Funds bridge gap

WASHINGTON — Ten college scholarships worth up to \$500 each will be awarded for the 1982-83 school year to members of the Reserve Officers Association (ROA) of the United States, the Reserve Officers Association Ladies, or their children.

Known as the Henry J. Reilly Memorial Scholarship Program, the awards honor the late Army Reserve brigadier general who was ROA's first president, 1922-23.

THE SCHOLARSHIPS are being given for the first time this year. The ROA announcement described them as ROA's modest contribution to bridging the funding gap "in a time of drastically declining availability of public scholarship funds."

It also noted that scholarships may "help recipients become more productive citizens and incline them more toward support of ROA's mission in the area of national defense."

Applicants must be attending or accepted for full-time studies at a college or university. They must maintain at least a 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale, be of good moral character, and show appropriate leadership qualities.

Consideration will be given to academic achievement in high school and potential for college success. Financial need will also be a factor.

AS MORE FUNDS become available, ROA plans to expand the number of scholarships. Scholarships to publically supported junior and community colleges having minimum tuition and fees are excluded.

Application forms are available from the Chairman, Scholarship Board of Trustees, Henry J. Reilly Memorial Scholarship Fund, ROA, 1 Constitution Ave., N.E., Washington, D.C., 20002.

ROA was founded in 1922 and chartered by Congress in 1950 to advise on matters of national security. Membership includes 128,000 officers of all services.

Leathernecks erect kids' activity center

The kids at the Child Care Center here have something new to climb on, thanks to several Marines from 3d Engineers, Brigade Service Support Group.

The engineers spent Friday, Saturday and Monday, erecting a new activity center for toddlers. The center features two swings, a climbing platform and a slide.

"We were really glad to find someone to put it in," commented Susan Cleveland, director of the Child Care Center. Cleveland said that parent volunteers do a lot of work at the center, but sometimes they need expertise to complete a project.

Cleveland explained that the \$1,200 activity center spent several months in limbo waiting

for someone to put it together. The problem the volunteers faced was anchoring the supports into the ground. That's where the engineers proved invaluable with their working knowledge of concrete.

"It makes me feel good to help the little kids," said Lance Corporal Stan Moszynski, 3d Engineers. The other volunteers felt the same way, and the group returned Saturday to help paint playground equipment.

"It's worth a lot to have it done," Cleveland said, "but I couldn't place a dollar value on it." The true value, though, can be found in the children's laughs and smiles.

Child care

Temporary facility will handle overflow

A temporary drop-in day care facility will open at the Pre-School building sometime this summer, according to Major M.R. Massie, Special Services officer.

The temporary facility is designed to handle the large number of drop-in patrons being turned away from the Child Care Center due to overcrowding there. According to Massie, the Child Care Center is currently at capacity with space for 97 children.

DURING MARCH, surveys were sent to more than 1,800 family housing units on the air station to determine the number of people who would use drop-in child care services. "Only about 350 of the surveys have been returned so far," said Massie.

Despite the lack of response from Marines and sailors in the family housing units, "We know that there is a need for more child care," Massie said.

The temporary drop-in child care facility will be situated in Classroom No. 5 of the Pre-School now located in Building 1391, sometime in July or August. Classroom No. 5 was selected because of its size, location within the Pre-School complex, the fact that the room has its own access

and because the Pre-School facilities are not fully utilized.

The opening of the temporary facility will not affect the Pre-School operation, and programs currently in effect at the Pre-School will continue, according to Massie.

Once the temporary facility is opened, patrons will continue to take their drop-in children to the Child Care Center first. If that facility is full, patrons will then be directed to the temporary facility at the Pre-School.

THE TEMPORARY drop-in facility will be used until a new addition to the existing Child Care Center is completed. Construction of the \$250,000-\$275,000 addition that will provide room for an additional 30 to 35 children is scheduled to begin within the next six months.

