Unit information officers help publicize activities

"It's no problem," said Gunnery Sergeant Victor Swanson, 1st Radio Battalion, about his duties as unit information officer.

"The main thing is getting cooperation from other offices on station, and that cooperation is there. Everything runs smoothly."

Swanson, a career planner, is one of many Marines and sailors who are assigned extra or collateral duty as a UIO.

The UIO's job is to help publicize his unit and the personnel in it, according to the SOP for Public Affairs.

UIOs serve as a point of contact for their unit as well as the Joint

Public Affairs Office. They maintain a liaison with JPAO concerning any tours of their unit given by the Public Affairs Community Relations Chief.

Any promotions, achievements, or other newsworthy events are passed on to JPAO, where there is normally a channel for its publication.

"I don't have any problems finding news," said Swanson.

"There is usually enough going

on. In our unit, the career planner is usually the UIO because he's the one who gets a chance to see everyone that reports into the unit."

The Fleet Home Town News release program is also the responsibility of the UIO. This program ensures that most accomplishments of service members have the opportunity to be published in home town newspapers.

UIOs must ensure that the releases are accurately completed by individuals and then sent to JPAO. The releases are then

forwarded to Fleet Home Town News Center, Norfolk, Va., where they are then distributed to the various home towns."

"We have the Fleet Home Town News system down pretty good," said Captain Diane Higgs, UIO for Marine Air Control Squadron-2. "The troops usually come in on time to fill the releases out."

Higgs, Air Defense Control Officer, has other collateral duties besides UIO. "I'm NBC Officer, Human Affairs Officer, and Drug and Alcohol Abuse Control Officer," she said.

"I can't spend as much time as

UIO as I'd like to, but it's pretty rewarding. My UIO duties take a couple hours a week, and I have a trusty sergeant who does a lot of the paperwork."

Like Higgs, First Lieutenant Lamont Boileau, UIO for Headquarters Company, 3d Marines, also has other collateral duties.

"I'm company commander, Data Processing Officer, unit representative, and Drug and Alcohol Abuse Officer," he said.

"I have a clerk for my UIO and drug and alcohol abuse duties. We

also have our own bi-monthly company paper called 'Times,' which I oversee."

Boileau, who spends approximately 1 1/2 to 2 hours a week on UIO duties, said that the only problem he encounters is timeliness.

"When I have something that I think is important and I need press coverage, it has to be done on a timely basis," he said.

Timely news can be a training operation, change of command, or even a public relations function with members of the civilian community.

Communicators bring tidings to underprivileged kids

The Marines were at it again, spreading Christmas cheer to children in the civilian community.

Following in the footsteps of leatherneck reservists, who handed out toys to children on Oahu, Kauai, and Molokai, members of Marine Air Base Squadron-24 Communications joined efforts to arrange a Christmas party for 75 underprivileged children Dec. 23.

The party, held at Lanakila Multi-Purpose Senior Center in Kalihi, included songs, food, games, and even a Santa Claus, who handed out grab bag presents.

"There were five of us on the committee to arrange the party," said Corporal Delma Alvarado, committee chairman.

"We called various places to inquire about the children and a place for the party. Catholic Services Center referred us to Kalihi Family Services, who gathered the children for us."

Nathan Chang, supervisor for Kalihi Family Services Center, said that he children came from

diverse backgrounds. "The children were 9 to 12 years old," he said. "We opened the event to the whole community, but the purpose was for the underprivileged children from low to middle income families."

Alvarado said that the food was supplied by McDonalds. "Every one in MAHS-24 Comm donated so we could buy the food, decorations, prizes, and the items for the grab bags," she said.

Among the group of youngsters were three children from Makaha Child Abuse Center. "The child abuse center called and said they had three children they wanted to come to the party," said Lance Corporal Chris Pittman, committee member. "So I went down there and picked them up."

The Marines also had prizes for game winners, a door prize, and a prize for the best color drawing.

"This is a great idea," said Alvarado. "Some of these kids don't know what Christmas is all about. This helps them to have a better Christmas than they would have had."

