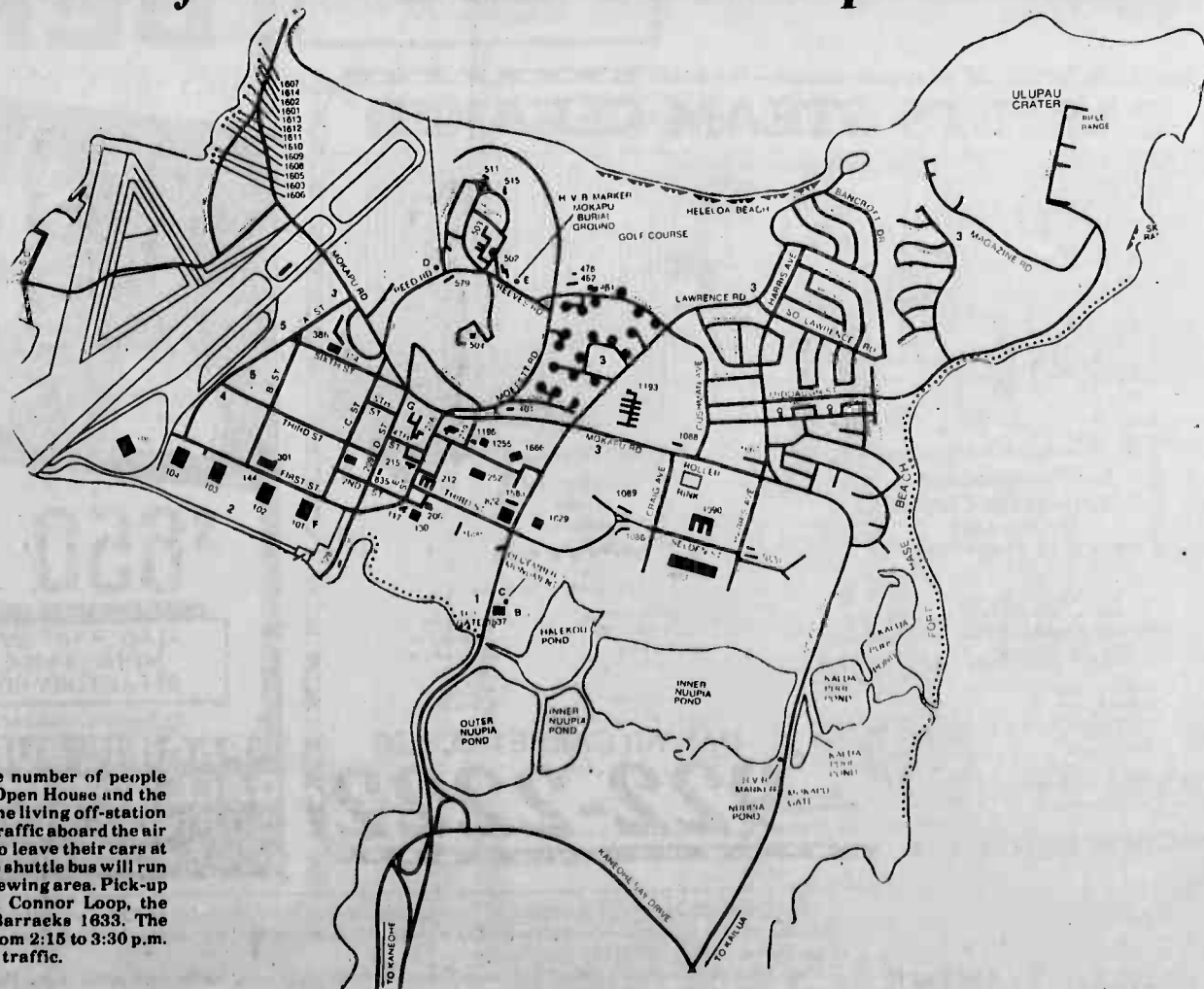

Sidney Batten

Wartime promise comes true

Wake, Midway, Iwo Jima, Guam, Tarawa, Guadalcanal... the names evoke pictures of jungles, fierce fighting and death.

