Pass in Review

Apprenticeship program

WASHINGTON, D.C. — "The Marine Corps apprenticeship program was developed to stimulate retention and professional development in Marines... while offering them an appealing means of military occupational specialty proficiency, with a clearly defined personal goal."

Those remarks, as outlined by the training division here, resulted from the signing of a National Standards agreement between the Department of Labor and the Marine Corps in July 1977.

At that time, military schools were designated program sponsors for developing the apprenticeship program within their areas of responsibility. Presently, the program is open to Marines of all ranks in the eligible MOCs listed below. Completion of an apprenticeship training program qualifies these Marines for "journeyman" status.

Upon completing the requirements of a six to eight thousand hour program (depending on the particular skill involved), the Department of Labor will grant a certificate of completion to the Marine, thereby allowing for journeyman's status.

Detailed information on the program, including eligibility criteria and application procedures, is contained in MCO 1590.22.

Logistics course

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The Commandant of the Marine Corps recently approved a new Advanced Logistics course and also directed the implementation of a new course in professional education for logistics.

The new course will be the Logistics Officer (LCO) in Amphibious Operations (LCO-400) in the new listing taught at the Landing Force Training Command, Alameda, in Norfolk, Va.

The course is designed to provide a solid background in logistics and related topics, primarily at the battalion and company levels.

This early-level training is intended to address the needs of the Landing Force Training Command, Alameda, in Norfolk, Va.

Assistant Commandant named

Gen Kenneth McLennan, Assistant Commandant, retired during ceremonies at Marine Barracks, 8th and I, Washington, D.C. June 29.

THE POSITION OF Assistant Commandant/Chief of Staff was assumed by Gen Paul Kelley July 1. Gen Kelley was promoted to his present rank June 30, by the Secretary of the Navy John F. Lehman Jr. in the secretary's office at the Pentagon.

Gen McLennan was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal during the ceremony and will reside in Kailua, Hawaii.

Prior to his selection as Assistant Commandant, Gen Kelley was the Commander, Rapid Deployment Joint Task Force at MacDill Air Force Base, Fla.

Gen Kelley was born Nov. 11, 1928, in Boston. He graduated from Villanova University, in Pennsylvania with a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics. He was commissioned a second lieutenant in June 1950.

IN MARCH 1951 HE served consecutively as a platoon leader, assistant battalion operations officer and assistant division training officer with the 2d Marine Division, Camp Lejeune, N.C.

From August 1955 to June 1956 Gen Kelley served as the aide-de-

camp to the deputy commanding general, and then as assistant force training officer, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, in Hawaii.

Following his assignment as the special assistant to the director of personnel, at Headquarters Marine Corps, Washington, D.C., he completed the Airborne Pathfinder School at Fort Benning, Ga.

IN FEBRUARY 1958, he was assigned to the newly activated 2d Force Reconnaissance Company, Force Troops, Fleet Marine Force, Atlantic, Camp Lejeune, where he served as the executive officer and then commanding officer.

From September 1960 to May 1961, Gen Kelley was the U.S. Marine Corps exchange officer with the British Royal Marines. During this tour he attended the Commando Course in England, served as assistant operations officer with 45 Commando in Aden, and Commander "C" Troop, 42 Commando in Singapore, Malaya and Borneo. March 1, 1961, he was promoted to major.

IN August 1965, Gen Kelley was transferred to Vietnam and reported to the 3d Marine Amphibious Force, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, as the combat intelligence officer. He was promoted to lieutenant colonel Jan. 20, 1966.

FROM VIETNAM, he went to the U.S. Army Infantry School at Fort Benning where he served from August 1966 to July 1968, as the senior Marine Corps representative of the Commandant of the Marine Corps. He then attended the Air War College, Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala., graduating as a "Distinguished Graduate" in May 1969.

