## Weinberger addresses American Legionnaires

Rearmament of America in the face of an ever-growing Soviet threat was the recurrent theme in the Thursday morning address by Secretary of Defense Caspar W. Weinberger to thousands of American Legionnaires in Honolulu.

Speaking on the heels of a filmed address to Legionnaires by President Ronald Reagan, one of the Secretary's first acts was to define what administration members meant when saying they are "fully committed" to an action.

"THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN being fully committed and just involved is like ham and eggs. The hen is just involved, but the pig is fully committed," he explained.

Saying the liberties of speech, assembly and voting are the heart of our political existence, the Secretary noted that beyond our shores, liberty is a rare possession, an "endangered species."

"Still, the continuing danger to liberty is not its scarcity, but its

undesirability in the eyes of those who fear its consequences for their own political power," Secretary Weinberger said.

"AMONG THOSE REGIMES that fear the consequences of liberty is the Soviet Union, and from its secretive depths arises a threat to our liberty unlike any we have ever seen," he said.

The Secretary pointed to the Berlin Wall as perhaps the best illustration of the differences in ideologies. Guard towers both sides of the wall face east. The ones in West, or free, Germany face east to repel invaders. Those in East Germany also face east — "to keep their own people prisoners in that freedomless land."

The Secretary said, "Our major problem today is that the great strategic military advantage we had over the Soviets during the 1950s and the diminishing advantage we held in the 1960s is now gone. That superiority enabled us to face any aggression in the world with absolute confidence."

CITING THE DEPLETION of military resources and the

strong anti-Vietnam War sentiment that arose as the major reasons we let our lead slip, the Secretary said he believed the nation learned from Vietnam.

"If a war is not serious enough for us to want to win, it is not serious enough for us to enter. I hope we will never again become involved in another war unless we mean to win it," he said.

The Secretary pointed out that having qualified, satisfied military people using up-to-date hardware is the prime way to ensure our freedom.

IN THE PEOPLE AREA, the Secretary said he was heartened by the increasing retention rates among qualified people in the services, saying this is due to increased pay and recognition.

Shifting to talk of military hardware, the Secretary singled out neutron weapons as a particularly effective means of counterbalancing Soviet superiority in numbers of weapons.

This view of neutron weapons, Secretary Weinberger said, is borne out by the virtually immediate, scathing condemnation issued by the Soviets after the

administration announced plans to begin their manufacture. In the Secretary's opinion, this offers convincing proof of Soviet respect for the system.

SAYING NONE OF THE weapons in the Soviet Union's huge arsenal were designed for defense, but rather for offense, the Secretary pointed to the invasion of Afghanistan as but one example of Soviet aggression.

Achieving the capability of dealing with the Soviet threat anywhere in the world is one of our chief goals, the Secretary said.

Secretary Weinberger cited a resolve to honor our commitments with our allies around the world. In order to honor the nation's commitments and meet the Soviet threat, a larger defense budget is a necessity.

NOTING THERE IS NO way to "wish aside the realities," Secretary Weinberger said we must be fully committed as a nation to preserving our liberty.

"Peace alone is not enough," the Secretary emphasized. "We can only survive if we have peace with freedom."

## Flight line joggers face fatal injuries

When you talk about an F-4 Phantom, you're talking about 15 tons of metal with exhaust temperatures hovering in the hundreds of degrees and intake capable of sucking in a grown person.

THAT IS A lot of aircraft to be playing a game of "keep away" with. According to operations personnel at Station Operations and Maintenance Squadron, however, a lot of people are doing just that every time they go jogging on the Station's runways.

Joggers on the runway have become a real problem even though it is against Station

Regulation P5500.6A for any unauthorized person to be on any runway, taxiway, paved helipad, aircraft parking area, ramp, runway safety zone or any other area actively used for airfield operations.

And yet, many jogging enthusiasts continue to plod along the runway.

"THE POTENTIAL is there for some serious accidents," explained Master Sergeant Wayne Baxter, Operations Chief at SOMS.

According to Captain Robert Barry, Station Aviation Safety Officer, there is a hazard to both the aircraft and the runners.

"You're talking about a multi-million dollar aircraft that may not be capable of maneuvering out of the way of someone on the runway, in time to avoid an accident."