And, judging from the 75 smiling faces, it was not only a great idea, but a great party.

PT-76 Amphibious Light Tank. Introduced in the early 1950s, the PT-76 remains the Soviets' only amphibious tank. While too lightly armed and armored to engage main battle tanks, it can destroy just about any other armored vehicle that gets within range of its 76-mm gun. This tank is well suited to spearheading amphibious assaults, supporting infantry, and conducting reconnaissance.

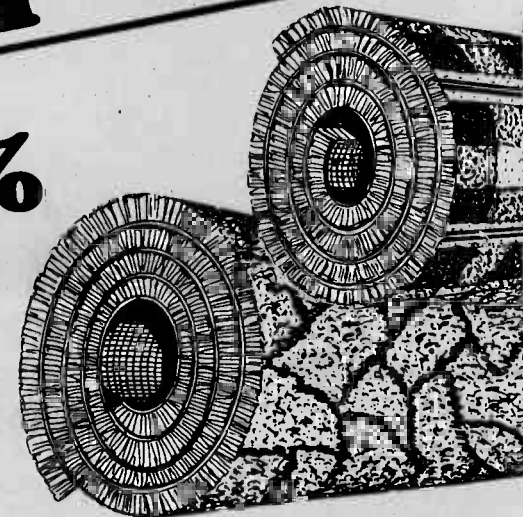

At a glance

Mail metering program

An official mail metering program, which starts Saturday, is designed to accurately determine the Marine Corps postage bill. The program requires that all mail chargeable to DOD 317 (Marine Corps) be deposited with the Station Post Office, Building 835.

Dependent dental

A Dependent Dental Care Program is offered at the Kaneohe

Branch Clinic the second Saturday of each month from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. The program includes a visual examination, a fluoride application and the proper method of brushing and flossing. A maximum of 75 appointments are taken each month, so dependents are encouraged to begin calling 257-3226 for an appointment the first work day of each month.

Proper I.D.

All patients, 10 or older, including active duty military personnel in uniform, must

present proper military identification before being treated at the Kaneohe Branch Clinic. This prevents unauthorized persons from using the military's medical facilities.

If military identification is unavailable, the patient, parent or guardian must sign a form attesting to the patient's eligibility. Proof of eligibility must then be presented to the facility before the end of the second work day or the individual will be billed for the services. This does not apply, however, in the case of real emergencies.

Retired Marine's daughter competes for Junior Miss title

The 17-year-old daughter of a retired Marine will compete with more than 45 other high school seniors from around the islands

for the title of Hawaii's Junior Miss and a chance for America's Junior Miss title.

Beverly Dawn Burgess, a senior at Kalanui High School, is the daughter of retired Master Sergeant William Burgess and his wife Angela.

"I'm really excited about it," said Beverly. "I'd like to win, but the main reason I entered was for the education. I want to go to college."

The 5-foot-7, green-eyed blonde enjoys riding dirt bikes, reading, cooking and exercising in her spare time. If she wins the Hawaii Junior Miss program, Beverly plans to attend either the University of Hawaii or the University of Georgia to study law.

All participants in the program will model fashions they sew themselves and will tour Washington Place and lunch with

the Governor and Mrs. Ariyoshi before being introduced to the public on Center Stage at Ala Moana Shopping Center, Jan. 9 at noon.

"There are a lot of things that she has become involved in that will be very rewarding to her," said Mrs. Burgess, a payroll supervisor at the Consolidated Financial Accounting Office here.

Hawaii's Junior Miss program was created in 1960 to recognize the islands' outstanding young women. The program is not a beauty contest, but bases its judging on scholastic achievement, poise, appearance, physical well-being and contributions to family and community.

"You have to be accepted to be a contestant in Junior Miss," explained Beverly, "and that's an honor in itself."