He returned to Headquarters Marine Corps in June 1969, as the military assistant to the assistant commandant. He was promoted to colonel April 1, 1970, and in June 1970 was reassigned to Vietnam where he commanded the 1st Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division. Gen Kelley redeployed the regiment, the last Marine ground combat unit to leave Vietnam, to Camp Pendleton, Calif.

GEN KELLEY WAS promoted to brigadier general Aug. 6, 1971. In May 1978, he was ordered to Headquarters Marine Corps, where he assumed the duties of Deputy Chief of Staff for Requirements and Program.

Following his promotion to lieutenant general Feb. 7, 1980, he was assigned as the Commander, Rapid Deployment Joint Task Force.


Gen Kelley's personal decorations and awards include: the

Silver Star Medal, Legion of Merit with Combat "V" and two gold stars in lieu of second and third awards, the Bronze Star Medal with Combat "V" and a gold star in lieu of a second award, the Joint Services Commendation Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal, and the Army Commendation Medal. He is a Marine Corps parachutist and U.S. Army master parachutist.

GEN KELLEY AND his wife, the former Barbara Joan Adams of Fall River, Mass., have one daughter, Mrs. John Cimko.

Unit's history marches on

Radio Battalion celebrates birthday

Although 1st Radio Battalion was commissioned July 14, 1964, its history can be traced back to World War II.

On Jan. 2, 1943, Headquarters Company, Corps Signals Battalion was established to provide a Radio Intelligence Platoon. With the conclusion of the war radio units were no longer needed and existing ones were deactivated.

On Sept. 15, 1958, the 1st Radio Company, Fleet Marine Force, was activated at Camp H.M. Smith. A year later the unit was redesignated as the 1st Composite Radio Company, FMF, and conducted training operations throughout the Pacific in support of the 1st and 3d Marine Divisions. Due to space limitations at Camp Smith, the company eventually relocated aboard the air station.

The increase of military involvement in Vietnam caused the activation of Subunit No. 1 at Pleiku, Republic of Vietnam. Subunit No. 1 was redesignated Detachment A in May, 1963, and a little more than a year after its organization was relocated to Phu Bai.

The term "composite" in the unit's designation was deleted Sept. 17, 1963. The next year the company expanded to battalion-size and assumed its present designation, 1st Radio Battalion, FMF.

After the establishment of an additional Detachment Designated J in March of 1965, this detachment was redesignated as Subunit NO. 1, 1st Radio Battalion at Dan Nang Air Base, Republic of

Vietnam in January 1968. With the continuous flow of personnel and material to support the conflict, the battalion flag was shifted from Hawaii to Vietnam. Subunit No. 1 was deactivated and 1st Radio Battalion minus the FMF, assumed its combat role. The rear echelon in Hawaii was designated as Subunit No. 2, 1st Radio Battalion, FMF.

Ombudsman assists families

A Marine's family is important to him. His morale and job performance are closely related to the health and well-being of his family.

While stationed at MCAS Kaneohe Bay, brigade Marines can be assured of their families' health and welfare. But when units deploy, Marines must rely on other persons or agencies to help their families in case of emergencies or major problems.

ONE WAY OF ensuring that assistance was available to families of deployed Marines is the establishment of the Family Ombudsman Program.

Ombudsman, by definition, is one who cuts governmental red tape and acts as liaison between the interested party and the official when normal procedures for problem resolution are unsatisfactory.

The Family Ombudsman Program began at MCAS Kaneohe Bay in February 1980. LtCol William Campbell, commanding

officer of Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-262 and his wife Linda initiated the program. It was felt that an official representative with a direct voice to the command was needed to provide informational services to dependent wives, according to LtCol Campbell.

As an official representative of company and squadron families, the ombudsman helps maintain good communication between the command, spouses and personnel assigned to the command.

Mrs. Teddie Williams, wife of GySgt George Williams, is the ombudsman for HMM-262. She has served in the job for almost a year and will carry on the program for the next deployment.

