Raiders case colors for deployment

Soldiers assigned to the 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, cased their colors at Cottrell Field on Fort Stewart Oct. 1, in preparation for their upcoming nine-month deployment to Korea.

The 1ABCT will replace the 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division, as part of a regular rotation of forces to support the United States' commitment to southeast Asia partners and allies.

"Today's casing symbolizes the transition of the 'Raiders' from our home here at Fort Stewart to an important mission in South Korea that is very familiar to this brigade," said Maj. Gen. Antonio Aguto, commanding general of the 3rd Infantry Division. "It is a symbol that once again, Dogface Soldiers stand in the breach, prepared to defend our nation."

Col. Trent Upton, commander of 1ABCT, said the event also serves as a

reminder of the legacy of this great Division and brigade combat team.

The Raider Brigade has a storied history including four deployments to Iraq and most recently, a rotation to Korea in 2018 as the Regionally Aligned Force to the U.S. Pacific Command. This will be their sixth rotation to Korea.

Aguto said the Raiders had to overcome many obstacles to get ready for the mission over the past year, to include a very successful rotation at Irwin, California.

"When the Army stopped and our nation had to pause, it was Raider Brigade that led our Army back to training," Aguto said. "[1ABCT] proved even throughout a pandemic just how diligent, resourceful, caring and driven you were by taking care of our Soldiers and our Families while finding a way to get it done."

Towards the end of the ceremony. Upton charged the Soldiers of the Raider Brigade to remember the

importance of winning, what the Raiders represent, and the discipline they must have in everything they do as they set out on their latest journey together.

"We are Raiders first for a reason," Upton said. "We are the battle axe of 3rd ID, and we are ready."



Ready Battalion welcomes new company commanders

The 3rd Brigade Support Battalion, 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, 3rd Infantry Division, recently held three company change of command ceremonies on Raider Field on Fort Stewart.

The 3BSB, known as the "Ready Battalion," is the support battalion for the Raider Brigade, which is known as the "Battle Axe of the 3rd ID."

On Raider Field, Sept. 18, the 3BSB commander, Lt. Col. Morris Brown Jr., hosted two sequential changes of command ceremonies for companies B and C.

Capt. Craig Davis, outgoing commander of Co. B, relinquished his command to Capt. David Smith.

Then, Capt. Anthony Kozubal, commander of Co. B, relinquished his command to Capt. Shannon Hudson.

"Every Soldier here should feel pride for the continued history made under the leadership of these company commanders," Brown said. "The Soldiers of this fine unit are in your capable hands and you must train and prepare them for future operations. Do not take this lightly or let them down because they are counting on you."

Six days later, Brown hosted a change of command ceremony for Company A, where Capt. Alexander Neal relinquished his command to Capt. Christopher Ferretti.

"Regulator Soldiers, thank you for the hours and hard work you put in," Neal said. "Thank you for your great attitude and staying ready to get out and train. You are the hardest working Soldiers in 3rd ID."

Soldier fosters new talents

HOHENFELS, Germany — For Spc. Devron Bost, assigned to the 703rd Brigade Support Battalion, "Maintainers" on Fort Stewart, a job title with his unit can best be described as a "jack of all trades," as he has found himself working outside of his original job description during Combined Resolve XIV at the Hohenfels Training Area.

The extra work has not only offered him new experiences, but it has even given him a new goal for his military career.

Bost, whose primary job title is a quartermaster and chemical equipment repairer, found himself taking on additional duties as his unit trained during Combined Resolve XIV at Hohenfels Training Area.

From equipment repair to logistics, Bost has been able to build his skillset in his unit. One of Bost's favorite extra duties with the unit has been serving as the unit public affairs representative.

As a UPAR, Bost travels with the unit for training exercises, and embeds himself with the 703rd BSB Soldiers to document the entire battalion's training and tell the stories of the Soldiers.

"I tell their story through articles and photos," Bost said. "While they are out

here training I have the honor of documenting everything and showing our leadership what we're doing."

His work for his battalion does not stop at being a UPAR. Additionally, Bost works as an automated logistics specialist, responsible for dispatching vehicles and making sure they are ready for movements.

He has also learned how to track and order parts for mechanics.

Bost, who has worked in the photography business for nearly seven years, learned about public affairs opportunities in the Army after he joined.

