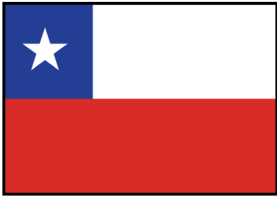

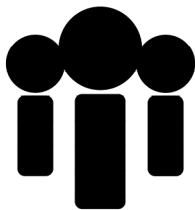

STRAIT OF MAGELLAN

The Strait of Magellan, named after the Portuguese explorer Ferdinand Magellan, is a navigable sea route immediately south of mainland Chile and is a natural passage between the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. The George Washington Strike Group, along with ships from the Chilean Navy, transited the Strait of Magellan June 3-5, completing the Atlantic Ocean portion of its Southern Seas 2024 deployment.

During the two-day transit, George Washington Sailors from multiple departments contributed to the ship's safe passage through the 570-kilometer strait. The passage required a master-helmsman to steer the ship throughout the potentially hazardous pass.

"I am one of three master helms on board," said Quartermaster 3rd Class Kyva Gardner, assigned to navigation department. "Due to the risk of running into shoal water, buoys or anything hazardous, we are required to have someone steer who can maintain a consistent course without deviating more than .2 degrees port or starboard."

The navigation team worked together to capture bearings from physical structures to establish the ship's position and ensure the ship is on course. They compare these bearings from the watchstanders to the Voyage Management System which is similar to a GPS.

"The Strait of Magellan transit served as a valuable training opportunity for qualifying junior quartermasters in different aspects of

their rate," said Gardner. "They learned the importance of bearings and how it assists with overall navigation of the ship."

Due to the weather conditions in the region, aerographer's mates played an essential role to safely get the ships and crew through the strait.

"Junior AGs learned that this part of the world is very dynamic," said Aerographer's Mate 1st Class Taylor C. Kane (IW/AW/SW), assigned to intelligence department. "[This transit required us to] coordinate with nearly every department across the ship. We provided our meteorological expertise, and were relied on heavily for up to date and current weather observations."

Prior to entering the Strait, George Washington anchored off the coast of Punta Arenas, Chile. Punta Arenas is considered the world's southernmost city. Sailors from deck department had to work together to lower and monitor the ship's anchor chain during the anchor drop evolution.

As the ship navigated through the Strait, George Washington, Carrier Strike Group 10, and embarked Carrier Air Wing 7 Sailors surveyed the snow-capped mountains from the flight deck and hangar bay.

"This was a very humbling and unique opportunity for everyone on board," said Kane. "People do not get the chance to travel this far south on the globe. I hope everyone took the time to appreciate this journey."