BESIDES doing the normal duties listed in the assignment order, sometimes special attention and concern is required when death or serious sickness occurs in a Marine's immediate family.

"A death in the family of one of the deployed Marines required detailed planning in working with

the family and the command," Mrs. Williams said. "When the Marine arrived from overseas, all he had to do was get on the plane with his wife and fly home."

Although some companies initiate the program only when deployed, HMM-262 carries on the Ombudsman Program year round.

PRIOR TO the actual deployment, all Marine and Navy dependents are invited to attend a pre-deployment brief of each squadron or company. Wives are introduced to the ombudsman and given an information packet concerning services and activities available on base.

Periodically, wives get together and discuss various topics in ombudsman workshops. They are held to present information to the wives (a questionnaire queries the wives for topics), and wives can share experiences and feelings in an atmosphere of support.

Dependent wives who encounter problems during the deployment can contact the Ombudsman.



Trust builds confidence

Trust... what would life be without it? Not very enjoyable, I suspect. We'd constantly be looking behind us, expecting to be stabbed in the back.

The old saying goes, "A person is innocent until proven guilty." The same should apply to trusting people — at least until they've given reasons not to be trusted.

UNFORTUNATELY, that's not always the case. I've often seen people checking up on someone simply because they felt he was the type to "try and pull one off." I admit there are people in the Corps

who will take advantage of every situation, but does that mean no one is to be trusted?

Perhaps the most important part of managing people is trusting them. I realize that Marines in supervisory positions are responsible for overseeing their people, but not to the point of stifling their initiative.

When a Marine is tasked with being at a certain place at an appointed time, it's his responsibility to be there.

If he doesn't make it, then he and he alone should suffer the consequences.

ACCORDING TO some leathernecks, that's not the way it goes in some shops. Because one guy can't be trusted, (or the noncommissioned officer in charge feels he

can't) the rest of the office must suffer also. That includes the NCOIC. It has a snowball effect.

The NCOIC checks their every move, sometimes calling ahead to ensure they make it to their destinations.

He finds it hard to assign jobs to someone he feels he can't depend on, causing him to give other Marines additional work. The people receiving more work get bogged down, fall behind on their own work and have to put in extra hours.

Not only can this cause inter-office resentment, instill feelings that make it hard for co-workers to work with instead of against each other, and rip morale to shreds, but it can also ruin reputations.

FOR INSTANCE, in my job, credibility is first and foremost. If I was sent on a job and informed by another office that my boss had called to make sure I had arrived on time, I would leave there hurt and embarrassed.

If I had a running record of being untrustworthy or undependable, there would be no reason for me to be upset. And I believe most people feel the same way.

The point I'm trying to make is: trust your people until they give you a reason not to. Ralph Waldo Emerson said it best when he stated, "Trust men and they will be true to you; treat them greatly and they will show themselves great."

Amateur artists, military or civilian can have their original cartoons published in the Hawaii Marine.

In an effort to obtain high-quality cartoons for use in the Hawaii Marine the editor is asking military and civilian artists, including dependents, to send their original works for publishing consideration.

Cartoons submitted for consideration must be:

- drawn in black ink (fiber pen is acceptable), with lead pencil lines erased;
- drawn on white paper approximately 8 x 10 inches (heavy typing paper acceptable) with caption either attached securely or lightly printed below the drawing;
- in good taste — no ethnic slurs, obscenities or overt sexism.

Here are some questions and answers concerning additional information about cartoon content, as well as the address where the cartoon should be sent:

Q — What is the Hawaii Marine looking for in a military cartoon?

A — A good solid gag that has eye appeal and makes people smile. In other words, situations and humor that are recognizable and amusing.

Q — Only enlisted people are to be the butt of the jokes, right?

A — Wrong. The military is big enough to

laugh at itself; however, direct attacks on rank for the sake of a laugh is not the aim. Hawaii Marine doesn't want any Marine humiliated at the expense of a joke, regardless of rank.

Q — So stereotypes are out, eh?

