New commander takes charge of Missile Defense Test Detachment

Maj. Benjamin W. Klandrud assumed command of the 3rd Battalion, 6th Air Defense Artillery Air Missile Defense Test Detachment (3-6 ADA AM-DDT) from Capt. Kevin M. Ryan on Sept. 24 at White Sands Missile Range during a change of command ceremony.

Lt. Col. Joseph C. Scott, the 3-6 ADA Battalion Commander officiated the ceremony and provided remarks.

“Over the last year, Capt. Kevin Ryan has led the dog pound through good times and bad, through tragedy and triumph, as he and his Soldiers strove to make our branch stronger and more capable for the battlefields of tomorrow,” said Scott.

The test detachment and their organization’s

overall mission is to support the rapid modernization of capabilities to

counter existing and future aerial threats. The 3-6 ADA AMDTD has

been at WSMR since 2014 conducting software testing, live-fire

testing, and working on the integration of systems.

Ryan commanded the test detachment for about a year. Upon graduating from the Air Defense Artillery Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, he was assigned to the 11th Brigade. He took command of C Battery 1st Battalion, 43rd Army Defense Artillery where he deployed to Bahrain in support of Inherent Resolve.

“Through this past year at command through the bad times and the good I watched 138 Soldiers band together and look out for each other like a family. I am truly grateful for each one of you and will never forget you all,” said Ryan. “Maj. Klandrud, welcome to the team, please look out for the Soldiers and take care of them, I know you will do a great job.”

This is Klandrud’s

fourth permanent change of station in the El Paso and White Sands area. He was previously the Executive Officer of the Combined Task Force Defender for the 35th Air Defense Artillery Brigade in the Republic of Korea.

“Thank you for being at today’s change of command ceremony. First of all, I want to thank Col. Scott and Col. Barnette, who could not be here, for the opportunity to serve as the detachment commander,” said Klandrud. “Being a leader of troops has always been the most rewarding experience in my career, I look forward to the unique challenge that this White Sands unit has.”

Originally, from Brookfield, Wisconsin, Klandrud was commissioned as a 2nd Lt. in the Air Defense Artillery Branch after graduating from Ripon College. +

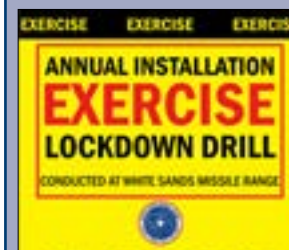

MEMORANDUM FOR U.S. Army Garrison White Sands Missile Range
SUBJECT: Army Energy and Water Conservation Awareness Month – October 2019

1. References:

- a. AR 420-1, Army Energy Program, Chapter 22, 24 August 2012.


2. Purpose: "Energy Resilience Enables Army Readiness" is the Army's 2019 Energy Action Month theme.

3. Background: Secure and reliable access to energy for our operational missions and our installations is essential to ensuring that the Army is ready to deploy, fight and win across the entire spectrum of conflict.

4. Policy: To help save energy, follow the guidelines in AR 420-1 such as:

- a. Heating season temperatures will be set at 72°F +/- 2°F during working hours; during unoccupied times, 55°F +/- 5°F. Cooling season temperatures will be set at 74°F +/- 2°F during working hours; during unoccupied times, 85°F +/- 5°F.
- b. Space heaters are prohibited: The operation of portable heating and cooling devices is prohibited where the intent is to circumvent the heating and cooling standards. Submit a service order if the building space is not at the correct temperature.

WSMR welcomes Staff Judge Advocate Lt. Col. Farmer

White Sands Missile Range Staff Judge Advocate Lt. Col. Brett Farmer is keeping the beat at WSMR as the new Staff Judge Advocate.

Farmer, who enjoys playing the drums as a hobby, said he is glad to be at WSMR. "You can't beat the view of the Organ Mountains," he said.

Farmer said his first impression was that WSMR is definitely a change of pace from Fort Bliss, where he was assigned as a deputy Staff Judge Advocate, before coming to WSMR, but the variety of missions here and issues that arise as a result of those missions is staggering.

"Fortunately, I've got an excellent team, and some of them have been here for quite some time and have shown me the

ropes," he said.

Farmer said he joined the Army as a result of a positive experience he had as a student one summer. While a sophomore in high school he received a letter in the mail inviting him to come out to a West Point Military Academy Summer program for two weeks.

He applied and was accepted and spent two weeks there at no cost. While there he found out about being an Army officer and got information about several career fields.

When it was time to graduate from high school he applied to West Point and was accepted.

Farmer said he decided early on in high school what he was good at and what he liked to do and decided to pursue a career in those areas. Since he was good at public speaking and liked to read, but definitely did not like math, he decided to become a lawyer.

While at the summer camp one of the electives was a mock trial. The judge preceding in the mock trial was a judge advocate. Farmer spoke to him afterwards and asked him about the career. He explained to him about the Funded Legal Education Program.

The program authorizes the selection of 25 active duty Army officers each year to obtain a legal education at government expense.

"You come back and serve in the Army as a judge advocate," he said.

Farmer said he kept that information in the back of his mind for future reference. After he graduated and was commissioned he applied and was accepted to the Funded Legal Education Program, after which he was accepted into law school.

"The plan was simple - you come up with a plan and work backwards from where you want to be and everything falls into place," Farmer said when asked how he made planning his career seem so easy.

Farmer said not too many people know about the Funded Legal Education Program, but it is a great program and more people should apply for it.

In reference to his goals while at WSMR, Farmer said he wants to do a good job.

"I would like to con-

sistently provide good, sound, reasonable advice that makes people's lives easier, and help our commanders make well informed decisions."

Speaking on leadership roles, Farmer said that from the time he was a cadet until now he has almost always been in a position where he is in charge of people.

One thing he has learned is that the key to being in charge of people is really just two things: If you want people to follow you - take everyone seriously - at every level, and if you want to motivate people - the single best motivator and most powerful motivator is gratitude.

"If people feel you are appreciative of what they have done they will walk through walls for you," Farmer said. "Be grateful for their work and show them genuine gratitude."

Fall weather brings snakes

This is the time of year when newborn snakes, including rattlesnakes, are emerging. White Sands Missile Range has 27 species of snakes, five species of which are venomous.

Snakes are generally not aggressive, and their first line of defense is to remain hidden and avoid confrontation with potential danger – including human encounters.

Camouflage usually masks their presence and snakes normally will make a diplomatic retreat.

Snakes will nearly always retreat to cover if given the chance. If a rattlesnake feels threatened, they will often rattle the auditory alarm that makes them famous and simultaneously attempt to egress from the threat.

If you see a snake, stay calm and walk away from it. Do not try to catch it or make it feel threatened. Do not let your pet run freely, especially in areas with heavy brush.

If you see a snake in the

housing or main post areas, report it by calling 575-678-1234 and warn people in the area. If you find a snake in a building, leave the room and attempt to contain it in the room and then report it.

If you are bitten by a snake, the following guidance is provided by the McAfee U.S. Army Health Clinic:

Remove the patient from snake's territory, Call 911 or 575-678-1234 (if on post) and proceed to the nearest Emergency Room. Keep them calm and at rest to minimize circulation of the venom.

Bites can cause a lot of swelling, we recommend any jewelry or footwear, etc., be removed from the affected extremity. Attempt to immobilize the injured body part, if possible. Stay calm and don't panic - less than 3 percent of rattlesnake bites in the U.S. result in death.

The WSMR Safety office has additional safety information to help prevent a snake bite from occurring, at 575-678-3921/3321. +
