

ENGLISH VERSION





On February 1st, 2023, PWD Rota hosted a kick-off meeting for the new base operation support contractor (BOSC), J&J World Wide Services. The NAVSTA Rota's BOSC recently held a transition of contractor from NEWIMAR, which served the base for past 30+ years, to JJWWS on January 1st, 2023. This \$132M Indefinite-Delivery Indefinite-Quantity (IDIQ) contract was awarded through NAVFAC Atlantic (LANT), our Echelon III command, on 2021 to JJWWS, which has been working with the DoD since 1970s, and currently has experience in working in 8 OCONUS military locations in UK, Germany, and Italy.

The BOSC touches many aspects of the base, servicing many areas within the properties of NAVSTA Rota with both recurring and non-recurring work items, including custodial, pest control, grounds maintenance, solid waste management, HAZWASTE/oily waste/CHT, and occasional crane lift activities (just to list few examples), supporting at the airfield, piers, family and unaccompanied housing, hospital, and other tenant commands. This \sim \$10M per year contract is very much so interwoven into how the base is maintained for the most part.

The meeting was attended by 42 personnel, including personnel from JJWWS, PWD Rota, and base clients that utilize BOSC. During the kick-off meeting, Jorge Diaz, the project manager of JJWWS, introduced himself and his team members to the base, following in-troduction of everyone in attendance.
