Fort Riley students learn about water treatment, conservation for Earth Day



This week Doc Jargon explains what going dark means and how the term originated. Doc's advice reassures a Soldier's boyfriend about Army training.



Historic Places

The first Post Exchange on Fort Riley, Waters Hall, was built in 1888 by Moses Waters, the last sutler at Fort Riley. The sutler provided products and services similar to today's Exchange or Commissary. When it

opened, Waters Hall was a general store and recreation center. After Waters died in 1889, his widow sold the building to the government for \$5,000.
