Wilson praises Airmen, expresses gratitude in farewell remarks reflecting on her tenure as Air Force secretary

JOINT BASE ANDREWS, MD — Two years and nine days since becoming the 24th Secretary of the Air Force, Heather Wilson bid a formal farewell,

Heather Wilson bid a formal farewell, May 21, to the institution and its Airmen, expressing gratitude for the opportunity to serve and declaring, "I will always be an Airman."

"I lived a blessed life," Wilson said in a 15-minute speech which reflected on her tenure as the Air Force's highestranking civilian official.

She praised the skill and dedication of Airmen while comparing lessons learned from gardening as a corollary for the qualities that make for good leaders and an effective Air Force secretary. You need a plan, she said; you need friends to help, meaning allies, and "as long as it's safe, let people tinker with the tools."

"Our Airmen...tinker and fix things in new ways," she said, extending the reference. "Let your people tinker with the tools. ... As a leader, you have to think about the long term and strengthen the positive culture."

"Every one of you in this hanger, every single one of you, is a leader," Wilson said, speaking at Joint Base Andrews in Hanger 3, surrounded by her family, senior Air Force leaders, including three former secretaries, approximately 900 Airmen and a B-2 bomber.

Wilson's comments came at the end of the two-hour ceremony in which she was praised for her service and her achievements. Wilson announced her resignation in March after she was selected to be president of the University of Texas El Paso. Her last day as Air Force secretary is May 31.

In a clear reference to what she sees as her legacy, Wilson told the crowd that a good gardener is someone who "accepts with confidence you won't be able to be able to harvest all the fruits of your labor" and embraces the "beauty of work well done on something good."

While Wilson reflected on two years as secretary by highlighting the achievements and contributions of Airmen across the Air Force's global enterprise, other speakers focused squarely on Wilson herself.

"You have been the leader we needed at this exact time in our Air Force," Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. David L. Goldfein said, praising Wilson. "As an Airman's Airman, you have served as a driving force for positive change."

Under her direction and in partnership with Goldfein, the Air Force became both more prepared and nimble in the last two years. A shortage of more than 4,000 active duty maintainers that greeted Wilson when she arrived in 2017 has been closed to zero. Aggressive efforts to streamline the procurement process has shaved 100 years off traditional timelines while a series of major contracts approved in recent years saved more than \$17 billion.

Wilson has been a catalyst as well driving innovation. She spearheaded the analysis which said the "Air Force we need" must increase to 386 squadrons from 312 to confront threats in an era of great power competition. Wilson was also a key architect of an ambitious upgrade for the service's science and technology strategy released in April.

That document will serve as a blueprint to better identify, develop and deploy breakthrough technologies in the future.

Wilson is leaving a considerable mark on the institution and its total force of 685,000 Airmen worldwide. She helped develop and manage the Air Force's annual budget of more than \$138 billion and was an influential voice directing strategy and policy development, risk management, weapons acquisition, technology investments and talent management of Airmen across a global enterprise.

She was a central figure in efforts to strengthen and build the Air Force to meet new global threats, particularly those posed by Russia and China. She was a strong advocate for increasing overall readiness and addressing personnel shortages that affected the Air Force's ability to fulfill any mission at any time.

Overall, the Air Force is 17% more ready today than it was when she was confirmed.

Wilson was a strong advocate for streamlining the contracting process when possible and injecting a more entrepreneurial approach.

In his remarks, Goldfein said Wilson will be remembered for "setting the conditions to build a more lethal and ready force we need for the future fight" while also paving the way "for the future Airmen who will follow in our footsteps.

And while hardware is important, Goldfein said Wilson, "understood the priority is with the people and improving the quality of service and quality of life for our uniformed volunteers and their families is where it starts."

Tennessee National Guard conducts joint training

Volunteer Training Site, Ga. — A crowd of Army National Guard Soldiers gathers around a giant piece of heavy equipment, as an Airman in a hard hat explains the purpose and function of the various knobs and shifters. One by one, they take turns donning hard hats and helmets, climbing into the driver's seat, and taking the machine for a spin around the field under the careful supervision of the Airman.

Tech. Sgt. Matthew Plaas from the 241st Engineering Installation Squadron is very familiar with this Vermeer RT950 trencher - he's used it to perform his duties for the length of his career with the Tennessee Air National Guard. For many of the Soldiers, mostly ranked E-4 and below, this is the first time they've received training on the machines.

