Pass in Review

Barracks COLA added

HQMC, WASHINGTON — "Barracks COLA" is on the way for Marines without dependents stationed overseas.

The new cost of living allowance will be paid to Marines assigned at permanent duty stations outside the United States, including Hawaii and Alaska. Payment of barracks COLA will not start until a change to the Joint Travel Regulations has been published, according to ALMAR 007/82.

The FY82 DoD Appropriations Act set the barracks COLA rate at 47 percent of the rate set in the JTR for members without dependents.

The allowance will be authorized when both government quarters and messing are available and will also be applicable to geographical bachelors serving on dependents restricted tours in Western Pacific, according to officials here.

Enlisted per diem reduced

HQMC, WASHINGTON — The daily enlisted Marine per diem allowance was recently reduced \$4.50 by the FY82 DoD Appropriations Act.

According to ALMAR 007/82, the reduction was enacted to preclude what was seen as a duplicate payment of the Basic Allowance for Subsistence.

The only exception provided by the law, according to officials here, is enlisted Marines on TAD and receiving BAS and Subsistence in Kind will not have their per diem reduced, but will not be entitled to the BAS. This exception applies to Marines on the Unit Deployment Program and designated Marine Amphibious Units.

The per diem and BAS reduction became effective Dec. 29, but according to officials here, the BAS reduction will not be reflected until the Jan. 29 payday.

Survivor benefits decrease

HQMC, WASHINGTON — Survivor benefits for dependency and indemnity compensation paid by the Social Security Administration were recently reduced.

Under the 1981 Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act, surviving spouses are now entitled to receive benefits until the youngest child is 16 years old, a two-year reduction in benefits. Children will continue to receive benefits until they are 18 years of age.

According to the Social Security Administration, under the new law, payments to college or other post-secondary students now on the rolls will be phased out by 1985.

Payments for students attending college or post-secondary schools, who first became entitled to social security benefits for September 1981 or later, can be made only for months they attend school full-time through July 1982. There will be no new entitlements for college or post-secondary students after July 1982.

For students attending high school or elementary school, payments will now end when the student reaches 19, effective with benefits for months after July 1982.

The \$255 lump sum death payment can now only be paid to an eligible husband, wife or child.

The reconciliation act went into effect Oct. 1.

Retirement pay policy

HQMC, WASHINGTON — One accurately completed form in a Marine's record book can help his next of kin know if he has had a serious or fatal accident.

The Record of Emergency Data form is essential for fast notification of next of kin as well as payment of decedent benefits, if necessary, according to personnel affairs officials here.

Delays in making casualty notification or settlement of benefits because of an inaccurate RED make an already difficult situation much worse.

Time is of the essence for making notification to next of kin when a Marine becomes a casualty, and outdated or incorrect information delays notification, according to officials.

In addition, an inaccurate RED can also impose a financial hardship on a Marine's survivors, and strain the goodwill between the Marine Corps and surviving family members.

Whenever information on the RED changes, Marines should go to their unit administrative office to complete a new RED. Some reasons for updating a RED are marriage, relocation of dependents or address change.

Update emergency data

HQMC, WASHINGTON — A modified method of computing retirement pay became effective Jan. 1 for Marines requesting retirement after that date.

With the passage of the 1982 Defense Appropriations Bill, military retirement service credit exceeding six months of a year will now be rounded to the nearest month. Previously, the excess was rounded to the next full year, according to manpower officials here.

For example, a Marine who has completed 22 years, six months, 17 days of active duty, would be credited with 22 years, seven months, instead of a full 23 years. Anything less than six months will continue to be dropped, according to the officials.

Marines currently in the Fleet Marine Reserve or who requested retirement prior to Jan. 1, are not affected by this change.

National commemoration highlights black history

WASHINGTON — It has been said that history is a witness of the times, the torch of truth, the teacher of life and the messenger of antiquity. Without history, people are rootless and, like a plant without roots, cannot grow and stretch forth to their rightful place in the sun. Nor can a rootless people take their place among other people of the world.