The contestants will be judged in three categories: poise and

appearance, physical fitness, and creative and performing arts, during preliminary nights, Jan. 21 and 22 at Farrington High School Auditorium. The group will then be narrowed to 15 girls who will vie for the title of Hawaii's Junior Miss on the final night, Jan. 29 at the auditorium. Tickets will be available at the door for \$6 each night.

Congeniality and scholastic achievement awards, among others will be presented on Final night along with the crowning of the 1983 Hawaii Junior Miss. The winner receives an \$8,000 scholarship at the state level and will be offered an additional \$40,000 scholarship toward a four year college education.

Hawaii's 1983 Junior Miss will also have the opportunity to represent the 50th state in America's Junior Miss pageant in Mobile, Ala. later next year.

Courts-Martial Report

EDITOR'S NOTE: Courts-Martial Report is compiled by the Joint Legal Services Center and is published as a source of information for all Marines.

Sergeant Darrell G. Highway, 1st Radio Battalion, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of assault by hitting a staff noncommissioned officer in the face with his fist.

He was sentenced to forfeiture of \$200 pay per month for two months and reduction to corporal.

Private First Class Jeffrey H. Johnson, 1st Battalion, 3d Marines, 1st Marine Brigade, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of assaulting another Marine by swinging at him with a pool cue and striking at him with a knife, and of twice communicating a threat to another Marine.

He was sentenced to six months confinement at hard labor, forfeiture of \$300 pay per month for six months and reduction to private.

Staff Sergeant Richard T. Rinck, Brigade Service Support Group, 1st Marine Brigade, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of disobeying the lawful command of a superior commissioned officer.

He was sentenced to two months confinement at hard labor and reduction to lance corporal.

PFC Ferdinand Resto, Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron-24, Marine Aircraft

Group-24, 1st Marine Brigade, was convicted at trial by general court-martial of twice failing to go to his appointed place of duty, of twice breaking restriction, of signing false official statements on five occasions, and of stealing \$5,624.79 in currency from the U.S. government.

He was sentenced to three years confinement at hard labor, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, reduction to private and a dishonorable discharge from the U.S. Marine Corps.

Private Melvin L. Price, Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, MCAS Kaneohe Bay, was convicted at trial by special court-martial of failing to go to his appointed places of duty on three occasions.

He was sentenced to two months confinement at hard labor and forfeiture of \$380 pay per month for two months.

PFC Mark D. Draughan, BSSG, was convicted at trial by general court-martial of larceny of \$399.25 and of \$399.75, all in U.S. currency from the U.S. government; of larceny of a U.S. Postal Service money order; and of larceny of a stereo cassette and headphones set of a value of about \$185, the property of another Marine.

He was sentenced to two years confinement at hard labor, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, reduction to private and a dishonorable discharge from the U.S. Marine Corps.

Teens visit elderly with songs, home-made gifts

Christmas is the time for giving but it's also the time for receiving. When a person is very old and alone, being on the receiving end is often just a dream.

Eighteen teens from the air station's Teen Center made a lot of dreams come true. Dec. 21, when they visited senior citizens at Ann Pearl's Nursing Home in Kaneohe.

The teens sang Christmas carols with more than 10 seniors before presenting each of them with brightly wrapped Christmas gifts.

Many of the gifts were hand-made by the teens, including 35 wheelchair totes designed to hang on the arm of the chairs. Fourteen pairs of hand-crocheted booties were donated by one of the mothers. In addition, the teens collected aluminum cans to buy gifts such as combs, change

purses, fims, cologne and small trays.

"Most of this was all their own initiative," said Teddie Williams, assistant director of the Teen Center. "They only came to us to help them organize it." Williams and Anne Legan, director, helped to coordinate the event.

According to Williams, "Most of these kids haven't seen their grandparents in a long time and many of the seniors don't get to see their grandchildren very often."

After handing out presents, the teens spent time talking with the seniors. "They seem to really appreciate our coming out here," said Mike Vezina, 19. "We're glad we could make their Christmas a little brighter."

"I think this is the best thing these kids have ever come up with," said Williams, "and if at all possible, they'll do it again."

Christmas is the time for loving and giving and remembering and the teens here didn't forget.

