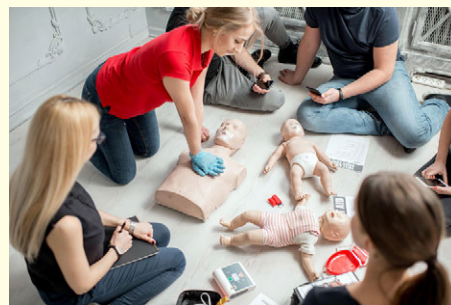



Jogashima Narcissus Festival Jan. 26 (Sunday)

Jogashima Prefectural Park (30-minute bus ride from Keikyu Misakiguchi Station, KK-72)

On Prefectural Jogashima Park and Narcissus Road, from the park to the vicinity of Jogashima Lighthouse, you can enjoy a walk while wrapped in sweet scent. Taiko performance will be held starting at 11 a.m. and 1 p.m.

7 a.m. to 4 p.m. | Mt. Takeyama summit (40-minute walk from Ikkizuka Bus Stop. 30-minute bus ride, bound for Nagai or Misakiguchi from Keikyu Yokosuka Chuo Station, KK-59)

Hatsufudo is a Buddhist holiday held every year on Jan. 28 and celebrates Fudo-myoo, which is Dharma Body incarnate. It is revered by the local shermen and you can enjoy fugashi sweets hung from a bamboo branch, symbolizing fish and a fishing rod respectively.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR MILITARY CHILDREN

The Scholarships for Military Children Program was created to recognize military families' contributions to the fighting force's readiness and to celebrate the commissary's role in the military family community. The application period for the 2025-2026 academic year has opened! The application period will close at 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time (8:59 p.m. Pacific Standard Time), Wednesday, Feb. 12.

Apply Now

The Scholarships for Military Children program intends that a scholarship funded through contributions be awarded annually at each commissary operated by the Defense Commissary Agency worldwide. Five hundred scholarship grants, each for \$2,000, will be awarded for the academic school year 2025-2026. There will be at least one recipient selected at every commissary location where qualified applications are received. Additional recipients are chosen on a prorated basis. Therefore, more applicants may be selected from those commissaries with more significant numbers of applicants. You may also visit our scholarship search engine for more scholarship opportunities.

Who Can Apply?

The Scholarships for Military Children program is open to unmarried military dependent children under the age 23 who possess a valid Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card. In addition, a student's parent(s)/sponsor(s) must be one of the following: active duty, reserve/guard, deceased, or retired from the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, or Space Force. Must be enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time undergraduate program leading

to a bachelor's degree or a community/junior college designed to allow for a direct transfer into a four-year program. High school applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 basis). College applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. College freshmen must submit a first-semester college transcript. Applicants or sponsors do not need to live at an installation with a commissary – simply select the commissary where you shop or the one nearest to you.

How Do I Apply?

The Scholarships for Military Children Program expects that the student completes the application themselves and they must attest to this when submitting the application.

1. Create an account that you can later come back to.
2. Complete all tabs of the form – a green checkmark indicates completion.
3. Write a short 500-word essay – the essay topic will be announced when the scholarship opens.
4. Submit transcripts
 - High school applicants – transcript indicating a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above on a 4.0 scale (unweighted)
 - College applicants – transcript indicating a cumulative minimum GPA of 2.5 or above on a 4.0 scale (unweighted)
5. You must validate your eligibility as a military dependent by entering the benefits number found on the reverse of the Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card. If you qualify for an ID card but do not have one, immediately schedule a visit to a military personnel office with the proper documentation.

YOKOSUKA COMMISSARY UPDATE

The Yokosuka Commissary advises that a disruption in shipping schedules may cause temporary shortages of commodities including fresh meats, frozen/chilled products and dry goods. The Yokosuka Commissary does not foresee any drastic shortages, however, eligible patrons may experience shortages of specific items and cuts. The Yokosuka Commissary does maintain a backup of frozen core items. These items are stored locally and in sufficient quantities to last until shipping schedules return to normal

CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES

Yokosuka: King Street partial closure. Closure period from Jan. 27 to Feb. 27. Crane work for building B-37. Half of B-37 parking lot to be closed. Two way traffic will be maintained.

- NEX building H-20 parking lot to be repaved (Jan. 27-31, 2025)
- Gravel lot across from berth 9 Blue Ridge to be repaired (Feb. 2-21, 2025)
- The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.
- 50 percent of Defense Logistics Agency parking lot secured until February 2025.
- McCormick Street and Leahy Street. Full road closure for underground utility works until Feb. 28, 2025.
- Vandegrift Lane: Full road closure until October 2025.

Ikego: A Government of Japan Contractor will perform excavation work on Shisagi Street until Aug. 31, 2025. Working hours will be between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Excavation site will be controlled as one-way alternating traffic control road during the daytime work. After daily working hours, road should be re-opened.