Who are Afro-Americans? Leone Bennet, in his book *Before the Mayflower*, tells of 20 Afro-American men

and women who arrived in 1619 as indentured servants, not as slaves. HE DESCRIBES the heritage of Afro-Americans as the children of the gentle Mandingo, the spirited Hausas, the creative Yourbas and others too numerous to name. Their civilizations included the wealth and power of Ghana and the scholarly cities of Timbuktu, Mali, Songhay, Egypt and the kingdom of Kush. The achievements of Afro-Americans have slowly appeared in

history books. The following people received no recognition until the black awareness movement updated history: Dr. Nathan Hale Williams, heart surgeon and founder of Chicago's Providence Hospital; Elijah McCoy, inventor of the self-lubricator which is used in trains, boats and other continually-run machinery; Dr. Charles Drew, developer of blood plasma and first director of the Red Cross Blood Bank; Dr. Ralph Bunche, Nobel Peace Prize recipient and former secretary general of the United Nations; and Matthew Henson, explorer,

interpreter and the first man to reach the North Pole in Admiral Perry's expedition.

BUT WHAT about today's Afro-Americans? Beginning with the leadership of Dr. Martin Luther King, they sat in, rode in and walked throughout this nation to win rights already guaranteed in the Constitution.

The results have begun to show somewhat as Afro-Americans begin to hold high positions in federal and local government and in the military. Twenty-two percent of the deaths in Vietnam were of Afro-Ameri-

can service members. In essence, Afro-Americans have worked, fought and died to help make this nation great. Yet, somehow, these achievements have been "lost, stolen or strayed."

Young Afro-Americans, the Americans of the future, now have role models who not only live in American but are part of its strength and its future growth. The military, in particular, has provided youth with many significant role models to emulate.

But what of the future? It is the opinion of many that the theme of the Constitution of

equality and justice for all has not changed and that we have begun to realize some of the benefits.

Feb. 1 marked the beginning of the national commemoration of Black History Month and Feb. 8 through 14 is Black History Week.

This year's theme is "Afro-American (Black) History — Blueprint for Survival." This observance provides an opportunity for all Marines to develop additional understanding for Black Americans and their contribution to our nation.



Pass and ID section relocates

For those who have experienced delays in receiving ID cards and firearm registrations due to the procedures at the Security Department, cheer up. A new system is going into effect Monday.

The Security Department ID section will be moved from the H-3 gate to the back entrance of Building

1096. "This will give the supervisors better control over personnel and will save the recipients a lot of time," said Chief Warrant Officer-2 Harriet Voisine, Administration Officer, Security Department.

"In the past, ID card forms or firearm registration forms were received from the unit

administrative section and taken to H-3 gate where a card was typed up and a picture taken. Then the card was sent to the Security Department, Building 1096 to be signed by an authorized officer at the department," she explained.

Once signed, it was returned to H-3 gate for pickup by the Marine or dependent. This

took a lot of time. Due to gas and convenience reasons, the cards were not brought to Building 1096 until there were a sufficient number of them. This usually caused overnight delay.

However, under the new system, the cards will be filled out and pictures taken at Building 1096 and brought immediately

into the Security Department for signature by CWO-2 Voisine or another authorized department officer. This process will only take an hour to an hour-and-a-half at the most depending on the wait for pictures.

"We're trying to cut it down to just a bare 2 Voisine. "However, amount of time," said CWO-2 Voisine. The hours of operation are

from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Due to insufficient parking space, Marines and their dependents are asked to use the access road next to Building 1096 to get to the back entrance. "For the first month or so it might be difficult," noted CWO-2 Voisine. "However, signs will be posted directing applicants where to park."

Harmful

American Medical Association labels marijuana as "dangerous drug"

WASHINGTON — The American Medical Association has stated, "There is now no doubt that marijuana is a dangerous drug, with great potential for serious harm."

Studies reviewed by the association point to a growing body of evidence from both animal and human experiments and from clinical observations that marijuana is "by no means" a harmless amusement.

That conclusion supports the statement by Admiral Thomas Hayward, Chief of Naval Operations, last month that, "Habitual use of illegal drugs ultimately results in tragedy both to the user and, all too frequently, to fellow shipmates." ADM Hayward's statement was contained in NAVOP 172/81, which announced a "Get-Tough" policy on drugs and drug offenders.


