
ailors and DOD e m ployees assigned to NAS Key West recently completed a Defense Equal Opportunity Climate Survey.

"The survey paints a very clear picture to where our command climate is right at this moment." said HMCS Ocheltree, command climate specialist.

The Defense Egual Opportunity Management Institute provides annual Organizational Climate Surveys that allow all Sailors and civilians to provide feedback on command issues.