There is also a problem with pedestrians on Mokapu Road where it crosses the runway. Vehicles and bicycles are allowed to cross the runway, without making any stops, after stopping at the flashing red light. If the cross arm comes down and the bell starts ringing after starting out across the runway at Mokapu Road, Capt Barry cautions that drivers should continue at the normal speed to the other side of the runway. Drivers should never stop or turn around

on the runway. The runway and taxiway are approximately 400 feet wide, according to MSgt Baxter, and because of the distance, pedestrians are not allowed to cross the runway.

"IF THE TOWER observes someone (walking or running) on the runway," explained MSgt Baxter, "the crash crew is sent out to pick that person up and the Provost Marshal's Office is notified. The individual's unit is also notified and there is the possibility that the individual will be cited for a violation of Station Regulations."

"You wouldn't believe who we've picked up off the runway," remarked Major V.W. Norako, Airfield Operations Officer. "People who should have known better."

Another potentially dangerous area, near the flight line, is at the end of the runway over Kaneohe Bay. A 500-yard buffer zone has been established off the shoreline, with the danger area marked by 48-inch black and orange horizontally marked bouys.

ACCORDING TO MSgt Baxter, when jets take off, the jet blast can cause a sailboat to capsize if the sailboat is within the 500-yard buffer zone. The dangers exist from gaseous exhaust fumes and flying debris off the runway.

The flight line area is a very dangerous area and no place for unauthorized persons. Besides, a sailboat or running shoes are no match for an F-4 Phantom.

## Emergency

Proposed rates hike ambulance cost

TRIPLER ARMY MEDICAL CENTER, Hawaii — Emergency ambulance calls could cost you \$110 or more when Hawaii Governor Ariyoshi signs the regulation on new rates for emergency ambulance service on all islands.

ACCORDING TO the Honolulu Advertiser, the new rates stem from a law passed by the 1978 Legislature. It placed the statewide emergency medical services system under the jurisdiction of the Department of Health and mandated statewide charges for ambulance service.

Should the regulation be signed approving the current proposed rates, each emergency run will cost \$110 per call up to June 30, 1982, and \$125 from July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1983.

According to Patient Administration Division, military family members, retirees and their family members under the age of 65 can use the Civilian Health and Medical Plan for Uniformed Services outpatient cost-sharing program. The amount to be reimbursed depends on whether or not they are already using the program.


FAMILY MEMBERS of active duty military will pay 20 percent of cost over the deductible. Retired and their family members will

pay 25 percent over their deductible, according to a PAD official. The official also stated that active duty family members who reside in federal housing areas will have their ambulance service provided by the closest military medical treatment facility near their quarters at no charge.

Retirees and their family members over the age of 65, or those not eligible for CHAMPUS, could seek aid in paying the ambulance expense through the Social Security Administration. The official warned that the filing process is quite lengthy and involved so the Social Security Administration should be contacted at 546-2110 or 671-4035.

THE VETERANS Administration requires pre-authorization for veterans to use ambulance service at VA expense. However, in a life-threatening emergency, a veteran may request an ambulance to the nearest medical facility and notify VA after the fact and request assistance in payment of the charges.

Active duty service members residing on federal property are provided ambulance service from the nearest military treatment facility. Elsewhere, in an emergency, a civilian ambulance may be utilized and the US Government will pay the charges.

## Act amends leave law

As of Aug. 14, personnel assigned to ships or mobile units deployed to the Indian Ocean during Fiscal Year 1980 and who lost leave Oct. 1, 1980 became eligible to carry-over up to 90 days leave into FY-81.

THE DEPARTMENT OF Defense Supplemental Appropriation Authorization Act of 1981 amends the law governing leave entitlements. Specifically, a leave carry-over of up to 90 days is extended for personnel assigned to designated deployable ships or mobile units operating in the Indian Ocean during the retroactive period of Oct. 1, 1979 to Sept. 30, 1980.

This new entitlement recognizes the hardship incurred by personnel whose unique service in the Indian Ocean was the impetus for passage of the 90-day leave accumulation legislation, yet who because of the length of time it took to pass the law were inadvertently precluded from its benefit.

or mobile unit which operated in the Indian Ocean during FY-80 is designated as an eligible unit for the purpose of qualifying personnel for the retroactive entitlement for lost leave. To be eligible for the retroactive leave carry-over, personnel must have been assigned to a designated ship or mobile unit deployed to the Indian Ocean operating area during any part of FY-80 and lost leave on Oct. 1, 1980.

Personnel who believe they are eligible should declare their eligibility to their commanding officer or officers in charge. They should also report the number of days leave lost (if known) to their CO or OIC.

