Pass in Review

Scheduled paydays released

HQMC, WASHINGTON — The Commandant of the Marine Corps has released the scheduled paydays for Fiscal Year 1982.

Pay and allowances are computed from the first day through the 15th day of the month for the first payday of the month, and from the 16th through the end of the month for the end-of-the-month payday.

Local commanders have the option to conduct paydays on dates later than the dates listed below. Paydays regularly scheduled for midmonth can be adjusted up to the 20th of the month and end-of-the-month paydays can be adjusted until the fifth day of the following month.

Computation of pay and allowances will not be affected by any adjustment in payday scheduling.

Allied exercise ends

WASHINGTON — Some 60 ships and submarines and almost 200 aircraft from eight NATO nations have completed participation in two exercises.

Designated Magic Sword North and Magic Sword South, both exercises were designed to demonstrate and improve the capability of allied forces to conduct maritime operations under wartime conditions.

Admiral Harry Train II, U.S. Navy, the Supreme Allied Commander, Atlantic, and General Bernard Rogers, U.S. Army, the Supreme Allied Commander, Europe, scheduled the exercises.

Exercise Magic Sword North, which took place in the Norwegian Sea from Sept. 2-4, was under the command of Vice Admiral James A. Lyons, U.S. Navy, Commander, Striking Fleet Atlantic. The exercise was comprised of two U.S. carrier battle groups which provided tactical air support to allied forces in Norway. Providing surface, air and subsurface opposition to these carrier battle groups were units from Norway and the United States.

Exercise Magic Sword South took place Sept. 7 and 8 in the North Sea. One U.S. carrier battle group participated. This exercise provided tactical air support to NATO forces in Denmark and Central Europe.

Units from Denmark, the Federal Republic of Germany, Norway and the United States provided opposition forces for Magic Sword South. Other nations that participated in these exercises included Canada, the Netherlands, Portugal and the United Kingdom.

Recon organization forms

HQMC, WASHINGTON — Force Recon Marines, past and present, are eligible to join a new organization unique to them.

The Force Recon Association, whose motto is "Link forever those who served together," is now forming and soliciting membership.

Gen Barrow visits Oahu

The Commandant of the Marine Corps, General Robert H. Barrow, will visit here Thursday and Friday as part of his tour of Corps installations.

The four-star General, a member of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, will visit various units including Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-235, Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-265, Brigade Service Support Group Maintenance Facility and Third Marine Regiment leathernecks.

Gen Barrow will also speak with Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, 1st Marine Brigade and Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay commanders and selected staff members. His topics of discussion will include equipment modifications, organizational changes, aviation safety, unit deployments and the quality of life in the Corps.

Pacific Force salutes creation

CAMP H.M. SMITH, Hawaii — Fleet Marine Force, Pacific will observe its 37th anniversary Thursday.

Commanded by Lieutenant General J.K. Davis, FMFPac encompasses about half the earth's surface and is composed of about 72,000 Marines. Fleet Marine Force Marines are those

assigned to the operating forces of the U.S. Navy, both in the Atlantic and Pacific Fleets.

THE FLEET MARINE Force was originally created in the 1930s as a permanent expeditionary force for amphibious operations. As a result, the FMF structural concept went through a

series of reorganizations until 1944 when the designation Headquarters, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, was officially established at Camp Catlin, Oahu, then Territory of Hawaii.

In June 1950, Headquarters, FMFPac was moved to quarters at Pearl Harbor. FMFPac then moved to its present location at

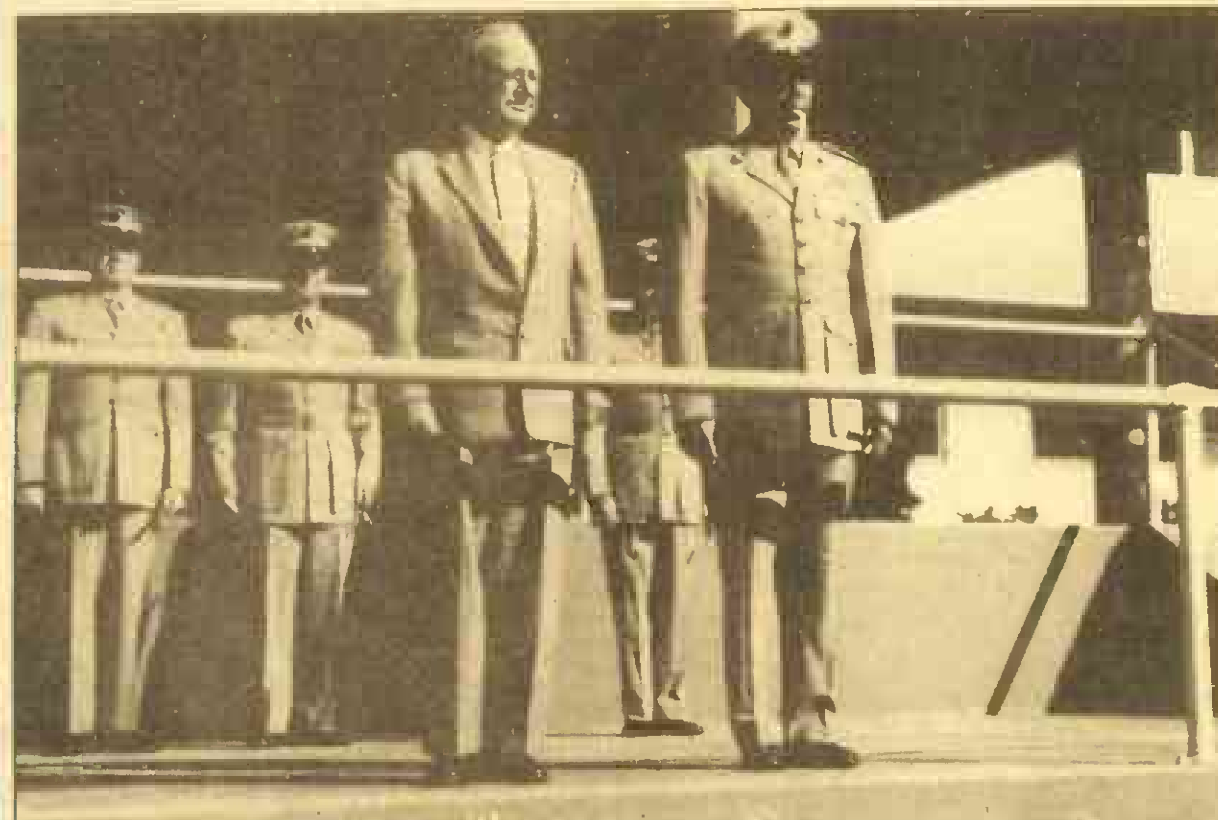
Camp Smith in January 1956. The camp was named after Marine General Holland M. Smith, a pioneer in the techniques of amphibious warfare and the first commanding general of FMFPac.