A — Exactly. Just as that desert island gags and puns are not acceptable in professional cartoon markets, Hawaii Marine has high standards of quality.

Q — For example?

A — Dining halls don't serve swill; all sergeants are not fat; enlisted people are not work-shirking and lazy.

Q — You mentioned eye appeal in the cartoon. What do you mean?

A — simple, outline drawings. No fancy crosshatches and comic book shading. Remember these drawings, have to be reduced to appear in the paper.

Q — Is good drawing a must?

A — No, but a good gag is! A funny idea can carry bad art, but rarely can great art make someone laugh at what is not amusing. On the other hand, no stick figures either.

Q — Where should the cartoons be sent?

A — Mail or bring your cartoon submission to: Joint Public Affairs Office, Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii 96863.

BUT BACK IN GARRISON the script differs somewhat. Those same corpsmen and doctors who are so highly sought in combat are the subject of many ill-intended comments.

But whoa! What is this? An upcoming physical fitness test brings many a seeker to Doc's door. Of course he'll be able to find the best of "good ol' friends" in that line.

The day after the PFT, though, it's back to normal.

What causes people to treat medical personnel this way? When they're needed, they are the best. But when they're not, they are half-trained, incompetent, maiming butchers.

Perhaps it's the fact that the medical help is always there when we do need it. Beyond that, it's free. It's a cinch to find fault with something free and readily available.

BUT THOSE OF US WHO have really needed medical assistance at one time or another can attest to the fine quality of help offered. Sure, there are problems and a few mistakes. That's true of anywhere the

fullible human is involved. As one Navy doctor so aptly put it, the practice of medicine is just that, practice.

A common complaint is that a visit to sick call takes the entire morning. If you think that's bad, try going to a civilian doctor. You're lucky to even get a preliminary appointment within two weeks. Then more than likely you'll be told to make another one to pick up any lab results or X-rays.

STOP TO THINK ABOUT the other side of the fence. Corpsmen, physicians' assistants and military doctors carry a tremendous case load. On a given day they see everything from stubbed toes to

multiple fractures, from simple headaches to near nervous breakdowns. They are expected to know miracle remedies and instantly cure even the most baffling of symptoms. And, usually, all without even a token word of gratitude, let alone a genuine thank-you.

But I, for one, am on their side. I've seen them work, both on myself and others. They are efficient and dependable. No matter how they feel, they have a smile for the patients and patience for the unsmiling.

SO DON'T TRY TO tell me the horror stories and how death-defying a trip to the dispensary can be. I know better.





After completing the pre-flight check LtGen O'Donnell boarded his

craft. The engines roared and gravity was defied as the Silver Hawk took to the skies, reminiscent of many actual combat missions.

Upon reaching Kahoolawe the target was spotted: rocks, painted white and constructed to simulate an enemy landing field.

Within minutes the objective was destroyed and with the mission accomplished, the Silver Hawk headed home.

UPON LANDING, LtGen O'Donnell was met by BrigGen Bain McClintock, Commanding General, 1st Marine Brigade. During a

small ceremony in his honor in 232's Ready Room, LtGen O'Donnell commented, "This (flight) was just as good as my first one... 39 years ago."

LtGen O'Donnell retired June 30 after noon, relinquishing his command to LtGen John Davis.



Joint medical exercise tests corpsmen's skills

It was a bright beautiful morning and a gentle sea breeze rolled across the field offering cool relief to the surgeons, nurses and corpsmen who stood idle. The atmosphere was melancholy until someone heard steps approaching and yelled, "Casualties!"

AS IF LIGHTNING had struck, everyone in the camp ran to their stations and prepared for the arrival of the wounded. Jeeps and gamagoats with red crosses tattooed on their sides came to a halt in front of the first tent and corpsmen frantically unloaded litter after litter of troops who had been wounded in battle at the front lines.

