

Weapons theft suspect apprehended in California

A 21-year-old Marine sought in connection with the Oct. 13, 1981 weapons theft here was apprehended in California by FBI agents Thursday.

Lance Corporal Charles Ng was transported to Hawaii Friday and incarcerated Saturday at Pearl Harbor Correctional Facility.

Ng, one of three Marines from 3d Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Brigade originally taken into custody Nov. 12, 1981 in conjunction with the armory theft, escaped

two days later. Ng was aboard the station for questioning by the Naval Investigative Service when the escape occurred. He was to have been returned to Pearl Harbor Correctional Facility that day.

During his 24 weeks of hiding, Ng was considered dangerous by both the NIS and the FBI.

The other two Marines were tried and convicted by general courts-martial for their part in the theft.

Sergeant Ricardo J. Dailey was convicted Feb. 17 of wrongful disposal of military property.

Corporal Christopher C. Thomas was convicted March 9 of larceny, conspiracy, wrongful disposal of military property, and breaking and entering.

The weapons, valued at \$11,406, were recovered in November near the Pali Highway. The cache included two M-60 machine guns, three M-203 grenade launchers, an M-16 rifle, seven .45-caliber

pistols and a starlight scope. No ammunition was stolen during the break-in.

A fourth Marine initially taken into custody last year as a suspect was taken back into custody Thursday. He was released from the brig at Pearl Harbor Friday and placed on military restriction in lieu of arrest.

His name is being withheld pending charges.

Nation observes Heritage Week

Their history is one of proud accomplishments and contributions. They have imbedded their mark in the arts, science, literature, industry, commerce, politics and education.

Asian-Pacific Americans, despite setbacks and persecutions, have pushed on to become significant seeds in the growth of America. They have wept and bled in this country's struggle for independence and nationhood.

More than 4 million Americans trace their ancestry to Asia and the Pacific islands. May 7 through 14 has been proclaimed Asian-Pacific Heritage Week, to acknowledge the many faithful commitments of Asian-Pacific Americans, and to renew a sense of pride among Americans of Asian-Pacific ancestry.

Asian-Pacific American Heritage Week was initiated in 1978 by four members of the 95th Congress. Representatives Norman Mineta (D-Cal), Frank Horton (R-NY), and Senators Spark Matsunaga (D-Hi) and Daniel Inouye (D-Hi), introduced the House and Senate resolutions.

"The President is hereby authorized and requested to issue

a proclamation designating the seven-day period beginning May 4, 1979, as Asian-Pacific American Heritage Week," they wrote. The first proclamation was approved Oct. 5, 1978. More Presidential proclamations followed.

The month of May is prominent in Asian-Pacific history. May 7 will mark the 139th anniversary of the arrival of the first Japanese immigrant to America. May 8 will be the 113th commemoration of the driving of the Golden Spike, signifying the contributions of Chinese Americans in building this country's transcontinental railroad.

In a past proclamation, President Ronald Reagan stated in part: "Asian and Pacific Americans have made outstanding contributions to the cultural and technological development of their adopted nation."

"Their hard work, creativity and intelligence have inspired their fellow citizens, added new dimensions to our national life, and strengthened the social fabric of our land."

As part of the Asian-Pacific Heritage Week, the dining facilities aboard the air station will feature international meals from the different Asian countries, beginning May 12.

Monies come from two sources

Air station operating cost tallied

Operating a Marine Corps Air Station is no easy task, but to help get the job done, Marine units at Kaneohe Bay rely on the civilian community of Hawaii for support.

That support comes in the form of goods and purchases which reveals some staggering figures.

Each year, the military spends millions of dollars of appropriated and nonappropriated funds in the civilian community.

APPROPRIATED FUNDS are monies given to the Marine Corps by Congress for facilities, supplies, and civilian and military payrolls.

Nonappropriated funds are monies obtained through services such as military clubs and exchanges.

According to David Sage, disbursing fiscal account supervisor, a total of \$79,576,024.63 was spent in appropriated funds during fiscal year 1981. That

included 1st Marine Brigade and Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay.