Also, said Massie, a major change to the Marine Corps Order (MCO 1710.30) governing child care is scheduled to be made soon, legally authorizing baby sitting services within family housing areas. Guidelines for family day care are contained in the new instruction and will be distributed shortly after the receipt of the new order. The commanding officer can approve family day care in government housing upon the tenant's request.

Abandoned sailboat discovered

Navy cargo ship recovers boat

PEARL HARBOR — A 42-foot sailboat discovered abandoned at sea was put ashore here by the USS Mobile when the amphibious cargo ship arrived at Pearl Harbor April 6.

The sailboat named "Sinderella" (correct spelling) is in good shape except for a broken mast and tattered rigging.

It was sighted adrift and abandoned April 4, 850 miles west of San Diego by a squadron of ships enroute to Pearl Harbor to take part in training exercises in Hawaiian waters.

The Mobile, an 18,600-ton cargo ship, was ordered to change course and hoisted the 10-ton yacht aboard with one of its huge cargo cranes.

THE MOBILE'S COMMANDING officer, Captain W. S. Christenson, sent advance word by naval message that the boat was "in excellent condition except for mast and associated rigging, which was badly damaged during unstepping."

The "Sinderella" was unloaded and towed to a Ford Island pier, where it will be retained in Navy custody until all claims are settled. According to the Coast Guard, the boat is owned by Richard Peterson of San Diego and is insured by the National American Insurance Co. of San Diego. Its value is estimated at \$250,000.

Navy officials at Pearl Harbor received

this message describing the recovery effort:

"On the afternoon of April 4, ships of an amphibious task group enroute to Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, encountered an abandoned 42-foot sailboat later identified as the 'Sinderella' at a position approximately 850 miles from San Diego and 1,400 miles from Honolulu.

"It was late afternoon when lookouts aboard the USS Cleveland spotted a lone sailboat on the horizon. The landing platform dock reported the contact to the task group commander who dispatched the landing ship tank USS Bristol County to investigate.

"As USS Bristol County approached the vessel, it was noted that only a very tattered Genoa sail was flying; the main sail was down. No one was aboard and it appeared that it had been adrift for quite some time, although in excellent condition.

"USS BRISTOL County reported the results to Commander, Amphibious Squadron 7 who in turn dispatched USS Mobile, an amphibious cargo ship, to determine the feasibility of hoisting the yacht. After determining that the yacht could be hoisted aboard with one of its eight 15-ton booms, the motor whale boat towed the sailboat alongside Mobile. After unstepping the mast, cargo nets were improvised to make a boat sling. Mobile's

crew demonstrated superior seamanship as they lifted the 'Sinderella' to its main deck. Mobile's crew used shoring to construct a makeshift but sturdy boat skid for use during the remainder of the transit to Hawaii.

"Documentation found on the boat indicated its value at approximately \$250,000. Almost no personal clothing or food were found aboard the boat, adding to the mystery of its voyage in the vast Pacific.

"This was USS Mobile's second sailboat recovery in as many trips between California and Hawaii. The last recovery occurred in June 1980 when USS Mobile returned an adrift sailboat and its occupants to San Diego.

"USS CLEVELAND, USS Bristol County and USS Mobile are transiting to Hawaii in company with the amphibious assault ship USS New Orleans and tank landing ships USS Tuscaloosa, USS Peoria and USS San Bernadino. The ships of the task group are under the command of CAPT John Higginson, U.S. Navy, Commander, Amphibious Squadron 7. All are homeported in San Diego with the exception of USS Mobile, which is based in Long Beach, Calif.

"The task group was steaming to Hawaii to participate in Exercise RIMPAC '82."

Marines rescue downed pilot

CAMP S.D. BUTLER, Japan — A Marine Corps CH-46 helicopter crew rescued the pilot of an Air Force F-15 Fighter who crashed into the ocean near here about 3 p.m. April 16.