DURING WORLD WAR II, FMFPac was comprised of six Marine divisions, five aircraft wings and the service command. Following the war, the force was drastically cut in manpower. However, when the United Nations went to the aid of South Korea in 1950, FMFPac rapidly geared up for combat.

In September 1950 some 30,000 leathernecks of the 1st Marine Division and the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing began their decisive assault at Inchon, Korea.

From 1954 to 1964 various units of the FMFPac participated in military advisory programs in Southeast Asia. Then, in March 1965, the 9th Expeditionary Brigade went ashore at Danang, Vietnam. From that date until the early 1970s, FMFPac units supported the United States effort in Southeast Asia.

TODAY, FMFPAC IS COM-prised of the III Marine Amphibious Force (3d Marine Division, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing and 3d Force Service Support Group) on Okinawa, Japan; the 1st Marine Division with its supporting elements at Camp Pendleton and Twenty-nine Palms, Calif.; the 3d Marine Aircraft Wing at El Toro and Tustin, Calif. and Yuma, Ariz.; and the 1st Marine Brigade here in Hawaii.

Exchange receives uniform sales

The first day of October is always a very busy day in the military and this Oct. 1 is no exception.

On that day all uniform items will be purchased at the Marine Corps Exchange instead of Cash Sales. In addition, the cost of many uniform items will increase that day, along with Marines' annual pay.

Just because everything happens on Oct. 1, the beginning of the new fiscal year, does not mean that the changes affect each other. Many Marines believe that the move from Cash Sales to the MCX and the proposed pay raise have caused the change in the price of uniform items. This is not true.

According to a bulletin issued

by the Defense Personnel Support Center in Philadelphia, the source of supply for all uniform items, the move from Cash Sales has absolutely nothing to do with uniform cost increases.

Costs in production and transportation and the rising rate of inflation are just a few of the factors that determine the price of uniforms. These factors are reviewed annually and the results of the review determine the amount of the increase or decrease in uniform prices for the following fiscal year.

So if something has to be blamed for the rising cost of uniforms, the blame lies on the beginning of the new fiscal year, not the move from Cash Sales to the annual pay raise.

Civilians hold hearing for helipad's approval

Last year, Governor George Ariyoshi released funds for a helipad to be built at Castle Hospital. Funds were also appropriated for helipad improvements in Waianae and Kahuku. Pending final approvals, the helipad will become a reality for Castle Hospital by spring of 1982, said Ron Combs, Vice President.

A site for the pad has been selected on a hill on the Kalaniana'ole Highway side of the hospital. The need for a helipad became apparent when an increase in hospital outpatients and employees made it a problem

for the parking lot to be cleared for helicopter landings.

This situation was paired with the increased use by U.S. Army (Medevac) emergency choppers who bring critical patients or transport them to other hospitals. The addition of the helipad would meet the need of immediate availability and unobstructed accessibility of medical care for the 120,000 residents of Windward Oahu.

A final public hearing will be held today at 2 p.m. before the City & County at City Hall in Honolulu for approval, said Combs.

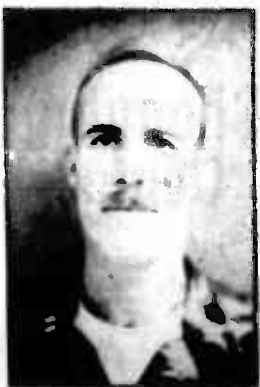
Do you think that command sponsored promotion boards for regular promotions to lance corporal, corporal and sergeant are necessary? Why?



Corporal Rodger Lehl, H&MS-24: "If a Marine has the time in grade, the necessary score and is recommended by his direct superiors, there should be no need for the Marine to stand a promotion board. His direct superiors, those individuals he works directly with, are more aware of the Marine's conduct, capabilities and awareness. They should be the ones who have the final say."



SgtMaj Saula Talamoni Sr., H&MS: "Promotion boards to the grade of lance corporal, corporal and sergeant are necessary to insure that only those Marines fully qualified to carry out the responsibilities are promoted."