Of that total, \$18,422,572.95 was spent on facilities and supplies from local vendors and \$1,460,000 was spent on mainland vendors. The actual disbursement of military payroll was \$50,620,437.28 and \$9,073,014.40 was the gross figure for civil service payroll.

The amount of appropriated funds fluctuates with each fiscal year, said Sage. "The figures will go up or down depending on a lot of things," he said. "Some years the amount of travel is different. At certain times the Marine Corps may have more or less money for TAD trips."

Sage explained that the payroll figures generally fluctuate because of pay raises.

Nonappropriated funds at MCAS Kaneohe Bay, are funds generated by the operation of Special Services, the Combined Clubs System, the Marine Corps Exchange, and the Chapel and Billeting funds.

The total nonappropriated funds spent on purchases such as supplies and facilities was \$9,086,137. Nonappropriated payroll funds totaled \$6,742,624, giving a grand total of \$15,828,761 for nonappropriated funds.

In FY81, Special Services spent a total of \$1,497,689. Civilian payroll consisted of \$997,388 and military payroll for active duty personnel working part time was \$40,301. Goods purchased total was an estimated \$460,000. The goods were bought from 152 local vendors and 30 mainland vendors.

THE COMBINED CLUBS System breaks down the nonappropriated funds it spends into five areas — liquor, wines and beer; food; supplies; entertainment; and payroll. During the FY81, those five areas combined spent \$3,388,042.

Liquors, wines and beer had a total of \$1,111,956. Food bought for the clubs system equaled \$694,066; \$235,025 consisted of supplies; and entertainment was

\$156,010. Civilian payroll was \$995,173, and military payroll for part time active duty personnel was \$195,812.

The Combined Clubs System makes all its purchases through 250 local vendors.

The Marine Corps Exchange spent \$10,910,663 in FY81. Purchases and contractual works cost \$6,411,759 and \$4,498,904 was spent on civilian payroll.

The MCX with 1,620 local vendors, and 695 vendors on the mainland.

The Chapel Fund spent \$854 on payroll and \$14,853 on other expenses, much of which included contributions.

The Billeting Fund, which handles transient quarters on station for visitors, spent \$14,192 on payroll and \$2,468 on supplies.

Combined appropriated and nonappropriated funds spent including Special Services, the MCX, the Combined Club System and the Chapel and Billeting funds, was \$95,404,785.83 in FY81.

Services

Centers focus on family needs

HQMC, WASHINGTON — Modern social and economic conditions present serious difficulties for many Marines and their families. The challenge for Marines "to take care of their own" must be met.

March 14, 1980, the Commandant of the Marine Corps General Robert H. Barrow created the Marine Corps Family Services Center program. Currently there are 17 FSCs at major stateside and overseas Marine Corps commands.


These centers provide information, assistance and guidance to Marines and their families by coordinating existing family support resources and when available, those social services offered by federal, state and local programs.

The centers also serve as a focal point for family concerns in the military community and advising commanders of current factors affecting their personnel's families.

Marine Corps FSC services are available to all active duty and retired military personnel and their dependents. Although the main mission of family services centers is to assist married Marines and their families, the centers also provide services to unmarried Marines.

Toll-free information and referral telephone lines have been established to assist military families who do not have access to one of the above listed centers. Marines and their families east of the Mississippi River (excluding Wisconsin) can call toll-free (800) 336-4663. Those west of the Mississippi River (plus Wisconsin) can call collect (714) 725-5361.

"Taking care of its own" has been a hallmark of the Corps for generations. The family services center is just one means of maintaining that distinctive quality, while at the same time, helping to ensure the homelife stability of Marines and their families.

USS Puller commissioned, 'Chesty' immortalized at sea

U.S. NAVAL STATION, LONG BEACH, CALIF. — The national anthem played twice on Pier #9 April 17 — first to signal the opening of an important ceremony; then again to signal a new life.

