EIGHT COUNTRIES TO COMPETE IN WOMEN'S WORLD CUP IN FRANCE

Twenty four women's national teams are competing to win the eighth edition of the FIFA World Cup, a worldwide soccer event that occurs every four years. This year's competition is held throughout France in June and July. There are just eight countries left to compete: U.S., The Netherlands, Germany, Norway, England, France, Italy and Sweden. TOUR DE FRANCE COMES TO BELGIUM JULY 6-8

This year, for its 106th edition, the Tour de France will be in Belgium July 6 to 8. The "Grand Départ" (the "Start of the Tour") will be held July 6 in Brussels, 50 years after famed Belgian bicycle racer Eddy Merckx's first victory. Since World War II, 55 cities hosted the "Grand Départ" in the Tour de France. After the first two stages in Brussels, the city of Binche will host the third stage on July 8 for the very first time. PUBLIC HEALTH COMMAND EUROPE OFFERS GUIDANCE ON HOW TO STAY TICK-FREE THIS YEAR

As people spend more time outdoors, so do many insects and pests. Among those are ticks, which can carry several potentially serious diseases. One of the most common is Lyme disease. According to Public Health Command Europe officials, a person with Lyme disease may develop fever, headache, fatigue and a skin rash. This rash is sometimes referred to as a "bulls-eye" rash because it is red and circular in appearance. [READ MORE]



HOW TO PREPARE FOR, RESPOND TO EXTREME HEAT

In the summer of 2003, Europe experienced temperatures 20 to 30 percent higher than the seasonal average. Extreme maximum temperatures of 95 to 104 degrees Fahrenheit (35 to 40 degrees Celsius) were recorded in July and continued into August. This extreme weather was the cause of an anti-cyclone that had firmly anchored itself over the western European land mass, resulting in the impediment of life-giving, rain-bearing depressions that usually enter the continent from the Atlantic Ocean.