Captains Dave Ramsey and Fred Kunkle, with crew chief Staff Sergeant Ken Walker, all attached to Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-268, Marine Aircraft Group-36, 1st Marine Aircraft Wing, were on a routine flight when they were diverted by a control tower alert to the crash site 40 miles northwest of Kadena.

The first of two HMM-268 aircraft to arrive at the scene, the crew immediately began rescue procedures.

"Once establishing radio contact with the downed pilot, Capt Ramsey piloted our bird to an up-wind position and maintained a steady hover," explained Kunkle, co-pilot in the rescue. "It was then my job to monitor altitude and engine instruments, insuring salt spray didn't envelop the engines.

Walker, as crew chief, lowered the hoist into the water, ensured the pilot was hooked up, lifted him with the hoist and finally pulled him through the helo's hell-hole, according to Kunkle.

"As in any rescue operation, crew coordination was instrumental in the successful completion of the mission," stressed Kunkle, who was on the scene of another recent sea rescue when the CH-46 he was co-piloting rescued two distressed divers west of Bolo Point March 18.

The F-15 pilot, Capt. Rick Carrier, was on a routine training mission from the 67th Tactical Fighter Squadron, 18th Tactical Fighter Wing, Kadena Air Base. He suffered no apparent injuries, according to an Air Force spokesman.

The 11th District Maritime Safety Board said there were no ships or fishing boats navigating in the vicinity of the crash site and no civilian damage was reported. The accident is under investigation.

"Top" shares memories of 35 years service

"If somebody had told me in 1946 that I'd be staying in the Marine Corps until 1982, I probably would have punched them in the mouth," said Master Gunnery Sergeant Harvey Wiegert, Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 24, as he reflected on more than 35 years of service in the Marine Corps.

"I was going to join the Navy but the line was too long," he said, "and while I was standing in line I saw posters across the room about the Marine Corps. I went over to ask the guys in blue what they were doing, and the next thing I knew I was going for a physical."

LOOKING A LITTLE tired, but otherwise in good spirits, (after a recent kidney stone operation, which kept him on active duty for six more weeks), Wiegert recalled more than a quarter of a century of military service.

The master gunnery sergeant pondered upon the numerous duty stations at which he has served, such as Cherry Point, N.C.; Iwakuni, Japan; Pusan, Korea; and South Vietnam.

"The Marine Corps was in a hurry back in 1946 to build up Marine Aircraft Group 22 at MCAS, Cherry Point," he said. "They pulled a lot of us going into the aviation MOS out of boot camp before graduation and sent us to Cherry Point. We had completed everything in boot camp except mess duty. They just packed us up and sent us off."

Wiegert said that he was never a trouble maker, but he did have a few problems when he entered the Corps. He was put on report in 1946 by General Alexander A. Vandegrift. Vandegrift was then Commandant of the Marine Corps, and during an IG inspection noted that the heels on Wiegert's dress shoes were too worn for Marine Corps standards.

"The only thing that saved me was the fact that I had another pair of shoes at the



cobbler," said Wiegert. "I had to borrow the money to get them out and the CO said okay after that, but to keep myself squared away."

WEIGERT SAID THAT the Marine Corps was a lot stricter in the '40s, but it was always fair to him. "I never had a problem with the Marine Corps not being fair to me," he said. "If I did what I was supposed to do, I didn't get into trouble."

After his brief tour at Cherry Point, the Marine Corps discharged 17,000 Marines to cut down expenses. Wiegert was one of them, and was released from active duty in May 1947. However, after six months of punching a clock at a civilian job, he reenlisted and joined the Marine Corps Reserve Unit at Glenview, Ill.

In March 1951, his reserve unit was called to active duty.

"That was the hardest time I've ever had in the Marine Corps," he said. "I was supposed to go to Korea when I came back on active duty in '51, but instead I got stuck at MCAS, El Toro, Calif. sending everyone else over there. I was a buck sergeant at the time. My wife quit her job

to follow me. We couldn't afford to move our furniture, and I wasn't authorized to take her — so we were paying on our apartment in Chicago as well as the apartment we were living in at El Toro. My wife was expecting to go back to Chicago when I was sent to Korea. Since I never went that time, she stayed for six months before going back to Chicago.