THE CO OR OIC CAN verify members' eligibility by reviewing their service record books. In the absence of adequate documentation, an individual signed sworn statement based on the eligibility criteria is acceptable.

To benefit from this law, lost leave must be taken before Oct. 1.

Mokapu Elementary School began the 1981-82 school year in excess of the anticipated 937 students, with an enrollment of 1,040 children.

AS A RESULT OF THIS growth of enrollment in some grade levels, the school has hired several new teachers and is busing some students to nearby Aikahi Elementary School, according to Elver Higashi, Mokapu School Principal. Approximately 25 students are

attending Aikahi, most of which are kindergarteners.

"The reason for the increased student load," says Higashi, "is that incoming Marine and Navy families have more elementary school age children. We (Mokapu School) have closed enrollment and all new people coming in will have to attend Aikahi."

"Our school is a public school under direction of the Hawaii State Department of Education," said the principal. "The children attending Aikahi will receive the same type of education Mokapu students receive."

Bus transportation to and from Aikahi is furnished by the state.

BOTH THE PARENTS AND students are cooperative, according to the principal. "Parents with children in grades other than those with an overflow are permitted to send them to Aikahi Elementary with those who must go there. This allows the family to remain together," Higashi said.

As classes thin out, due to rotations next semester, these students will be offered enrollment to Mokapu.



## Biologists study booby birds

# Research determines diet

**EDITOR'S NOTE** — The Red-footed Booby Bird is a marine bird that breeds in a colony at Ulupau Head.

Wear old clothes and bring a pair of gloves, he told me the day before the Red-footed Booby Bird research at Ulupau Crater. Our trip was just one of seven simultaneously scheduled for two consecutive weekends in June at seven islands in the Hawaiian archipelago. 'He' was Rick Coleman, the Assistant Refuge manager for the Pacific Refuge Complex and a Fish and Wildlife biologist from Honolulu. What he forgot to tell me (or at least I didn't ask), was that I also needed a hat and some anti-gag medicine for the type of meals I would see — partially digested flying fish and large pieces of squid.

The booby bird study was part of the Tripartite Cooperative Agreement signed in May 1978 between the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Department of Land and Natural Resources and the National Marine Fisheries Service. In signing the agreement, the three agencies agreed to divide the responsibilities and study the marine life in the Northwest Hawaiian Islands.

Under the Tripartite Cooperative Agreement, the Fish and Wildlife Service took the study of seabirds as their primary function. The Fish and Wildlife Service is finishing its third major field season, (the seabirds' breeding season, usually January to September), having established major field camps on the islands of Nihoa and Laysan and one permanent field station at Tern Island all manned by Fish and Wildlife biologists.

"One major part of the seabird research was to determine their feeding habits," said Dr. Robert Shallenberger, the supervisory wildlife biologist for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Honolulu. "Our trip to the booby bird colonies at 7 p.m. on succeeding Saturdays was a chance to discover the differences in feeding habits along the Hawaiian chain."

We spotlighted the birds with a bright light and had very little trouble netting them.

"The booby birds are less apt to be nervous and fly away at night," Coleman said. "They are similar to other animals in the respect that bright lights cause them to momentarily hesitate and we are able to net them without much trouble."

Once a bird was netted, we carefully removed it from the net, turned it upside down and coerced it to regurgitate its meal. If the bird didn't have any food, it was weighed and released. If a food sample was collected, the food was placed

in a numbered jar of formaldehyde then weighed and released. At the same time, data was gathered concerning the birds' roost at the time of capture, whether or not they were with young or hatching an egg.

Food samples will be tested by the National Marine Fisheries Service to determine the species of fish and the percentages of each species.

The Fish and Wildlife Service have been taking food samples from seabirds over a three-year period to determine the

species of fish they eat, how much they eat, how diet changes with weather conditions and different seasons and how it changes geographically.

"One overriding factor in our study," states Shallenberger, "is that we want to be able to predict the effects of commercial fisheries on the seabirds' food supply. When the study is complete, Fish and Wildlife will be able to make recommendations to fisheries about when and where to fish and how much to take so as not to affect the birds' diet."

## Hawaiian heritage

### Man's thoughtless actions threaten native wildlife with extinction

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** This article was compiled from information in a pamphlet entitled 'Hawaii's Endangered Wildlife' by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and from the book 'Hawaii's Birds' by the Hawaii Audubon Society.

