#### Allied exercise ends

WASHINGTON - Some 60 ships and submarines and almost 200 aircraft from eight NATO nations have completed participation in two exercises.

Designated Mani. Sword North and Magic Sword South, both exercises we e designed to demonstrate and improve the capability of allied forces to conduct maritime operations under wartime conditions.

Admiral Harry Train II, U.S. Navy, the Supreme Allied Commander, Atlantic, and General Bernard Rogers, U.S. Army, the Supreme Allied Commander, Europe, scheduled

Exercise Magic Sword North, which took place in the orwegian sea from sept. 2-4, Vice Admiral James A. Lyons, U.S. Navy, Commander, Striking Fleet Atlantic. The exercise was comprised of two U.S. carrier battle groups which provided tactical air support to allied forces in Norway. Providing surface, air and subsurface opposition to these carrier battle groups were units from Norway and the United States.

Exercise Magic Sword South took place Sept. 7 and 8 in the North Sea. One U.S. carrier battle group participated. This exercise provided tactical air support to NATO forces in Denmark and Central Europe.

Units from Denmark, the Federal Republic of Germany, Norway and the United States provided opposition forces for Magic Sword South. Other nations that participated in these exercises included Canada, the Netherlands, Portugal and the United Kingdom.

# Pacific Force salutes creation

CAMP H.M. SMITH, Hawaii -Fleet Marine Force, Pacific will observe its 37th anniversary Thursday.

Commanded by Lieutenant General J.K. Davis, FMFPac encompasses about half the earth's surface and is composed of about 72,000 Marines. Fleet Marine Force Marines are those

assigned to the operating forces of series of reorganizations until the U.S. Navy, both in the Atlantic and Pacific Fleets.

THE FLEET MARINE Force was originally created in the 1930s as a permanent expeditionary force for amphibious operations. As a result, the FMF structural concept went through a moved to its present location at

1944 when the designation Headquarters, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, was officially established at Camp Catlin, Oahu, then Territory of Hawaii.


In June 1950, Headquarters, FMFPac was moved to quarters at Pearl Harbor. FMFPac then Camp Smith in January 1956. The camp was named after Marine General Holland M. Smith, a pioneer in the techniques of amphibious warfare and the first commanding general of FMFPac.

DURING WORLD WAR II, FMFPac was comprised of six Marine divisions, five aircraft wings and the service command. Following the war, the force was drastically cut in manpower. However, when the United Nations went to the aid of South Korea in 1950, FMFPac rapidly geared up for combat.

In September 1950 some 30,000 leathernecks of the 1st Marine Division and the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing began their decisive assault at Inchon, Korea.

From 1954 to 1964 various units of the FMFPac participated in military advisory programs in Southeast Asia. Then, in March 1965, the 9th Expeditionary Brigade went ashore at Danang, Vietnam. From that date until the early 1970s, FMFPac units supported the United States effort in Southeast Asia.

TODAY, FMFPAC IS COMprised of the III Marine Amphibious Force (3d Marine Division, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing and 3d Force Service Support Group) on Okinawa, Japan; the 1st Marine Division with its supporting elements at Camp Pendleton and Twenty-nine Palms, Calif.; the 3d Marine Aircraft Wing at El Toro and Tustin, Calif. and Yuma, Ariz.; and the 1st Marine Brigade here in Hawaii.

#### Exchange receives uniform sales

The first day of October is always a very busy day in the military and this Oct. 1 is no exception.

On that day all uniform items will be purchased at the Marine Corps Exchange instead of Cash Sales. In addition, the cost of many uniform items will increase that day, along with Marines' annual pay.

Just because everything happens on Oct. 1, the beginning of the new fiscal year, does not mean that the changes affect each other. Many Marines believe that the move from Cash Sales to the MCX and the proposed pay raise have caused the change in the price of uniform items. This is not

According to a bulletin issued

by the Defense Personnel Support Center in Philadelphia, the source of supply for all uniform items, the move from Cash Sales has absolutely nothing to do with uniform cost increases.

Costs in production and transportation and the rising rate of inflation are just a few of the factors that determine the price of uniforms. These factors are reviewed annually and the results of the review determine the amount of the increase or decrease in uniform prices for the following fiscal year.

So if something has to be blamed for the rising cost of uniforms, the blame lies on the beginning of the new fiscal year, not the move from Cash Sales or. the annual pay raise.

# Civilians hold hearing for helipad's approval

Last year, Governor George Ariyoshi released funds for a helipad to be built at Castle Hospital. Funds were also appropriated for helipad improvements in Waianae and Kahuku. Pending final approvals, the helipad will become a reality for Castle Hospital by spring of 1982, said Ron Combs, Vice-President.

A site for the pad has been selected on a hill on the Kalanianaole Highway side of the hospital. The need for a helipad became apparent when an increase in hospital outpatients and employees made it a problem for the parking lot to be cleared for helicopter landings.

This situation was paired with the increased use by U.S. Army (Medevac) emergency choppers who bring critical patients or transport them to other hospitals. The addition of the helipad would meet the need of immediate availability and unobstructed accessibility of medical care for the 120,000 residents of Windward

#### Is the country ready to abandon the all-volunteer force and return to the draft?

EDITOR'S NOTE — This article is reprinted from the Navy Times.

