

Nobi Beach Park (6:30 a.m.)/Nobi Beach down Shirahige Shrine (6:50 a.m.)/Nobi Bach down the Sunny Stage (7 a.m.)/Kurihama Nagase Beach (10 a.m. to 12 p.m.)/ Kurihama Beach in front of Perry Park (10 a.m.) Dondo-yaki/Onbe-yaki is Japanese New Year Traditional bonfires. People observe the rituals of bidding farewell to the past year and welcoming the New Year. Dondoyaki/Onbe-yaki is the proper way to dispose of sacred, or lucky items like daruma, amulet, or New Year decoration, and believed to purify and promote good health.

### SCHOLARSHIPS FOR MILITARY CHILDREN

The Scholarships for Military Children Program was created to recognize military families' contributions to the fighting force's readiness and to celebrate the commissary's role in the military family community. The application period for the 2025-2026 academic year has opened! The application period will close at 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time (8:59 p.m. Pacific Standard Time), Wednesday, Feb. 12. **Apply Now** 

## The Scholarships for Military Children program intends that a scholarship funded through contributions be awarded annually at each commissary operated by the Defense Commissary Agency worldwide.

Five hundred scholarship grants, each for \$2,000, will be awarded for the academic school year 2025-2026. There will be at least one recipient selected at every commissary location where qualified applications are received. Additional recipients are chosen on a prorated basis. Therefore, more applicants may be selected from those commissaries with more significant numbers of applicants. You may also visit our scholarship search engine for more scholarship opportunities.

#### Who Can Apply?

The Scholarships for Military Children program is open to unmarried military dependent children under the age 23 who possess a valid Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card. In addition, a student's parent(s)/sponsor(s) must be one of the following: active duty, reserve/ guard, deceased, or retired from the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, or Space Force. Must be enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time undergraduate program leading to a bachelor's degree or a community/ junior college designed to allow for a direct transfer into a four-year program. High school applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 basis). College applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. College freshmen must submit a first-semester college transcript. Applicants or sponsors do not need to live at an installation with a

commissary – simply select the commissary where you shop or the one nearest to you. **How Do I Apply?** 

The Scholarships for Military Children Program expects that the student completes the application themselves and they must attest to this when submitting the application.

1. Create an account that you can later come back to.

2. Complete all tabs of the form – a green checkmark indicates completion.

3. Write a short 500-word essay – the essay topic will be announced when the scholarship opens.

4. Submit transcripts

• High school applicants – transcript indicating a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale (unweighted)

• College applicants – transcript indicating a cumulative minimum GPA of 2.5 or above on a 4.0 scale (unweighted)

5. You must validate your eligibility as a military dependent by entering the benefits number found on the reverse of the Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card. If you qualify for an ID card but do not have one, immediately schedule a visit to a military personnel office with the proper documentation.

### **OFF-BASE TRAFFIC CONTROL**

• Yokosuka Chuo Oodori (Blue Street) will be closed in the morning of Jan. 12 due to Yokosuka Fire Engines Parade.

• The Zushi Ekiden relay race is scheduled for Jan. 12 at the joint use field/area. The runners start from the joint use field at 9 a.m. The race will end at the park near the Zushi Marina. Partial road closures will be implemented all around Zushi City along the route to accommodate the runners during the race.

## **CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES**

**Yokosuka:** NEX building H-20 parking lot to be repaved (Jan. 27-31, 2025)

• Gravel lot across from berth 9 Blue Ridge to be repaired (Feb. 2-21, 2025)

• The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.

• 50 percent of Defense Logistics Agency parking lot secured until February 2025.
• McCormick Street and Leahy Street. Full road closure for underground utility works until Feb. 28, 2025.

• Vandegrift Lane: Full road closure until October 2025.

### Ikego:

• Maintenance will be conducted on Shisagi Street from 10 to 11 a.m. and Yasakayato Street from 11 a.m. to 12 p.m. After maintenance is completed on Shisagi Street, maintenance personnel will then switch to Yasakayato Street. Road closure timelines are subject to change. If you attempt to go off base and one way is secured, the other street will be open. Pedestrian traffic will not be affected.

• A Government of Japan Contractor will perform excavation work on Shisagi Street until Aug. 31, 2025. Working hours will be between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Excavation site will be controlled as oneway alternating traffic control road during the daytime work. After daily working hours, road should be re-opened.

• 50 perent of Ikego NEX/MWR Parking Lot secured until the end of February 2025.