Sailors, Marines, families and friends were gathered for the commissioning of the USS Lewis B. Puller (FFG-23).

Lieutenant General Lewis B. "Chesty" Puller, the only Marine ever awarded five Navy Crosses for heroism and gallantry in action, stands as a legend among Marines. As pointed out by Commandant of the Marine Corps General Robert H. Barrow, during the ceremony, "Chesty" Puller serves as an inspiration to many

Marines who have never laid eyes on him.

Commander Ralph Martin accepted command of the ship, one of the versatile new class of guided missile frigates. The commissioning directive was read by Rear Admiral David Ramsey, Deputy Commander of Naval Surface Forces, U.S. Pacific Fleet. Then the first watch was set, and the ship's company manned the USS Lewis B. Puller.

As the crowd rose for the second time to the familiar notes, the national ensign was raised at the stern, and the Union Jack at the bow.

Martin noted that the ship's complement of 14 officers, 15 chief petty officers and 168 enlisted men

held three watchwords: service, discipline and esprit. "We live by those words," he said, "as did Gen. Puller."

Turning to the ship's sponsor, Virginia M. Evans Puller, Martin said to the general's widow, "You are a treasure to us. We are most fortunate to have a sponsor who takes such an active interest."

Mrs. Puller, noting references to her husband's courage, strength and toughness, emphasized he was a man of great humanity. "I wanted to add that he was a great lover," she said. Mrs. Puller asked God's blessing on the ship and its men. Then she asked the ship's crew to always bear in mind her husband's belief that "You can be what you resolve to be."

Courts-Martial Report

Private First Class Marvin L. Henry, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines, 1st Marine Brigade, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of unauthorized absence from Oct. 9-12, 1981, and from Oct. 16-20, 1981; of missing movement through neglect; and of violating a lawful order by wrongfully possessing two Armed Forces identification cards.

He was sentenced to three months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$200 pay per

month for three months and reduction to private.

Corporal Leonard A. Kahakauwila, Battalion Landing Team 3/3, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of the wrongful sale, transfer and possession of 3 grams of marijuana.

He was sentenced to 30 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$488 pay per month for one month, reduction to private first class and a bad-conduct discharge from the U.S. Marine Corps.

LCpl Juan S. Delrosario, BLT 3/3, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of the

wrongful possession of 3.9 grams of marijuana; and of the wrongful sale and transfer of 1.8 grams of marijuana.

He was sentenced to three months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$300 pay per month for four months and reduction to private first class.

Lance Corporal Alejandro Claudio, Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron-24, 1st

Marine Brigade, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of unauthorized absence from Feb. 16-21, 1982; of acting with contempt toward a staff noncommissioned officer; of resisting lawful apprehension; and of breaking restriction.

He was sentenced to 45 days confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$300 pay per month for one month and reduction to private first class.

At a glance

Convection oven hazard

HONOLULU — The Moulin-Air Convection Oven, model CTCO 300, manufactured by Moulinex, poses an electrical shock hazard. That was the finding made by the Army and Air Force Exchange Service Quality Assurance Laboratory, which has recalled the oven.

Numerous tests were conducted by AAFES Quality Assurance Technicians after learning of incidents in which customers had been shocked while using the oven. Results of the tests determined that an electrical shock could occur if the user touched the control knobs, oven door or rear panel mounting screws and another conductive surface, such as a metal sink. The hazard exists whether or not the unit is in operation. If the

oven is plugged in, the user could receive a shock. Therefore, AAFES Quality Assurance Technicians urge customers to stop using the Moulin Air, to unplug the unit carefully, taking care not to touch control knobs, oven door or mounting screws.

The Hawaii Area Exchange has removed the oven from shelves at all main stores. Customers who may not have purchased the Moulin-Air Convection Oven, model CTCO 300, in an exchange are advised to return it to their nearest HAAX Main Store for a full refund.

Advanced life-saving

A six-week Advanced Lifesaving Course will begin May 13 at the Station Pool. The course, offered by the American Red Cross, is open to all active duty personnel,

dependents and retired military. Dependents must be at least 15 years of age.