That was the start of the three-day exercise. Members of Company A, 3d Medical Battalion, Brigade Service Support Group, 1st Marine Brigade and the Reserve Surgical Team-122 participated June 29 through July 1 to acquaint themselves with medical procedures in a field environment.

Their mobile camp is designed to act as the liaison between the battalion aid station and a rear field hospital.

THE FIRST stop for the injured is the assessment and sorting tent. There, patients are stripped of clothing surrounding wounds. Their weapons are taken to the armory tent.

Corpsmen and doctors examine the wounded, record vital signs and decide surgery priorities. Information taken from the patients or from the tags placed on them at battalion aid stations is recorded and sent to the nearby administration tent.

Blood samples are also taken at the A and tent and rushed to the laboratory tent. Intravenous drips are started and corpsmen stabilize the wounded and prepare them for surgery.

CORPSMEN TAKE vital signs every five

minutes until the patient is stable. From there he is moved to the general ward and within 24 to 72 hours after his arrival to the medical company he is either on his way back to the front lines or sent to a rear field hospital. The patient affairs tent, which doubles as a headquarters tent, keeps track of everyone admitted into the medical company. They are also responsible for sending messages to higher headquarters as to the location of these patients. Statistics on who is in the two wards, their progress and other general information is kept on file.

CMDR. HERBERT Thomas, commanding officer of the reserve surgical team, stated, "The exercise was a unique and instructive opportunity for us. It was the first time this company has worked with a Marine medical unit. Our basic mission is to supplement a

medical company, whether it be aboard ship or on the beach head, with an operating and intensive care unit." Hoping to return next year the commander continued, "During this exercise we had a chance to really see what it was all about."

"THE LABORATORY tent can do just as much as any small hospital laboratory can," says Chief Petty Officer John Barrett. "In this field environment, however, our major concern is blood. The first 10 casualties in this morning's exercise required 24 units (pints) of blood. You might think that's a lot, but some patients can take up to 30 units."

If the patient is classed as "walking wounded," then he can simply walk to the X-ray tent. "This tent has the capability of shooting and developing X-rays," states Petty Officer 2d Class James Shufelt. "We operate a fluoroscope, a machine that shows the

internal organs on an X-ray screen while the patient is lying on the table. This saves a lot of time for the doctors. For example, if a Marine is shot, doctors can locate the bullet and mark the position on the patient. The patient will go straight into the operating room and the bullet is removed.

"FOR MORE complicated wounds," the X-ray technician continued, "such as several pieces of shrapnel embedded in the patient, regular X-rays are taken so the doctor can see where every piece is located."

After the blood type is identified and X-rays are taken, the patient is placed in the pre-operation tent and prepped for surgery.

"In the fully equipped operating room, the wounded will spend anywhere from one-half to four hours in surgery," says Chief Petty Officer Peter deMonch. "After surgery the patient is moved to the acute care ward."

He was sentenced by military judge alone to three months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$150 pay per month for three months, reduction to private and a bad conduct discharge.

Pvt Roger T.C. Jones, 2/3, was convicted at trial by special court martial of unauthorized absence from Nov. 30, 1980 to April 5, 1981.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to

75 days confinement at hard labor and forfeiture of \$200 pay per month for three months.

PFC Jeffrey C. Chapman, Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-265, was convicted at trial by special court martial of unauthorized absence from Feb. 13 to March 14, 1981 and for missing movement through neglect.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to two months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$200 pay per month for three months and reduction to private.

LCpl Charles G. Brookes, 1/12, was convicted at trial by special court martial of attempting to burglariously break and enter a house, of burglariously entering another house and of indecent exposure.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to

three months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$200 pay per month for three months, reduction to private and a bad conduct discharge.

LCpl Paul R. Pereira, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines, was convicted at trial by special court martial of wrongfully having alcoholic beverages in a military vehicle and in the bachelor enlisted quarters, of resisting lawful apprehension and of operating a military vehicle in a reckless manner.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to 45 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$300 pay per month for two months and reduction to private first class.

