Pass in Review

Field grade officers

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Last month, in a move to improve the availability of field grade officers in the Fleet Marine Force, the Commandant of the Marine Corps directed a five percent reduction in staffing of fieldgrade billets at HQMC, and other non-FMF commands.

As a result, an additional 29 majors and lieutenant colonels slated for reassignment this summer will be assigned to FMF commands. The temporary reduction in staffing at HQMC and other non-FMF commands, will not affect structured table of organization requirements.

According to manpower officials here, the additional staffing in the FMF directed by the commandant, was requested by the FMF commanding generals. A recent report from the commanding general, Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic, emphasized the requirement to more effectively support the manning of Marine Amphibious Units, Marine Amphibious Brigades, the Fleet Assistance Program and non-T/O billets.

Some of these field grade officers could be assigned to permanent billets in Marine Amphibious units and MABs at the discretion of the FMF commanding generals, according to officials here.

Billets considered for permanent staffing in Marine Amphibious Units are: commanding officer, executive officer, S-1, S-2, S-3, S-4, embarkation officer and communications officer.

The permanent staffing of these key billets will enhance the stability of the Marine Amphibious Unit staffs.

Warrant officers

A board to select and recommend active duty Marines for appointment to permanent warrant officer in the Marine Corps or Marine Corps Reserve convened May 5.

The board is authorized to select 250 active duty Marines from 2,576 applications received.

Board members are: Col James Sweeney, Majors Clarence Bryant, Paul Durpanca, Mack McGlumphy, David Jones, A.K. Law, Ronald Marsteller, Chester Pinto, Robert Sickler Jr., Dennis Snook, Rex Taylor and Captains J.T. Adams, Paul Ehlers, Mary Lowery and J.S. Swift.

The board is expected to be in session approximately eight weeks.

July sergeant promotions

The following are requirements set by Headquarters Marine Corps for the July 1981 sergeant promotions.

To be eligible, a Marine's date of rank must be July 17, 1980 or earlier. The Armed Forces active duty base date must be June 30, 1979 or earlier, making time-in-service to sergeant 24 months.

The cutoff date for computing time-in-grade and time-in-service is June 30, 1981. The cutoff for proficiency and conduct marks was April 30. Composite scores must be reported on unit diaries in sufficient time to be entered and posted no later than June 1, 1981.

Secretary of the Navy

Secretary of the Navy John Lehman in congressional testimony recently reemphasized his basic philosophy; that national security demands maritime superiority and nothing less. He called for a sustained national commitment and a dedicated effort to restore sea power.

The secretary assured the committee that the Navy would "... never stop its efforts to improve the quality of life and career satisfaction of Navy and Marine men and women." He said that the increased pay and compensation legislation passed during the last year was not enough to restore competitiveness with industry nor seven years of accumulated lost buying power.

Urging a pay raise for servicemembers, Secretary Lehman said, "Despite the beneficial selective reenlistment and specialty bonuses, it is hard to see how our youth will be attracted to military careers, particularly in the sea services, when neither the personal sacrifices and demand nor the assured pay are comparable to those of civilian employment."

Marines prove readiness

KAHUKU TRAINING AREA, Hawaii — They were at it again ... doing what they do best. Leathernecks of 2d Battalion, 3d Marines conducted the final stages of their combat readiness evaluation exercises here May 11 through 14.

Company A, 3d Reconnaissance

Battalion, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines, Company A, 3d Combat Engineer Battalion, Brigade Service Support Group, and Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-262 provided ground, and air support for the infantry battalion.

As Marine judges and referees

observed, Devil Dogs from Companies E, F, G, and Weapons Company displayed their know-how in combat tactics. A good scoring in the area of tactical and technical proficiency would ensure a combat ready status.

The infantry battalion utilized every support element available to them.

With the assistance of reconnaissance Marines, the ground troops located and plotted possible enemy positions.

Battery B, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines provided an occasional thrust of artillery support for the infantry Marines vying to overtake an enemy position.

