Rescuer rescued

One survives helo crash

A memorial service was held Monday at the Air Station Chapel here in memory of Captains Ronald G. Powell, Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-165, and Richard L. Ferguson, Marine Air Base Squadron-24.

The two pilots, along with the crew chief, Corporal Mark Rager, 22, also from HMM-165, were returning from Maui when their CH-46 Sea Knight helicopter crashed into the ocean between Maui and Lanai Nov. 17.

Rager, who survived the crash, was treated and released from Maui Memorial Hospital Nov. 18, but was later taken to Tripler Army Medical Center for observation.

"I don't know what happened," he said of the incident. "We got separated from the other birds and were trying to catch up." The downed helicopter was one of three returning to the air station

here after transporting 40 members of the Young Presidents' Organization from Maui to Kahoolawe, then back to Maui.

"I was working on the life preservers we used while hauling the Young Presidents' Organization," Rager said. "I looked out the window and we were heading toward the other planes. Everything seemed to be good. The pilots were talking to each other. About a minute after that, we hit the water and I was thrown from the aircraft.

"I inflated my life vest. I used my left hand, pulled the toggle and it inflated," he said.

According to Rager, his rescue took approximately 45 minutes.

"I used my radio (part of the life vest equipment) to contact Maui control with a mayday. The other Marine helo may have heard me too. I shot a pen flare and they homed-in on my radio strobelight. They (Search and Rescue

helicopter from Station Operations and Maintenance Squadron) dropped a SAR swimmer into the water and he came out and got me. I was hoisted up. I didn't break any bones, just bruised my body. Everybody keeps telling me I'm a lucky fellow," he said.

On Nov. 18, the day before the helicopter mishap, Rager helped rescue the pilot of a downed Piper Cherokee aircraft that crashed one nautical mile south of Honolulu International's Reef Runway. Rager hoisted the civilian pilot into the Marine transport helicopter.

Search and rescue efforts continued until sunset Nov. 18 for Powell and Ferguson, but to no avail.

Powell, 32, from Gadsden, Ala., is survived by his wife, Sherry, his daughter, Kayla, and son, Ronald Jason. Ferguson, 29 from Tippencanoe, Ind., is survived by his wife, Cheryl and daughter, Nicole.

MAC flight travelers must be in uniform

Beginning Dec. 1, all military personnel traveling on Department of Defense owned or controlled aircraft will be required to be in uniform, according to Air Force General James R. Allen, Commander-in-Chief, Military Airlift Command (CINCMAC).

CINCMAC announced the new policy in a message after consulting with Army Gen. John W. Vessey Jr., Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Marine Corps liaisons at MAC

terminals have listened to complaints from leathernecks about traveling in uniform for years. In addition to complaints, excuses abounded. Marines claimed to have lost their luggage, spilled things on their uniforms, and some have even claimed to have sold them.

Sergeant Jorge Santiago, Marine Liaison at Hickam Air Force Base, is excited about the new policy. "We've (Navy and Marines) attempted to enforce the

rule all along," said Santiago, "but it's hard when they let them on in civies at Guam and Travis (San Francisco). Now, there's no ifs, ands and buts about it, they just don't fly."

The policy applies to duty and leave passengers traveling on military and MAC contracted (Category B) civil aircraft departing from military airfields and commercial gateways.

"Our passenger agents are not enforcing a MAC requirement,"

stated Gen. Allen, "but are acting on behalf of the traveler's service. Our agents will limit themselves to what the policy requires."

The policy requirement is simple: passenger agents will not process or board any service member who is out of uniform. They will not attempt to arbitrate specific uniform combinations, nor to judge any member's compliance with service's detailed policies on placement of insignia, etc. That's the individual service's

responsibility.

"They (passenger agents) will continue cheerfully to provide requested information to all passengers and potential passengers, whether in uniform or not," stated Gen. Allen.

Exceptions to the uniform ruling are limited to: when civilian attire is required by the USAF Foreign Clearance Guide; and when the service member's orders authorize civilian attire.

The policy may be waived for military people in civilian clothing for reasons beyond their reasonable control, provided designated local representatives of the members' services concur.