"Boy, that was a rough time! I used to bring home unused or extra guard-rations from the mess hall just so my wife could eat. She couldn't even get a job back then, because she wasn't a California resident."

AFTER 15 MONTHS at El Toro, Wiegert was released back to the weekend reserves in Glenview. He punched a clock for eight more months before deciding the civilian routine had no future for him. In March 1953, he signed up for active duty.

Wiegert finally made it to Korea in 1954, and remembers it as the coldest place he's ever been.

"Inchon was mainly a staging area and we stayed there until we were assigned somewhere permanent. I was finally sent to Pohang in Southern Korea."

In March 1955, Marines began to move out of Korea. The majority went to Hawaii to form the 1st Marine Brigade, and Wiegert was among them.

"After Korea, the warm weather in Hawaii felt good," said Wiegert. "I bought my first house on Kaneohe Bay Drive for \$75 a month."

During the next 12 years, Wiegert served at Morocco; Iwakuni, and Da Nang, South Vietnam.

He spent three months in Morocco supporting the "flying boxcars" with

engines during the Lebanon Crisis of 1958.

"I FIRST WENT TO Vietnam in 1964," said Wiegert. "I was a flight engineer with the KC-130s getting Marines, cargo, and supplies in and out of Vietnam. We were the Marine Corps' only air transportation."

Wiegert recalled a Viet Cong, the Marines named Charley, who used to hide at the end of the runways and shoot holes into the aircraft. Charley was hard to see and even harder to catch.

"Sometimes we would find holes in the gas tanks," said Wiegert. "I heard that one gunnery sergeant was killed."

Wiegert went to Vietnam a second time in 1969. He served as an administrator for Technical Representatives. "Every night the VC would be dropping rockets on us," he recalled. "Most of the rockets landed on the Air Force side of the field."

Following his second tour in Vietnam, he served once more at Cherry Point and Iwakuni before going back to Glenview to instruct reservists on aircraft.

Wiegert explained that teaching reservists was frustrating to him because everything that was taught in one weekend had to be repeated the following month. However, he did manage to qualify two reserve flight engineers.

In 1977, Wiegert was transferred once again to Kaneohe Bay. He was maintenance chief with Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 232 until April 1980 when he went to H&MS-24 as controller of group support equipment for the 1st Marine Brigade.

WEIGERT HAS SEEN A lot of

changes in the Marine Corps. "I've seen racial problems go from bad to good," he reflected. "We first had racial problems in the '50s. Now all Marines are green and it doesn't make any difference."

Wiegert has also noticed a change in the physical fitness program.

"The Marine Corps didn't get tough on physical fitness until around 1955. Individual squadrons were the only ones who pushed it. To graduate from boot camp, there was no physical fitness test. There was just no doubt that you would be fit."

Wiegert thinks the caliber of the average Marine is about the same today as it was in 1946. "However, since around the '60s we've had a slight drug problem," he noted. "I hate to see it happen and I'm glad the Marine Corps is fighting it."

This month, almost five years after reporting to his final duty station, Wiegert lays down his cover to retire.

At a retirement luncheon March 31 at the Staff Noncommissioned Officer's Club, Wiegert said humorously, "I asked for another two years, but they said to give someone else a chance."

MGySgt Bob Morley, H&MS-24 Group Maintenance Chief, presented Wiegert with a certificate of flag presentation, March 29, from 8:14 a.m. until sunset, the flag above the USS Arizona Memorial at Pearl Harbor was flown specifically for Wiegert.

THE RETIRING MARINE spoke briefly to the crowd gathered for him, and added his final thoughts, "Some people call what I'm doing retiring, but what I'm doing is going unemployed."