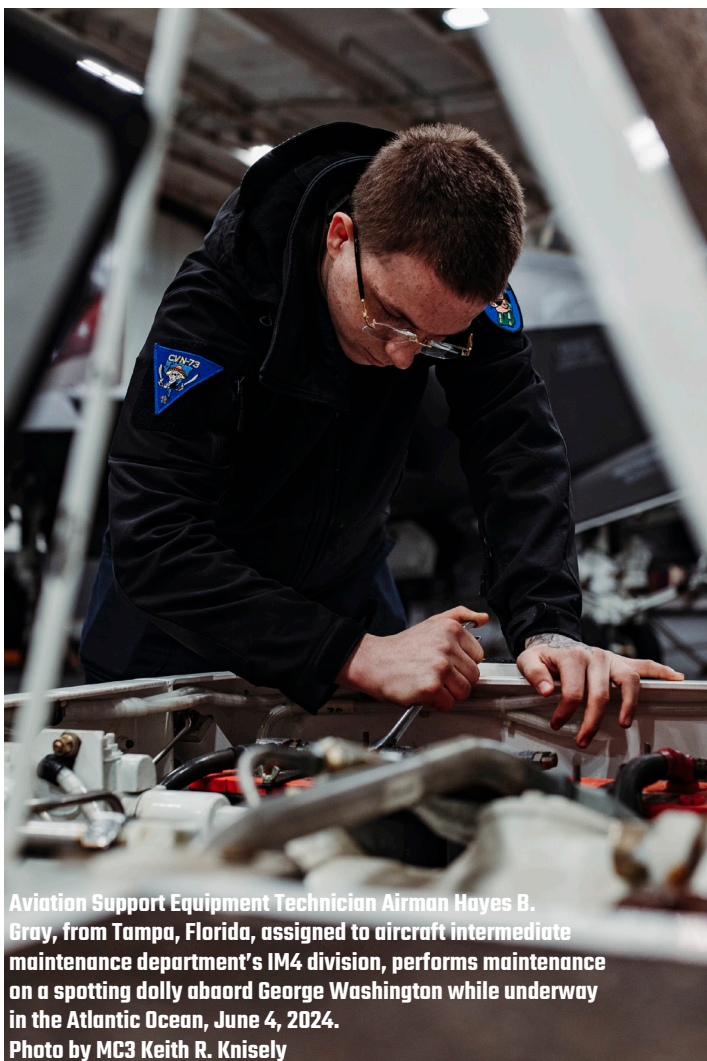

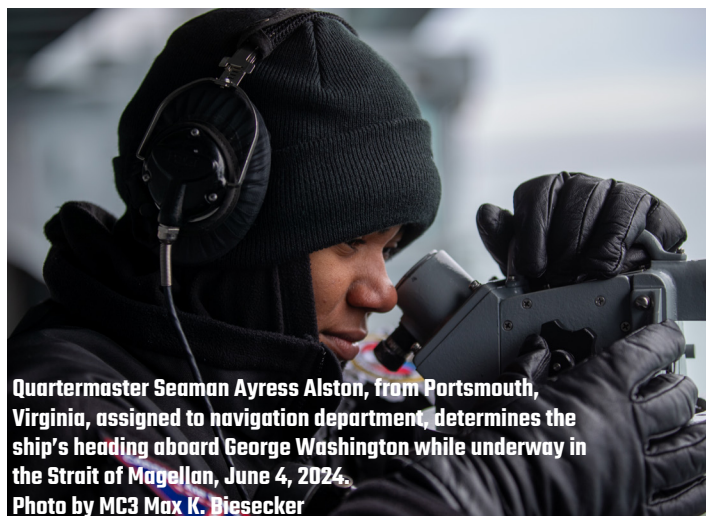