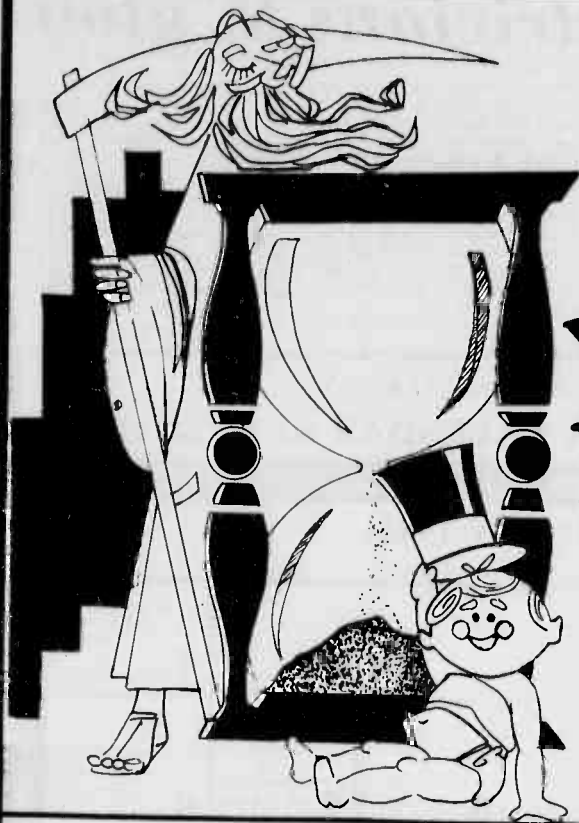

High winds and syrup cause electricians to glow

The office is cramped, with clipboards and key boxes lining the walls. An old file cabinet stands mute in one corner. The lineament testifies to the heavy traffic in and out of the room.

The two men who share this space as an office know the meaning of pressure.

"We put in over two weeks' work here during the week of the storm," said Dennis Shewell, Facilities Electric Shop foreman. It may be several weeks more before all the damage is fixed, but the major work has been completed.

Pete Benner, the office's other occupant, is the high-voltage work leader. He and 13 other men spent eight hours clearing the tangled mess of high-power lines along the road near Mokapu Gate.

The electricians volunteered to work through the Thanksgiving holiday to restore power as quickly as possible.

The shop has 16 workers, including Shewell, and they've been hard-pressed repairing storm damage together with their normal work load.

The shop takes care of all the

station's electrical needs, including maintaining runway navigation lights, galley equipment at both dining facilities, power lines in housing and three high-voltage distribution lines entering the air station at Mokapu Gate.

These three 12,000-volt distribution lines supply all the power for the air station and two of these were destroyed during the hurricane when high winds snapped power poles. The third line, which is buried, was undamaged.

The underground distribution line feeds the area west of Harris Avenue, and when Hawaiian Electric restored power to the station, only that area was able to get electricity. The other two lines were still being replaced.

The shop has several generators for emergencies, and these were in great demand during and after the storm. When the power went out many of these generators, along with others supplied by Brigade Service Support Group, were already working. Sewage lift stations received the highest priority, though. "Sewage will start backing up within 15 minutes of a power outage in some

areas," explained Shewell.

Albert Mongeon, an electrician helper, was assigned to a generator crew during the storm, and the experience revived old memories. "I was an Army specialist five in Vietnam 12 years ago," he said, "and these are the same type of generators we used then."

Normally, the electricians perform routine work such as electrical wiring for minor construction jobs, replacing street

lights and emergency repairs. Although the title "emergency repairs" doesn't sound routine, it normally is, explained Shewell. "Most of the damage to power lines here is caused by salt corrosion."

Some emergency calls aren't routine, just hilarious. Shewell related one incident. "When I got to the house (in station housing), the fire department and military police had the power disconnected and the house evacuated," he said.