Captain P.L. Carey, Hq, 3d Mar: "No. In order to be promoted to the above ranks, a Marine has to be recommended by his platoon commander/section head. His composite score is then computed and submitted to HQMC. His platoon commander/section head and company commander make the determination, which is as it should be."



Private First Class Lopez, Jr., Co, 3d Mar: "I became this way because I was a Marine before, and I was a Marine before."

Money alleviates pain and hunger

Disease. Poverty. Hunger. Deprivation. Pain. Loneliness. Many words, verbal and written, have been expended on these subjects.

Unfortunately, not one word, on paper or spoken, however forceful has ever cured an illness, fed or clothed a child or raised the standard of living of a poor village. Newspaper and magazine articles, television reports, movies, radio broadcasts and speeches are only able to

call attention to these evils. The only positive cure for any of them is money.

Money comes from people. People give because they care, because they want a tax deduction or because they're embarrassed not to give. Some never give.

Once a year members of the Armed Forces and federal employees are solicited in the form of the Combined Federal Campaign. The 18th annual campaign

kicked off island wide Sept. 8 and lasts until Oct. 20. It is a one-shot deal, painless way to give, that spreads contributions among 93 organizations in the Honolulu area.

It's easy for Marines to give. Key persons have been appointed for every unit. They will approach each Marine in their unit. It couldn't be easier. Contributions can be made through military allotments, civilian payroll

deductions or given as a lump sum.

The dollars raised are distributed in two ways. A Marine can designate all or any portion of a gift to one or more agencies. An undesignated contribution will be split among the agency groups according to a pre-determined scale. Almost everyone's pet charity can benefit from the Combined Federal Campaign.

A few examples should prove how comprehensive CFC is. Project HOPE and CARE are two international service agencies. The Easter Seal Society and the March of Dimes fall under the National Health Agency while under the Aloha United Way heading are many categories: character building and youth services like Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Honolulu and the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts; care of children and the elderly that includes Salvation Army Corps and Child and Family Service; health education and rehabilitation services such as the American Cancer Society and the American Heart Association; community service agencies like the American Red Cross, Hawaii State Chapter and the Armed Services YMCA of Honolulu; and the specialized services which include USO of Hawaii and REACH, the Joint Services Recreation for Adults and Children with Handicaps. In the National Service Agency area falls the American Foundation for the Blind Inc. and the National Black United Fund Inc.

Even such a small sampling gives a good idea of how comprehensive the list is. What the lists fails to do is tell the story of CFC. Just as people give, so do people receive from CFC. Every dollar given benefits someone, in some way betters their life.

Words paint a poor picture of pain, poverty, hunger and want. But the money donated to the Combined Federal Campaign will erase that picture some day. Words are also useless. They won't provide a phial of medicine, a meal, a home or an act of mercy. Money will.

Is the country ready to abandon the all-volunteer force and return to the draft?

EDITOR'S NOTE — This article is reprinted from the Navy Times.

After eight years of turbulent and controversial existence, the notion that the All-Volunteer Force is working still persists in many quarters. Yet, there are increasing signs that support for the AVF is eroding. In fact, some of its most ardent supporters appear to be defecting. Perhaps it's a sign of the times wherein it is again respectable and even fashionable to espouse conservative and patriotic views. Perhaps, on the other hand, it's merely a result of the aging process; as the arteries grow harder, political conservatism, patriotism and religion seem to set in.

WHATEVER THE CAUSES, there are many doves-turned-hawks fluttering about lately. Speaking before a gathering of San Diego's City Club members recently in La Jolla, Mr. James Fallows, an Atlantic Monthly magazine editor and author of the new book "National Defense," spoke of his early opposition to the Vietnam conflict and revealed candidly that he had once intentionally lost weight in order to avoid being drafted. In criticizing the increasing complexity of military hardware and the growing gap between technology and human qualifications in the armed services, Fallows, who was a speechwriter for President Jimmy Carter, stated that "the machinery almost never matters as much as the character and cohesion of the people in the armed forces." So saying, he criticized the all-volunteer concept and called for some form of selective service.

"I think that is the only way to have any kind of a representative armed force," he stated. "You have a military force now that is much less representative of the country than you had in Vietnam." Few advocates of the

draft could have stated it better or with greater credibility. Spoken like a hawk!

THE ARGUMENTS ON THE table in favor of a return to some form of draft seem to outweigh those in favor of struggling on with the AVF. Popular arguments on behalf of the latter seem to boil down to two basic ones, to wit: (1) the draft would do little to aid in the retention of skilled supervisors and journeymen; and, (2) because resumption of the draft would be unpopular, its reimposition would prove to be a severe political liability.

In an article appearing in The Wall Street Journal (May 26, 1981), Gen. William C. Westmoreland, Army Chief of Staff for four years during the Vietnam conflict, stated his belief that the American public, including our young men, would gracefully accept a return to conscription based on lottery selection with minimum deferments. "It would," he acknowledged, "also resurface the radical leaders of the past decade, who will attempt to rally their old constituencies, but their chants will have a hollow ring."

I'm not certain that many of the old leaders will even stand up to chant in opposition. Former Sen. Eugene McCarthy recently admitted, before an astonished college audience, that he favored a return to the draft. Even Sen. George McGovern has made recent hawkish sounds about the need to strengthen the armed forces of this country. In any event, the popular mood has never, in eight long and dismal years of the AVF, been more receptive.