1st Lt. Jason Mckelvey of the 230th Signal Company was on-site training with his troops, and emphasized how important this experience was for them. "We typically don't even see this equipment until we're overseas," Mckelvey stated, "and we need to operate it to perform our job. Being able to incorporate this training and getting hands on experience is invaluable to us."

Tech. Sgt. Doug Haveman, team chief from the 241st EIS, is also familiar with this problem. The 241st EIS often works joint missions with Army troops, who frequently aren't afforded these training opportunities.

"It's a really good experience," Haveman said. "I've deployed with the Army before, and we often have to train them onsite. It's good for us to learn how to train other people, it helps them prepare and it helps us grow as trainers."

Of course this type of joint training is exactly what the Tennessee National Guard leadership hopes will continue to grow. Col. Jason Glass, Tennessee Assistant Adjutant General, Air, was on site to observe the troops working together.

"One of my initiatives is to develop Airmen and Soldiers," Glass said. "Part of that is training. The 241st and 230th have the same mission set and it only makes sense to conduct joint training. We're working on several opportunities to get the two groups together. For example, they will be working on a project at the Tennessee Volunteer Challenge Academy. We're really trying to interlace the Army and Air National Guard and get them working together across the state."

Once the soldiers learned how to maneuver the Vermeer RT950 safely, they then received instruction on how to operate the digging functions. The machine features a rock wheel for creating a narrow trench on one side, operated from the driver's seat of the vehicle. The other side features a backhoe with its own operator seat, from which the driver could also maneuver the machine into a better position, if necessary.

The 241st worked with a new group of 230th SC Soldiers every day for a week, repeating and refining their training instruction. Plaas emphasized that the experience was just as beneficial for them as it was for the Soldiers they trained.

"I've been here all week and it's been a lot of fun," Plaas said. "I feel a natural desire to instruct, so it's been a real pleasure to share the knowledge I have with our sister service. To us it's just fun to get outside and play on the equipment so it's a great experience all around.

How to prepare for a PCS

Many men and women join the military to travel and see the world, it comes with changing duty locations.

Commonly known as PCSing, making a permanent change of station can be a stressful process. With PCS season, between May and August each year, well underway, there are key things members can do to get ready.

The key to any successful PCS is preparation and knowing what resources are available. Members should be aware of what needs to be done and when they need to do it.

A good rule of thumb is to organize tasks according to a three month plan, with three, two and one-month milestones. There are also some dayof tips to help make moving day as stress free as possible.

The Airman and Family Readiness Center here now offers a virtual Plan my Move briefing that discusses moving considerations as well as resources service members are entitled during the PCS process.

"Going virtual essentially puts the move on the service member and their family and allows them to tailor their briefing to get as little or as much out of it as they want," said Margie Leinhart, a Work/Life consultant at the A&FRC



Getting Started

- Check your PCS Eligibility Check under your records in the vMPF or your orders to determine when you are eligible to PCS to ensure you do not create any conflicting schedules
- **Research your new home** Seeing what your new base offers can make you excited for new opportunities. This is much easier now with the Military One Source by going to www.militaryonesource.com.
- Notify your landlord or housing office Since you're moving, your landlord can begin advertising for possible new service members who PCS'd to your location
- **Reach out to the Travel Management Office and A&FRC** Both offices provide assistance in planning and options to make your move less stressful. Be aware that you must have your orders before talking to TMO.
- Military or Do-It-Yourself Move One of the first decisions you and your family need to make is will you do the move yourself or do you want the military to do the move for you






Locking in Logistics

- Purge unwanted items Get rid of things you don't need or want anymore. Consider donating items to the Airmen's Attic or the Thrift Store so that others can get use of your unwanted items.
- Compile all important paperwork (if doing a DIY move, save all receipts) Put things like birth certificates, social security cards, and copies of your orders in a safe place that you know where they won't get lost.
- Take pictures and videos of belongings In case that something is damaged, have photos of items to prove they were not damaged before the move for insurance claims.
- Coordinate with TMO to get movers a

- time/ Get volunteers to help pack Make sure you have a time for the movers so that you can plan your day more effectively. Ask for help from friends to help load truck in advance if you're moving yourself.
- Plan your temporary living situation Some situations require you to either leave or wait an extra few days. For that reason, look up hotels near you or even find a friends you could stay with for a night
- Figure out what movers can and can't pack – Reach out to your movers and get an idea of what they can't pack that way you can do it before they arrive so all your belongings can be packed in one day. This eliminates some last minute stress.
- Call and set date to cancel utilities

Guests will get an up-close look at strategic Air Force assets that our Airmen use to carry out missions across the globe as well as the technical expertise of the U.S. military.