Sailor prevents suicide attempt

"Trying to talk to a person who is about to commit suicide really gets the adrenalin flowing," commented Navy Petty Officer Ronald Britton, on his attempt to save a distraught young man from jumping to his death at Honolulu Airport.

The former fireman and deputy sheriff from Belair, Md. has had to deal with attempted suicides before, but has never been the negotiator. He currently works as an administrative cryptological technician and is the Navy drug and alcohol abuse counselor at Intelligence Center Pacific located at Camp Smith. Britton also works as a security guard at the Honolulu Airport during his off-duty hours.

"It was a busy evening at their report when a call came over the

radio to respond to a possible suicide attempt on the fifth floor of the parking structure."

On arrival, Britton observed a man standing on the ledge holding on to a floodlight. Britton introduced himself and tried to gain the man's confidence.

Britton engaged the man in conversation for 30 minutes until he saw the approach of a Honolulu Police Officer coming up on the blind side of the individual. Britton then climbed onto the eight inch ledge, distracting the would be jumper, while the police officer grabbed him. Britton then grabbed both the police officer and the jumper and pulled them to safety.

For his action, Britton was awarded the Navy's highest non-combatant award, the Navy/Marine Corps Medal.

Woodland cammies available in June

The woodland camouflage pattern utility uniform will be available in late June here, according to Major Tom Loughlin, exchange officer.

The new cammies are made of heavier material than the present poplin uniform, and are reinforced at the elbows, knees and buttocks. The new uniform also has unpleated breast pockets, unlike the current issue.

The woodland coat costs \$16, and the trousers cost \$17.20, according to ALMAR 046-82. The message contains complete information on the woodland cammies.

Although the new cammies are already authorized for wear, they cannot be mixed with the poplin uniform, except for the utility cap. The woodland and poplin covers may be worn with either uniform.

The woodland utilities should be washed using the lowest possible temperature setting. Exposing the uniform to temperatures greater

than 130 degrees could cause shrinking. The ALMAR also warned that starch adversely affects the new uniform, therefore starching or sizing the woodland cammies is prohibited.

Care should be used in placing the "USMC" decal on the new camouflage coat. The iron setting should be 300 degrees (synthetic) without steam, and pressed for three to four seconds. The emblem is centered one half inch below the bottom of the left breast pocket flap and the "USMC" letters are centered horizontally three quarters of an inch below the lower point of the emblem anchor and one inch above the bottom of the pocket.

The "U.S. Navy" decal is centered horizontally one and one quarter inch below the bottom of the left breast pocket flap.

The mandatory date for possession of the woodland cammies and the phaseout date for the poplin uniform will be established at a later time.

Trackers surpass goal during PTA exercise

They made an amphibious landing April 19 at Kuwaihue on the Big Island and rolled 30 miles inland to establish their command post.

The men and machines of Detachment, Company A, 3d Assault Amphibious Battalion were prepared for their part in RIMPAC-82 and post RIMPAC training at Pohakuloa Training Area.

Their goal, according to Captain Richard Roan, officer in charge, was to prove that their 26-ton amphibious assault vehicles could operate and train effectively at PTA. A goal that was met and exceeded . . . the nine-day exercise began and ended with all 10 Landing Vehicle Tracked Personnel carriers operational.

"We accomplished our objective of utilizing this superb training area to increase the mechanized readiness of 2/3 and our detachment," Roan said. Marines from 2d Battalion, 3d Marines spent six days training with the AAVs.

The mechanized training for 2/3 included orientation to the LVTPs, principles of mechanized warfare and mechanized offensive and defensive problems at the infantry platoon and company level.

The training helped 2/3, but the detachment benefited even more. "The training here with the infantry and the tactics we used helped show us what combat might be like," commented Lance Corporal Paul Westmoreland, an AAV crewman. Westmoreland also said he improved his driving skills over rough terrain.