They're small islands in the Pacific where thousands of Marines gave their lives in defense of their country. And, they're part of the Corps' heritage...

Leathernecks weren't the only ones to fight in these tropical jungles for the Allied cause. In addition to American servicemen from all branches, military men from several nations, especially Australia and New Zealand, fought side-by-side with the Americans.

Syd Batten was one of them. Service to their country was a family affair for the Battens, as it was for many New Zealanders. His brother served in the navy — his sister and wife worked in the volunteer auxiliary services.

Sydney James William Batten enlisted in the Royal New Zealand Air

Force in 1939. He met many leathernecks at McKays' Crossing in the early '40s when the Americans were preparing for their island-hopping campaign, but it wasn't until 1942 that he fought with the Corps' finest.

GUADALCANAL WAS A hell-hole in 1942. Sergeant Batten was there with his squadron, which was attached to Marine Aircraft Group-14. The ground transport maintenance mechanic kept his squadron's equipment running, and assisted Marine ground crews whenever he could.

Batten's squadron, No. 3 Reconnaissance Squadron, flew bombing and reconnaissance missions that supported American troop action.

The Marines shared their campsite, Bloody Knoll, with the New Zealanders and, when the leathernecks shipped out for other campaigns, they left behind articles that have marked military camps since the Roman Empire — buttons, badges, emblems

and other small pieces of clothing and equipment.

Batten stuck some of those small items into his pocket, and kept them, for more than 40 years.

Enemy action was fierce during Batten's tours on Guadalcanal, but the biggest killer wasn't the enemy.

"Climate was more harmful to our men and yours (Americans) than the war," said Batten. "High fever and stomach ulcers sent him home from Bougainville two days before the war ended.

AFTER THE WAR, BATTEN worked as an automotive parts manager, but the Marines he knew in combat never left his memory. "I knew if I ever came to the United States, I wanted to return these to a Marine unit," Batten said Tuesday when he presented a small collection of buttons and emblems to Bill Buck, Deputy Director of the Joint Public Affairs Office here.

The items will be forwarded to the Marine Corps Museum in Washington, D.C.

Key to Sea Power

Energy Awareness Week underway

The fifth annual Energy Awareness Week, Oct. 25 through 31, is now underway. Navy and Marine Corps commands, units, and stations are developing and promoting a stronger appreciation for our energy resources. The theme is Energy: Key to Sea Power.

According to the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps Planning Ideas and Resources Guide, sea power is unique to the Navy and Marine Corps, whether patrolling the oceans, the air space above the

sea, or conducting a beach-head landing. It is sea power that allows America's strength to be known world-wide.

The Honorable John Lehman, Secretary of the Navy, wrote, "The Navy and Marine Corps are at the forefront of our national defense strategy. Maritime deployments to distant points can be achieved quickly and efficiently, a testament of this nation's strength through sea power."

"However, the mobility of these forces on land and sea is only as long-reaching as are our efforts to

ensure the adequacy of energy resources. We in the Department of the Navy, as managers of public funds, have a responsibility to continue seeking economies and efficiencies in all that we do. With our every increasing annual energy bill, we must continue our efforts to improve our energy efficiency."

According to the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps Planning Ideas and Resources Guide, the Navy Department's energy program consists of tasks in three

categories: ensure that adequate energy supplies are available to sustain peacetime and combat operations; improve the energy efficiency of the shore establishment and operating forces, and substitute more plentiful energy sources for natural petroleum.

It is estimated that a cost savings of \$200,000,000 has resulted in FY1981 alone from energy management efforts throughout the naval complex, according to the resource guide.