On the attack, the Marines' advancement was an intricate portion in grading their combat readiness. Concentrated grading was focused on the actual advance, fire power displacement and conduct during the attack.

Combat engineers provided the battalion with their expertise in combat construction apparatuses, such as designing perimeter security devices.

A simulated hostage rescue exercise was also scheduled to be conducted with air extraction support, provided by Marine

Medium Helicopter Squadron-262.

The combat activity wasn't restricted to the rifle companies. The battalion command post was also involved in attack and defense tactics.

As Lieutenant Colonel William Rakow, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines' commanding officer, briefed his staff, a small group of aggressors staged an attack on the command section.

The perimeter security forces immediately responded by thwarting any intentions the enemy may have had to overtake the position. Additionally, an interior security force was established in the event the enemy broke through the security barrier.

Subsequently, an enemy soldier was captured and delivered to the battalion's intelligence section for interrogation.

During the grueling and challenging week of testing, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines had to painstakingly prove they are combat ready.

But as a lone lance corporal perched in his hideaway vantage point suggested, "I'm not worried about the overall outcome of the evaluation. Second Battalion, 3d Marines always has been and always will be "combat ready."

Command changes hands

Colonel Warren Ferdinand, Commanding Officer, Marine Aircraft Group-24, will relinquish his command to Lieutenant Colonel Richard Ward, group executive officer, during a ceremony between Hangars 101 and 102 at 10:30 a.m. tomorrow.

COL FERDINAND will be reassigned as the Flight Marine Officer, Commander in Chief, Pacific Fleet.

LtCol Ward was born in Newark, and graduated from Seton Hall University in South Orange, N.J. He has a Master of Arts Degree in Human Resources Management from Pepperdine University.

After attending the Naval Air Training Command and being designated a naval aviator on Oct. 12, 1961, he was assigned to the 3d Marine Aircraft Wing, Marine Corps Air Station, El Toro. While at El Toro, the lieutenant colonel served with Marine Aircraft Repair Squadron-37, Marine Training Squadron-2 and Marine Attack Squadron-121.

In April 1962, he was assigned to VMA-223 and deployed with that squadron to the 1st MAW, Iwakuni, Japan until April 1964.

From May 1964 until February 1967, LtCol Ward served as flight instructor and legal officer of Naval Training Squadron-7, Naval Air Station Meridian, Miss. Then he joined VMA-324, MAG-31, 2d MAW, MCAS Beaufort, S.C.,


where he served as intelligence officer and weapons officer until November 1967.

FOLLOWING THIS assignment, LtCol Ward joined MAG-12, 1st MAW, Chu Lai, Republic of Vietnam where he was the weapons officer, VMA-121, officer in charge, of Dong Ha Air Base and assistant aircraft maintenance officer of VMA-121 and VMA-223.

Upon his return to the United States, in January 1969, LtCol Ward was assigned to MAG-31, 2d MAW, MCAS Beaufort. He was tasked with several positions while at Beaufort, including group weapons officer; operations officer, Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-451 and aviation safety officer, MAG-31.

From September 1973 until September, 1974, the lieutenant colonel was assigned as group administrative officer MAG-15, Iwakuni. He served as management engineer and then Commanding Officer, Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, MCAS Iwakuni through July, 1977.

LTCOL WARD attended the Command and Staff College, Quantico, Va. and upon graduation in June 1978 was transferred to MAG-24, as group S-4 officer. He served as Commanding Officer, H&MS-24 from June 1979 until May 1981, when he was assigned to his present position,

UNFORTUNATELY, the good news doesn't always get the airplay it deserves.



BUT OVERALL I believe things are constantly getting better. The reason is simple. People in both communities care.





Helicopter never hovers

Pilots attached to Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 463 are required to fly a minimum of 100 hours per year.

One way this requirement may be completed is by using the UH-1H Flight Simulator at Wheeler Air Force Base.