WITH REGARD TO THE OTHER leading argument against the draft to the effect that it would do little for retention, it is always instructive to probe some of the reasons why experience noncommissioned and petty officers leave the services at the height of

their usefulness. It is not always simply a matter of more pay. It may be that more and more of them are tired of coping with the problems of skill shortages and declining recruit quality. If it did nothing else, a truly universal draft with no college deferments would certainly improve the quality of the recruit base, at least to some degree, providing larger percentages of trainable people.

It is further argued by those who oppose a return to the draft that the armed forces need motivated young people, not conscripts. This argument assumes that the bulk of the current volunteers are driven by some loftier motive than merely the need for a job and that the bulk of the draftees would be resistant to the idea of service to country. The need to escape unemployment may not be the most effective incentive to serve in a combat force.

In fairness, there are other respectable arguments against the draft. Its administration could add to the cost of government. It could lessen enthusiasm for continued compensation improvements (which could be viewed as an argument for or against, depending where one sits). It would contribute modestly to the ranks of the unemployed when some of the untrainables, who might otherwise be recruited, have to seek work in the civilian sector.

BUT THE ARGUMENTS ON behalf of a return to the draft seem to me to be overwhelming. It would, as Westmoreland and others have pointed out, ease the burden and expense of the recruiting effort, more than compensating for the expense of administering selective service. It would, as Fallows and others have said, result in a military force more representative of the country than is the case now. It would improve the quality of recruits. It would symbolize a rejection of

the misguided notion that service to country is not a fundamental obligation but rather a matter of choice and conscience.

Creation of a conscripted force of recruits could facilitate targeting compensation increases to the career force where they are more effective in improving retention. It would improve morale among the career force members who are concerned over the discipline problems posed by a continuing decline in recruit quality. Above all, it would send a clear and unmistakable message to potential adversaries that we are deadly serious about regaining military pre-eminence; a message more vivid, perhaps, even than the reactivation of battleships.

Public sentiment appears increasingly receptive to a return to at least some form of federal service obligation. Many feel that if young people have an aversion to military service, they should be permitted to serve their country in some other way. What is meant by "some other way," however, is seldom clear. It sounds like a noble idea, but it should be recalled that the objective is to man a military force, not re-invent the Job and Peace Corps. Creating new non-military forms of service would require a cumbersome administrative apparatus which would increase the cost of government and the taxpayers' burden in return for advantages that may not justify the expense.

IT SHOULD ALSO BE KEPT IN mind that a draft would serve as an inducement for many qualified young persons to volunteer in order to take advantage of special programs and options. The draft, in fact, would probably touch few lives directly, but it would touch all of us indirectly in that, in the long run, it would actually serve to unify us as a nation, after the initial scattered whining subsides.

Getting out of the Corps?

If you have made the decision to separate from your service, or if you are "on the fence" and don't know which way to leap, consider the following questions before you make your final decision.

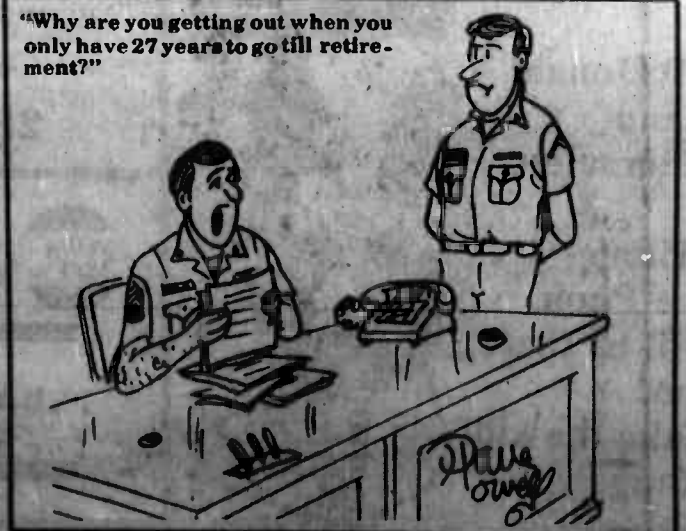
If you cannot answer "yes" to at least half of these questions about a very important aspect of life after you leave service, could be you have overlooked some pretty positive factors right where you are.

- Will your new employer —
- Give you a tax-free allowance for quarters, or furnish quarters free?
- Furnish free health and accident insurance and provide full pay if you are unable to work?
- Provide free dental care for you?
- Give you 30 days paid vacation a year, with travel allowance, starting with your first day of employment?
- Provide an insurance plan in case of an emergency?
- Help you pay to attend college or trade school?

- Provide a pension for life in case you are disabled?
- Pay you a bonus for staying with the company?
- Provide free air travel during vacations or reduced commercial air fare if you are transferred?
- Provide free legal advice?
- Operate for your convenience a discount grocery, drug store, service station, cafeteria, barber shop, beauty parlor, dry cleaners, tailor shop?
- Guarantee retirement pay for life after 20 years of service with the company, regardless of your age at the time?

Even though you are confident that you will find a dependable civilian employer and you might expect cash pay to be higher than the cash pay you receive now, are you quite certain the difference in cash pay can make up for even half of the above non-cash benefits of military service? — from an article by MSgt J.R. Platoon tunes in combat units

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA, Hawaii — "Yes, we need artillery and air support and we need it fast or it'll be too late."

"Sir, headquarters says hold on, support is on its way."

In combat many things can make the difference between victory and defeat. Sometimes it may be as important as artillery and air support or as simple as resupply of rations.

TO GET ANY of these things communication is necessary between units. And that is where the Communications Platoon, 3d Marines, 1st Marine Brigade comes in.