Enforcement of this policy comes at a time when MAC terminals are busiest — holiday leave time. Passengers can assist them in remaining a source of help — not grief — to travelers by wearing the proper uniforms.

Beachmasters juggle supplies for MAU Marines in Lebanon

BEIRUT, Lebanon (Delayed) — When the 24th Marine Amphibious Unit came ashore here to replace the 32nd MAU, dug-in around the Beirut International Airport, hundreds of tons of supplies flowed ashore like the relentless Mediterranean tide.

But the evolution was much more difficult and complicated than the ebb and flow of seawater. Bringing the right items to the beach at the right time took tremendous, sometimes tedious, coordination between Marines and sailors on ships and shore.

In Beirut, a sweaty band of Navymen, working with the 32nd MAU as they moved back aboard ship, also handled all supplies coming in for the 24th MAU. "It was easier to have one beach group coordinating all the movements," said Boatswain (CWO-4) Harold R. Smith Jr., the 36-year-old Beachmaster with Beach Group Two. His unit

relieved another Beachmaster outfit which had been here since the landing of the multi-national force.

"When they finished moving out the 32nd, they went aboard ship and we took over," Smith commented.

Much of the Beachmaster's efficiency was credited to the unique causeway which was quickly shoved ashore to allow trucks and other vehicles to roll directly off the landing craft.

The causeway is a small, floatable pier that can be set up on almost any beach. "It takes the amphibious Seabees a couple of hours to put it together, said Smith, veteran sailor and native of Bayonne, N.J. Causeways are composed of 30 yard sections wide enough for two vehicles to pass. Usually the four sections stored aboard an amphibious landing ship are put together at sea and towed to the shore where one end is anchored to the beach.

"This is done to keep the

Marines from getting their wheels wet," joked Smith. The water at the other end of the causeway is usually about 10 feet deep.

Around Bos'n Smith's causeway floated other sailors helping with the change-over landings. An Assault Craft Unit used utility landing barges and the smaller amphibian vehicles to move most of the Marine equipment from ship to shore. Lighter gear was flown in by helicopter, but the tough task fell mainly to the coxswains of the boats.

Bringing a landing craft to the end of the causeway for unloading can be tricky for the crew. "They have to hook their front ramp onto the 'Rhino horn' at the end of the pier," said Smith. That keeps the landing craft from drifting while allowing the causeway to rise and fall with the waves. If the surf is too rough the ramp can break away from the boat and be damaged.

Once the supplies and equipment were across the

causeway and ashore, they were counted and sorted by men of MAU Service Support Group-24 who also moved them to storage areas near Marine positions at the airport.

"Our workdays depend on what is needed by the MAU," said First Lieutenant Joe Castle, 26, commander of the Landing Support Detachment. During the first days of the landing changeover, Marines worked 24 hours as they moved the 24th MAU ashore.

"With most of their gear ashore, our work day is down to 12 hours," said Castle, from Norstown, Pa. He expected the work days for his 70-man crew to get even shorter as the Marines became more settled here in Beirut. But the job on the beaches will never really end.

As long as the Marines are in Lebanon, most of their resupply will come from the amphibious ships anchored off the coast of Lebanon.

Aircraft carrier hosts open house

PEARL HARBOR — Hawaii residents and special groups will be able to walk a carrier deck that is the length of three football fields and tour a hangar bay that could comfortably park 580 cars when the aircraft carrier USS Coral Sea (CV-43) hosts open house, Nov. 24.

Special tours for school, youth and other organized groups will be given by appointment only on Wednesday (Nov. 24) from 9 to 11 a.m. and 1 to 4 p.m. Organized groups may call COMNAVBASE Public Affairs at 471-0281 for reservations.

A general public open house will be held Wednesday (Nov. 24) from noon to 4 p.m.

Entry for the open house will be at Halawa gate with parking at the Naval Supply Center's adjacent areas. Overflow parking will be available at Aloha Stadium. The Navy will provide shuttle bus service to and from Aloha Stadium and the ship, which will be berthed at Hotel Piers 3 and 4.

The 973-foot, 63,380-ton carrier will hold the open house during a break for the Thanksgiving holiday from a fleet exercise being conducted in the area. Seventeen West Coast-based ships of Battle

Group One participating in the exercise will stop at Pearl Harbor for the holiday.