Wiegert plans to find a job in Hawaii and stay in Maunawili Village. He will try to get into the aircraft industries.

"The Marine Corps has always been good to me and my wife. We've always been secure. It's a darn good job and I advise every Marine to take a good look at the Corps before getting out. Make the best of what you've got."

FPCA or their application may not be processed. Most states require a separate FPCA for each election. Voters should make sure they specify the election for which they are requesting a ballot.

Information concerning registration and application requirements by state is available from your command voting officer or counselor, political party. Voters and in the Voting must indicate their party affiliation on the Navedra 4600-71D.

Students experience Corps

"We got a taste of the real Marine Corps and it's been a good experience," commented Patricia Averett, a Marine Corps Junior ROTC student.

Averett and 59 other Junior ROTC students from Tuba City, Ariz., were here April 3-12 for military orientation training. The students, who are mostly Hopi and Navajo Indians, were escorted by five chaperons, including three Marine instructors.

The Junior ROTC program is designed to develop leadership ability in high school students. The classes are taught by retired Marines.

Master Gunnery Sergeant Lloyd Wathen Jr. said the training here is

great for the kids and they "learned a lot about the 50th state and the people over here." More importantly, Wathen said, was that the students learned firsthand about the Navy/Marine Corps team.

Major J.T. Irons, officer in charge of the group, explained further. "They (the students) can learn more here than any other base because nowhere else can give them the full air/ground outlook."

The students spent 10 days here learning about the Corps, from the ground up. Demonstrations were provided by the 3d Marines, 3d Reconnaissance Battalion and other 1st Marine Brigade units, including several aircraft squadrons.

Students were treated to helicopter orientation rides by Station Operations and Maintenance

Squadron, boat rides by Waterfront Operations and VIP tours of jet aircraft here.

Marksmanship training and familiarization firing with the M-16, flights in F-4 and CH-46 simulators, and a tour of Brigade Service Support Group occupied many hours of their time, but the training didn't stop within the Station. The group traveled to Marine Barracks, Pearl Harbor, to see how things are run there.

They did get breaks from the military routine though.

Tours of the USS Arizona, the famous battleship named after their home state, the Submarine Museum and the Polynesian Culture Center provided them the chance to see more of Hawaii.

The cadets even found time to walk along Waikiki Beach.

Contracts legally bind consumers

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following article is the third of a series prepared by the Mobilization Training Unit (Law) VA-05, Fredericksburg, Va.

Despite the plethora of consumer protection laws enacted by the various states and the Federal government, it remains true now, as it always has, that the consumer's best protection is to carefully review all features of a transaction before signing.

The whole point of a contract, after all, is that it can be enforced, and in general a consumer who signs an installment sales contract or promissory note is not entitled to "rescind" (cancel) simply because he or she has second thoughts about the deal or is

disappointed with the goods or services.

THERE ARE SEVERAL exceptions, of course, such as where the credit is extended by the dealer and the goods turn out to be defective.

Also, under the Federal Truth in Lending Act, there is a cooling off period of three business days during which you may cancel any consumer credit transaction in which your house is used as security.

Several states have additionally passed laws giving a limited right of cancellation, or "rescission" as it is called, in certain special situations, such as door-to-door solicitations.

In the absence of a specific law permitting you to cancel, however, the general rule remains that a contract once entered into is binding. Obviously, then, if you have any question as to the meaning or effect of any document you are asked to sign, the time to see a lawyer or legal assistance officer is before you sign, not after.

A WORD OF WARNING also about co-signing. Depending on a would-be borrower's financial condition, a lender may insist on a co-signer on the note or contract. If you are asked to co-sign for someone else's loan or purchase, think long and hard before agreeing.

A co-signer is not merely

vouching for the integrity or good intentions of the principal borrower, but is actually promising to pay if the other person doesn't. The lender or seller has the right to demand that any co-signer — and that could be you — pay the whole amount due if the principal borrower does not.