Like everyone else, Comm Platoon needs training to keep their skills finely tuned. And like many, they went to Pohakuloa Training Area on the Big Island Aug. 21 to accomplish that training and test their skills with 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, 1st Marine Brigade, during Combat Readiness Evaluation Exercise Quiver.

The platoon provided

ed many services during CREE Quiver and used several types of equipment to provide them.

"WE HAVE high frequency radios for long range communications," Master Sergeant Daniel Dillon, Platoon Communications Chief said during the exercise. "We also use very high frequency for tactical radio and multi-channel radio with which we can provide telephone and teletype communications."

He explained that the platoon also maintains the equipment while in the field. "The environment is pretty rugged on comm gear," he said. "There is dirt in everything, the heat and cold are extreme, and roads are poor causing a lot of shock for the equipment."

"We have a 10 to 20 percent deadline rate if we're in the field for more than one week."

THAT DOESN'T mean that communications go down. The platoon can do some

maintenance while in the field.

Staff Sergeant Russell Ross, Electronic Maintenance Supervisor, said, "We have the capability to do third echelon maintenance but we're only authorized to do second echelon."

"We are just doing field expedient repair and getting the gear back out there. We try to fix what we can, if we can, and if we can't, we float it."

"We have what we call a maintenance float from Brigade Service Support Group," MSgt Dillon said. "We give them our down gear and they give us functional equipment."

ANOTHER AREA of Comm Platoon's responsibility is the field Tactical Communication Center, from which teletype messages are sent.

Sergeant James Puckett, Message Center Chief, said, "We have two secure teletype circuits. One goes to 1/3 and the other to 1/12."

He related that the teletype is used to transmit messages like casualty reports.

"Radio isn't used for long messages because it doesn't take much time to pinpoint the source of radio transmissions," the sergeant said. "This system is highly secure."

The teletype system uses multi-channel radio to send its cryptic messages.

"WE CAN SEND messages through land lines such as telephone lines with the system," Sgt Puckett said, "but we don't normally because it is less secure. Someone could easily tap into the line."

Another advantage of the teletype system for long messages is the tapecutter and sender.

"The tapecutter," Sgt Puckett said, "encodes the messages on a strip of paper tape. The tape can be used to send a message to more than one unit or to repeat it to the same unit."

The Com Center did have some problems with the generator and the multi-channel radio breaking down and causing temporary lapses in teletype communications.

BUT, ACCORD-

ing to Sgt David Hongiorno, Communications Support Company, 7th Communications Battalion, a one-man contact team with Comm Platoon, "This is the most successful communication I've seen."

Captain Robert Shearer Jr., Communications Officer, 3d Marines, said of the operation "We've learned a lot about our capabilities and how to make every thing work."

"I think we've done very well even though the platoon has been short-handed and had new troops."

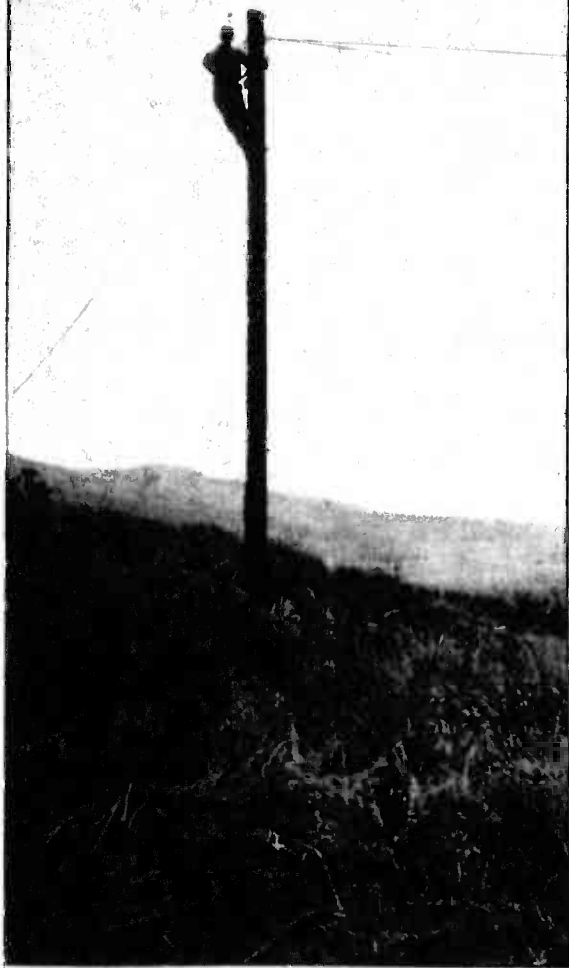

Marines earn combat ready rating

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA, Hawaii — "We won," said Captain George Flinn, Operations Evaluator, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, 1st Marine Brigade.

His response was a simple answer to the question, "How did the war go?"

THE WAR OF COURSE was CREE Quiver, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines' Combat Readiness Evaluation Exercise and the Captain explained that his response meant that the battalion had earned the rating of "combat ready" for deployment with the 31st Marine Amphibious Unit from Colonel I. Buehl, Commanding Officer, 3d Marines.

"CREE Quiver was a regimental size exercise scenario in which reinforced battalions attacked and seized regimental objectives," Capt Flinn said.

Capt Flinn pointed out that with the exception of the evaluators and aggressors from 3/3, 1/3 and its supporting elements were the only real units in the regimental force. For the purposes of training and evaluation, the 2d and 3d battalions of 3d Marines were simulated.

