Medical guidelines established for Agent Orange examinations

HQMC — Vietnam veterans on active duty who are concerned about possible exposure to Herbicide (Agent) Orange can now more easily take a special medical exam and be included in the Veterans Administration Agent Orange Registry.

The herbicide was used as a defoliant to improve visibility in dense jungles and to deny cover and crops to the enemy. Used extensively in Vietnam from 1965-70, the herbicide was believed to be harmless to humans. In acute doses, such as a result of an industrial manufacturing accident, the herbicide can

adversely effect the skin, and possibly the liver and nervous system. In animal studies, the herbicide acted in some cases as a promoter or of cancer and congenital defects. To date, these effects have not been confirmed in humans.

Procedures for the special medical exam were recently outlined in a memorandum from the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Health Affairs. Marines should contact the local medical facility for the exam and information about the Registry.

Administration forms new office

The Veterans Administration has formed a new office to deal exclusively with matters involving Agent Orange, and its possible effects on Vietnam veterans. Agent Orange was a herbicide used in Vietnam to kill unwanted vegetation and to defoliate trees which otherwise would have provided cover from which the enemy could attack American personnel. The VA is leading the way in resolving the Agent Orange question through medical and scientific research projects.

SATO saves money

Airfare discounts available

The Scheduled Airline Ticket Office can help service members save hundreds of dollars on airline tickets. These savings often make the difference between an island vacation and a trip to the mainland.

"We try to provide our customers with the lowest possible fare to their destination," said Jim Laddie, a traffic agent here.

Laddie explained that there are several different "special" fares offered by various airlines. One example he cited was the coach fare from Honolulu to Denver, which is \$728.42 round trip on United. However, they offer a zone discount for \$475.80 — a savings of \$253.62.

The best discount offered by the airline industry is the 50 percent military discount, also known as "Furlough

Fare," "Leave Fare," and other names, depending on the particular airline. Although the discount doesn't apply to travel between Hawaii and the mainland, 10 airlines currently offer the half-priced tickets for air travel within the continental United States. The discount applies to military members on leave or other travel at their own expense, such as permissive travel orders.

The 50 percent discount has been offered to the military for the past year and a half, and is the most generous known benefit ever offered the armed forces by the American industrial sector, according to the Military Traffic Management Command in Washington, D.C.

The discount is in trouble, though, with 10 airlines changing the discount to raise

revenues. United, Delta, Pan Am, American, Eastern, Braniff, Texas International, Air Florida, Western and Continental changed the discount May 1 to 33 1/3 percent. The keys to maintaining this benefit are to be aware of the discount, use it when possible and ensure the airlines know the discount is appreciated, according to the MTMC.

Services combine open houses

The local military dons full-dress Saturday when the services entertain their civilian neighbors at two open houses.

It's Armed Forces Day '82 and, according to President Reagan, this day provides Americans "the opportunity to honor the men and women who serve in our nation's military services. Their dedication to the freedom and security of America exemplifies the spirit, courage and love of country which have made our nation the greatest land on Earth."

The Fleet Marine Force Pacific Band will strike up a rousing Stars and Stripes medley to start the seven-hour show Saturday at Pearl Harbor.

Marines from 4th Force Reconnaissance Battalion will show the youngsters in the crowd how real life "Spideermen" ease down the side of a building. Some of those Marines will have the best view of the sea service extravaganza, dangling on a single line from a hovering helicopter high above the crowd, as they repeat last year's show stopper for a crowd expected to exceed the 15,000 who visited last year.

The ultra-modern guided missile cruiser USS Worden, standing proud and ready with its heavy weight weapons and smart

sailors, is the centerpiece of Navy might in this year's exhibition.

Navy A-4 jets from Barbers Point and Hawaii Air National Guard Phantoms will roar by. And helicopters will buzz over the Navy show, dropping skydivers from nearly 11,000 feet amid a rainbow of colors swirling from smoke canisters. They'll free fall to 2,500 feet, pop their chutes and land, some near the crowd, others in Pearl Harbor.

A 102-foot long Navy torpedo retriever boat, will loiter in the shadow of the Coast Guard's buoy tender Sassafras, painted black with a bold orange stripeblazoned across its bow.

And some of the Coast Guard's constituents will be there too. A swarm of approximately 60 sailboats will sweep around Ford Island in the annual Waikiki-to-Pearl Maritime Day Regatta, and are expected to arrive in Pearl Harbor around noon.

The science of war at sea has changed so much that many World War II veterans visiting Pearl Harbor will be amazed at the computerized systems aboard the cruiser and the satellite communications exhibit on the pier. These systems

exemplify the show's theme — Peace Through Strength.