THE SIMULATOR differs from the helicopters '463 pilots fly in a number of ways. "The simulator is a single engine UH-1H," explained 1st Lt J. Scott Miller, HMH-463 flight officer. "The squadron pilots fly UH-1Ns, which are double engine helicopters, or CH-53 aircraft."

Even with the differences in the aircraft at Wheeler, 1st Lt Miller said that there are advantages to using the

simulator, which simulates all axes of flight and motion.

The simulator accommodates three people: the pilot, co-pilot and an instructor. Once in the simulator the crew goes through the actual motions of helicopter operations. There's even a pilot-to-controller radio system.

Two controllers sit at a console to monitor the four simulators and also watch the simulated flight path of each UH-1H aircraft on a screen while instructing each crew.

AFTER THE helicopter is started and the crew is ready to get underway, they receive clearance from the controller and suddenly, supported by several hydraulic lifts, the simulators rise about 12

feet off the ground.

The pilot and co-pilot can simulate flights to and from any military air field in Hawaii, operating the simulator through the same flight path and timespan as if they were flying.

There are a few small differences, though. Instead of viewing ocean and landscapes, it appears as if they are continuously surrounded by clouds.

Since they can't physically crash the simulator they can add or delete turbulence and engine failures, or select malfunctions without risking life or limb.

According to 1st Lt Miller, the simulator is a good refresher for practice flights in instrument conditions but it still differs from flying an actual helicopter.

"In the simulator we are also capable of

freezing the motion," commented 1st Lt Miller. "That way if there is something we don't understand, we can stop and talk about it."

THE SQUADRON pilots can complete as many as 50 of their yearly flight hours in the simulator.

Landslide: Leathernecks tackle heavy job, resume canal's normal waterflow

The damage caused by the heavy rains that fell on the Windward side of Oahu April 14 are still present to this day. One example is the

tree-blocked canal that flows through Bellows Air Force Station.

A MINIATURE

landslide was created by the heavy rains causing sand, dirt and trees to slip into the canal. The debris

resulted in a major backup of the canal's normal flow and considerable flooding around the station.

"Because of our heavy equipment capabilities, engineers were asked to help assist the Air Force in removing the trees and other debris from the canal," stated Sergeant Alfred Ojeda, Heavy Equipment Platoon, 3d Combat Engineers, Brigade Service Support Group, and project supervisor.

The work crew tackled the project May 15 with emphasis placed on getting the water flowing again. "The canal had been blocked in several areas but we removed a large portion of the debris to help ease the overflow," commented Sgt Ojeda.

Another canal was constructed by the engineers to relieve any future strains placed on the already existing canal by climatic mishaps.

ACCORDING TO Sgt Ojeda, the project scheduled to end next week serves a dual purpose for the seven Marines tasked with clearing the canal. "This operation is good training for everyone. It gives the men a chance to get out and work with the heavy equipment machines and practice what they'd have to do in combat."

And work with the machines they did. The sound of the "heavy metal" equipment ripped through the tranquil setting at Bellows as fallen trees were dragged from the canal.

"We're using three pieces of equipment to accomplish the mission," Sgt Ojeda said.

"We're using an 1150 Scooploader which has a wench attached to it. The wench is used to pull the trees from the canal.

"An 8230 bulldozer is

being used to excavate the new canal, and a 30-ton crane takes care of removing debris and obstacles in the uneven portions of the canal. This will allow an easier flow of water from the ocean to the stream and vice versa," Sgt Ojeda concluded.

THE ASSISTANCE rendered by the engineer Marines is a helping hand appreciated by more than the Air Force alone. Local community farmers also welcomed the assistance of the Leathernecks.

"Because the trees and debris had blocked the canal's water flow it caused extensive flooding which affected the farmers," commented 1st Lt Antonia Silva, platoon commander, Heavy Equipment Platoon, Company A, 3d Combat Engineers, Brigade Service Support Group. "Some of them even lost their crops."

\$9 million Leatherneck pioneers automation program

CAMP H.M. SMITH, Hawaii — Marine GySgt Ronald Bridges spent \$9 million in less than a year at Headquarters Marine Corps in Washington, D.C. — and he got a medal for it.