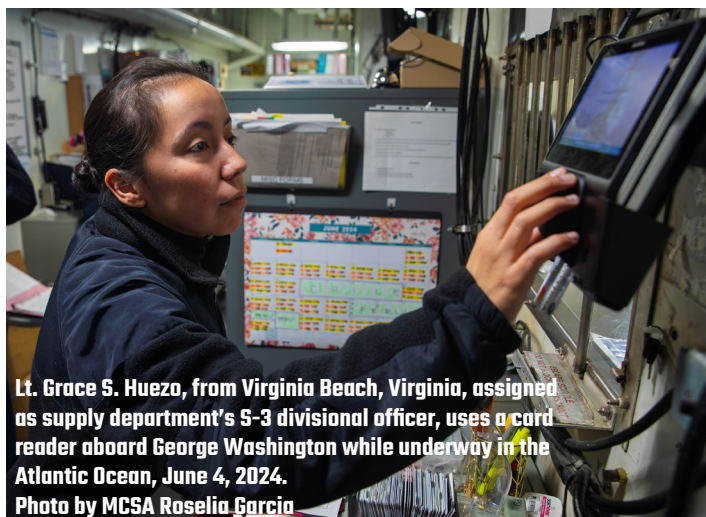

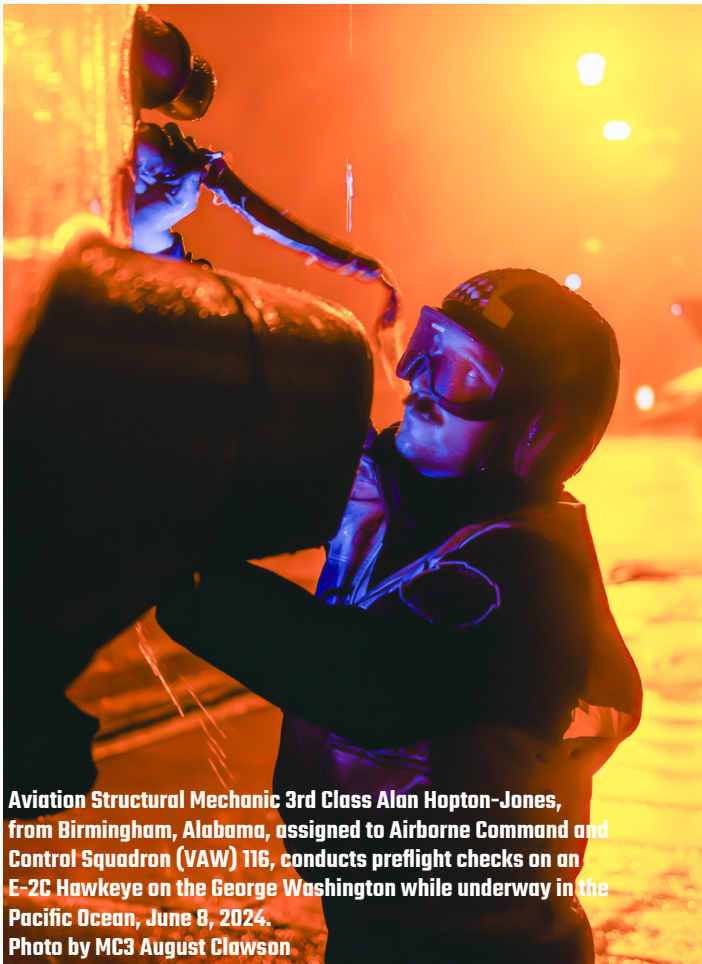

