



By the time you read this message, PWO will have released an ALL HANDS e-mail containing the link of the video, and your supervisors may be scheduling sessions during normal work hours to encourage you to watch this important video message.

CE2 Bullen Says "Lock It Up"

Doing these important work required hefty training on CE2 Bullen's part. Last year in the midst of ongoing pandemic, he attended the Lockmasters Security institute in Kentucky and was educated in operating on all government security locks and approved safes and vaults, as well as normal door hardware. He told the team it was interesting and the instructors were very professional and experienced. With BU2(SCW/EXW) Mara Benitez, another of the PWD Rota's locksmiths and CE2's sole counterpart, scheduled to depart in the short future, CE2 Bullen sees importance in having other motivated Seabees given opportunities to attend this important training. CE2's goal is to always leave a job or piece of equipment in the better state than before. He likes to think of work as an extension of himself, and wants to leave a good lasting impression even after he's gone.

CE2 Cutter Bullen is PWD Rota's very own Locksmith. On February 25th, 2021, he invited the public affairs team for a quick peak into the day in a life in his busy schedule.

The team accompanied CE2 on three different work orders placed from NAVSUP and DESRON-60, both tenant commands onboard NAVSTA Rota, Spain. The first stop involved update of two locks at NAVSUP main building (BLDG 55). One of the locks was for a door the other was for a filing cabinet. He told us that the codes for these door locks must be changed on an annualbasis as a part of the extra necessary security measure. At DESRON-60 (BLDG 3307), CE2 installed a new lock for added security measures. This ensures prevention of breaks that can cause leaks of classified information.
