
Giving Back to the Community

Battle Assembly it is important for us to remember that 98 years ago this month marks the date when the first soldiers began to arrive at what was then Camp Lewis, Washington to activate the 91st Infantry Division and to begin their basic training for combat in Europe in World War One. In a short two years we will begin to mark these important dates for our Division's history. August 5, 1917 was the day that the 91st Infantry Division was officially activated



at Camp Lewis. We hope to coordinate with the Joint Base Lewis-McChord museum to arrange a joint centennial event. The current 91st Division Historian is also currently planning events commemorating our founding here at Fort Hunter Liggett as well. The 91st Division League, an association which has supported the Divisions soldiers past and present, is planning a large event in 2017 to celebrate the founding of the Division.