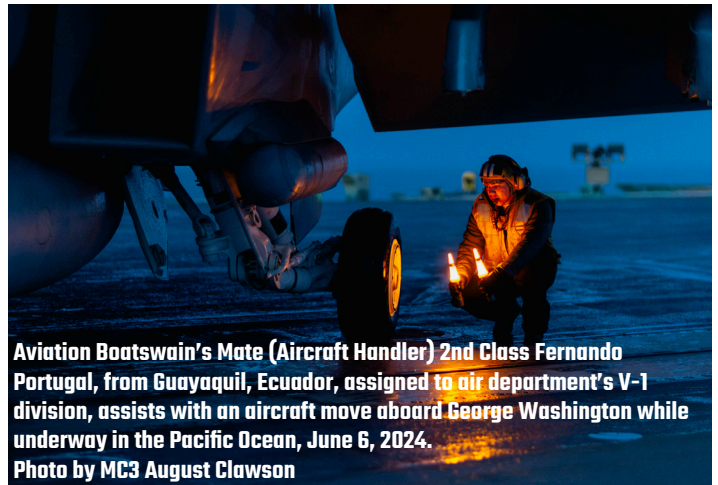

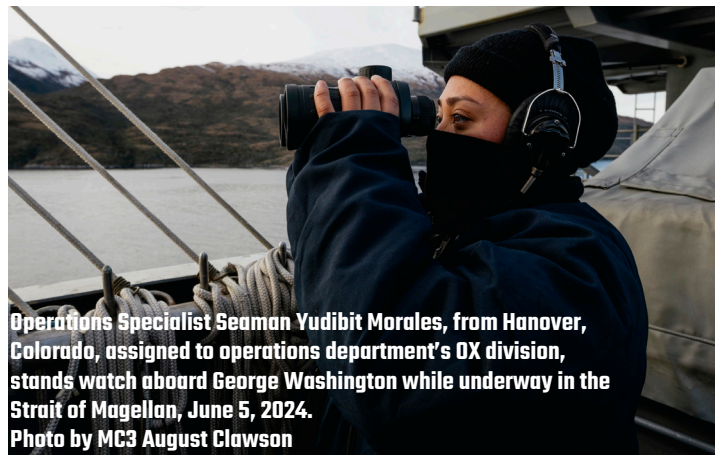

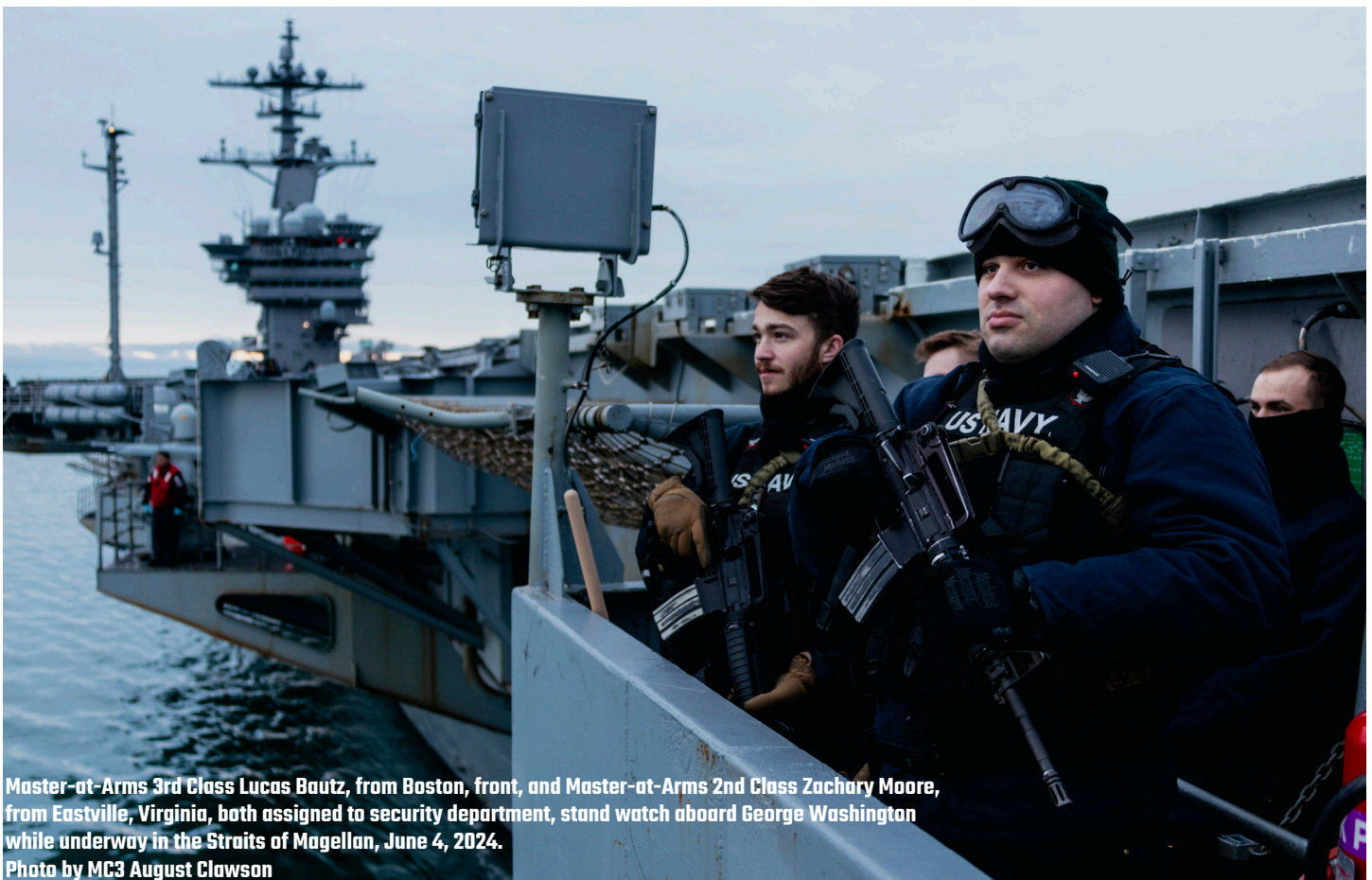