PFC Harvey R. Butler, Brigade Service Support Group, was convicted at trial by special court martial of unauthorized absence from Oct. 29, 1980

to Feb. 12, 1981 and missing movement of his unit through neglect.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to 75 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$300 pay per month for three months and reduction to private.

PFC Melvin H. Burris, 1/3, was convicted at trial by special court martial of unauthorized absence for 14 days, of missing movement through neglect and of disobeying a lawful order of a staff noncommissioned officer.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to 75 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$250 pay per month for three months and reduction to private.

LCpl Oltha L. Wallace, 1/12, was convicted at trial by special court martial of the sale of marijuana on two occasions.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to three months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$250 pay per month for four months and reduction to private.

SSgt Joseph R. McLaughlin, Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-232, was convicted at trial by special court martial of drunk driving, assault committed by a battery on a corporal, and drunk and disorderly conduct on station.

He was sentenced by members to forfeiture of \$200 pay per month for six months and restriction for 60 days.

LCpl Joseph A. Thompson, H&MS-24, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of attempting to sell marijuana and of possession of 21.9 grams of marijuana.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to three months confinement, reduction to private, and a bad conduct discharge.

LCpl Robert D. Pettigrew, Company A, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion, was convicted at trial by special court martial of unauthorized absence from April 15 to April 20, 1981, wrongful possession of mari-

juana and resisting apprehension.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to 45 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$300 pay per month for two months and reduction to private first class.

PFC Davis C. Honie, Headquarters and Maintenance Squad-

ron-24, was convicted at trial by special court martial of the wrongful sale of .29 grams of cocaine.

He was sentenced by military judge alone to three months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$300 pay per month for three months, reduction to private and a bad conduct discharge.





Landfill playground holds hidden hazard

It was a typical day at Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay's sanitary landfill. Work was 'piling up' for the bulldozer operator as his thunderous diesel engine shut out the sounds of the world around him. School was out for the day and the usual troupe of children were passing the afternoon by playing in the landfill. They knew if the bulldozer operator saw them he would make them leave, so they were hiding. One little girl saw something

she wanted laying behind the 'dozer. As she ran to pick it up the bulldozer began to back up. The other kids yelled for her to come back but the diesel engine muffled their cries. Just when she reached to object she saw the bulldozer's track closing in on her. She screamed for the operator to stop but he couldn't hear her. It was too late. For both of them, it was too late.

This incident is fictional. But it could easily happen. Children playing at the

landfill every day and adult scavengers are walking hand-in-hand with disaster.

"We have a big problem with scavengers and children playing at the landfill," says Capt Patrick Herd, motor transportation officer. "We are worried that a child will get injured or even killed. Then there is the possibility of someone getting cut on something. It is hard to tell what germs, diseases or infections are on some of the trash there. It is very dangerous." The sound of working

equipment drowns out any cries for help an injured person might make. To further complicate matters, there is no telephone at the landfill making it difficult to get help in an emergency.

"Usually we only have one person working at the landfill," Capt Herd points out. "That makes it impossible for him to both do his work and look out for children and scavengers."

Capt Rick Caldwell, deputy provost marshal, mirrors the concern expressed by Herd. "Our primary

consideration is safety," he reports. "Nobody knows what is really thrown away at the landfill and an injured person could go quite awhile without being found. We want to prevent any accidents before they happen."

In an effort to ensure safety, military police will apprehend scavengers and children playing at the landfill. The landfill worker will have a radio to call for help in case of an emergency, or to call for military police if he tells persons to leave

the landfill and they refuse.

"We can try to make the situation safer," Capt Herd declares, "but parents must help with the children and scavengers have to stop. What they do is against station and Marine Corps orders and Department of Defense regulations. If they don't cooperate, there could be a tragedy and that would be unfortunate for everyone."

Capt Herd stresses that the landfill will continue to be open for residents wishing to dump trash.


