in sexual relations with different sex partners, the greater the risk of

acquiring a venereal disease and passing it on to several others.

HERPES CANNOT as of yet be prevented by vaccines, but research to find one is underway.

Sensei trains body, mind and spirit

Leatherneck leaps into martial arts

"Once on Okinawa back in 1961, I saw this little man beat up four larger men who had been harassing him,"

stated MSgt Rick Raymond, motor transportation chief at Headquarters and Service Company, 1st Radio Battalion.

"The finesse in the moves he made on men at least twice his size really impressed me." This comment made by Raymond reflects his

first encounter with a martial art form.

ENCHANTED by that impression, Raymond decided to dedicate his life to the martial arts.

"From 1961 through 1969, I spent tours of duty on Okinawa and in mainland Japan, Korea and Vietnam," Raymond said. "During my tour in Vietnam, I taught Tae Kwon Do and Karate to American and Korean Marines.

Presently, Raymond holds a sixth degree black belt in both Shorin-Ryu-Shobukan and in Matsumura-Ryu. But this status didn't come easily.

"Every promotion I received, I earned from masters in mainland Japan and on Okinawa," Raymond said. "The old masters were very sincere about the arts. A student wasn't promoted until he completely fulfilled the requirements and the teacher was satisfied with his performance."

RAYMOND'S achievements are numerous. On a previous tour here he coached the Hawaii Marine Karate team (full contact). His team did well in many interservice tournaments on the island.

In April 1977, Raymond was a member of the All-Hawaii State Black Belt Team that fought against Japan's Mak Oyama's team during a bare fist, full contact to the knock-out competition. According to Raymond,

Devildog strives for professional soccer career

When Sgt John Lichtfuss isn't performing his duties as a personnel clerk at Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 463 he can often be found doing one of three things: bowling, playing soccer or running.

THE SIX-FOOT two-inch sergeant boasts a 174 bowling average, but it hasn't always been that high. "I became interested in bowling about a year and a half ago. Then, I only had about a 129 average," said Lichtfuss.

THE APPLETON, Wis. native's soccer background began in high school. "Soccer was becoming a popular sport and I guess I just caught the fever," he commented. And catch the fever he did, along with his three brothers, two of whom play semi-pro soccer, and one who is rapidly advancing in the game.

Lichtfuss says he hopes one day to play professional or semi-professional soccer.

When Lichtfuss was 16-years-old he applied for the State Olympic Soccer team. "I filled out the form and sent it in. To make a long story short I ended up trying out and making the team."

AT THE STATE Olympics, Lichtfuss placed second in soccer juggling, fourth in soccer dribbling and numbered in the top eight for shooting the soccer ball.

With statistics like these, one might wonder why he gave up soccer to join the Marine Corps. As he explains, "I was attending my first year of college and I was tired of school. I wanted to do something worthwhile. A friend, who was a Marine, told me about the Corps and I joined." He says he doesn't regret his decision.

"I haven't completely stayed away from the game," explained Lichtfuss. "Last year I took leave and returned to Wisconsin to play in a men's indoor league with my three brothers."

SINCE SOCCER requires plenty of stamina, Lichtfuss stays in shape by running five miles each day. He also keeps up on what's happening in

the world of soccer by reading soccer magazines and playing on the Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron soccer team.

When the blond-haired 20-year-old prepares to leave the Corps in 1984, he says there will be two soccer

options he'll consider.

"I really don't know if I want to return to college and work toward playing on a professional soccer team or whether I'll get a job and try to play semi-pro with my brothers."

"I **WOULD** stay in the Corps, if soccer didn't mean so much to me. The service isn't as bad as everyone thinks it is. It's just the attitude people take about their jobs. But what I really want is to play soccer," he concluded.



Detachment rejoins parent organization

While family and friends gathered at Pearl Harbor's K-Pier April 7 to welcome Marine Amphibious Unit-37 back to Hawaii, a small party of families and friends waited at Pier M-3 to greet 70 other Marines.

THE 1ST RADIO Battalion, Detachment-R, Fleet Marine Force Pacific was due to return from the Republic of South Korea on the USS Ogden.

According to LtCol Michael Keane, commanding officer of 1st Radio Battalion, "Det-R began their deployment in October. The purpose was to allow the members of the detachment to live and train in the field with their equipment for an extended period of time. This better familiarized them with their skills and equipment in providing support to forces of the III Marine Amphibious Force."

Capt Richard Ingold, officer-in-charge of Det-R kept the men constantly on the move during the deployment training. The Marines went to Okinawa and the Philippines.

ALSO DURING this period of training, portions of the detachment joined with the 9th Marine Amphibious Brigade to provide electronic warfare support during Exercise Valiant Blitz. Afterwards they returned to Okinawa to reform.

On Okinawa, the detachment conducted preventive maintenance on their equipment in preparation for airlift to Korea.

By early December Detachment-R had been airlifted to Osan Air Base in South Korea. From there they conveyed to Warrior Base, located in close proximity to the demilitarized zone of South Korea, and conducted forward area training. While there, the Marines received assistance from Marine Support Battalion and elements of the Army's 2nd Infantry Division.

CONCLUDING their mission in late February, Det-R moved to Pohang, Korea, to provide more electronic warfare support to the III Marine Amphibious Force, during Exercise Team Spirit '81.

The detachment enjoyed very little liberty while conducting their missions at the various training sites. According to Keane, "When the men were not training in the field, they stood watches. The most liberty they saw on this operation occurred while they were located at Warrior Base and in Korea."

The lack of liberty didn't seem to affect the Marines' performance.

NOW THAT the 70 members of Det-R have rejoined, 1st Radio Battalion at Kaneohe Bay, they will return to the basics of their readiness requirements, until called upon again.


