

Command sergeant major's career comes full circle

The hand that opened the cruiser door on a junior military police Soldiers' first patrol 30 years ago, now aged by a full Army career, again grasps the handle of a 549th Military Police Battalion cruiser. She opens the door, climbs in and swings the Durango out onto the darkened streets for one last patrol.

Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield Garrison Command Sgt. Maj. Rebecca Myers began her military career as a military police Soldier in Panama and chose to close it out Nov. 27 with the same unit now stationed on Fort Stewart.

"If I was going to do this, I might as well have done it with the 549th because then I can feel like everything has come full circle," Myers said.

Her MP training came back to her inherently knowing where to stand on a traffic stop and alert for things out of the ordinary, but Myers admitted she most appreciated being welcomed back into the brotherhood and sisterhood of the MP Corps.

"What was really kind of special was to be able to go and do some walking patrols with each of the patrolmen and talk to them about what they like about Fort Stewart and hear their thoughts and share stories," Myers said. "It was just a good

Myers wasn't alone in commemorating her career come full circle that night, either. Sgt. Raymond MacKenzie, patrol supervisor, 549th MP Co., said he had worked with Myers when he was going through one-station unit training at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, and Myers was the 795th MP Bn. command sergeant major.

"I was there for his first day in the Army," Myers said.

MacKenzie told Myers he remembered her making him drop for pushups for not calling "at ease" when she walked in the building. Throughout the night, the two patrolled for MacKenzie's midshift but saw a mostly calm post.

"It was awesome; it was quiet," Myers said. "From a garrison sergeant major, I was happy that it was quiet, but from an MP perspective, I was looking for a little bit of excitement."

The ride along ended with Myers' last Ending Time on Duty call, where 385th MP Battalion Commander Lt. Col. Craig Giancaterino commended her over the radio.

"That part was really special, in fact they had me speechless," Myers said.

Capt. Chelsea Kay, 549th MP Co. commander, said the final ETD was something Kay had never seen before.

Giancaterino, also director of

Fort Stewart Emergency Services, wrote the script which he and other members of the company made sure would be read by the **Emergency Communications** Center when Myers made her last ETD call.

"It is fitting your final days of active-duty are with the unit that your legacy began – the 549th Military Police Company, 'Tropic Enforcers," Giancaterino said. "Your engaged leadership has left the most positive impact for the Fort Stewart and Marne community. Remember retirement isn't just the end of something great, it is the start of something better. Happy retirement. Enjoy. You deserve it."

Myers intends to seek employment through the Hiring Our

Heroes Corporate Fellowship Program following her retirement, but more importantly, she intends to spend time with her daughter in Kansas City, Missouri.

"I'm really looking forward to spending time with her," Myers said. "Being apart for so long, it is going to be good to be able to have uninterrupted time to spend with her that I haven't had over the last several years."

Myers gave challenge coins to the entire shift of MPs with her that night, and she received unit challenge coins from the 385th MP Bn. and the 549th MP Co. She knows the challenges of the MP occupation, and she felt they deserved a display of appreciation for their hard work behind

"I felt that it was important they understood how much I appreciated them and everything that they do every single day. To work all hours of the day, all hours of the night, on holidays, in the rain, in the heat ... I wanted to thank them for doing what they do and keeping everybody safe here on Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield."

Each year, the Department of Defense surveys current residents of government-owned, government-leased, or privatized Family housing and current residents of privatized unaccompanied housing. The goal is to obtain feedback regarding their living experience.

Survey participation is voluntary and residents are invited to share their views about their current housing, resident services and community amenities.

"Obtaining feedback from our residents is of the utmost importance when it comes to maintaining quality living conditions and top notch customer service for our Soldiers and their Families," said Carl Smith, Directorate of Public Works Garrison Housing Office on Fort Stewart and Hunter

Army Airfield. "We encourage our Balfour Beatty Communities residents to let their voice be heard through this year's survey."

A link to the survey was sent via email to each household on Fort Stewart and Hunter Army Airfield. Only one person per address will receive the invitation email. All respondent information will be kept confidential. It will not be linked to the overall feedback results shared with DOD or the results that DOD shares with privatized housing companies or other stakeholders.

The survey launched yesterday and will remain open for responses for at least 45 days. Human resources agency adapts to pandemic

WASHINGTON— The safety and well-being of Army personnel is a top priority for the Civilian Human Resources Agency, as it continues to find new ways to acquire, develop, employ, and retain diverse talent amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

Hiring and HR personnel have collaboratively developed and executed innovative processes this year that will forever influence future civilian recruitment and hiring, said Carol Burton, the agency's director.

Since March, civilian recruitment operations have been able to hire approximately 21,000 new Department of Defense and Army civilian employees during the pandemic.

"We have onboarded between 1,000 to 1,300 new civilians each pay period, or every two weeks," she said.

CHRA manages all aspects of the human resources lifecycle for close to 330,000 Department of Defense and Army civilians worldwide, she said.

Out of the 21,000 new employees, close to 85% were hired virtually, including 3,000 medical professionals to augment the Army's COVID-19 response, she said. A DOD direct-hire authority provided CHRA officials a method to fill critical medical positions quickly.

"The Army never closed; the mission continued with a guiding principle of protecting the health and safety of our workforce," Burton said. "We quickly shifted to maximum telework."

Working in tandem with other agencies, CHRA officials also looked to expedite pre-employment physicals. The agency found ways to onboard new personnel for select positions as they awaited their results.