The CREE was "fought" Sept. 6, 7 and 8, but 1/3 Marines didn't just appear then and start the war. The battalion's advance party arrived at Bradshaw Base Camp, Aug. 17, and the main body followed Aug. 21.

One-three and its supporting units spent the days prior to the CREE in strenuous training exercises,

establishing command operations centers and setting up necessary field equipment.

TRAINING WAS broken down to company and platoon level for pre-CREE exercises.

The companies engaged in daylight attacks, night attacks, and company defense positions. They practiced helicopter insertion and extraction techniques, motorized convoys and other mechanized operations.

Third Marines Air Liaison Officer Capt Stan Horton showed his high regard for Marine Aircraft Group-24's support of CREE Quiver by saying, "The MAG never let us down, their support was superb."

He said that support from Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-235 and Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-265 was particularly noteworthy.

Each of the companies had the opportunity to conduct live fire operations. Various scenarios were developed for effective use of the companies' resources during these live fire exercises, that called for use of rifle, machinegun, dragon and mortar fire. Even 1st Battalion, 12th Marines added the might of their big guns to the live fire operations.

Second Lieutenant Mike Humilton, Weapons Platoon Commander, Company A, 1/3 said, "The live fire has helped us work on our accuracy for actual fire. During the CREE you never know where the rounds are really hitting because everything is simulated."

Finally it was "H" hour and 1/3 Marines moved to take their objectives in CREE Quiver.

The first day's play was to seize and hold regimental landing team objectives 3, 4 and 5, according to Capt Flinn.

OBJECTIVES 3 and 4 were tasked to 1st Battalion, while objective 5 was tasked to the simulated 3d Battalion's Marines.

1st Battalion seized their objectives after battling their two enemies, the aggressor forces, and the elements of PTA itself.

"We met opposition about 1,000 meters out," Corporal Joe Imondi, a Weapons Company dragoon said of the first assault.

"It was a little rough coming into the first objective," Lance Corporal George Guzzi, Company 1/3 said. "The right side of our attack line had to cross some pretty rough lava rock and they had trouble with the lava dogs. So we

had to slow down so they could keep up."

Private First Class Matthew Ward, Company C, 1/3, explained about lava dogs, "They've got real sharp teeth. Alavadog is a piece of lava rock and if you step on it, it will bite you like a dog."

LAVA DOGS were not the only weapons PTA hurled against 1/3 during that first day, and every other day they spent on the big island.

There was heat during the day, cold at night and the wind during both.

In spite of these "natural" enemies, 1/3 took their objectives and held them against their aggressors.

After taking objectives 3 and 4, the 1st Battalion Marines called in their reserves from Company B to seize battalion objective alpha, a key road intersection in their zone of action.

They repulsed counter attacks from enemy tanks and infantry,

withstood artillery fire, a Nuclear Biological Chemical attack and dug in to spend 36 hours in defensive positions.

"THIS IS THE first time we've tried that long of a defense," Capt Flinn said.

"While in the defense, 1/3 reacted to two events. They successfully withstood an NBC attack and responded to and carried out a NEM-VAC, a non-combatant emergency evacuation operation."

He said that at 3:50 a.m., Sept. 8, the battalion began to move again when Companies A and B made a night attack and seized the north-half of objective 6.

Their command post displaced at dawn, and at 9 a.m. two companies made a helicopter assault to secure blocking positions preventing enemy entrance to the zone of action.

At the same time, 2d Battalion seized and

occupied Bradshaw Airfield.

First Battalion held ground until ordered to retrograde to the vicinity of Bradshaw Field.

CREE Quiver was terminated when 1/3 completed the retrograde movement.

Capt Flinn said, "One-three accomplished all of its missions."

HE ADDED THAT this CREE was different from others in that the scenario is usually known before the CREE starts. But, this time the battalion didn't have any advance knowledge.

Lieutenant Colonel James Brandon, Commanding Officer 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, said, "The change in format probably made the CREE more realistic, because we didn't know where we'd start or where we'd end."

"We were required to plan and execute our missions in a short time period. I'm very proud of our Marines and the way they performed."

Tank busters train to duel with dragons

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA, Hawaii — The dragon roars belching its flaming breath, and leaving destruction in its wake.

The dragon was a mythical creature of awesome size and power that ravaged kingdoms and took their gold, jewels and princesses during the days of kings.

THROUGH THE Marine Corps' arsenal, the dragon lives in 1981 as a medium anti-tank weapon. Now the dragon is prepared to ravage the marauding might of enemy tanks, as demonstrated by the Marines of Dragon Platoon, Weapons Company, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, during Combat Readiness Evaluation Exercise Quiver Sept. 6 through 8.

"A dragon is a crew-served, command-to-line-of-sight, wire-guided missile capable of penetrating 24 inches of homogeneous steel a thousand meters from its gunner," 1st Lieutenant John Byzewski, Platoon Commander said. "Each dragon has a crew of two, a gunner and an assistant gunner."

"In combat, the gunner carries one dragon round and the tracker and the A-gunner carries two rounds," Lance Corporal Bobby Smith, Gunner and Radio Operator said.

THE HEART and brain of the dragon is the tracker, an optical sensing device and mini-computer. The tracker sees the target, computes the range and location, and

transmits in-flight corrections to the missile via a thin golden wire that connects the two. One thousand meters of the strong wire unrolls from the dragon missile to keep it "in touch" with its semi-intelligent tracker.

According to 1st Lt. Byzewski, the dragon is superior to other anti-tank weapons for several reasons, the most important one being the device's ability to track its target.

