
NAPLES, ITALY—Jose Hernandez Forja was recently awarded the 2022 Senior Civilian of the Year for NAVFAC Europe, Africa, Central (EURAFCENT) at a ceremony on August 3rd, 2023. He was presented with a plaque celebrating his selection by Captain Joe Harder III, our former Commanding Officer. The NAVFAC EUR-AFCENT recognition program distinguishes individuals who have made significant positive contributions to

NAVFAC EURAFCENT, the Department of Navy and supported commands. Jose, the Senior Project Manager at the Expeditionary Directorate of NAVFAC EURAFCENT, has definitely made a difference in the command for his exemplary work that he has done in managing humanitarian projects in European theater, that required challenging coordination between the United States and other nations, including areas in permissive and restricted environments. Since 2009, he has spearheaded renovation or building of orphanages, schools, kindergartens, hospitals, and clinics, up to 20 to 25 projects per year, in large cities and in the most remote locations.

"This award represents a very important award to me and to the entire Expeditionary Directorate Team, of which I only aspire to be a worthy representative. Next year, I will make 30 years of service with the US Navy. I dedicate this award to all local nationals working for NAVFAC EURAFCENT here in Rota, as well as Naples and all places where our services are needed. I come from a family of beekeepers. MUSE Delivery

Public Works Department Rota recently worked with NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center-Sigonella Rota Detachment Office in order to receive delivery of a MUSE generator that was shipped from the Naval Facilities Engineering and Expeditionary Warfare Center (NAVFAC EXWC) in Port Hueneme, California. The new MUSE generator will provide 2.5MW of additional back-up power to Naval Station Rota in case of commercial power outage. This asset is also critical in support of PWD Rota's services as pier requirements increases in the near future. NAVSUP coordinated the overall delivery from the stateside to Spain, while NAVFAC's Production/UEM and FEAD team worked together to contract a crane with SEMI SA in order to safely accept the generator onsite at the UEM complex. Bravo Zulu to all those who were involved!



PWD Rota's Port Operations CE-Crew recently reorganized the ship-to-shore power cables on Pier 1 Berth 4 in anticipation of USS Paul Ignatius's arrival on Monday July 24th, 2023. Prior to the ship's arrival, the CE-Crew, led by CE1(SCW) Ashley Anzilottilampson and CE2(SCW/EXW) Kwamme Washington, worked to untangle the cables. Due to the necessity of keeping the cables organized in orderly fashion, the CE-crew does its best to assist each deployed ships the correct manner and order of hooking the cables on-board the ship, but eventual messiness are inevitable on the piers, especially with fast-paced operational tempo. Moving these cables are not a simple task; each cable weighs on average about 2000 kgs/ km, which is substantial. Kudos to these Seabees for ensuring seamless power support to the ships!




