PWD ROTA FOOTBALL TEAM 2021



This was performed at the Fire Department Training Compound while the Fire Department was conducting a Live Fire Joint Training with Moron Firefighters.

These kind of tests are highly important to ensure fire pumps deliver the correct amount of water at the rated pressure.

This type of testing helps to detect any significant failure forcing the pump to its highest performance level..