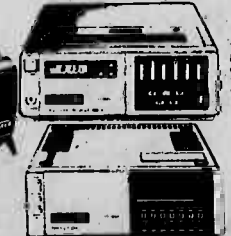

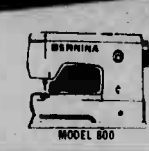

MCAS IWAKUNI, Japan — In sports competition it's usually the first team that grabs all the glory, but there is an old saying which says that, "a first class team usually has a good backup team." When it comes to Marine Corps Aviation it's the aircrews that are in the limelight. However, all good aircrews know the best backup team is a crack ground crew, and the aircrews of Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-212 know it well. Keeping the Lancers' F-4 Phantoms in top condition falls on the shoulders of Marines in various ground support positions ranging from flight operations to hydraulics.

"Our main function is to ensure that the aircraft are ready to go when the aircrews are ready for them. We check for leaks, pull pins and refuel the planes before they taxi out to fly into the wild blue yonder," said Gunnery Sergeant

Charles Yeager, noncommissioned officer in charge of flight line operations.

Flight line operations is just one of the many sections which comprise the backup team for Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-212. Also lending a hand in keeping the Lancers flying high are a variety of shops, like the electrical shop where Marines repair everything from simple switches to complex electrical circuits.

Moving from switches and circuits, the hydraulic shop ensures that all components which use hydraulic fluid are in good working order, and the powerplant section makes sure that the Phantom's high performance engines are in top working order at all times.

The aircrews of Marine Fighter Attack Squadron-212 have been flying for 40 years and, as always, backing up the Lancers is a crack ground crew.