He was escorted to one of the bathrooms where a mysterious black fluid was seeping out of the wall above the sink. "They thought it was some electrical insulation melting from a short or something. It didn't look or smell like anything electrical, so I tasted it... and it tasted like cough syrup. I opened the medicine cabinet and there it was. A bottle of cough syrup lying on its side, dripping away."

The joke was on everyone, but

there have been times when the incident wasn't funny. "One time, a power line came down in housing and fell across three parked cars, destroying them," he said. Luckily no one was injured.

"There is danger involved with our work," Shewell said, "but with proper safety procedures, it's as safe as being a doctor." No one has been injured on the job here during his two years as foreman, and that attests to the skill of all the safety-conscious workers.

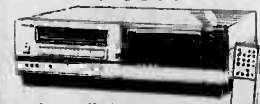

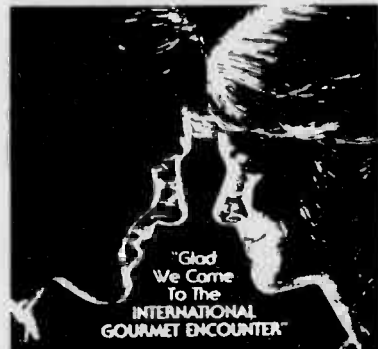

A maximum of 12 semester hours may be allowed when the work experience is adequately documented.

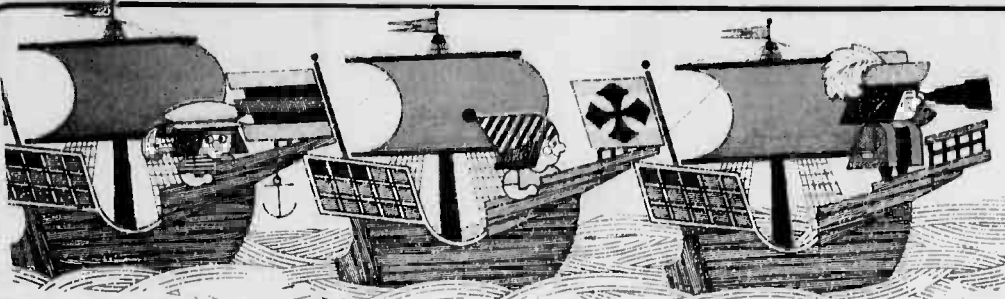

Safety

Mopeds, bicycles prohibited on H-3 walkway

Moped and bicycle riders will no longer be allowed to use the H-3 walkway beginning Jan. 14, 1983. Effective immediately, government vehicle operators who do not use available backing guides, will be cited. That is the word from the Station Safety Office.

According to Master Sergeant Thomas Bishop, safety non-commissioned officer in charge, these are not new changes, but a crackdown on current command, state, and city and county regulations.

Bishop explained that moped and bicycle riders create a danger to pedestrians who use the walkway as an entrance and exit. Although there have not been any reported injuries to pedestrians, Bishop said there have been several moped riders sustaining injuries while attempting to avoid

collisions with walkway users. "One day someone is going to get killed if we let it continue," he commented.

Warning signs will be posted at either entrance of the walkway, and moped and bicycle riders will have to use the Mokapu Gate. Riders will not be allowed to enter the walkway at the main gate, and if caught entering the air station from the walkway, the rider will be ticketed.

"People (moped/bike riders) are abusing the walkway privilege, and we are not going to overlook it anymore," said Bishop.

As for the backing up problem, Bishop said such accidents are on the rise. So far this year, 14 reportable backing accidents have occurred, compared to eight last year at this time. He said a

reportable accident is one where there is injury and/or damage to property exceeding \$500. He also estimated that approximately three times this year's rate has probably occurred, but were not serious enough to be reported to Headquarters Marine Corps.

"Regulations state that drivers of government vehicles must use a guide when one is available, and sound the horn before backing up. A lot of drivers haven't been doing that," he said.

Bishop explained that "when available" means when passengers are in the vehicle who can assist the driver with backing up safely. "If there are two, maybe three passengers in a vehicle, there is no reason one of them cannot get out to help the driver," he said.

