# Corpus Christi Army Depot's Outstanding Performers



## CCAD Outstanding Performer

### ADOLPH SKROBARCZYK



Mr. Adolph Skrobarczyk from the Directorate of Manufacturing Process Production (DMPP) Machine Shop is recognized as an outstanding CCAD performer for his work on the hydromechanical unit (HMU) improvement process and identifying Mechanical Engineering Order (MEO) issues in removing sealing plugs. As a result of his due diligence, the Depot now follows the Navy MEO to remove far fewer plugs, improving the process by 26% per HMU. Mr. Skrobarczyk took the lead and embraced the challenge, demonstrating that he understands "WINNING MATTERS!" His actions and skills are vital to "Keeping the Army Flying."

### Rudy Perez



After encountering corrosion issues associated with pedal assemblies and sub-assemblies, Rodolfo "Rudy" Perez, Directorate of On Condition Maintenance (DOCM), worked with Production Control (PC) and Pre-Shop Examiners (PSA) to evaluate and process the assemblies before releasing them for maintenance. Working with engineers, he helped create two maintenance engineering calls (MEC) to provide the disposition and the chemicals required. Pedal assemblies are now ready for evaluation and processing before release for maintenance. Mr. Perez's efforts and dedication to the Depot provided substantial safety oversight to our products.

The NDT Program Management team also worked together to establish a backup ultrasonic inspection because of his efforts.

The Corpus Christi Army Depot recognizes Ms. Michele Kunicki, from the Directorate of Human Capital (DHC). A team of employees from the Composite, Cowling and Sheetmetal Shops collaborated on a Value Stream Map (VSM) method to reduce the hours and process cycle time (days) of the turtleback part. The turtleback is used on the RECAP-Black Hawk weapon systems. By using the VSM tool, the team was able to successfully reduce the hours by 40% and process cycle time by 50%. This VSM was the first of a three-step process. Congratulations to the Composite, Cowling and Sheetmetal shops for their continuous efforts to improve cost, quality and schedules.

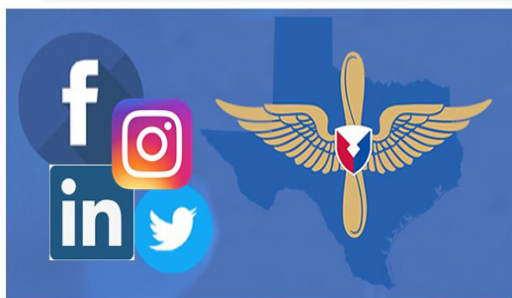

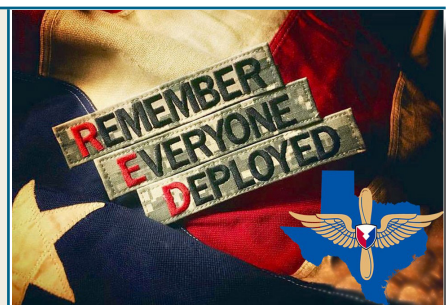