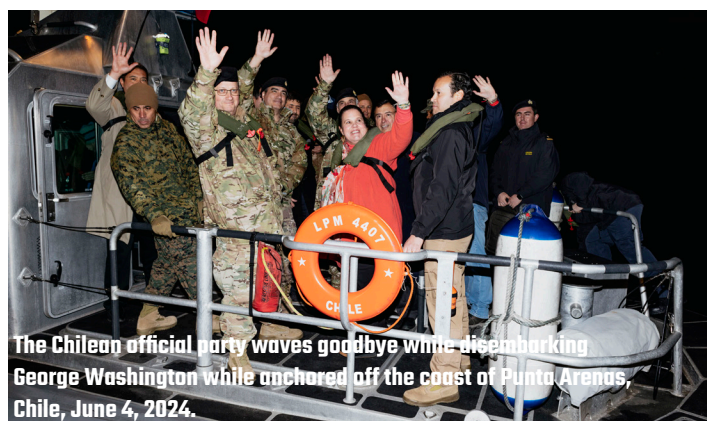

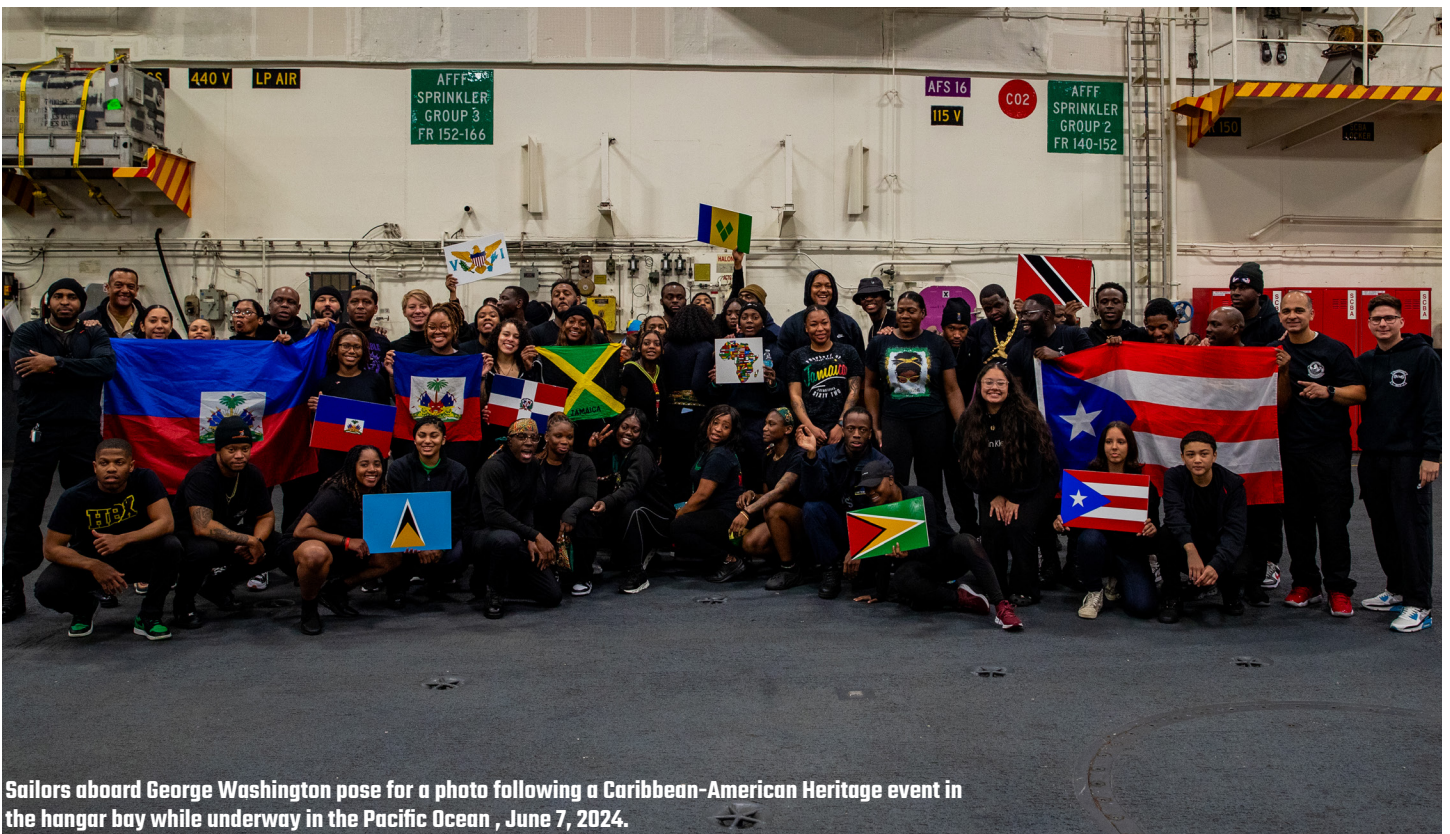