The battle group is commanded by RADM Paul E. McCarthy who is embarked in the Coral Sea.

The Coral Sea's open house will be the first opportunity Hawaii residents have had to tour an aircraft carrier since the USS Enterprise was open to the public in 1966. At that open house more than 35,000 visitors were able to get a firsthand look at the host-

life aboard a carrier.


The Coral Sea is capable of providing all the services of a modern city of its crew of more than 4,500 officers and enlisted men with every facility from its own post office to a combined TV and radio station.

The Coral Sea began her commissioned service in October 1947. She was named for the Battle of Coral Sea which marked the first success for the United States between major forces in the

Pacific during World War II.

A veteran of the Vietnam conflict, the Coral Sea saw its first combat action in 1965 with the next eight years spent giving support to ground troops in South Vietnam.

Since then the Coral Sea has continued to uphold her mission as a backbone of American seapower, earning numerous awards for the outstanding performances of ship and crew.



Intelligence Brief

The eight-wheel drive Soviet BTR-60P is an infantry squad fighting vehicle which comes in four other versions: BTR-60PA, BTR-60PB, BTR-60PU (Command vehicle) and forward air control vehicle. It has a two-man crew and, depending on the model, carries 14 to 16 men. The BTR-60P has a large boat-like hull, well-sloped armor, and a rear-mounted powerplant. The BTR-60P's land speed is 80 Kmph, with a cruising range of 500 kilometers. The BTR-60PB has overhead protection, fireports, and a turret-mounted 14.5mm machine gun firing HE, armor piercing (AP), and armor piercing incendiary (API) ammunition to a maximum range of 1,500 meters. The armor penetration at 500 meters is 32 millimeters. There is also a 7.62mm coaxial machine gun.





New memorial park dedicated

HAIKU-MAKAWAO, MAUI — It rained. The blustery winds made their umbrellas flop inside out. The leaky open-air tent was too small for the nearly 200 people who came from all over the United States. But this island adopted them.

Despite the conditions, they sat through the ceremony to dedicate a new park. Some squinted or wiped an occasional tear from their weathered faces. Others did not bother to hide their emotions, they choked back a sob when the bugler began playing taps.

One frail World War II veteran looked out over the rainswept landscape and with a quivering note of nostalgia remarked, "Look, it still rains horizontally here, just like back then. I've come home."

It was in February 1944, the newly formed 4th Marine Division set up camp at the base of a small hill on the side of Mount Haleakala. The area is now covered mostly with eucalyptus and Norfolk pines.

Nearly four decades later, a Marine color guard detail, a bugler, a rifle squad, together with Maui residents and about 100 World War II veterans and their families gathered to dedicate a new six-acre memorial park, which was the site of the division's old headquarters.

THE PARK IS A FENCED AREA among the trees growing on the edge of Kaunioa Hill. Stone walls of volcanic rock frame the entrance and inside there is a double pavilion with tables and grill, running water, landscaping and a parking lot. Five more pavilions will be built in the near future. A memorial plaque will be placed on the first pavilion in honor of Major General Clifton B. Cates, one of the commanders of the Maui Marine Camp and the 19th Commandant of the Marine Corps.

The second and third pavilion will honor congressional Medal of Honor recipient Colonel Justice M. Chambers and the Fourth Tank Battalion respectively, according to former Marine sergeant Jack Crouse.

A central feature of the new park is the monument that stood on the side of Kokomo Road. Recently a new generation

of Marines and Maui's Army Reserve labored to set the concrete monument on its new base within the fenced area.

The park is a realization of Cates' dream. Six months before his death, 12 years ago, Cates asked Chambers to carry on the dream. Like a sacred trust, Chambers carried the torch, getting support from retired, active duty and reserve Marines. Chambers, lauded for his action on Iwo Jima, attended the blessing of the park site last year. He died in August of this year.

CHAMBER'S WIDOW TRAVELED from her home in Rockville, Md., to attend the dedication. She sat silent throughout the ceremony. Later she said, "This was one of the most important things in my husband's life. Last year a Honolulu newspaper ran a photo of a Marine pouring concrete here. He was so excited about that. Now his dream has become a reality. I'm so pleased."

