MEET THE SERGEANT MAJOR

Sergeant Major Lamberth was born in Batesville, Mississippi on August 19, 1979. He graduated from South Panola High School in 1997 and enlisted in the Marine Corps in August 1997. He completed recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot San Diego in November 1997 and was assigned the Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) of Motor Transportation. After graduating, Private First Class Lamberth attended MCT at Camp Pendleton, CA and Motor Transport Operator Course at Fort Leonard Wood, MO

After completing MOS training, Lance Corporal Lamberth was then assigned to Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, NC. While there, he was an emergency vehicle operator attached to the Naval Hospital and was also promoted to Corporal. He then attended Corporal's Leadership Course in April 2000.

In April 2000, Corporal Lamberth reported to Third Marine Division Combat Assault Battalion HQSVC Company in Okinawa, Japan. While there, he was the Onboard Vehicle Equipment NCO. In January 2001, he was promoted to Sergeant.

In June 2001, Sergeant Lamberth reported to Marine Corps Reserve Support Command in Kansas City, MO where he was the Motor Transportation Chief. He also served as a Drill Instructor for the Young Marines Unit aboard the Richards-Gibaur Campus and volunteered many hours annually in support of two, Twenty-Fourth Marine Regiment Toys for Tots Campaigns. In April 2002, he attended Sergeant's Course in Quantico, VA, and in September 2002, he attended International Incorporated Defensive Driving Training Course in Texas. After



completing those courses, he attended Motor Transport Career Course in March 2003 at Camp Lejeune, NC. Upon return Sergeant Lamberth was meritoriously promoted to Staff Sergeant in April 2003.

In April 2004, Staff Sergeant Lamberth reported to MCRD Parris Island, SC where he attended Drill Instructor School. Upon graduating, he was assigned to Alpha Company, First Recruit Training Battalion and served as: a drill instructor, senior drill instructor, and Series Gunnery Sergeant. After the completion of 3 cycles, he served as a drill instructor for Medical Rehabilitation Platoon, Special Training Company. In July of 2007, he extended to Drill Instructor School, where he served as a squad instructor, the uniform instructor, and as the physical training Instructor. There he was promoted to the rank Gunnery Sergeant.

In September 2008, Gunnery Sergeant Lamberth reported to Combat Logistics Battalion 3, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii assigned to Motor Transportation Company as the Company Gunnery Sergeant where he deployed to the Helmand Province, Afghanistan. Shortly after returning he was assigned as the Battalion Motor Transportation Chief. May 2010 he transferred to Headquarters and Service Company assigned as the Current Operations Chief during pre deployment Training. Sept 2010 he was hand- picked to serve as the Company First Sergeant for Headquarters and Service Company (Forward) in Camp Dwyer, Afghanistan. January 2011 Gunnery Sergeant Lamberth was frocked to the rank of First Sergeant.

June 2011 First Sergeant Lamberth reported to 4th Maintenance Battalion, Engineer Maintenance Company, I&I Staff Omaha, Nebraska as the Company First Sergeant. While there he served as the Senior Enlisted Advisor for the Active and Reserve Components.

June 2014 First Sergeant Lamberth reported to The Basic School, Quantico, Virginia, Basic Officer Course, where he served as Company First Sergeant for Company G, Company B and Company D. June 2016 he frocked to Sergeant Major and received orders to Recruiting Station Fort Worth,

Sergeant Major Lamberth's personal award include the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy/Marine Corps Commendation Medal with gold star, and the Navy/Marine Corps Achievement Medal with gold star.

He is married to the former Devan Morgan of Batesville, Mississippi. They have three children, Morgan, age 14, Keith, age 13, and Braden, age 10.




Marine Corps Knowledge

DID YOU KNOW...?



Lieutenant Colonel Alfred Austell Cunningham was a United States Marine Corps officer who became the first Marine Corps aviator and the first Director of Marine Corps Aviation. First Lt. Alfred A. Cunningham became the first Marine to enter the world of aeronautics when he arrived at the aviation camp at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md., on May 22, 1912, with orders to learn how to fly. Today, Cunningham's reporting date is marked as the anniversary of Marine Corps aviation. The Navy's first three aviators, Lieutenants T.G. "Spuds" Ellyson, John Rodgers, and J.H. Towers, oversaw the camp's three aircraft and Cunningham's initial efforts.