The Pearl Harbor Armed Forces Day open house will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Naval Supply Center's Kilo piers. The pier area will be transformed into an indoor-outdoor showroom with a concert stage, bleachers, food booths, souvenirs, and more than 30 exhibits and displays, including a SH-3 helicopter and deep-sea diving demonstrations.

Visitors to the Saturday open house should enter the base through Halawa Gate on Kamehameha Highway near the Arizona Memorial Visitors Center, which will open at 9 a.m. A Navy bus will shuttle visitors between the center and the open house site.

Another bus will run between the Navy's show and the Hickam Air Force Base open house from 10 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Hickam Joint Services open house will be located between the flightline housing and the disaster preparedness building just inside the Hickam Air Force Base main gate. The display area will be open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Aircraft static displays, provided by all branches of service, will highlight the open house along with exhibits, musical

performances, work demonstrations and aircraft flyovers.

Scheduled for display are: A-4, A-7, B-52, C-5A, C-130 (both Air Force and Coast Guard), C-141, C-174, C-182, CH-53, CH-53, F-4C, F-4J, H-2, HH-52, HH-53, KC-135, L-19, O-2A, P-3, RB-26, T-33, T-43, TA-4, UH-1 and possibly an F-15 aircraft.

Also on display will be an ambulance from the USAF Clinic, a crash/rescue vehicle from the 15th ABW Civil Engineering Squadron fire protection branch and a jeep.

Display booths will be operated by the Coast Guard, Marine Corps, 25th Infantry Division, 15th Security Police Squadron, 15th Air Base Wing life support section, 6594th Test Group pararescue section, Hawaii Air National Guard, 201st Combat Communications Group, 1st Weather Wing, 16th ABW disaster preparedness section, 1957th Communications Group, Pacific Communications Division, Military Affiliate Radio System, Hickam/Wheeler Aero Club, U.S. Air Force Academy, 15th ABW safety office, Air Force Sergeants Association, Air Force Recruiting Service, Civil Air Patrol and a martial arts club.

Flyovers tentatively scheduled during

the day include appearances by T-33, F-4, A-4 and O-2 aircraft.

Demonstrations are scheduled to include security police working dogs, martial arts, Coast Guard helicopter rescue, Marines rappelling from helicopters and a parachute jump by 10 members of the Tropic Lightning Sports Club.

Scheduled musical entertainment includes the Royal Hawaiian Band at 9:30 a.m., the Honolulu Community Band at 11:30; Bernadette and the Sunshine Company at 12:30 p.m., the Hickam Skylarks at 1:15, the Fleet Marine Force Pacific Band at 2 and the 5th String at 3.

Special traffic control procedures will be implemented around the Open House area for the safety of all people visiting the displays. Freedom Avenue will be open only to inbound traffic. Traffic leaving the base or going to Area 61 will be required to use Vandenberg Boulevard.

Parking will be available between Vandenberg and the display area and behind Building 2085, the veterinarian clinic.

Water fountains, refreshment stands and restroom facilities will be provided inside the area.

Direct Deposit lessens rush-hour problem of check-cashing lines

A traffic jam during rush-hour is avoided like the plague by most drivers; however, many Marines become ensnared in another type of traffic jam — the check-cashing traffic jam at the bank.

The direct deposit system was designed to alleviate the problem, but only 12 percent of the people at the air station use the system. Why?

Major Priscilla Stewart, station disbursing officer, believes that many people are unaware of how the program works.

"I think a lot of the junior troops don't use direct deposit because they don't have checking accounts," said Stewart. "However, the deposit does not have to go into a checking account. It can go into a savings account at any bank or credit union and can be withdrawn as needed."

Stewart also said that a Marine with direct deposit who is afloat can cash checks on board ship through the disbursing officer.

"If you go on leave or TAD, you know your paycheck is in the bank for you. It's also good security not to carry too much money with you because of theft," said Stewart.

To start direct deposit, a Marine should notify his bank or the credit union. A standard form must be completed by the Marine. The bank completes their portion of the form and forwards it to Marine Corps Finance Center, Kansas City, Mo.

"After that it takes at least two paydays for the direct deposit to start," said Stewart. "If a Marine is transferring or getting discharged and wishes to stop direct deposit, the disbursing office needs to be notified at least 30 days in advance."

Outreach offers self-defense course

"There is a need for self-defense for women," said Carole Pajari, Director of the Armed Services YMCA Outreach. "Husbands are deployed and a lot of women are frightened. They want to know how to take care of themselves."

An attack on a woman can be as serious as an attempted murder or rape, or as subtle as a friendly smile or an offer to help. "That's why it's important to become aware of danger signals, to increase awareness of surroundings, to gain a working knowledge of defensive tactics, and to build self-confidence," Pajari said.