Recent research shows that

cannabinoids contain psychoactive substances of high potency and rapid onset. These substances target the brain and cause changes in brainwave patterns. Acute marijuana intoxication impairs learning memory, comprehension, thinking and general intellectual performance. Adverse psychological consequences may be long-lasting.

Other organs are also affected. Marijuana smoke contains larger

amounts of cancer-causing hydrocarbons than tobacco smoke. Bronchitis and emphysema are common in regular users and lung damage can appear in three months with daily use.

Studies have raised the concern that chronic use may have the potential to cause at least temporary infertility. Sperm abnormalities have been noted among lab animals.

Most traffic regulations apply to cyclists

Police cite bicycle riders, too

Decrease considerably the size of the motor on a motorcycle and you've got a moped. Take the motor off completely and you've got a bicycle. Well not quite, but when it comes to traffic laws, that's basically the only difference between the three. In other words, yes, you can get a traffic ticket while riding your bike.

WITH VERY few exceptions, all traffic regulations pertaining to motor vehicles apply to operators of bicycles, and parents are directly responsible for the actions of their bike-riding children.

required to obey all the laws of the road including halting at stop signs and yielding the right of way. Riders must stay as far to the right of the road as possible and use bicycle lanes if they are provided.

According to Station regulations, every bicycle that is ridden on the Air Station at night must be equipped with a white light, not a reflector, that is visible 500 feet to the front. A red reflector is sufficient for the rear of the bicycle. The

bicycle must also be equipped with a bell or horn capable of giving an audible signal within 100 feet. Sirens are prohibited on bicycles.

BICYCLES HAVE always been prime targets for thieves. The Security Department suggests protecting bicycles by recording the serial number, model number and a complete description. When not in use, bicycles should be secured with a lock and chain, to a stationary

object. If a bicycle is lost or stolen it should be reported immediately to the Honolulu Police Department and the Station's Security Department.

Devildogs prepare for CREE "Rattler's" bite

The steward's disembodied voice sounded over the 737's public address system, "Welcome aboard special Aloha Airlines flight one-one to Hilo."

Flight one-one's 125 passengers were leathernecks from 3d Battalion, 3d Marines; 1st Battalion, 12th Marines and Brigade Service Support Group, 1st Marine Brigade, enroute to Pohakuloa Training Area on the Big Island. Eleven Aloha flights transported

Marines to the Hilo Airport, where they were transferred to PTA to take part in 3/3's Combat Readiness Evaluation Exercise "Rattler."

Preparations for CREE "Rattler" began at PTA Jan. 19 when the advance party arrived to set the stage for the battalion exercise. PTA was occupied Jan. 22 and 23 by the battalion's main body. They immediately started preliminary training

to sharpen their combat skills for CREE "Rattler."

Each of 3/3's companies, 1/12's batteries and BSSG's support units engaged in individual training during the two weeks prior to Rattler.

Infantry companies practiced various tactics such as, night defense and attack, company defense, deliberate attack and patrolling techniques. They also engaged in Nuclear Biological Chemical defense team training and first

aid in a cold weather environment.

The 1/12 artillery batteries trained in similar scenarios using the techniques necessary to supply support to the infantry Marines. In addition, they were afforded the opportunity to test their skill and accuracy with the big guns on live fire ranges.

BSSG added its skills by providing motor transportation, maintenance and numerous other support activities.

The air team joined its infantry counter-

parts by providing Marine logistics flights between PTA and MCAS Kaneohe Bay. CH-46 Sea Knights from Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-165 and CH-53 Sea Stallions from Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron-463 were also used to provide close-air support to the 3/3 leathernecks.

With the advance projects completed, Battalion Landing Team 3/3 prepares itself to receive the scenario for CREE Rattler, Saturday.





Family Service Centers offer keiki car seats

More children, under the age of four, die every year from automobile accidents than from any other cause. An automobile accident at 40 mph is about the same as falling off a four-story building.

Parents may be sentencing their children to death by holding them on their lap in the front seat. A woman weighing 130 pounds can exert more than 5,000 pounds of pressure on her child as they slam against the dashboard in an accident at 40 mph. Even if the mother is wearing a seat belt, a 20-pound child can still hit the dashboard with a force equal to

approximately 800 pounds. A child sitting unrestrained in the back seat has only a slightly better chance of surviving an accident than when sitting in the front seat.