Of course, if you are called upon to pay, you theoretically have a right to sue the person you co-signed for, but if the lender was unable to make that person pay, you are not likely to be any more successful.

The moral should be obvious: do not co-sign anything unless you are willing to accept the very real risk that you will have to pay for someone else's loan.

Hard drugs: Medical officials state use of narcotics affects physical and mental well-being

HQMC, WASHINGTON — Marines who use illegal drugs take risks, and according to medical officials, may be risking their very lives.

Individuals using these drugs may actually be playing physical roulette not only with their lives but with their mental well-being as well.

Marijuana use can lead to physical damage of the lungs, heart, throat, reproductive organs and other parts of the body where the fat soluble THC collects. Extreme amounts can cause hallucina-

tions, paranoid feelings, a clouding of the mental processes, disorientation, confusion, and marked memory impairment. Usage can also lead to mental illness, malnutrition or a failure to get treatment for other developing diseases or injuries.

Illegal use of amphetamines (speed, uppers, bennies, pep pills) can cause hallucinations, according to medical officials. They may also create a psychological and sometimes a physical dependence. Continued high dosages can cause heart problems, malnutrition and in some cases, death.

Cocaine (coke, flake, snow) use can

cause confusion, depression or hallucinations. The person using "coke" can develop a psychological dependence, destroy nasal membranes and cause damage to the lungs.

Misuse of barbiturates (barbs, goof balls, downers, blues, reds), tranquilizers, such as "valium" and "librium," and methaqualone (soapers, quads, ludes) may all cause confusion and loss of coordination. They may also lead to physical and psychological dependence. Overdoses can lead to a coma or death.

When depressants are taken in combination with alcohol, they are especially dangerous, said the officials.

LSU use can lead to hallucinations and/or panic. People may have "flashbacks" — recurrences of events during drug use — for years after they stop using the drug.

Mescaline, MDA, DMT and STP have effects similar to LSD.

Phencyclidine (PCP, angel dust) can create depressions, hallucinations, confusion and irrational behavior. An overdose can lead to convulsions, coma and or death.

Heroin, morphine, codeine and opium can create abnormal drowsiness, apathy, loss of judgment and self-control. Users also risk malnutrition and infectious

hepatitis. An overdose can cause convulsions, coma or death.

Delirants such as aerosol products, lighter fluid, or paint thinners can cause loss of coordination, confusion or hallucinations. Psychological dependence can develop. Also, permanent damage to lungs, brain, liver, throat and bone marrow may result. An overdose can cause convulsions or death.

The use of illegal drugs can only provide a false, temporary escape from the world. If you value your health and well-being, then you're one of the lucky ones. Lucky, because you understand that the risks involved aren't worth it.

Corps procures new weapon

QUANTICO, Va. — The Marine Corps has always been infantry oriented and its recent decision to procure the new Squad Automatic Weapon (SAW) lends credence to its efforts to sharpen the capability and fighting edge of the Marine infantryman.

Known as the Fabrique National MINIMI, the Belgian-made SAW will be the first such weapon to grace the Marine Corps' inventory since the days of the Browning Automatic Rifle (BAR).



"WE HAVEN'T HAD A SAW since we did away with the BAR," said Captain Richard Simmons, SAW Project Officer, Firepower Division, Development Center. "M-14 rifles were tried for a while, but were inadequate. When we adopted the M-16, the need for two types of rounds at the fire team level proved to be too much for a logistics problem."

Besides, since the M-16 rifles were equipped with an automatic rate of fire, the new infantry weapon virtually made everyone carrying the rifle an automatic rifleman.

Another problem that arose with having the M-16 used as a fully automatic weapon was its inability to maintain a high rate of fire for long periods of time because of the barrel getting hot and the need to constantly change magazines.

Actual research into the possibility of obtaining a SAW was first explored by the Army in the mid-'60s.

"Once the Department of the Army began looking for a suitable replacement for the BAR, they conducted extensive testing to determine the relative effectiveness of rifle and machinegun squads with various mixes of 5.56mm and 7.62mm ammunition," explained Simmons.