Recognizing this need, ASYMCA Outreach developed a 10-week self-defense course for women. Though the course began Monday, late registration will be accepted. Classes are held each Monday from 9-11 a.m. in Building 455.

"The course is a way to develop confidence and competence," said Pajari. "It teaches the woman to rely on herself in

case of an assault. It's all part of a woman taking charge of her life when she is left on her own. She needs to know she can take care of herself."

Ginger Russell Reznik, instructor for the course, is recognized as one of the foremost women in the United States on self-defense. She has been involved in "victim prevention" for 14 years, and is presently employed with the ASYMCA Outreach.

"Most police departments and rape crisis centers deal with the victims and assailants after the crime," Reznik said. "We deal with them before, during, and after the crime. Women are recognizing the need and necessity of self-defense."

"A lot of women who took our course have gone into several areas of police work. Others have gone on to save their own lives."

The classes will deal with the mental aspects of self-defense as well as the

physical training. Being able to think out a threatening situation and how to react is an essential part of learning self-defense.

Areas covered include lectures and rap sessions, preparing skills, guest speakers, defense tactics, and body conditioning. Two additional instructors from Honolulu will also contribute to the course.

"The course was given once before in February," said Pajari. "It was one of the most continually, highly attended classes. The women really felt they were getting something for their money. They had a marvelous time and truly enjoyed it despite the serious subject. A number of them wanted to take the class again."

"If there is enough interest, there will be a night course geared for women Marines."

A fee will be charged, so women interested in taking the course may call 254-4719, 254-4965, or 254-5556 for more information.



Do, but don't overdo weekend exercises

WASHINGTON — It's T.G.I.F. day, and you're all revved up for a weekend of fun, frolic and physical fitness.

But a weekend filled with strenuous exercise, followed by a week of inactivity, won't do you or your heart any good. In fact, the American Heart Association says that the best kind of exercise is moderate exercise done on a regular basis.

To help your heart, you should exercise every other day for at least 15 to 30 minutes. For the weekend warrior, this means slowing the pace and scheduling some exercises during the week.

All exercises are good for you, but some are better for your heart.

Exercises that improve circulation and help the heart, lungs and muscles to work together more efficiently include exercises that are rhythmic and repetitive, like walking, jogging, cycling and swimming.

To improve cardiovascular fitness, you should begin exercising at a comfortable level. Then, when you have become accustomed to that level, go on to something more demanding.

Remember that it's important to include a warm-up period of three to five minutes and to allow a few minutes to "cool down" after exercising.

Only exercises that challenge the circulatory system and

significantly increase blood flow to the muscles for an extended length of time improve cardiovascular fitness.

If you are planning to start an exercise program to improve the

functions of your heart, the association suggests that you check with your doctor. Many physicians recommend stress tests or give patients an exercise prescription tailored to the individual's needs.



Bonus: Temporary limit placed on reenlistment payments

HQMC — The large number of bonus reenlistments already processed this fiscal year has expended bonus funds at a very rapid rate.

To avoid depleting Selective Reenlistment Bonus funds before the end of FY82, a temporary limit has been placed on SRB payments.

As of April 7, reenlistment bonuses are only paid to Marines with an EAS in FY82, according to ALMAR 89/82.

This action will affect Marines with an EAS scheduled to occur on or after Oct. 1, 1982, and who otherwise are eligible for a bonus during this fiscal year. As a result, they will not be able to reenlist for that bonus money until after Oct. 1.

More than 6,400 Marines have reenlisted under the SRBP as of the end of February. The large number is "extremely encouraging" and has helped the Marine Corps make substantial progress in reducing skill shortages by

increasing the retention of high quality Marines in these fields, according to manpower officials.

The restriction on SRBP payments can only be waived in a few cases. Marines scheduled to make a permanent change of station move in FY82, but have an EAS in FY83 and must have additional obligated service prior to transfer, will be considered on an individual basis.

Marines whose reenlistments were approved by a CMC message with a date time group prior to

April 7, can still reenlist for an SRB during FY82.

Marines in the Agreement to Train Option Program who have an EAS in FY83 can reenlist for an SRBP in FY82 if they complete their training and are reclassified in their new military occupational specialty during FY82.

The restrictions of this ALMAR do not pertain to Marines with an EAS in FY83 who desire to reenlist in a non-bonus MOS.

Asian/Pacific American Marines spotlighted

Millions of Asian and Pacific Americans have joined the ranks of the armed forces to uphold the guarantees of this country's constitution.

To focus in depth on the ancestry of Asian and Pacific Americans would be a tumultuous task because Asia includes more than 40 countries, and thousands of islands scattered throughout the Pacific account for the Pacific Americans. In the text that follows four Asian and Pacific American service members of the air station are highlighted.

