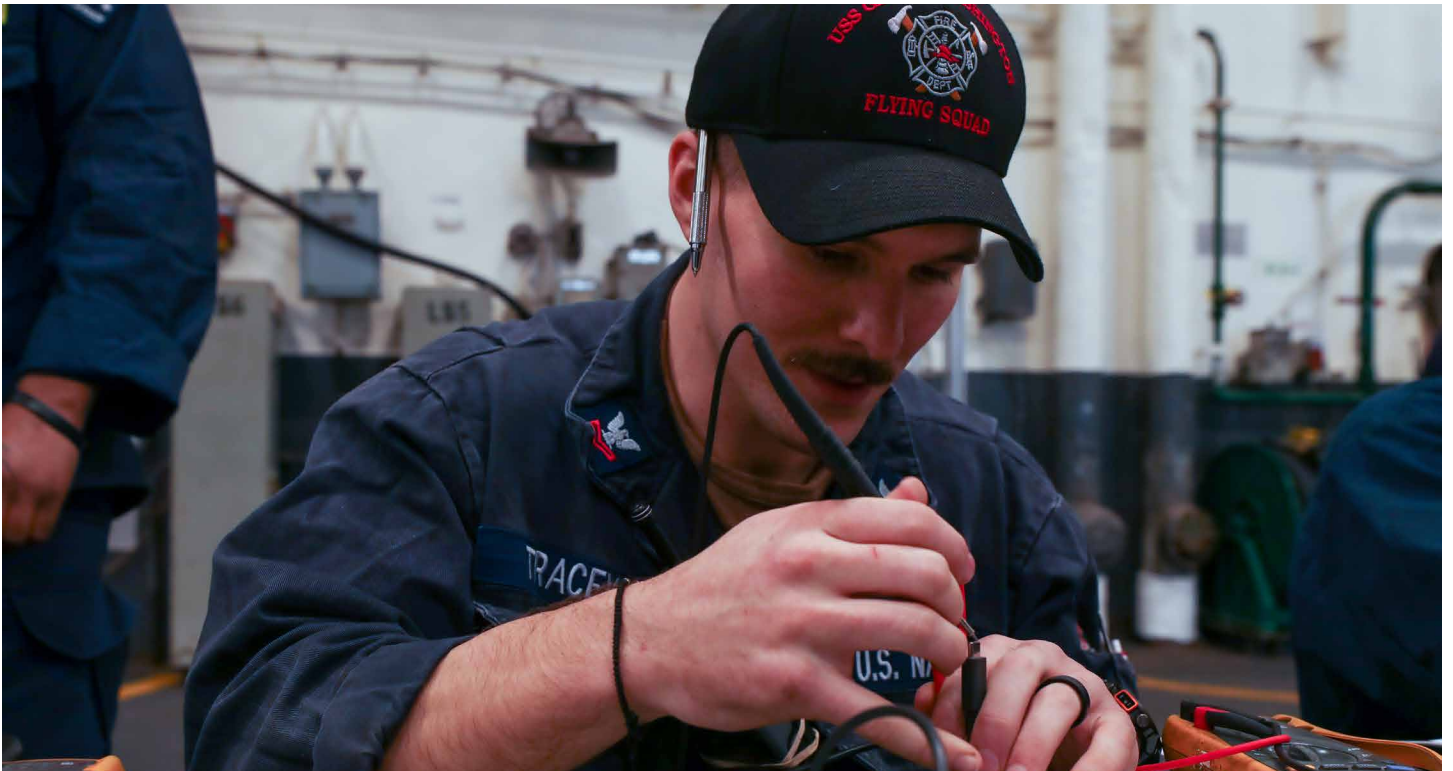


The Board of Inspection and Survey (INSURV) was initially established by Congress in 1870, with legislation enacted in 1882 to inspect our Navy ships and to report on their readiness. It is a thorough inspection that examines ships against Navy standards to determine readiness in various areas. The inspection is designed to be taken “in stride” and as an “open-book test” with the standards available beforehand.