"When I joined, I never knew Public Affairs existed," Bost said.

Soon after joining his unit, Bost found himself taking photos at events, and his first sergeant soon assigned him to official public affairs tasks.

Although he only planned to serve as the UPAR for one year, Bost said that he has been able to remain in the position and serve in the capacity for more than three years at this point. He said he plans to reclass in the military as a public affairs specialist.

"When I found out this job existed, it was a dream come true," Bost said. "Ilove getting to wake up and do this because it's almost not a job because it is such an amazing experience."

A French general officer is making history with 3rd Infantry Division at Fort Stewart as the first from his army to serve as the deputy commanding general for U.S. Soldiers.

Brig. Gen. Hubert Cottereau began serving with 3rd ID in July 2019. After one year in the position of deputy commanding general-maneuver, he now serves as the deputy commanding general-future where he is in charge of long-range planning. In this position, he oversees more than 15,000 Soldiers in the division with the most Medal of Honor awardees in the Unites States Army.

Cottereau's role as DCG is part of the U.S. Army's Military Personnel Exchange Program. The program is designed to strengthen bonds of friendship, understanding and interoperability between the countries and their respective military organizations.

These partnerships allow foreign officers to serve in the U.S. and to experience the U.S. Army's customs and courtesies, missions and daily operations. While the 3rd ID has benefited from Cottereau's expertise, U.S. Army Brig. Gen. Todd Wasmund currently serves as the deputy commander for the French Army's 3rd Armored Division in Marseilles, France.

"Having Brig. Gen. Cottereau here cements the relationship, furthers the partnership and expands our knowledge exchange in how we both run an Army and fight. There has been a huge amount of lessons learned already," said Maj. Gen Antonio Aguto, commanding general of the 3rd Infantry Division. "As our true DCG, he also oversees all of our future operations and plans for this Division. Modernization, our training areas - he's in charge of putting all that together. It has been a huge benefit to have a general officer as smart as him as our deputy commanding general."

Cottereau said the opportunity to work beside U.S. Soldiers is the chance of a lifetime.

A word came to Cottereau's mind when asked what it's like to lead U.S. Soldiers.

"Honor, because it's a huge sign of confidence," Cottereau said of the chance to lead here. "That expectation of me has to be met. Honor because this is a really lethal division with a great esprit de corps. Honor, because I have the utmost respect for the people I've crossed and worked with. They are very talented, dedicated and professional. They have a very positive mindset ... very humble and accessible as well."

Cottereau plays a key role in a number of division initiatives, but perhaps none as important as the role he has played in the Division's response to COVID-19.

"He was the brain behind the assessments, analysis and coming up with courses of action for how we see and protect ourselves. He knows it like the back of his hand," Aguto said.

Cottereau said his first step was to help operationalize the fight against the virus across the Division and Fort Stewart. This meant working closely with commanders, the garrison's team and medical professionals to standardize response measures and ensure Soldiers and Families had access to the necessary precautions and care they needed.

"It was a holistic approach," Cottereau said. "It was not only to treat the physical problem itself; it was the readiness of the Division, the morale; it was the Family and it was the communications piece. We have a tremendous, holistic team. A methodological, very detailed approach, very reactive and when hard decisions needed to be made, they were made. The Division has done very, very well. It's very impressive."

With the pandemic response ongoing, Cottereau continues to help spearhead the Division's response and prepare for the Division's future training and modernization initiatives.

Cottereau said foreign officers serving in America run the risk of living a parallel life from their American counterparts without truly integrating into the local community.

"With COVID came the moment where we were the same as every other Family living on the base in terms of safety," Cottereau said. "I think this pandemic made me significantly closer to the U.S. than I would have thought. We were not only fighting for ourselves, we were fighting for our Families."

Cottereau said the Division's response to COVID-19 was unlike any operation he has ever taken part in. Serving as a coordinator between the Division, the tenant units, the garrison and civilian authorities, as well as medical professionals at Winn Army Community Hospital, his role in ensuring the readiness of the Division, the safety of Soldiers and their Families was one he took extremely seriously.

Cottereau brings a new perspective based on his experience, acquired within the French armed forces. This assignment continues a long history of challenging military assignments, including a recent yearlong deployment in Mali, a country in West Africa.

