HONORING THE ROYAL FLUSH VICTIMS IN FOULENG, 75 YEARS LATER

Seventy five years ago, on April 13, 1944, a B-17 flying fortress, called the "Royal Flush," was coming back from a successful raid over the ball bearing industries in Schweinfurt, Germany when it was hit by the German flak based in Chièvres, Belgium. The plane crashed in a nearby field in Fouleng, Belgium, killing six out of the 10 crew members. [READ MORE]
