Suicide Intervention Training



ASIST

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training

This hands-on course in crisis intervention provides content beyond the minimum Ask-Care-Escort (ACE) Training. Not only does ASIST teach in-depth methods on how to understand the risk factors of suicide and recognize the warning signs of possible impending suicide, but it also teaches exactly what to say to someone at risk, how to intervene in a potential crisis, and what resources are available to refer someone at risk.

ASIST is required training for those designated in gatekeeper positions as defined in AR 600-63.
