Mons' Doudou, also called the Ducasse, was recognized by UNESCO in 2005 as a "Masterpiece of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity." The most anticipated part of the event will be "Trinity Weekend," during which the public will pay tribute to Saint Waudru, the patron saint of the city, and will participate in the battle known as the "Lumeçon." ARMY MAKING IMPROVEMENTS TO FAMILY READINESS GROUPS

The Army recently made some of the most significant changes to Family Readiness Groups since their creation following the first Gulf War. The groups have been re-named "Soldier and Family Readiness Groups" or SFRGs. his designation links Soldier readiness to the family, and clarifies the role of the SFRG to be more inclusive to Soldiers who are single, are single parents or have non-traditional families. ARMY LENGTHENS TOURS FOR SOLDIERS IN EUROPE, JAPAN

The Army is adding a year to overseas tours for some Soldiers heading to Europe and Japan, as part of an effort to boost readiness and reduce moves. Under the new policy, which applies to permanent change-of-station orders published after June 14, tours for Soldiers who have no dependents and are not married to other service members will extend from 24 to 36 months.
