



Air monitoring in project area




Illinois EPA and Cook County

Dust control at Chicago Area CDF:

Water and vegetation



Sediment is wet when dredged. Water prevents dust.



Vegetation grows quickly in sediment and prevents dust.

Potential additional dust controls



Sprinklers keep dust down.



Planting vegetation holds sediment in place.



Fencing disrupts wind.

Dust settles to ground.