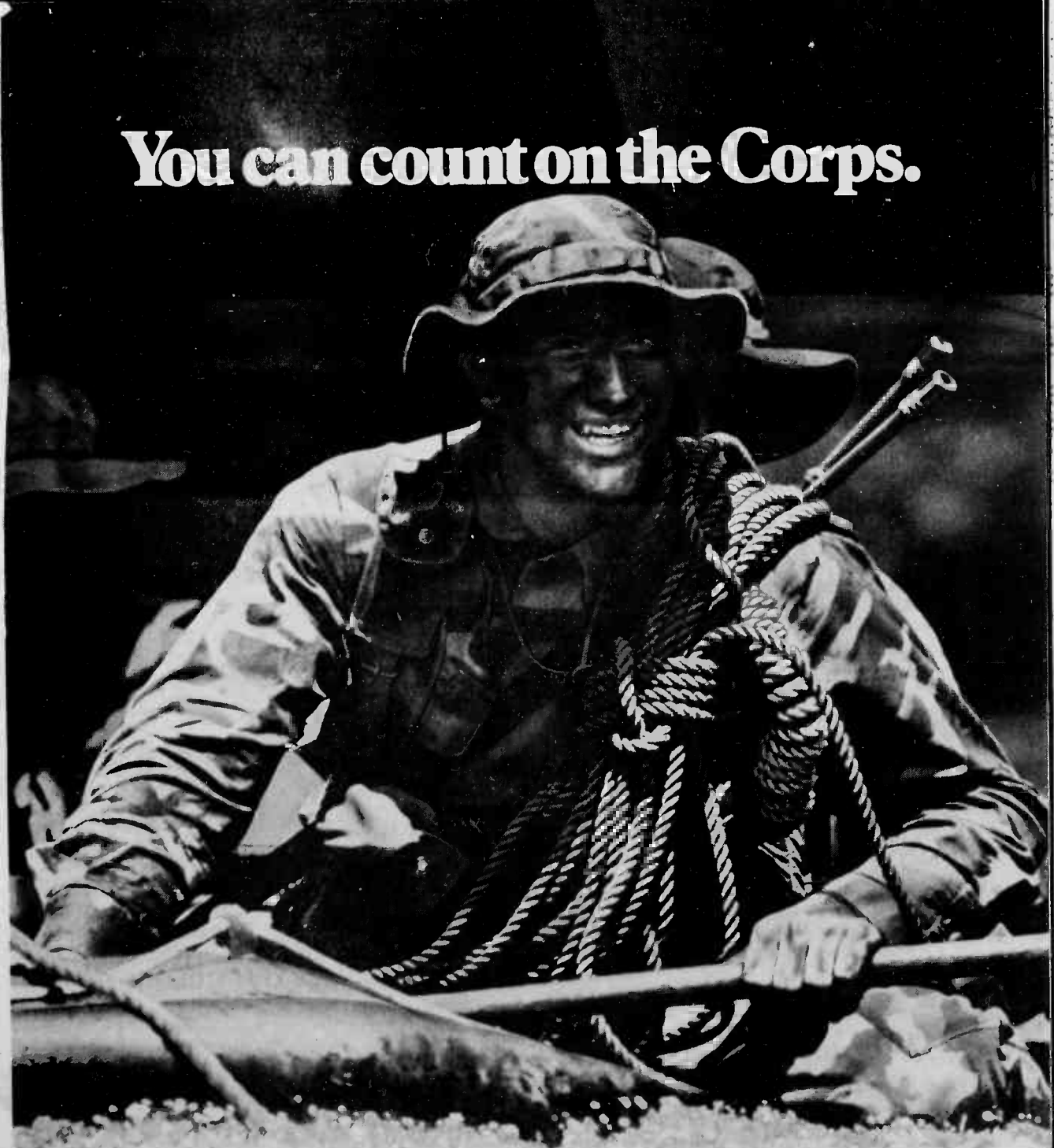

Reservists hit the beach at Bellows

BELLOWS AIR FORCE STATION, Hawaii — Dune buggies, surfers and other beachgoers here provided a somewhat different training setting for the reservists of the 4th Force Reconnaissance Company. In spite of the onlookers, the recon reserves went about their weekend business as usual. Oct. 16 called for water exercises. After boarding a boat at Marine Corps Air Station Kaneohe Bay, the 10 two-man surface swimming teams and three scuba teams headed for their objective here. Stopping approximately 700 meters from shore, the reservists entered the water. According to Major Gordon Jackson, the unit's inspector-instructor, the idea next was to approach the beach in a clandestine manner, while carrying their clothing in water-proofed bags.

Once on the shore the plan called for the Marines to hide in the woods, change clothing, and move out on a scouting mission. But, it did not quite work that

way. Jackson said a majority of the reservists were fresh from basic training and unfamiliar with the techniques; so, the process was repeated a few times. "The first time around it wasn't so good, but after doing it several times, they got the hang of it." Once it was dark, the reserves broke down into six patrol teams. This portion of the training cycle tasked them with moving toward designated objectives and gathering information. An evaluator was assigned to each team to observe how it conducted its mission. That phase was completed sometime during the wee hours of Sunday morning. After returning to their unit in Honolulu, the reserves were given a massive critique which Jackson called, "a critical portion of a reconnaissance mission." By his observation, he said the unit did well; however, training only once a month is a drawback. Jackson added that under the keen direction of Chief Warrant Officer-2 Al Chang, commander of the Reconnaissance Indoctrination Platoon, the newbies will be whipped in shape quickly.

Spin-on Oil Filters

Spin-on filters are much easier to change. They are self-contained since the complete filter assembly is disposed of and replaced with a new one.

1. With the engine cool, place a drip pan under the filter and remove it from the engine (turn counter-clockwise). Using same drip pan, remove oil from crankcase.
2. Clean all exposed surfaces of mounting base and check for any gaskets which may be stuck to sealing surface.
3. Lubricate surface of filter gasket with engine oil — never use grease.
4. Screw filter onto base until gasket makes contact. Tighten filter by hand with the number of turns specified in the installation instructions printed on the filter.
5. Replace crankcase drain plug and fill with specified amount of oil. Crank engine and run for at least 5 minutes while checking for leaks.