After eight years of turbulent and controversial existence, the notion that the All-Volunteer Force is working still persists in many quarters. Yet, there are increasing signs that support for the AVF is eroding. In fact, some of its most ardent supporters appear to be defecting. Perhaps it's a sign of the times wherein it is again respectable and even fashionable to espouse conservative and patriotic views. Perhaps, on the other hand, it's merely a result of the aging process; as the arteries grow harder, political conservatism, patriotism and religion seem to set in

WHATEVER THE CAUSES, there are many doves-turned-hawks fluttering about lately. Speaking before a gathering of San Diego's City Club members recently in La Jolla, Mr. James Fallows, an Atlantic Monthly magazine editor and author of the new book "National Defense," spoke of his early opposition to the Vietnam conflict and opposition to the Vietnam conflict and revealed candidly that he had once intentionally lost weight in order to avoid being drafted. In criticizing the increasing complexity of military hardware and the growing gap between technology and human qualifications in the armed services, Fallows, who was a speechwriter for President Jimmy Carter, stated that "the machinery almost never matters as much as the character and cohesion of the people in the armed forces." So saying, he criticized the all-volunteer concept and called for some form of selective service. "I think that is the only way to have any kind of a representative armed force," he stated. "You have a military force now that is much less

force now that is much less representative of the country than you had in Vietnam." Few advocates of the

draft could have stated it better or with greater credibility. Spoken like a hawk!

THE ARGUMENTS ON THE table in favor of a return to some form of draft seem to outweigh those in favor of struggling on with the AVF. Popular arguments on behalf of the latter seem to boil down to two basic ones, to wit: (1) the

boil down to two basic ones, to wit: (1) the draft would do little to aid in the retention of skilled supervisors and journeymen; and, (2) because resumption of the draft would be unpopular, its reimposition would prove to be a severe political liability.

In an article appearing in The Wall Street Journal (May 26, 1981), Gen. William C. Westmoreland, Army Chief of Staff for four years during the Vietnam conflict, stated his belief that the American public, including our the American public, including our young men, would gracefully accept a return to conscription based on lottery selection with minimum deferments. "It would," he acknowledged, "also resurface the radical leaders of the past decade, who will attempt to rally their old constituencies, but their chants will

I'm not certain that many of the old leaders will even stand up to chant in opposition. Former Sen. Eugene McCarthy recently admitted, before an astonished college audience, that he favored a return to the draft. Even Sen. George McGovern has made recent hawkish sounds about the need to strengthen the armed forces of this country. In any event, the popular mood has never, in eight long and dismal years of the AVr., been more receptive.

WITH REGARD TO THE OTHER leading argument against the draft to the effect that it would do little for retention, it is always instructive to probe some of the reasons why experience noncommissioned and petty officers leave the services at the height of their usefulness. It is not always simply a matter of more pay. It may be that more and more of them are tired of coping with the problems of skill shortages and declining recruit quality. If it did nothing else, a truly universal draft with no college deferments would certainly improve the quality of the recruit base, at least to some degree, providing larger percentages of trainable people.

It is further argued by those who oppose a return to the draft that the armed forces need motivated voung their usefulness. It is not always simply

oppose a return to the graft that the armed forces need motivated young people, not conscripts. This argument assumes that the bulk of the current volunteers are driven by some loftier motivethan merely the need for a job and that the bulk of the draftees would be resistant to the idea of service to country. The need to escape unemployment may not be the most effective incentive to

serve in a combat force. In fairness, there are other respectable arguments against the draft. Its administration could add to the cost of government. It could lessen enthusiasm for continued compensation improve-ments (which could be viewed as an ments (which could be viewed as an argument for or against, depending where one sits). It would contribute modestly to the ranks of the unemployed when some of the untrainables, who might otherwise be recruited, have to seek work in the civilian sector.

BUT THE ARGUMENTS ON behalf of a return to the draft seem to me to be overwhelming. It would, as Westmoreland and others have pointed out, ease the burden and expense of the recruiting effort, more than compensating for the expense of administering selective service. It would, as Fallows and others have said, result in a military force more representative of the country than is the case now, It would improve the quality of recruits. It would symbolize a rejection of

the misguided notion that service to country is not a fundamental obligation but rather a matter of choice and

Creation of a conscripted force of recruits could facilitate targetting recruits could facilitate targetting compensation increases to the career force where they are more effective in improving retention. It would improve morale among the career force members who are concerned over the dicipline problems posed by a continuing decline in recruit quality. Above ull, it would send a clear and unmistakable message to potential adversaries that we are deadly serious about regaining military pre-eminence; a message more vivid, pre-eminence; a message more vivid, perhaps, even than the reactivation of battleships.

Public sentiment appears increas ingly receptive to a return to at least some form of federal service obligation. Many feel that if young people have an aversion to military service, they should be permitted to serve their country in some other way. What is meant by "some other way." however, is seldom clear. It sounds like a noble idea, but it should be recalled that the objective is to man a military force, not re-invent the Job and military force, not re-invent the Job and Peace Corps. Creating new non-military forms of service would require a cumbersome administrative apparatus which would increase the cost of government and the taxpayers' burden in return for advantages that may not limited the apparatus justify the expense.

IT SHOULD ALSO BE KEPT IN IT SHOULD ALSO BE KEPT IN mind that a draft would serve as an inducement for many qualified young persons to volunteer in order to take advantage of special programs and options. The draft, in fact, would probably touch few lives directly, but it would touch all of us indrectly in that, in the long run, it would actually serve to unify us as a nation, after the initial scattered whining subsides.