"With other weapons it was necessary to lead a moving target," the Lieutenant said. "With a dragon the gunner keeps his aim on the target. As the target moves, the tracker corrects the missile's flight for a hit."

1st Lt. Byzewski quickly pointed out that it is not as easy as it sounds.

GUNNERY Sergeant Anastacio Herrera, the Platoon Sergeant, added, "The dragon is pretty tough to shoot at first, but after awhile it's okay. Last year all our gunners were experts."

Five dragon missiles cost \$4,400 each, so Dragon Platoon Marines seldom get to fire them.

"A dragon gunner gets to fire maybe one live missile a year," 1st Lt. Byzewski said.

So how does a gunner learn his skill? "We use a Launch Effects Trainer coupled with an infrared source and a monitoring set," the Dragon Platoon Commander said.

He related that the LET, a modified dragon tube fires an M61 NATO grenade cartridge. The cartridge simulates a dragon back blast and propels a weight inside the tube that simulates the missile firing.

THE INFRARED source is placed in the target and tells the monitor if the "missile" was a strike or miss.

He added that by properly training his gunners with the LET, they can obtain a 94.5 percent first round hit capability.

"The infrared source has been a major problem in our training program," he said. "It's so sensitive we can't do any maintenance on it. We have to send it to Brigade Service Support Group."

"This platoon was the first one to get the training equipment," GySgt Herrera added. "Now it's getting to the point where it's breaking down because we use it so much."

"The source recently broke down in the middle of our training package and it had to be sent to Georgia for repairs. It took three months for us to get it back."

In spite of delays, LET training continued, honing the platoon's skill to a razor edge and they proved that skill at PTA.

That mythical beast the dragon could rarely be bested. But, he who could by skill and strength defeat and bend the mighty dragon to his will, was called a dragon master.

FROM 1STLT Byzewski, Dragon Platoon Commander to the platoon's newest private, they are dragon masters one and all.

Dust dampens dental drill

POHAKULOA TRAINING AREA, Hawaii — "It's the back tooth on the top right side sir," moaned Corporal Ake N. Tuthe. "It's really killing me."

"Well corporal," replied Lieutenant Commander Pulz M. Kwik, "the only thing we can do for you here in the field is extract the tooth."

Once, field dental care was confined to relieving a Marine's pain by the fastest means possible. And, with poor equipment and limited training, usually meant simply pulling the offending tooth.

TODAY'S Marines are much more fortunate, because the 21st Dental Company has both the training and the equipment to meet their dental needs in field conditions.

Commander David Altaras, one of the company's doctors, related that 21st Dental has the same capabilities in the field as the dental clinic at Kaneohe.

The unit went to Pohakuloa Training Area Aug. 21 to test and sharpen their field skills. The company was supported by 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, 1st Marine Brigade

who went to PTA for their Combat Readiness Evaluation Exercise.

"We have field training twice a year," said CDR Altaras. "We usually put up our tents on the grass by the clinic at Kaneohe. This is the first time we've trained at PTA, and is probably the first time dental company has been on a field maneuver of this magnitude."

"BASICALLY, we are here to do routine restorative dentistry," said the Commander. "We normally do cleaning, scaling and filling."

"However, we have had a couple of emergency cases here. We've had to do oral surgery, and in one case endodontics, a root canal," he added.

The dental company uses nine doctors and supporting dental technicians during its field training at Kaneohe. At PTA, two dental teams, consisting of four doctors and six dental technicians each, were deployed.

The first team set up the dental camp and operated until Aug. 29 when they were relieved by team two. The second team continued until Sept. 4 when they

closed shop and headed home to Kaneohe.

"THERE ARE two reasons why we used teams," CDR Altaras said. "Primarily, we couldn't take all our people from Kaneohe, and secondly we didn't have enough patients to keep them all busy here."

To keep the dental teams occupied during the exercise at PTA, all of 1/3's dental records were screened at Kaneohe, and appointments were made for those Marines who needed care.

"We serve a dual purpose here," CDR Altaras said. "Not only are we getting our semi-annual training, but we are meeting the immediate dental needs of the 1/3 Marines before they go on float."

CDR Altaras added that he scheduled the Marines by unit to keep interference with their training to a minimum and keep dental training at a maximum.

"WE HAVE gotten a lot more training here than at Kaneohe," the Commander related. "At Kaneohe we set up the tents and equipment on Monday, see patients Tuesday, Wednesday and Thurs-

day, and then break down the camp on Friday.

"We wind up with only three days of training. At PTA we've gotten a full 10 days."

Even though the Dental Company set up shop at Bradshaw Base Camp, the rough terrain and weather conditions of Pohakuloa Training Area proved to be a better test of the dental field equipment than the grassy field beside Kaneohe Branch Clinic.

"All of our equipment is new and top notch," CDR Altaras bragged. "It has proven itself real well in these tough conditions."

"OUR BIGGEST problem here has been dust, and if we come back we'll make provisions for that."

"It didn't slow anything down," he added, "but it was a real nuisance."

The dust may have been a nuisance, but it didn't keep the doctors and technicians of the 21st Dental Company from handling the dental needs of 100 Marines the first week and 70 more the second.

Surely a dentist is not the person a Marine might want to see most in the field, but if he needs one it's a relief to know he can see a trained, equipped dental specialist.