PTA offers an abundance of rough terrain, including lava flows, but the area is, in the words of one Marine, "The most scenic in Hawaii." Snow-capped mountains formed the backdrop for much of the training. Star-studded nights greeted the weary Marines at the end of the day and temperatures in the 40s awaited them at daybreak.


In contrast, the days were hot and dry, with the sun eager to redden exposed skin. "We learned to operate

continuously in dry, dusty desert-like terrain," Roan said. The captain added that his men were able to mount and fire M-85 machine guns from their tractors. An old car had been placed in the fire zone by helicopter, and the crews opened fire with relief. Tracers set the auto on fire, and when the last round went down range, only a burned out mass of metal was left.

More than 10,000 rounds had been fired at the car, and other targets in the area. The training was invaluable, as it was the first time for several of the Marines to practice with the .50-caliber weapon. "I've learned to fire the M-85 effectively," said LCpl Tyler King. The 21-year-old Denver native said the training helped him to be combat ready for mechanized warfare, which is the purpose of their training.

"I think we should come here more often and for longer periods," said Roan. "It's the finest training I've done in three years here."

The training ended April 27 with a 30-mile return trek to the beach. The AAVs had met the challenge — and won.

"We plan to have plenty of music and a large carnival," said Sergeant Steve Mahnke, Hickam AFB Public Affairs Office. "An appearance by the Tropic Lightning Parachute Club is also scheduled," he concluded.



Last year Navy Relief at Marine Corps Air Station, Kaneohe Bay assisted in 620 loans. The loans totaled \$158,128.43. Nine grants were given with a monetary value of \$495. There were 545 service cases, and the total number of applicants was 1,174.

Officers' Special Education Program

HQMC, WASHINGTON — The 1983 Fiscal Year Special Education Program selection board is set for October. Marines, first lieutenant through lieutenant colonel, can apply for 21 different major academic disciplines.

Disciplines offered are: Engineering Electronics; Operations Analysis; Computer Systems; Defense Systems Analysis/Managerial Economics; Communications Engineering; Computer Engineering; Electronic Warfare Systems Technology; Computer science; Telecommunications systems Management; Command, Control, and Communications; Weapons Systems Engineering; Aeronautical Engineering; Applied Mathematics; Financial Management; Acquisition and Contract Management; Engineering Management; Nuclear Engineering; Chemical Engineering; Law; Manpower/Personnel Training Analysis; and Human Resources Management.

Most of the disciplines are taught at the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, Calif. However, certain disciplines are offered at either the Air Force Institute of Technology, Dayton, Ohio, or at approved civilian schools.

Selected officers will normally attend school in 1983, but in certain cases may go in 1984 or 1985. Students must meet entrance requirements of the school they will attend.

A letter-type application, outlined in Marine Corps Order 1520.9D, Special Education Program, must arrive at HQMC (Code MMOA-3) by Aug. 13. The number of students accepted for each discipline depends on Marine Corps needs.



Marksman advance to nationals

PUULOA RIFLE RANGE, EWA BEACH — Marksmen from MCAS Kaneohe Bay recently copped seven medals in the individual pistol and rifle events of the Pacific Division Matches held here April 20-23.

The 1st Marine Brigade shooters followed with six collective medals. During the team competition, Camp H.M. Smith earned the Julian C. Smith Rifle Trophy with a tally of 1154-74, and the brigade's 2d Battalion, 3d

Marines team captured the Pacific Pistol Trophy with a score of 1010-13.

Hawkeyes from the air station, brigade, Camp Smith, Marine Barracks, Hawaii, and Adak, Alaska, spent one month here practicing for pistol and rifle awards. Six civilians also competed.

In the individual pistol and rifle events, Master Sergeant Albert Miral, a double-distinguished shooter from Camp Smith, won top honors in both divisions, scoring 545-11 with the pistol, and 581-42 with the rifle.

By already being a distinguished shooter, Miral was no longer eligible to win medals, but he was awarded a Distinguished Certificate, and will receive an M-14 rifle at a later date. Chief Warrant Officer-4 Charles Julian, another Camp Smith double-distinguished marksman, was also awarded a certificate.