Captain Janice Closson, an aircraft defense control officer with Marine Air Control Squadron-2, was born on Oahu. She said she never called Hawaii home because she left when she was five years old, and had not returned until two years ago upon assignment to the squadron.

Closson is the adoptive Hawaiian daughter of two former Marines. A graduate of the University of the Pacific in Stockton, Calif., Closson recalled that she was halfway through

college when she decided to join the Corps.

After graduating with a bachelor's degree in Liberal Arts, she took the plunge. "I grew up with an enlisted idea of the Corps, and I thought OCS (Officer Candidate School) would be similar to recruit training," she commented. But she quickly discovered that OCS was a totally different scene.

Once completing her schooling as an ADC officer, the captain was ready to begin life as a Marine.

At that time Closson was one of the first women officers in her field. Because of that she was afraid of not being accepted, however, she said she easily integrated into the squadron.

Although she was too young to clinch any memories of Oahu when she left, Closson said returning for duty "was like a homecoming. I'd been trying to get here for a long time."

Off duty, Closson paddles with an outrigger canoe club, which she said is refreshing and an excellent way of making new friends. Closson has one year remaining in Hawaii and she said she would like to experience the East Coast.

When Hospitalman First Class Jose Manzano of the Naval Regional Medical Clinic, Kaneohe Branch, enlisted into the Navy 15 years ago, he was a medical student in the Republic of the Philippines. He wanted to pursue that career in the Navy but was not allowed.

"Back then Filipinos were recruited solely as stewards. To get another job, we had to prove we were good at something else," he said. Manzano did just that.

Manzano is the supervisor of the clinic's laboratory. He considers himself to be one of the luckiest people in the Navy. "The Navy has given me everything I've wanted," he said.

Mazano has the distinction of being the leading petty officer at the clinic. His seniority has bestowed him with plenty of expectations to live up to, but the cooperation he receives from his peers and junior sailors makes the chore manageable. "I'm respected for how I am, and I know how to talk to people," he commented.

The father of three children, including a son attending the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md., said he believes in the concept of Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week. He encourages other Asians to be proud of their ancestry.

"The week is good recognition for what we're doing because we're working as hard as everyone else. I think Asians are doing fine in the service."

As a domineering and brash youngster growing up on Maui, Corporal Randy Augustin often

used his fists to get his point across. Since joining the Corps in 1979, the 20-year-old has mellowed considerably, and he said he likes the change. "I have more discipline now, and I'm aware of life."

Augustin is an administrative supplyman with the 3d Marine Regiment. He said the idea of coming back to the state to serve is what attracted him to the Corps, but he hinted that he may stay in. Augustin is the seventh child of 11 brothers and sisters. His bloodline includes, Filipino, Spanish, Hawaiian, and Chinese. "But I feel more Hawaiian," he commented.

Second Lieutenant Robert Cusick, Augustin's boss, describes him as, "a good worker who never tires. Cpl Augustin puts forth any effort to get the job done, and I

think he exemplifies what a Marine should be."

Lance Corporal Joseph Ono is a radio operator with Headquarters Company, 3d Marine Regiment. When he went through recruit training in San Diego, he indicated that it was almost like home. "It wasn't too bad. My father was very strict so when I got to boot camp, it seemed like he was there yelling at me."

Home for the Japanese-American is Palolo Valley. He and his brother David, also a lance corporal, enlisted under the Buddy System. David is presently deployed with Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-265. By being natives of the state, the Onos' contract allowed them to return and serve on the island.

Ono said his job as a radio operator is interesting, and he and

his co-workers are closely-knit. In his spare time he tinkers with cars. In fact, he is so into that hobby that before joining the Corps, he worked three jobs to get money for parts. Compared to that routine, he said his Corps job is like a vacation.


Ono is unsure of whether or not he'll remain in the Corps. If he decides to leave, he said he wants to finish college. Either way, he said he would be carefully thought it over.

According to Staff Sergeant Bob Biggs, Ono's supervisor, "The Marine is an outstanding person. If I had a shop full of Onos I'd be alright." Biggs added that Ono is being considered for a meritorious promotion to corporal.

Capt Closson, HM-1 Manzano, Cpl Augustin and LCpl Ono are, of course, only a small percentage of the hundreds of brigade and air station Asian and Pacific Marines and sailors doing their part to make the air/ground concept work.

Perhaps Representative Norman Mineta (D-Calif.) illustrated the Asian and Pacific American's role the best. While introducing the House resolution concerning Asia/Pacific American Heritage Week, he commented: "This nation is like tapestry with yarns of different fabrics and colors."

"They're interwoven to bring strength to our country. Whether in or out of uniform, Asian and Pacific Americans of the Department of Defense continue to maintain that strength."



Lucky Lanai wins 7th YPF