Preliminary results found that an improved version of the 5.56mm round was more conducive to a combat

environment as far as lethality and in the amount of rounds that could be carried by each soldier.

ADVANCED DEVELOPMENT of a SAW was initiated in February 1976 to develop a weapon to be matched with the 5.56mm round. Two candidates were singled out (the Gmm Ford Aerospace Communication Corporation XM235 and the Fabrique National MINIMI) but later that year, funds for testing were zeroed out of the budget and the entire project appeared to be scrubbed.

That was soon to change as funding for the project was incorporated into the budgets for FY78 and FY79. As a result, the FAAC XM235 was redesignated the XM248 and the MINIMI was designated the XM239. The testing, conducted at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Md., also included a modified M-16 with a much thicker quick change barrel for sustained automatic fire.

The latest round of testing officially began in April 1979 at Aberdeen and continued until February 1980. Once the tests were completed, the Army

selected the MINIMI as the SAW weapon for their troops. And, on Feb. 2, it was approved for service use and type classified.

The Marine Corps also plans to adopt the MINIMI as the Corps' new SAW which can be used in conjunction with the 5.56mm round.

Besides the Army and the Marine Corps purchasing these new weapons, the Air Force and the Coast Guard have also expressed interest which will be in a joint-service contract. Currently, the Marine Corps' FY82 budget calls for ordering over 2,000 of these new machine guns.

"WE EXPECT TO SEE initial deliveries in the summer of 1983," said Capt. Simmons. "Shortly thereafter, they'll be seen in the field."

"The aim of the Corps is to provide a SAW for each fire team."

The Fabrique National MINIMI, valued at approximately \$3,000, will be produced in Belgium for the first two years of production. After that period, a U.S. manufacturer will be contracted to produce them for defense needs.

Devildog does double duty

After most of the day, one Marine trades his pencil and typewriter for a pistol and a nightstick — doing everything from giving out traffic tickets to chasing thieves. "I was petrified my first time out," Sergeant Kurt Nakamura said about his initiation as an auxiliary military policeman. "We had to chase five guys up at the rifle range, who were walking in the restricted impact area. They went into the old bunker and we never found them, but I got my initiation."

DURING THE weekdays, Nakamura works as a classified materials control center clerk at the Station Adjutant's Office. However, during the evenings and weekends, he puts on an MP badge and volunteers his time to work with the Security Department, which he describes as exciting and rewarding.

"On duty you have the same authority as a regular MP and you learn what the other side of the street is like first hand," the 21-year-old Marine said. "I used to hate MPs before I started working as one. Now I see things through their point of view."

presently working with the Security Department, Nakamura has been there the longest, for one and a half years.

"They started me off with the radio, learning the different codes and riding around with regular MPs, watching what they did," he said.

Nakamura explained that to be considered as an auxiliary MP, a Marine must pass the Use of Force Examination. The exam deals with questions on hypothetical situations that ask the individual Marine how he would react in each case.

"The purpose of the test is to see what type of attitude you have. A Marine needs to show that he is competent in handling situations that deal with force," said Nakamura. "If you get lax, you're inviting injury."

Everything auxiliary MPs learn is through on-the-job training. An auxiliary MP must put in a minimum of 16 hours a month, but may do more if he wishes. He is issued a badge and a red military police ID card, similar to the yellow ID card issued to regular MPs.

"AN AUXILIARY MP can go in whenever he wants to work, but he has to call and make sure that there is a one-man unit open that needs

someone," said Nakamura. "Two auxiliary MPs never ride together."

Nakamura said he worked as an MP six days a week, averaging nine to 12 hours a day when he first started. Now he works four to five days a week, averaging seven to 12 hours a day.

"I get self-satisfaction from being an auxiliary MP, because I like to help people," he said.