"In terms of the virtual onboarding [and] some hiring flexibilities ... I would like to continue that practice," Burton said. "We want to hire skilled individuals as quickly as possible" to retain the best candidates.

Along with improved hiring, the agency's Army Benefits Center–Civilian stood up a quick response team to support employees with their

health benefits, COVID-19 Thrift Savings Plan loans, retirement, work-related injuries, or to report an untimely death, Burton said. Support is available 24 hours a day and seven days a week on the CHRA website.

CHRA's information technology division also established automated tools to aid readiness during the pandemic, she said. One such program helped track close to 5,000 overseas civilian workers impacted by the DOD stop movement order. Agency officials relied on the collected data to prioritize the movement of personnel, and get them to their gaining location safely.

While COVID-19 created a share of additional challenges, CHRA remains committed to the Army's People Strategy as officials work to implement a 21st century talent management system, Burton said.

"People are the Army's greatest strength and most valuable asset," she added. "We are seeking legislative changes to improve hiring and implementing procedures to execute onboarding and acculturation programs."

In June, the Army announced its Civilian Implementation Plan, or CIP, which aligns a range of efforts to integrate each individual's knowledge, skills, behaviors and preferences to achieve organizational outcomes and sustain readiness.

CHRA also established the Army Civilian Career Management Activity, or ACCMA, in October, which is in alignment with Army's CIP requirements, she said.

"Before the establishment of ACCMA and the Army People Strategy, we had a decentralized method of managing civilians," Burton said.

With ACCMA, the Army now has 11 centrally-managed career fields, she added.

The new approach to career programs "offers our civilian workforce a centralized approach to hiring and managing their careers," she said. "Army civilians will now have a clear career path. We will also have a focused effort on training for the skills that we need today and in the future."



Understanding wise men's wisdom

Look at the nativity scene in Matthew with Mary and Joseph surrounding the central figure, Jesus. They were in a barn focused reverently on him, wrapped in cloth, sleeping in a feeding trough.

Generations in Israel longed for Messiah to rescue them, and now prophecy was fulfilled.

All of this attention was on one baby, the theme of salvation. Yet, there are still more figures to mention, such as the wise men, Arabian philosophers who studied the scriptures and found the star over Bethlehem and the Christ child.

Their presence shows that the birth of Christ was a global event, not exclusive to the Hebrews only.



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

Providers develop leadership skills

The Department of the Army has developed several initiatives to enable a "People First" policy. United States Army Forces Command and XVIII Airborne Corps identified the requirement for a monthly day of foundational training. To meet that requirement, the 3rd Infantry Division Sustainment Brigade developed the Provider Framework to create and foster conditions for open and respectful discourse to build trust between Soldiers and Leaders.

Senior leaders assigned to the Special Troops Battalion, 3rd SB., attended the initial Foundational Training Day event Nov. 13, at Victory Chapel on Fort Stewart.

"For the STB we put together a training for conflict management," said Capt. Richard Rivers, the acting Chaplin for the 3rd SB. "The reason why we are doing a lot of this training is because as the world is changing we want to give our Soldiers the best chance to talk about what is going on especially within a diverse population where one group may not agree with what another group is doing.'

The 3rd SB aims to hold this type of training with targeted key tasks such as leader development, the three corrosives (suicide, Sexual Harassment Assault Response Prevention and Equal Opportunity) and installation programs quarterly.

"What we're doing with the quarterly training is getting the leadership together to discuss the issues that are most prominent amongst our junior enlisted Soldiers," said Rivers. "We are trying to equip our Soldiers with the tools and resources they need so they can go back down to the squad level and address the situations where it's most important."

By providing the leadership with different perspectives, Rivers also gave reasons why it is important to provide a platform for leaders to address conflicts.

"The training is important because it gives Soldiers an outlet to discuss what is happening around the world. If they don't have that outlet, then if another Soldier has a different opinion than they do, it can create conflict within the workplace," said Rivers. "And if those workplaces are full of Soldiers who are bickering or fighting because of what's going on in the world, then we're not going to get the mission done."

Commanders and first sergeants that attended the training could take their training further by passing the torch of information down to the leaders within their companies.

"I would hope that those of us that are in leadership positions will gain perspective as to what it is that we need to train our Soldiers, how we need to speak to them and ultimately how do we reach them at their level," said Rivers. "In order to do that, you need to get down to their level to understand the most important thing you can teach and talk about."

Some of the senior leaders have learned additional skills to converse with the Soldiers within with platoons.

"I learned how I can better articulate the division's and the brigade's intent as well as help enable my squad leaders, platoon leaders and platoon sergeants to reach out and better meet the needs of their Soldiers," said Capt. Donald Knight, the commander of 90th Human Resources Company, STB, 3rd SB.

For other leaders, the training reinforced information that they already knew, but also gave them ways to push the information back to the leaders within their companies.

"It reinforced what I already knew," said 1st Sgt. Shontavious Wilkerson, the first sergeant of 90th HRC. "Squads and leaders need to know and train their Soldiers and by doing this it's going to essentially make the organization better and stronger."

In the future, the Sustainment Brigade plans to host further training on Dec. 4.

"The focus of each training will be different," said Rivers. "Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 87th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion, 3rd SB, wants to focus on suicide prevention because with the approaching holidays and COVID-19 restrictions, they want to ensure they address each situation and find the people that will need the help."