DEFENSIVE DRIVING can help save children but only buckling the children into some type of restraining device will effectively reduce the chance of injury or death.

The Family Services Center at the Air Station has been offering the Keiki Auto Restraint program since October 1981. Military personnel and their dependents may check out one of more than 40

car seats for children up to the age of four.

The car seats are loaned free of charge, on a first come first serve basis for a period of three months, according to Sergeant Cindy Newbold of the Family Services Center here.

Anyone borrowing the car seats must sign a contract waiving the Family Services Center of all liability. Before the car seats are loaned out, Sgt Newbold explains how the seats are to be used.

There has been a huge demand for the car seats, according to Sgt Newbold, and although the car seats are in extremely short supply right now, the Family Services Center plans to order

more. For more information about borrowing a car seat for your child contact the Family Services Center at 257-3606.

THE FAMILY SERVICES Center at the Naval Station, Pearl Harbor has a slightly different type of infant car seat program.

At Pearl Harbor, infant car seats are rented to interested Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard personnel and their dependents for \$7.50 per month. At the end of six months the infants car seat is traded for a toddler-size car seat. At that same time, the person renting the car seat has paid for it and the toddler car seat is theirs to keep.

According to Navy Counselor First Class Iggy Soriano, Family Services Center, Pearl Harbor, "All you have to do is rent the car seat for six months and it's yours to keep." He added that all of their toddler car seats are brand new and approved by the National Safety Council.

Before renting the car seats, NCI Soriano gives instructions on how to use the seats, points out safety factors and advises people of the infant car seats that are not

approved by the National Safety Council.

The Family Services Center at Pearl Harbor has approximately 150 car seats for rent, and although there currently is no waiting list, they are rented on a first come first served basis.

CAR SEATS CAN be rented at the Family Services Center at Pearl Harbor Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. For more information call 474-1256.

Sonics slip past H&MS-24, Radiomen down Navy

With three seconds left Corporal Mark Thompson sank an insurance free throw allowing the Sonics of Maintenance Company, Brigade Service Support Group, to win their 16th straight game, 43-41, over Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron-24, Saturday at Hangar 103.

"This was the toughest game all season," stated Staff Sergeant Dan Thompson, coach, after the

Sonics won their first game of the playoffs.

As the two teams exchanged baskets in a foot race, H&MS-24 shaved two points off the Sonic lead 34-32.

Cpl Delbert Boards found his mark and hit on three jump shots and for the first time since the start of the second half H&MS-24 had the lead.

Now H&MS-24 controlled the game until their three-on-one was broken up. Cpl Boards made another jumper and Private First Class Ricky Hicks scored on a tip-in. PFC Hicks completed a three-point play and with two

minutes left the Sonics regained the lead 39-38.

H&MS-24 stepped on the line on an inbounds pass, which was a costly turnover.

Cpl Brooklin, capitalizing on the mistake, hit a jumper as he was fouled. Again he went to the line, sank the free throw and increased the Sonics' lead to four.

With 1:39 remaining Sgt Smith's clutch basket brought his team within two points.

As a minute ticked away, Cpl Boards was fouled and went to the line shooting one-and-one. The first shot was good but his second, which could have tied the game, was off the mark and the game's leading rebounder, PFC Hicks, came down with the ball.

Committing a foul to stop the clock, H&MS-24 couldn't score in the final three seconds to send the game into overtime.

Major James Wilson's, Commanding Officer of Maintenance Company, post game comment was "... it was too close for comfort," as he looked up at the scoreboard. Again he glanced up at the clock to reassure himself that his team actually did win, and boasted, "We're No. 1!" He continued, "Even though we made a lot of errors out there, we are still the greatest." "Don't get me wrong," he added, "it's still anybody's tournament and the hungriest team is going to take it."

LCpl George Smith, connecting with 17 points, and teammate Cpl Bruce Randleman, hitting nine out of 12 shots from the foul line, led 1st Radio Battalion to a decisive 49-46 win over the Navy.

The A division's second-ranked Navy committed 24 fouls, sending Cpl Randleman to the line on


numerous occasions where he scored all but two of his points.