"Cottereau was selected to open this partnership between our two countries for his high potential, his vast professional and operational experience as well as his people skills," said Brig. Gen. Benoit Chavanat, the general officer in charge of international relations. "These abilities, along with the excellent welcome extended to him, have enabled [him] to rapidly fit into the 3rd ID and efficiently and fully assume his duty."

When the Chief of Staff of the French army Thierry Burkhard selected him for this position, he told him, " ... I think that is the job of the year."

"I think he was right," Cottereau said. "It's a significant adventure."

France is one of the U.S.'s oldest allies. The selection of the 3rd ID for this special partnership is fitting,

as the Division is nicknamed the "Rock of the Marne" due to its commitment in France in 1917.

"The exchange of general officers holding high-responsibility positions bears testimony of the mutual trust and solid partnership existing between our two armies," Burkhard said. "That exchange is directly part of the enhancing of operational interoperability between the U.S. and the French armies. The objective is to consolidate our common training to be ever better prepared for a high intensity commitment."

While serving in this role is a first for a French general, it is not Cottereau's first time working in the U.S. Seven years ago, he served with NATO in Norfolk, Virginia. His wife, Brigitte, and his five children have loved their opportunities to live in the U.S.

"You don't send anybody to this kind of adventure without asking 'Are you willing? Is your family okay with that?'" Cottereau said. "My whole family was excited about coming back to the USA,"

He said his children asked him every week when they could return to the U.S.

Cottereau looks forward to what the future holds for him in his position as the DCG and is sure the assignment will continue to help him grow as a leader. He said it is probably one of the most interesting assignments in his 33-year career in the army and has been a learning experience.

"It's challenging for me and humbling," Cottereau said.

Fort Stewart Bulldogs finish season as conference champs, NCO named ACMBC Player of the Year

The Fort Stewart men's basketball team, the Bulldogs, finished their conference as regular season champions and recently learned that a 3rd Infantry Division noncommissioned officer earned Player of the Year honors.

He was named Men's Basketball Coach of the Year following the 2017 Southeast Military Athletics Conference season, and following the 2019-2020 season, he was a Military Basketball Association Coach of the Year finalist.

He said he intends to remain involved with the Fort Stewart basketball program and expects the team to continue its winning tradition.



CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Reminders that God has got this

I have a framed photograph hanging on the wall of my office that was taken on my seminary campus and given to me by my wife at graduation. It serves as a reminder. When I was 33 years old, my wife and I quit our jobs, sold our house and moved our Family across the country so that I could attend seminary. The three-and-a-half years that followed were years of struggle. There were times when I could not see a light at the end of the tunnel. That photograph reminds me that God always provided just what we needed just when we needed it. Reminders can be powerful.

We set up reminders of our loved ones in cemeteries and we build national monuments and memorials so that we can remember great events and great people. Reminders are important. As human beings it is easy to forget, especially if we are in the middle of the struggle.

There's a passage in the Old Testament book of Joshua about reminders. God had freed the nation of Israel from slavery and he was about to keep his promise of providing them a homeland. A flooded river stood between them and God's promise. They had no boats or bridge-building material and no way to cross. I suppose they felt stuck and frustrated.

God gave them some instructions, they followed them and God brought about a miracle. He stopped the flow of water and the Bible tells us that the nation crossed the Jordan River on dry ground. As they crossed the river they were instructed to

pick up 12 large stones from the middle of the river bed, one for each tribe, and stack them up as a memorial on the far river bank. This memorial was to serve as a reminder.

Everyone that saw that stack of stones would be reminded that God keeps his promises, that when our situation seems hopeless, with no way out, God makes a way. The Israelites would be reminded that God provides what we need when we need it. God has a long history of keeping his promises. But when we are in the midst of the struggle it's easy for us to forget. God has promised many times that he will never leave us or forsake us, that he will be with us always.

Maybe you have something that serves as a reminder to you. It could be a diploma that hangs on the wall of your home, an old photo, or even a patch that you wear on your uniform. It doesn't matter what your reminder is. What's important is that we don't forget.

God always keeps his promises, he is with us. He will see us through this time of turmoil and struggle. He will see us through the frustration and fatigue. He will never leave us or forsake us. All we have to do is remember, and trust him.