When the Hawaiian Islands were discovered there were about 70 different species of birds and two mammals found here. Within the past 150 years, at least 23 kinds of birds have become extinct and 31 are on the verge of extinction, according to Robert Shallenberger, a supervisory wildlife biologist from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Honolulu. Hawaii has lost more of its native birdlife than any other area in the world in relation to its size.

Some extinctions such as the one in 1923 were witnessed by scientists on Laysan Island, a tiny dot in the Pacific between Honolulu and Midway.

**RABBITS WERE INTRODUCED** to Laysan Island about the turn of the century. In the absence of any natural enemies there, the population of these animals exploded and they overran the island in such numbers that they consumed all the vegetation. The island became a barren waste. The rabbits no longer had food and perished as did thousands of nesting seabirds and their young who were trapped in burrows by wind driven sands.

According to experts, most tragic was

the extermination of three species of small birds found nowhere else in the world except on these islands. The Laysan millerbird was gone by 1923. A scientific expedition that year witnessed the extermination of the last three Laysan honeycreepers in a sandstorm. The little Laysan flightless rail was also gone.

Destruction of waterbird habitat also occurred on the main Hawaiian Islands. The habitat has declined drastically since 1900. Sub-divisions, hotels, landfills, croplands and factories have replaced former native environments.

**THE RATE OF HABITAT** destruction has accelerated in the past 20 years. Rice and taro fields once provided over 34,000 acres of habitat; today such fields comprise but a few hundred acres.

The number of birds dependent on wetlands for food and a place to raise their young have declined as these areas were destroyed. The non-migratory Hawaiian birds like the stilt, coot, koloa duck and gallinule are threatened with extinction because of this loss. Areas such as Nuupia Ponds on Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay, Pearl Harbor and other small water areas are vital to the survival of these birds.

Two native mammals, the monk seal and the hoary bat are also being considered in the endangered category. The Hawaiian monk seal was nearly

exterminated by seal hunters in the late 1800's. Establishment of the Hawaiian Islands National Refuge in 1909 gave it necessary protection and now its population is estimated to be about 1,500 animals.

**THERE IS ALSO CONCERN** manifested for the future of the green sea turtle. Certain of the refuge islands in Hawaii are the only significant nesting sites for the turtle. Because of the value of the refuge to all these animals, only scientists with appropriate permits are authorized to land on the islands.

Animal species are the result of evolutionary changes which spanned millions of years. Each species and subspecies developed certain characteristics which fitted it for a special niche in the complex world. Yet man, through thoughtless actions, has caused the extermination for many species. Essential habitat has been destroyed or altered through various means. Animals have been introduced which competed with native forms for food and living space, preyed upon them, or brought strange diseases which took a devastating toll.

The loss of such wildlife is the loss of a unique heritage not only to present, but to future generations of Hawaiians and all other Americans. Many of the species are found nowhere else in the world.


There were tales to be told, new friends to meet and old acquaintances to renew.



# Marines mix expertise with pride

"We don't accept anything less than excellence, and that's the bottom line," stressed Master Sergeant Bob Mann, Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-235's Maintenance Chief.

said MSgt Mann. "At times some of the F-4Ss have little things wrong, but it's not because of the maintenance Marines. It's her, use we are waiting for necessary parts."

Over the past four months VFMA-235 has had an average of 77 percent full systems aircraft. Along with that, they have flown about 12,000 accident free hours. "When a pilot and radar intercept officer get into one of our aircraft they are going to come back safe. That's how sure I am about our main-

tenance," remarked the maintenance chief.

"WE ARE THE best there is, and we're going to keep it that way!" stressed MSgt Mann.

But what is it that motivates '235's maintenance crews and makes them feel they are the best air squadron there is?

"Everyone in the squadron works together to keep the airplanes flying," noted LCpl Kevin Loper of '235's metal shop. "This squadron stands out because we are all proud to be here."

Cpl Michael Manning has been attached to VMFA-235 since 1978 and feels this is the best squadron he has worked with. "I extended here to go on the Western Pacific deployment with '235 because we are so good. We're one hot team!" asserted the flight line Marine. "There's a lot of initiative and motivation in the squadron. All the shops pitch in and help each other get the job done."

"I'VE BEEN IN a lot of squadrons over the years," commented MSgt Mann, "and I've never seen a squadron that cares as much. No one wants to do anything to make the squadron look bad."

"I feel part of the reason we've been able to have such an outstanding maintenance crew is leadership. During our morning foreign object damage walks along our flight line, it's not just the sergeants and below out there. Many staff noncommissioned officers and officers are out there picking up the trash and rocks."

