Distracted Driving Dangerous and Deadly

Distracted driving continues to be one of the top contributors to accidents and fatalities among drivers. Each year more than 37,000 people die in automobile crashes in the U.S., and about 421,000 people are injured in crashes that have involved a driver who was distracted in some way.

Over 330,000 accidents caused by texting while driving lead to severe injuries. One out of four car accidents in the U.S. are caused by texting while driving.

Texting and driving is 6 times more likely to get you in an accident than drunk driving. That's right, it is actually safer for someone to get wasted and get behind the wheel than to text and do it.

The chances of a crash because of any reason is increased by 23 times when you are texting. The bottom line is, there is no text, picture or email that is worth endangering your life or the lives of others. It can wait.



IT'S TIME FOR YOUR FLU SHOT

Soldiers should be aware that this year the Flu Mist is no longer authorized as an approved immunization. Email completed vouchers to historicalupdates@logisticshealth .com to update the immunization in the tracking system.