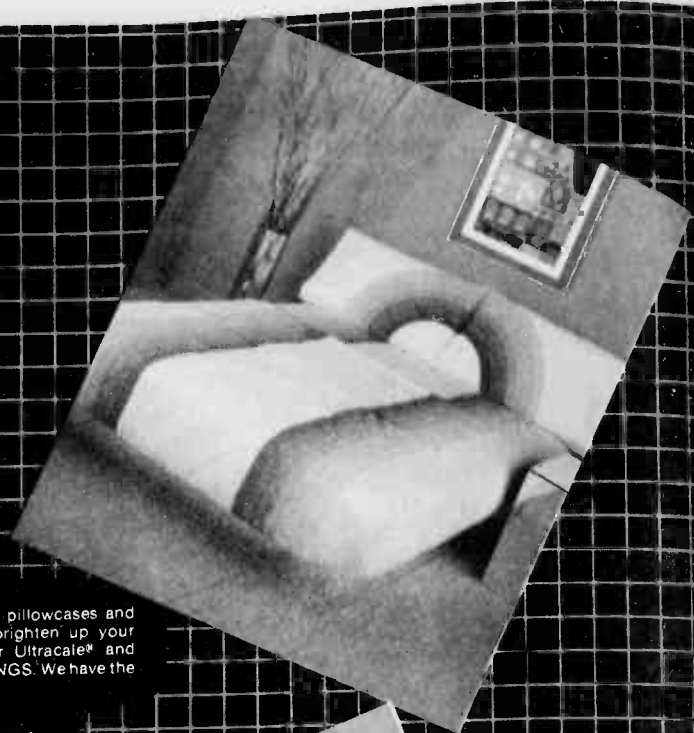

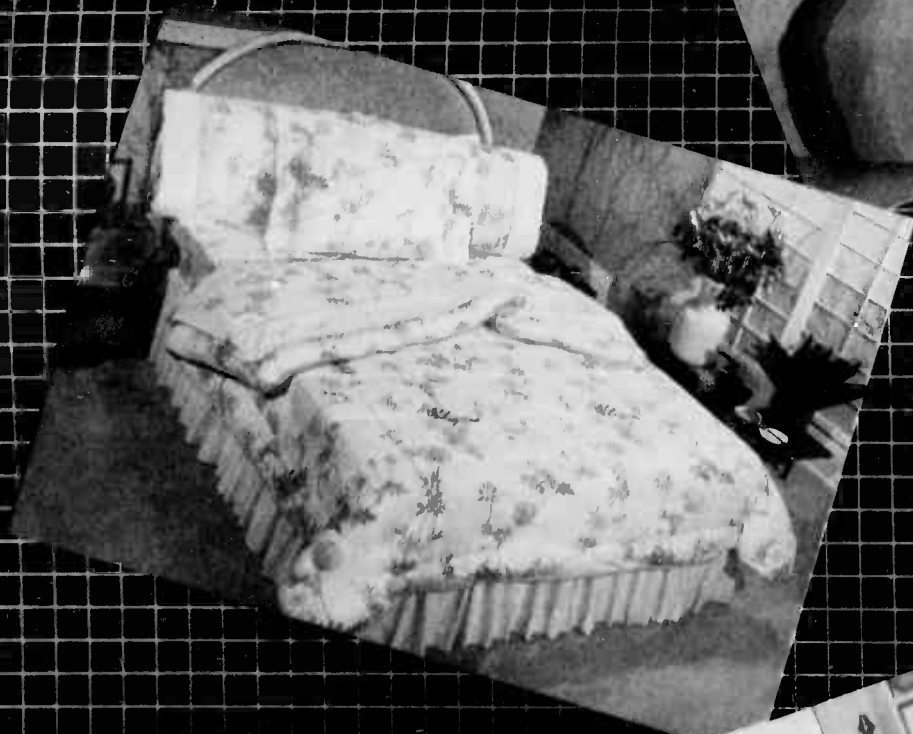

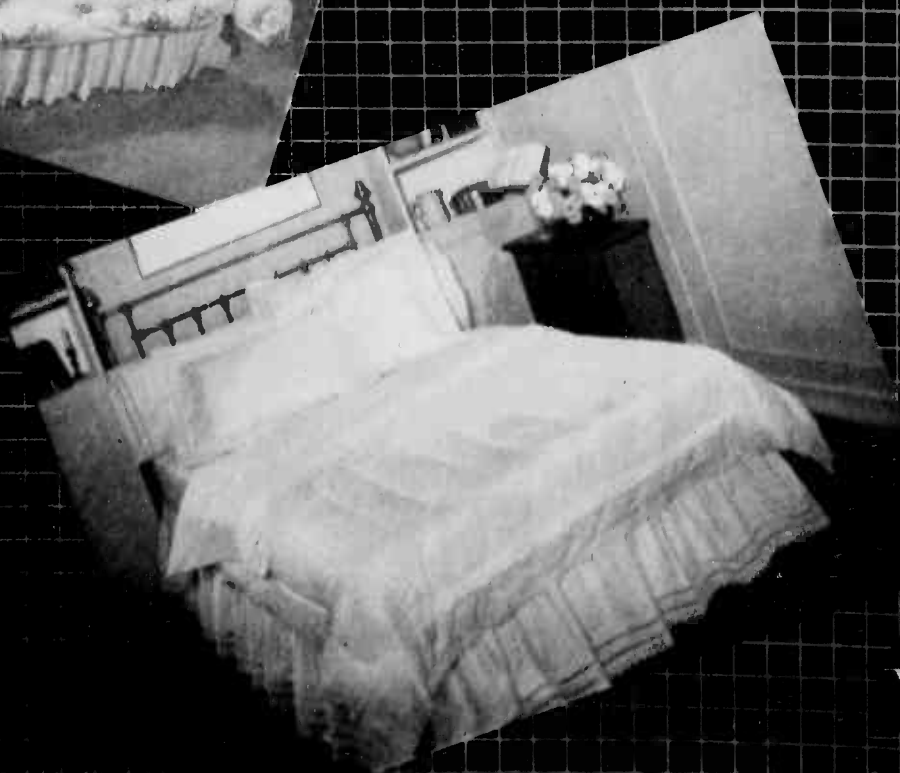

Jolly Roger takes Marines to hoop

The Jolly Rogers sent the air station's varsity basketball team to the lockers Thursday smothering them from a 105-85 defeat.

The score wasn't expected. The Hawaii Marines looked better organized than the Jolly Rogers. The Marines were probably better trained as a team. But it's difficult to beat experience and skill, and that's the hallmark of the swashbuckling Jolly bunch.

The game started quickly with Antoine Goodlow chalking up four points before the leathernecks could get on the board. The Hawaii Marines didn't stand still for long.

Staff Sergeant Norris Chappel

stood at the free throw line and sent two-for-two to the net to tie the Jolly Rogers at 18. On the way to the tie Chappel, scored two baskets, Sergeant Ellis Duncan scored three and Corporal Joseph Pemberton helped with one.

After the two freebies, the game exploded for the Hawaii Marines. Chappel netted two more baskets and two more free points. Pemberton added his comments with two baskets while the Hawaii Marines maintained the lead.

Ten minutes into the game it seemed as if the Marines might be able to defeat the undefeated Jolly Rogers. The leathernecks led 28-23.

The momentum was all for the Marines, but then the tide changed. The Jolly Rogers started playing better team ball. That

small improvement, combined with the skill and experience expected from former collegiate basketball stars, was more than the leathernecks could handle. The end of the first half found the Marines trailing 51-47.

The third quarter was a constant battle between the teams as each scored after the other. Then two incidents marred the performance.

There was some confusion early in the quarter among the officials. They couldn't decide which Marine had been fouled. The end result was Chappel shot twice from the line, missed once and earned zero points. Lance Corporal Jimmy Harvey approached the line next and went two-for-two and added two points to the scorebook.

The other incident was a collision between a Jolly Roger player and Duncan. The crash sent Duncan to the floor, and then to the bench, but not before he had scored eight points and been instrumental in many more.

The second half proved to be the Marines' undoing as the Jolly bunch blasted the net for 54 points. Michael Parker netted 12 points, followed by Bob Nash with 10, Robert Smith with eight, and Artie Wilson with six. These four ball handlers totaled 36 points in the second half — one basket shy of the leathernecks total second half offense.