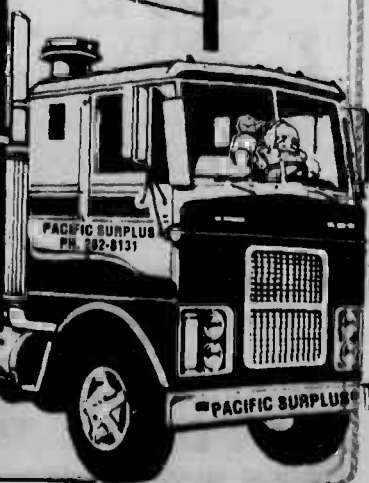

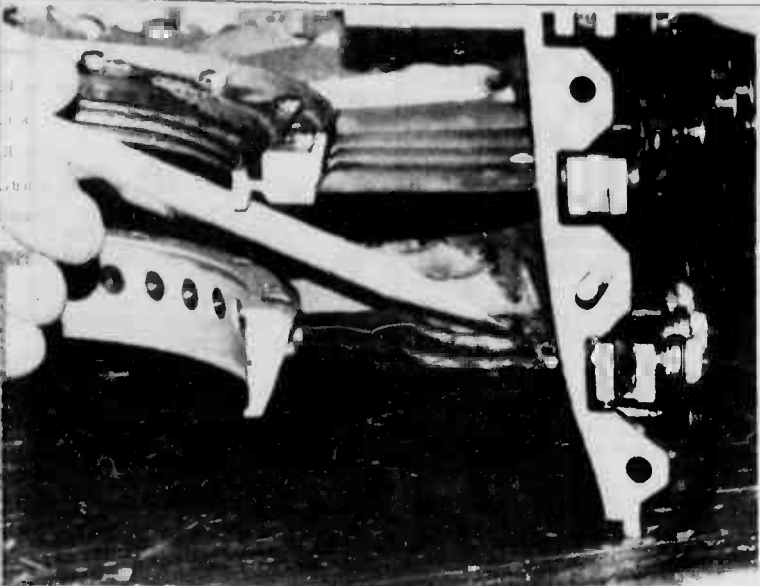

FOD:

Last year's damage totaled \$500,000

Most people don't take nuts seriously, but the Marines at Marine Aircraft Group-24 do. They know the seriousness of nuts, bolts, screwdrivers, pieces of wire and anything else that can cause foreign object damage to aircraft engines.

MAG-24 has three fighter squadrons and four helicopter squadrons here. With as many as 70 aircraft operating at any one time, the danger of FOD is too great to be glossed over.

Last year more than a half million dollars' damage was done to aircraft engines throughout MAG-24. Through a comprehensive FOD program, the MAG hopes to drastically reduce that amount. "The program is designed to educate everyone, especially the young Marines," said Staff Sergeant Anthony DeLaRosa, MAG-24 FOD supervisor. "FOD prevention can only be accomplished through

education and training awareness."

The spearhead of this program rests with individuals. People working near and around aircraft should account for each nut, bolt and washer, as well as keep tabs on every tool they use. They should also keep loose objects out of their pockets and wear clothing that isn't loose fitting.

Close inspection of all work areas, removal of loose objects from support equipment and picking up all trash and FOD from hangar and flight line areas will also reduce damage significantly.

This last step, keeping an eye out for FOD, should be done by everyone who works in and around aircraft hangars. Even people just visiting these areas can help reduce FOD by keeping an eye out for wayward nuts.

Failing to deregister vehicles could result in punitive action

There has been an increase in the number of personnel failing to register and deregister vehicles aboard the air station, according to a recent station message.

Master Sergeant Philip Johnson, Operations Chief at the Security Department, said that since April about 30 percent of vehicle owners aboard the air station have failed to deregister their vehicles.

Vehicles are required to be deregistered at the 11-3 PassHouse when owners are transferred, separated from duty or employment, or sell or dispose of their vehicle.

When personnel are transferred, the expiration and installation tabs on the vehicle will be removed. This must be done prior to

shipping.