Two Medal of Honor recipients were present at the ceremony. Retired Colonel Joseph J. McCarthy received the nation's highest award for bravery for his action on Iwo Jima. Former First Lieutenant Richard K. Sorenson was lauded for his heroics on Kwajalein.

The people of Maui not only shared the painful memories of the war, but they also shared Cate's and Chamber's dream for a memorial park. Mr. Jack Crouse, a native of New York, has made Maui his home since the war. Crouse, along with other Maui residents, headed local efforts to get the park started. "I'm amazed and touched at how the entire people of the county cared so much about this memorial park," said Mrs. Chambers.

"THE PEOPLE HERE HAVEN'T changed a bit. They were so nice to us 38 years ago and I'm grateful for their hospitality then and now," said retired Lieutenant Colonel Tom Witherspoon. Witherspoon, a native of Long Beach, Calif., was a rifle company commander with the 25th Marine Regiment.

Also present at the dedication was a former police officer during the war. He remembered the multitude of training Marines, which was a common sight in the Valley Isle. He is now Maui Mayor Hannibal Tavares. "It is a distinct honor

to have the Marines call this island their home away from home. On behalf of the people, the Marines of the Fourth are truly affectionately and proudly called 'Maui's Own.'"

The park marks the spot where thousands of Marines, between campaigns, learned to love Maui. It is set in pastures where Camp Maui housed the division's headquarters, and the three regiments practiced the skills needed and gained the endurance that allowed them to capture tiny but strategic Pacific islands, then only known to a few map experts.


"I can recall the countless hours and days practicing with our weapons in the boondocks," said former Private First Class Norman Chandler of Hartsfield, Ala. "But, it sure paid off."

DURING THE 21 MONTHS IN THE Pacific, the division engaged in combat at four campaigns: First, at Roi-Namur at the Kwajalein toll on the Marshall Island group; then at Saipan and Tinian on the Marianas Island and finally Iwo Jima. More than 3,500 4th Marine Division leathernecks were killed in action throughout the campaigns.


Iwo Jima brought back painful memories for the veterans, Maui residents and their families. It was the longest and most fierce of the four campaigns. "We don't talk much about Iwo," said former Corporal Clyde Dickerson of Riverside, Calif. "It was such a horrible 26-day experience for us."


Many of the veterans who once lived in the pasture the park overlooks are now gone. Others live-on, holding dearly the memories of comradeship, victory, valor and fallen friends. "But, the new park will be a place not only for the people of Maui those veterans loved so much, but also a spot to which their children's children will come," said Colonel Chambers, a few months before his death.

Make plans early for holiday season

The Military Traffic Management Command is urging service members to carefully plan their trips and make reservations as early as possible for leave travel during the holiday season. This should make it easier to shop around for the discount fares available to military personnel traveling on leave at their own expense and help avoid some of the rush and congestion at transportation terminals.

Fare discounts, ranging from 25 percent to 50 percent, are available on most airline and AMTRAK routes. Travelers should check with their local Scheduled Airline Traffic Office (SATO), travel agent or airline to

make sure they are getting the best price available, since many promotional fares may be even lower than the military discount.

The United Services Organization (USO) has centers in 18 U.S. airports and five terminals overseas. The centers provide information, refreshments and recreation facilities. Some have babysitting services, nurseries and interpreters. Hours vary from center to center, but all are open during heavy traffic hours.

Personnel who experience service-related problems during their travel can get help at the military information desks

located in major U.S. terminals. Assistance can also be obtained from the nearest military installation, regardless of the traveler's branch of service.

Additionally, the American Red Cross, Traveler's Aid and the various USO centers listed in local telephone directories are available for help.

Military personnel are urged to report excellent service or travel problems to the Military Traffic Management Command (MTMC) Washington, D.C. 20315, on a DD Form 1341, which can be obtained from local transportation offices.

MTMC uses the reports to ensure that service members continue to receive high quality service.

Teenagers need foster homes

To help meet the need for foster homes in Hawaii, a Foster Parent Program has been established.