BRIDGES was presented the Navy Commendation Medal for being instrumental in pioneering the Marine Corps' multi-million dollar program

in automation and miniaturization of 350,000 active duty and reserve Marines' official records.

The 30-year-old Mount Savage, Md., native was responsible for evaluating and introducing equipment for the new automated records management system. "Once we got the computer modules and other automated equipment, we had to

work 16-hour days for nine months," said Bridges. The project, which started in 1976, was recently completed when all Marines' official jackets were transferred to microfiche.

"The process of putting a document on microfiche is fairly simple," explained Bridges. "It's like taking someone's picture with an instantaneous camera, only the opposite is done with microfilm. The image is

reduced on the negative instead of enlarged on photographic paper."

information recorded on a palm-size piece of film. "Even now, a Marine with more than 30 years service has a 4 by 5-inch size microfiche on file," according to Bridges.

The arduous chore of storing correspondence on each Marine's folder is a thing of the past. "It's all computerized now," said Bridges.

A microfiche copy of a Marine's official jacket or the original jacket itself can be mail ordered through the

Commandant of the Marine Corps, Code MSRB-10, Washington, D.C. 20380, according to Bridges, who now works at the Classified Material Control Center, Headquarters, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific.

"THINGS ARE looking up," said the 12-year Marine veteran. "After my tour here, I'd like to see what new developments I can get involved in for the Corps," he concluded.

SCHEDULE XXII OF SECTION 15-14.5(1) ESTABLISHING PROHIBITED PARKING CERTAIN AREAS; SCHEDULE XXV OF SECTION 15-16.3(4) ESTABLISHING OFFICIAL BUS STOPS; SCHEDULE XXVI OF SECTION 15-16.1 ESTABLISHING TIME LIMIT PARKING; SCHEDULE XXVIII OF SECTION 15-17.2(3) RESTRICTING PEDESTRIANS CROSSING ROADWAYS; AND SCHEDULE XXXVIII OF SECTION 15-24.17 ESTABLISHING MISCELLANEOUS TRAFFIC CONTROLS.

SECTION 1, Chapter 15 (1978 Traffic Code), City and County of Honolulu, as amended, is hereby further amended in the following particulars:

 - "Malaii Street, Traffic on Malaii Street shall stop before entering Lawehana Street."
 - "Ventura Street, Traffic on Ventura Street shall stop before entering Senoma Street."

 - "Hilwa Drive, kohohead side, beginning from the haleiwa property line of 250 Hilwa Drive and extending in the southerly direction for a distance of 100'."
 - "Judd Street, makai side, for a distance of 65' in the kohohead direction from the kohohead curbline prolongation of Nuuanu Avenue."
 - "Kaonohi Street, whaiwa side, beginning from the mauka property line of 98-288 Kaonohi Street and extending in the makai direction for a distance of 200'."
 - "King Street, makai side, for a distance 115' ewa of the ewa prolongation of Ward Avenue."
 - "King Street, mauka side, between Kahoaloa Lane and University Avenue, between the hrs. 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Monday thru Friday, except Saturday, Sunday, and holidays."
 - "Maunulua Avenue, odd numbered side, from Summer Street to its end."
 - "Penaacola Street, ewa side, between Kapiolani Blvd. and Hopakea Street."
 - "Poola Street, mauka-ewa side, for a distance of 280' from the mauka property line of 5280 Poola Street to the ewa property line of 5284 Poola Street."
 - "Star Road, kohohead side, for a distance 25' mauka from a point 35' mauka of the makai property line of 2215 Star Road."
 - "Ulukala Street, makai side, between Kailua Road and Ululani Street."
 - "Ward Avenue, ewa side, for a distance 85' makai of the makai curbline prolongation of King Street."
 - By amending Schedule XXIII of Sec. 15-16.1 establishing time limit parking, by deleting therefrom the following:
 - "King Street, makai side, between Waialakamilo Road and Kailhi Street."