It's the same for any other job that needs to be done.

"IT'S A GROUP effort," said MSgt Mann. "It has taken a lot of hard work and long hours to get where we are now. But because of our work in the past, we are able to fly a good percentage of our aircraft without any defects. And, it's never been one person doing the job. It's always the maintenance Marines working as a team."

When talking of working as a team there are many factors the master sergeant points out. "Maintenance includes all the shops that have something to do with keeping the aircraft flying and safe. A few of these shops include the radar people who keep the radar systems working. There's the seat shop to ensure the ejection seats are working and installed correctly."

IN ADDITION TO each shop having to work together, there are also three shifts working to keep the F-

4Ss airborne. "The day crew works when the aircraft are flying. They're the ones who get the F-4Ss in the air," commented MSgt Mann. "The night crew repairs items that may have been broken during the day, while the mid crew prepares the planes for the next day's flight. This includes checking the oil, fuel and giving the planes a good look over for any possible problems."

Continuing he said, "Each shift is not limited to these duties. The day crew does repair work and the night crew will launch a plane if one needs to go out. Every shift of each shift is needed to keep the squadron ready."

GYSGT JOHN Holland, avionics chief said, "I don't feel there are motivation or morale problems in the squadron maintenance shops. Everyone is proud of the emphasis we place on full mission capability."

**LIKE THEIR** little friends, Big Brothers and Big Sisters represent all walks of life. Vicki Hoyman, wife of Staff Sergeant Mike Hoyman, Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron-24, has been in the program almost two and a half years.

"I have two younger sisters at home," Vicki said. "I've been away from home so long, I felt like I was missing something."

Vicki's Little Sister is Jeri Jesus of Kaneohe, Hawaii. She joined the program

because she was bored at home.

"I have one older sister and three older brothers but they've all moved away and gotten married," she explained.

**WHAT DO THE** two do when they get together?

"Well, we go to the beach, cook, go shopping, just stuff you would normally do with your little sister," Vicki said.

One thing Big Brothers and Big Sisters have in common is that they all share a love for children. They also desire to help a child experience opportunities for gaining personal enrichment and self-confidence.

# Red Devils celebrate 56th birthday

On Sept. 1, 1925, the original Red Devil Squadron, known as Division One, Fighting Plane Squadron-3M, was activated at the Naval Air Station, San Diego, Calif. This was the heart of the squadron, now at home here, known as Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-232.

**VMFA-232 IS** the oldest fighter attack squadron in the Marine Corps and just celebrated their 56th anniversary with a Mess Night here, Sept. 1.

The Red Devils began in the 1920s with the Vought VE-7SF, a single seat fighter/trainer. This aircraft had only a single 180 horsepower engine and traveled at

a "whopping" 150 mph. It was in 1929 that the Red Devil insignia was officially adopted. The significance of the insignia, however, remains a mystery since no record of it was ever made.

**THE RED** Devil's aircraft continued to grow in size and speed during the 1930s with the introduction of the F4B-4. This aircraft had an air speed of 184 mph, but did nothing to mar the spotless record of the Red Devils. Two thousand accident free hours were logged by the end of June 1932.

During World War II the Squadron moved from San Diego to the Marine Corps Air Station at Ewa,

Hawaii. During the Dec. 7, 1941 attack by the Japanese, all 20 of the Squadron's aircraft were on line at the Ewa Air Station. Of the 20, only one escaped with only minor damage. Ten were completely destroyed and nine received major damage.

**OVER THE NEXT** several months the Red Devils continued to rebuild their squadron until August 1942 when they headed for Guadalcanal. The Red Devils remained in the Pacific, off and on, until returning to San Diego in November 1945 when the squadron was decommissioned.

In June 1948 the squadron was reactivated as Reserve Marine Fighter Squadron-232 in New York. At the outbreak of the Korean conflict, the squadron was ordered to active duty and reassigned to MCAS El Toro, Calif. The squadron then flew F4U-4 Corsairs with 2,400 horsepower and air speeds in excess of 450 mph. During March 1953 the Red Devils received their first jet fighters, the F9F-2 Panther.

**THE SQUADRON** was committed to combat operations in Vietnam during the 1960s with the new F-8E Crusader. Sept. 8, 1967 the squadron was redesignated Marine Fighter-Attack Squadron-232 and began flying the F-4J Phantom.

By the end of 1973 the squadron had spent three combat tours in Southeast Asia. VMFA-232 has been located here since 1977, where they remain a force in readiness, participating in the Unit Rotation program.