The auxiliary MP does not receive extra pay or time off for his services, and must still fulfill his regular daytime duties in addition to his volunteer work.

"Marines who wish to be on the auxiliary program must go through about three days of training in general military police subjects and be interviewed by the provost marshal," said Master Sergeant Guinn Henry, Security Department operations chief. "They must also pass a .45 caliber pistol and take a Use of Force Examination."


"The auxiliary program is a benefit to the Security Department, because an auxiliary MP can go back to his command and let them know that we are not out to harass people. We are here to enforce regulations and to assist the public," Henry concluded.



Marine grabs state wrestling title

FORT SHAFTER, Hawaii — One Marine, who has dominated the 163-pound wrestling class for the past two months, claimed the Amateur Athletic Union Greco-Roman State Title here Saturday in 16 seconds.

Private First Class Wayne Hall, a radar technician for Marine Air Traffic Control Squadron-18, feels, "It's a good style of

Both wrestlers plan to return here again Saturday to participate in the State AAU Freestyle Championships starting at 10 a.m.

Matches end Friday

Marksmen put to test

CAMP H.M. SMITH, Hawaii — Seventy-seven Marine Corps marksmen have gathered at the Puuloa Range Facility located near Ewa Beach to compete in the 1982 Pacific Division Matches.

The shooters, representing Marine Barracks, Hawaii and Adak, Alaska; MCAS Kaneohe Bay; 1st Marine Brigade and Headquarters and Service Battalion, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, Camp Smith, have been at the range facility since late last month preparing for the month-long matches.

The Marine shooters had a week of marksmanship training classroom instruction, participated in practice firing and some even had an opportunity to undergo close combat pistol training.

CLOSE COMBAT PISTOL course instructors and other range personnel, who are assigned to the Marksmanship Training Unit from Quantico, Va., are on hand to support the matches that are being sponsored by the commander of Camp H.M. Smith and to share their knowledge about weapons firing.

"The close combat pistol course teaches those skills

required to survive an encounter with a hostile individual at close range and while armed with an automatic pistol or revolver," said Master Sergeant Albert Miral, the range chief for the Puuloa facility. "It is designed to expand the basic pistol marksmanship fundamentals of the shooters, however, it isn't meant to replace the normal pistol requalification."

THE COURSE TESTS the shooter's abilities in real life type situations instead of the normal known distance, sight alignment and trigger squeeze/control course that personnel normally go through for requalification.

"During the course of instruction the participants fire from the 25-yard, 'strong-hand' barricade, over the top of a barricade, the 'weak-hand' barricade, the 15-yard point shoulder using the sights, 10-yard point shoulder without sights and the 7-yard, one-handed hip shoot," Miral said.

The unit teams "set their sights" for two trophies — the Pacific Trophy (awarded in recognition of the best pistol team in the matches) and the Smith Trophy (awarded to the winning rifle team).

In addition to the team trophies, the individual shooters vie for awards. "The

shooters compete for Marine Corps competition badges," said Major Mark Hayden, the officer in charge of this year's Pacific Division Matches. "First place shooters receive gold badges, second place shooters, silver badges and third place shooters receive the bronze badges."

THE RIFLE SHOOTERS fire from the 200-, 300- and 600-yard lines during the competition. From the 200-yard they fire 20 rounds slow fire in a maximum of 20 minutes from the offhand (standing) position and 10 rounds rapid fire in a maximum of 70 seconds from the prone position. On the 600-yard line (six times the length of a football field), the shooters have 20 minutes to fire 20 rounds in the prone position.

"All pistol shooters fire the National Match Course during the competition," Hayden said. "They fire 10 rounds slow fire in a maximum of 10 minutes from the 50-yard line. They also fire 10 rounds; 20 seconds per five-round string, and 10 rounds; 10 seconds per five-round string, from the 25-yard line."

After the final rounds are fired down range Friday, everyone involved in this year's matches will know which Marines are the best shooters stationed in Adak, Alaska and Hawaii.