Americans recognize Hispanic contributions

President Reagan recently announced National Hispanic Heritage Week in a proclamation, by saying in part: "Outstanding Hispanic men and women have advanced our nation in science and tech-

nology, business and public service. The Hispanic peoples today add to our strength as a nation with their strong devotion to family, deep religious convictions, pride in their language and heritage and commitment to earning a livelihood by hard work. Hispanic Americans bring to us, as well, a tradition of respect for the role of women both at home

and in the workplace. "Hispanic Americans serve with distinction in our military services today as they have served with leadership and courage on the battlefield in defense of this nation in the past," the President continued.

Hispanic American contributions are prevalent throughout the Navy. USS Valjejo is named for Mariano G. Valjejo, who was in

the forefront in the movement for California statehood. USS Valdez is named for Hospital Corpsman 3d Class Phil I. Valdez, who was killed in the Vietnam War while risking his life to care for wounded comrades under heavy fire. USS Farragut is named for Admiral David Farragut, whose father was born in Majorca, Spain. ADM Farragut distinguished himself

by performing repeated acts of bravery during the Civil War. He made the quote: "damn the torpedoes, full speed ahead."

The longest held prisoner of war during the Vietnam War was Lieutenant Commander Ed Alvarez, a Hispanic American. In addition, there are 14 Navy and Marine Corps Medal of Honor winners of Hispanic origin.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 79-44 AMENDING ARTICLE III, CHAPTER 15 (1976 TRAFFIC CODE) RELATING TO TRAFFIC ADMINISTRATION, THE DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES, CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, HEREBY ESTABLISHES TRAFFIC CONTROL SCHEDULE NO. 81-7 TO AMEND SCHEDULE XI OF SECTION 15-8.3 (2) ESTABLISHING NO TURNS; SCHEDULE XIX OF SECTION 15-13.10 (1) (d) ESTABLISHING TOW ZONES - MORNING AND AFTERNOON PEAK PERIODS; SCHEDULE XX OF SECTION 15-13.10 (1) (d) ESTABLISHING TOW ZONES - 24 HRS.; SCHEDULE XXI OF SECTION 15-13.10 (1) (d) ESTABLISHING TOW ZONES - RESTRICTED PARKING OTHER THAN PEAK TRAFFIC HOURS; SCHEDULE XXII OF SECTION 15-14.5 (1) (d) ESTABLISHING PROHIBITED PARKING CERTAIN AREAS; AND SCHEDULE XXIV OF SECTION 15-15.1 (4) ESTABLISHING CURB LOADING ZONES.

SECTION 1. Chapter 15 (1976 Traffic Code), City and County of Honolulu, as amended, is hereby further amended in the following particulars:

- By amending Schedule XI of Sec. 15-8.3 (2) establishing no turns by adding thereto the following: "South King St. No right turn from South King St. into Bishop Street in the makai direction." "Ward Ave. No left turn from Ward Ave. into South Bermania St. in the ewa direction." "Ward Ave. No left turn from Ward Ave. into South King St. in the kokohau direction."
- By amending Schedule XIX of Sec. 15-13.10 (1) (d) establishing tow zones - morning and afternoon peak periods by amending the item relating to Kapiolani Blvd., both sides, between McCully St. and Harding Ave., to read: "Kapiolani Blvd., makai side, between McCully St. and University Ave."
- By amending Schedule XX of Sec. 15-13.10 (1) (d) establishing tow zones - 24 hrs. in the following particulars:

- By adding thereto the following: "Kooehoo Pl., makai side, commencing from the property line of 1066 and 1072 Kooehoo Place for a distance 85' in the kahuku direction."
- By deleting therefrom the following: "Kapiolani Blvd., mauka side, between Kamoku St. and the Manoa Palolo Drainage Canal."
- By amending the item listed below as follows: (a) By amending the item relating to Kapiolani Blvd., both sides, between McCully St. and Kalaheua Ave., to read: "Kapiolani Blvd., makai side, University Ave. to Harding Ave." (b) By amending the item relating to Kapiolani Blvd., mauka side, between Paani St. and McCully St., to read: "Kapiolani Blvd., mauka side, between Harding Ave. and Atkinson Dr."

- By amending Schedule XXI of Sec. 15-13.10 (1) (h) establishing tow zones - restricted parking other than peak traffic hours by adding thereto the following: "Kooehoo Pl., makai side, from a point 35' kahuku of the makapuu property line of 1064 Kooehoo Pl. for a distance 110' in the kahuku direction during the hours 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m., Tuesdays and Fridays, only." "Kooehoo Pl., makai side, from a point 8' kahuku of the makapuu property line of 1122 Kooehoo Pl. for a distance 285' in the kahuku direction during the hours 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m., Tuesdays and Fridays, only."
- By amending Schedule XXII of Sec. 15-14.5 (1) establishing prohibited parking certain areas by adding thereto the following: "Kamehameha Hwy., both sides, from the intersection of Hailu Road and Lipiluna Road to the kailua side of the Heaia Viaduct (Kamehameha Hwy. bridge over Heaia Stream)." "Kooehoo Pl., makai side, commencing from the property line of 1066 and 1072 Kooehoo Pl. for a distance 85' in the kahuku direction."

- By amending Schedule XXIV of Sec. 15-15.1 (4) subsection (1) establishing curb loading zones by amending item relating to Hamakua Dr., makai side, for a distance 30' in the waimanalo direction from a point 385' waimanalo of the waimanalo curbline prolongation of Hehiki St., to read: "Hamakua Dr., makai side, for a distance 45' in the waimanalo direction from a point 370' waimanalo of the waimanalo curbline prolongation of Hehiki St."

SECTION 2. This Schedule is hereby attached to and made a part of Article VI hereof and shall take effect ten (10) working days after its publication.