To become a distinguished shooter with either the pistol or rifle, a marksman must accumulate 30 points by placing in various Marine Corps and other sanctioned matches. Ten of those points must be from Corps competition. Points are awarded

as 10 for gold, eight for silver and six for bronze.

Once 30 points are attained, the shooter no longer qualifies for medals.

Sergeant Rhandall Allen, an air station armorer, waded through a field of 70 other non-distinguished shooters to win the first place gold rifle medal with a score of 584-42. Corporal George White of the brigade, netted the first place gold pistol award. His score was 538-10.

The first place silver rifle award went to Cpl Terry Edelman of the brigade. Edelman collected a sum of 575-37. Captain Karen Hunt, air station range officer in charge, took home the first place bronze rifle and medal by firing 573-35. Hunt also won the first place silver pistol honor, while Allen trailed with the first place bronze.

During an awards ceremony at the Dining Facility here, the competitors were presented their awards by Major General William Maloney, director for operations, Commander-in-Chief, Pacific.

The medalists are now preparing for the nationals which will be held at Camp Lejeune, N.C. next month.



Marine runner wins 10k race

Sergeant Robert Beyer, 1st Radio Battalion, won the first Johnny Faerber All-Men's 10-kilometer race Sunday finishing 31:35 for the 6.2-mile course.

Seeded No. 1 against 58 other runners, Beyer set the course record for which plans to be an annual race sponsored by Faerber's Flyers, and all-women's running club coached by Faerber.

Taking the lead after the first half-mile Beyer said that it was a good race and that he

ran under his desired six-minute mile.

Running his favored course, uphill and close to home, Beyer was preparing himself for the Windward Half-Marathon May 16. "I have to win that one," he explains, "because it's my home course and my last race as a Marine."

Beyer has received a scholarship for cross country and track to South Dakota State University. But, before he leaves for school the 21-year-old will run in the Coca-Cola Relays, a race he finished first last year running with the Hawaii Marine gold team.

Second to cross the line was

Dennis Hansen at 32:07 followed by a race between Michael Georgi and James Hall. Georgi won the contest by three tenths of a second finishing 32:26.5. James Gallup finished fifth at 32:37.

Hall, a lance corporal and a contender for the Windward Marathon, said, "I first saw Beyer take off in the beginning of the race. I tried to close the gap, but he killed me going up the hill."

The course, starting and finishing at the Kokokuhi YWCA, traveled up Mokapu Boulevard and down to Aikahi where it made a left turn on Kaneohe Bay Drive and back to the start.

Statistics place Marines at finish line

As the final days wind down toward the Windward Marathon and Half-Marathon, the Marines have a good chance of winning both races.

In the Marathon, two Marines have listed faster times than last year's maiden run of 2:40:59. Sergeant Gary Smith and Lance Corporal James Hall say they can finish the 26 miles under last year's time set by Staff Sgt Ron Welch. Welch is not entered in this year's running.

Running on his "home course," Sergeant Robert Beyer is a good candidate to win the half-marathon. Beyer has won his last race (6.2 miles) and has finished second in two previous races. The winner of those two races was Jon Cross, who was not entered in the race that Beyer won, nor is he entered in the half-marathon.

Another contender for the half-marathon is Don Boardman who listed a finishing time around 1:09. Last year's race was won by the Big Island's Doug Lindsay in 1:12:58.

A little less than 400 people are entered to run in this year's marathon with approximately 45 percent being active duty military. Officials guess that 35 percent are Marines.

On the other hand, 1100 runners have registered for the half-marathon with approximately 200 of them being Marines.

Four hundred-fifty people indicated that this was their first half-marathon and 46 newbies have entered in the marathon.

Three of the 13 aid stations are located on the air station. The first station is three miles into the race and approximately every two miles thereafter.

Since the course on the air station has been changed, faster times are being predicted for the

marathon. Instead of runners traveling along the air strip, they will run through station housing.