In addition to receiving the Hanson Award in 1974, as the best fighter squadron in the Marine Corps, the Red Devils have been recognized with a number of unit decorations.

VMFA-232 has come a long way from its inception in 1925, with aircraft barely capable of speeds up to 150 mph, to the Phantom of today, capable of traveling in excess of Mach 2.

was convicted at trial by special court-martial of unauthorized absence from Dec. 27, 1980 to May 4, 1981; and for missing a movement of his unit through neglect.

**Private Mark A. Means,** 1/3, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of unauthorized absence from March 6 to April 4, 1981 and missing a movement

through neglect on March 6, 1981. He was sentenced to four months confinement at hard labor and reduction to private.

**PFC Frank J. Rivera,** Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-235, 1st Mar Bde, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of the wrongful possession of marijuana and LSD.

He was sentenced to four months confinement at hard labor, reduction to private and a bad conduct discharge.

**Private Brian E. Swiedburg,** 1st Bat-

alion, 12th Marines 1st Mar Bde, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of failing to obey lawful orders on two occasions, attempting to sell amphetamines, and attempting to transfer amphetamines, and attempting to possess amphetamines.

He was sentenced to six months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$334 pay per month for six months and a bad conduct discharge.

He was sentenced to 75 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$330 pay per month for three months and reduction to private.

**LCpl Earl J. Churchill** 13, was convicted at trial by special court-martial for disrespectful language toward a staff noncommissioned officer, assault by striking another Marine and wrongful possession of marijuana.

He was sentenced to 45 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$330 pay per month for three months and reduction to private.

### ALL ABOUT HAIR...

## Hunters

### Wardens announce sheep season

The Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of Forestry and Wildlife, has announced the opening of a hunting season for mouflon and hybrid sheep in Unit A (The Mauna Kea Game Management Area) on the Island of Hawaii beginning Oct. 3, and continuing for four weekends. Hunting days will be on Saturdays and Sundays only.

Interested licensed hunters may telephone the Division of Forestry and Wildlife Office at 961-7307 in Hilo, Hawaii to reserve a one-day hunting trip (either Saturday or Sunday). All persons registering once on the list will be made ineligible for the rest of the season. In-person reservations will not be accepted. Reservations will be accepted by telephone on a first come, first served basis

beginning at 8 a.m. on Wednesdays preceding each weekend of hunting.

Any licensed hunter may apply; however, hunters ages 15 or younger must be accompanied by a licensed adult while hunting. Hunters may call in a maximum of four names, giving the current hunting license numbers if they wish to hunt together.

A maximum of 25 names will be accepted for each day of hunting. No interchange of hunting reservations will be permitted.

One mouflon or hybrid sheep of either sex may be taken by a hunter on his assigned day. Hunters may also hunt feral sheep and feral goats. There will be a season limit of one mouflon or hybrid sheep per person; however, there are no bag limits for feral sheep and feral goats.

The unskinned tail must remain attached to the carcass of all animals killed as evidence of species.

Check-in time will be 5 a.m. on the day of hunting at the Puu Huluhulu checking station on the Saddle Road. Check out time will be 6:30 p.m.

# Clinic physicals save money

Once again this year, as in the past three years, dependent children at the Air Station received physical examinations at the Branch Clinic before the start of the school year.

**THE PHYSICALS, WHICH** took three days last month, caused a reduction in services in other areas of the Branch Clinic during that time. However, according to the Senior Medical Officer at the clinic, Commander J.R. Gorman, through the cooperation and

understanding of everybody, emergency cases were handled in the Emergency Room and at Military Sick Call. This year 222 patients were seen under these circumstances, with an average waiting time of only 15 minutes.

The school physical examination program saves parents a lot of money. Physicals with civilian doctors are not covered by Civilian Health and Medical Plan of the Uniformed Services and must be paid for by the parents.

**WITH THE HELP OF** several Red Cross volunteers and almost the entire Branch Clinic staff, more than 1,000 children received their school physicals this year.

Based on current pediatric fees and the cost of immunizations it would have cost the parents of these children \$135,500 if they were to receive physicals from civilian doctors. At these figures a school physical with a civilian doctor would cost nearly \$130 each.

It took each child approximately 20 to 25 minutes to complete their physicals this year. This was an improved time compared to the 777 children who spent about an hour completing their school physicals in 1978.

**WITH THE RISING COST** of medical care in the civilian world, the school physical examination program at the Branch Clinic is a service to Marines with school-age children.