Its purpose, according to Nancy Donnelly, program coordinator, is to recruit, certify, provide support, and train foster parents who are willing to open their homes to teenagers in a crisis.

Many teenagers, ages 12 to 17, who are judged by the Family Court of Hawaii to need out-of-home placement, are in need of foster homes. These teenagers need to find living situations out of their own homes for varying reasons; they may have run away from home and don't want to return because of family difficulties; their parents may not want them to return home or refuse to take responsibility for them; or the Family Court may have ordered out-of-home placement for their well being.

THE TEENAGERS, FOR whom a foster home placement

would be appropriate, don't need to be locked up and could benefit greatly from living in a stable, sharing family situation, according to Donnelly.

The foster family will receive a stipend from the Family Court for each foster child (\$232 or \$332 per month depending on the type of behavior problems of the teenager and the responsibilities of the foster parent(s)) to cover the costs of shelter, food, clothing, and personal incidentals.

In addition, the foster parents will be certified as volunteers for the judiciary which entitle them to liability insurance and reimbursement for certain expenses, according to Donnelly. The Foster Parent Program staff will provide the foster parents with orientation, support, and training. The child's probation officer will make regular contacts with the foster child and foster parents to provide any assistance.

The requirements for being a Family Court Foster Parent are: room in home; income sufficient to

meet the needs of the family; personal characteristics such as stability, tolerance, understanding, and the capacity to learn in relationships with others; and willingness to work with the natural parents and court officers regarding the foster child.


AS MANY HOMES AS CAN be recruited and certified are needed, says Donnelly, and will be used for adolescents needing placement. All types of foster homes are needed: Emergency Shelter Homes (emergency placements lasting one week or less); Short Term Foster Homes (placements lasting three months or less); and Long Term Foster Homes (placements lasting longer than three months). According to Donnelly, foster homes are especially needed in the areas of Wainanae, Kalihi-Palama, and Waimanalo.

Marines lose to Flyers, 86-79

PORT SHAFER, Hawaii — The Varsity Basketball team blew a 13-point third quarter lead and lost to the Hickam Flyers, 86-79, Thursday in a game full of turnovers.

The Flyers' head coach Ken Pupun attributes the win to benching his starters until they decided to play as a team. "We were upset as to the way the game was going. We have a certain way of playing and the Marines were not letting us play to our style. I sent the stars on the bench until they were ready to play, then put them back out there and they won."

The Marines controlled the opening tip and scored first, but then stalled for the next eight minutes allowing the airmen to build up a six-point lead. With two minutes left in the first quarter, the Marines retook the lead

17-16 and maintained it until late into the third quarter.

Cpl James Puckett led the scoring for the Marines in the first half with 12 points. Their largest margin was nine points, however, a final minute bucket by the Flyers narrowed it to seven at halftime, 39-32.

The statisticians had both teams scoring an equal amount of baskets during the first half, but the leathernecks' foul shooting gave them the advantage. The Marines shot seven out of 11 from the free throw line and didn't commit a shooting foul.

The Marines kept pounding at the Flyer defense and after five minutes had developed a 13-point lead.

From there it was all downhill.

Youth basketball registration scheduled



And, who can forget the Miami Dolphins when they had their

perfect season. There were running backs like Jim Kiik and Larry Czonks, fired up by a quarterback named Bob Griese.

Do you remember the intense rivalry for quarterback in the Dallas Cowboy "recovery period" after Don Meredith left? What wore their names? Something like Rodger Stauback and Craig Morton. And, who was that end that played for Dallas, known as "Bob the Bullet"? Ah yes, I remember. It was Bobby Hayes who was converted from a world class sprinter to a split end.

There was the year that Duane Thomas had an outstanding year as a running back for the Dallas Cowboys and then literally quit football. Then he tried to come back, but... no one wanted him. So he went to the World Football League and played here in Hawaii. But he was never as good as he once had been.

Do you remember when New Orleans was playing Detroit in 1970 and a stubby field goal specialist came out to the field to attempt a 63 year field goal? The kicker's name was Tom Dempsey. One player for Detroit, Jack Kramer remembers how the football left the tee — the ball seemed to go on forever until it crossed the cross bars, and New Orleans had beat the Detroit Lions.