The final buzzer handed the Hawaii Marines their third defeat in five games, and added a sixth notch for the Jolly Rogers' undefeated tally.

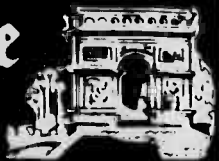

DEERS enrollment

WASHINGTON, D.C. — By now, each active duty Marine should have sponsored and verified each of their eligible dependents, regardless of age, for enrollment in DEERS. The intensified enrollment of dependents of active duty Marines in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System ended Oct. 1. While active duty and retired Marines are automatically enrolled in the DEERS program based on existing service records, dependent enrollments are the responsibility of the sponsor.

DEERS is a system designed to cut down the number of people illegally using military benefits. Currently, it is being used in the area of military health care. Planners of the program hope to eventually include exchange and commissary privileges in the system.

According to Manpower officials here, eligibility checks by CONUS military medical treatment facilities and CHAMPUS officials has already begun. The eligibility checks are being done through the DEERS data base. "Failure to enroll," say the officials, "may result in billing to the member for medical treatment rendered."

"The importance of enrolling your dependents in DEERS cannot be overemphasized," the officials continued. "If you have not already done so, in order to ensure that your dependents receive the benefits to which they are entitled, enroll them in DEERS today."

MCO 1750.8 explains DEERS and establishes procedures for enrollment. Marines should contact their personnel officer for details.

Light armed vehicles

WASHINGTON — The contract for the production of the first 60 Light Armored Vehicles (LAV) in the Marine Corps was awarded to General Motors of Canada.

That contract, awarded by the U.S. Army Tank Automotive Command, totaled \$29.9 million and is the first in a five-year multiyear contract for 929 vehicles totaling \$447.8 million. The Marine Corps will receive 289 of the LAVs.

The LAV is expected to be used by rapid deployment forces. It is highly mobile, air transportable and armor-protected. The LAV travels in excess of 60 miles per hour, and mounts the 25mm rapid-fire automatic cannon.

The contract was awarded based on field tests conducted earlier this year on four vehicles from three companies.

Included were a tracked vehicle built by Alvis Ltd. of Coventry, England; the eight-wheel vehicle from General Motors of Canada; and both four and six-wheel vehicles from Cadillac Gage Co. of the Detroit Metropolitan area.

Competitive testing at Yuma Proving Ground, Ariz. and Twentynine Palms, Calif., included battlefield tactical situations expected to confront the vehicle in its actual roles.

The Marine Corps will begin receiving 60 of the first LAVs produced in approximately one year.

Navy Relief Society

WASHINGTON — With the current economic hard times, the Navy Relief Society's caseload has almost doubled from what it was just five years ago. As a result, the Society is in need of more volunteers to help handle the overload.

Since it was founded 78 years ago, the NRS's sole purpose has been to assist sailors, Marines, active and retired, their dependents, and the dependents of deceased servicemembers.

"Thanks to the extraordinary generosity of its contributors," states Manpower officials in ALMAR 203/82, "the society has been able to finance these heavy requirements without difficulty. However, the overload on the dedicated volunteers from the Navy-Marine Corps community, who perform the great bulk of Navy Relief's work, is another matter."

While volunteerism is on the upswing at almost every Navy Relief activity, it is not growing as fast as the caseload. More volunteers must be recruited and the most likely candidates will continue to be among the spouses of active duty Marines. "We should be able to do more," officials added, "to tap the great reservoir of experience and talent in the retired community."

In addition, Manpower officials encouraged all Marines to pursue active participation on the advisory boards that provide local guidance and assistance to Navy Relief field activities.

"Commanders should give personal attention and support to the operations of the Navy Relief Society as one means of fulfilling their responsibility for providing programs that give prompt, qualified, and effective assistance to Marines and their families when needed," they concluded.

Protect your property

There have been 315 reported larcenies of private property here during the first nine months of this year, according to Sergeant David Watson, Statistician for the Provost Marshal's Office, with more than half involving items which weren't locked up.