Upon separation from duty or employment, the entire decal must be removed.

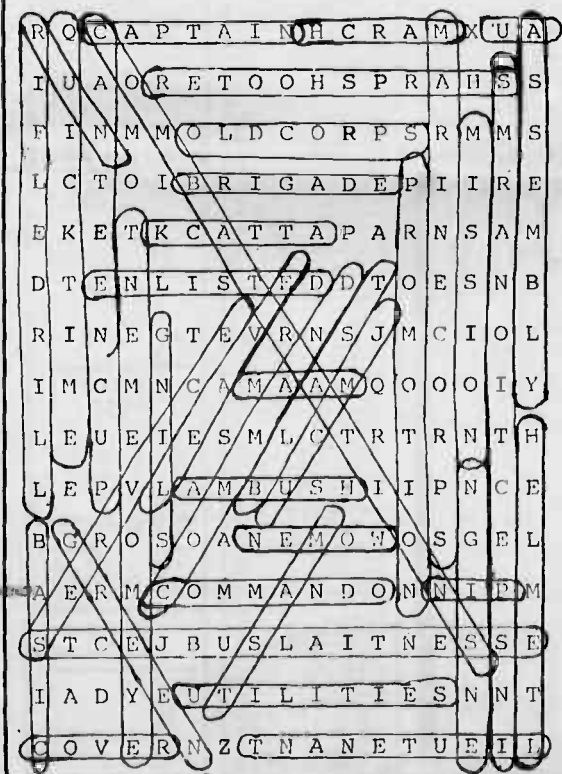
In the case of sale or disposal of a vehicle, both the old and new owners must be present to alleviate extra paperwork.

According to Johnson, the decal does not have to be removed when a vehicle is changing military owners.

"However, the number on the decal will be changed to reflect the new owner's EAS," said Johnson. "And it is important that we change the owner's name on our files."

According to the message, anyone failing to deregister their vehicle will be administratively processed for violation of a lawful order.

Corpsman saves choking soldier

BEIRUT, Lebanon (Delayed) — For Hospitalman Michael A. Nichols, it was no different than any other day in this rubble-strewn city, standing duty at Post Five in a Lebanese village near the American University of Beirut.

The squad of Marines from Lima Company, B1T 3/8 which normally mans the post routinely bring a hospital corpsman to duty areas in the tense environs here.

Nichols, 21, and Lance Corporal Tom Vassus, 19, were in a staging area behind a building near the post when a Lebanese soldier rushed up frantically asking for help.

"They knew I was a Doc," said Nichols, a native of Tronton, Ohio, who could easily be mistaken for a Marine because of his short haircut. "He said he needed me inside."

Nichols followed the Lebanese soldier into the building and saw a pandemonium. "One of the other soldiers was on the bed and he was violently rolling around," explained Nichols. The corpsman immediately recognized what was wrong. The soldier was choking on something and had already turned blue in the face. Nichols quickly went to work to save his life.

Standing by the window looking into the room, LCpl Vassus witnessed the Doc's efforts. Vassus, a native of Hartford, Conn., said Nichols first tried to make the soldier vomit, then slapped him on the back and applied the Heimlich Maneuver in

an effort to get air into the soldier's tortured lungs. Quick action by Nichols worked. With a wracking cough and a huge gasp, the Lebanese soldier spit up a large ball of food.

The gratitude of the soldier was overwhelming. Time and time again he thanked Nichols for saving his life. Before the end of the day the commander of the Lebanese company came to Lima Company's command post to thank the American commander, Captain Charles Johnson, for the heroic efforts of his corpsman.

It was the second time in his medical career that Nichols has performed the Heimlich Maneuver on a choking person. Chief Thomas Miller, Battalion Aid Station Chief for 3/8, praised the sailor for his professional performance.

First Lieutenant Don Hard, a platoon commander, described Nichols as a conscientious, mature young man who takes his job very seriously. There's at least one Lebanese soldier in his violence-racked city who couldn't agree more.