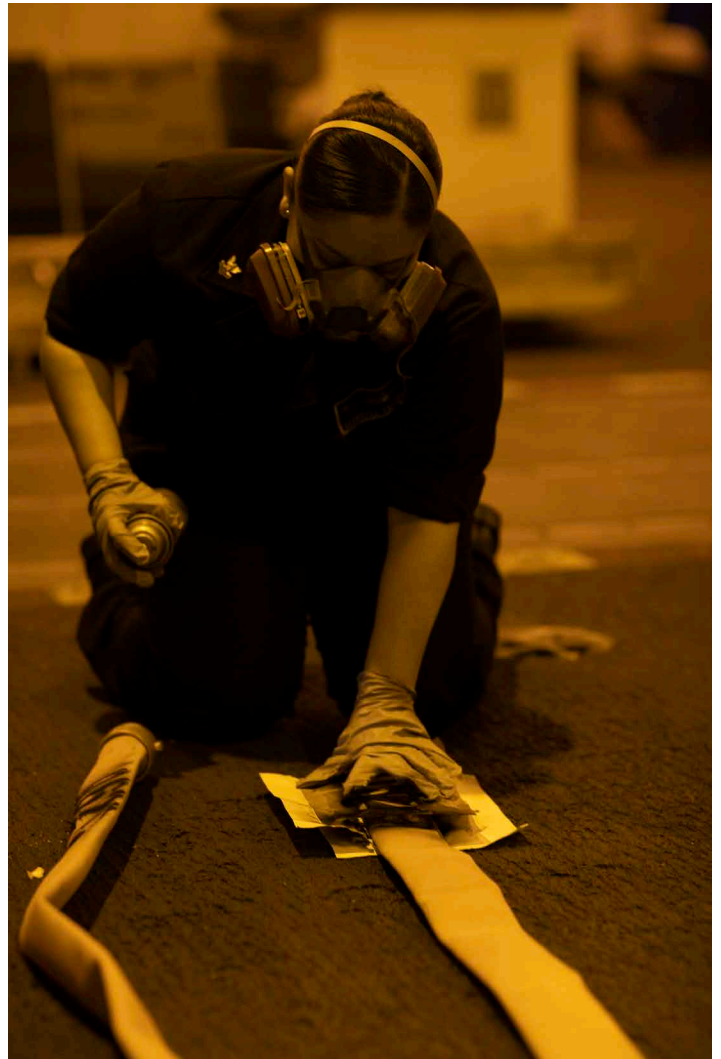
With any inspection, ownership is a key part. Know your spaces and what your team is responsible for.

While preparing for this inspection, it not only important to go above and beyond to show the inspectors our Warfighting capabilities, but we must remember we are preparing to be the forward-deployed naval forces carrier at the tip of the spear.

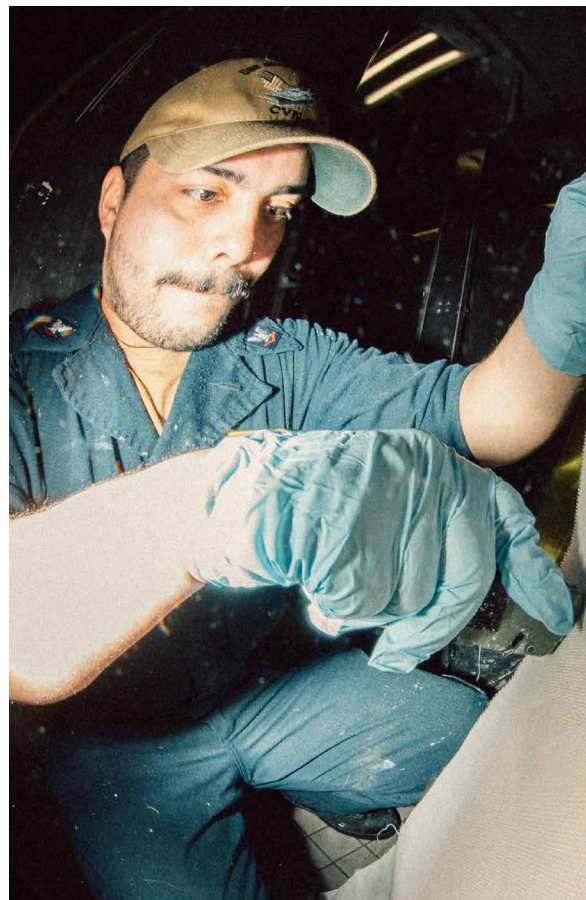


# DOOR TEAM

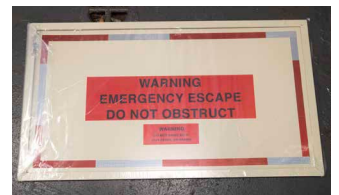

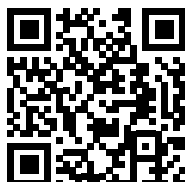
