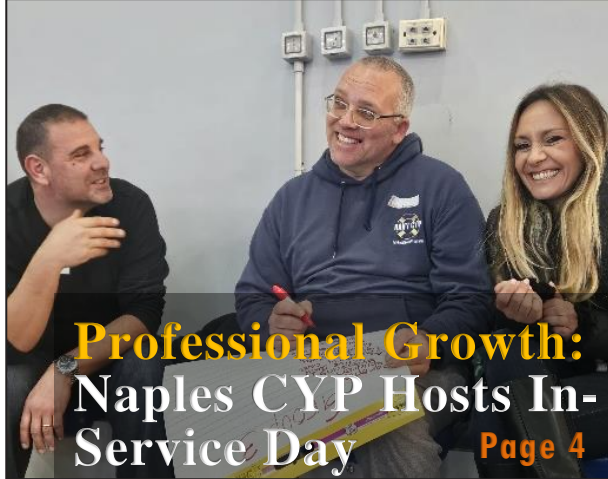

It is estimated that 1/3 of U.S. teens will experience some type of abuse from someone they are in a relationship.

As part of TDDVAM, Naples Fleet and Family Support Center (FFSC), along with Naples Middle High School, held several events to raise awareness, teach what healthy relationships are, and ensure our youth know their resources.

One of the events, a Teen Pledge Signing, offered students the opportunity to pledge their commitment to maintaining healthy behaviors in their relationships. The pledge lists several examples on healthy behaviors in relationships, encouraging and reminding teens what are healthy relationships.

Other events, like the FFSC Adolescent Counselor Brief and the NMHS Parent Coffee Engagement, focused on providing tools to both parents and teens in fostering positive relationships. Lastly, the Junior/Senior Seminar included teens in a discussion on how to establish dating boundaries and recognize signs of abusive behavior in a relationship.

NAVFAC Leaders Across EURAFCENT Gather for 2025 Public Works Symposium in Naples, Italy

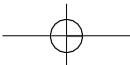

From cybersecurity to streamlining operations, and alternate construction methods, these dedicated professionals are building a stronger future for our Navy forces.



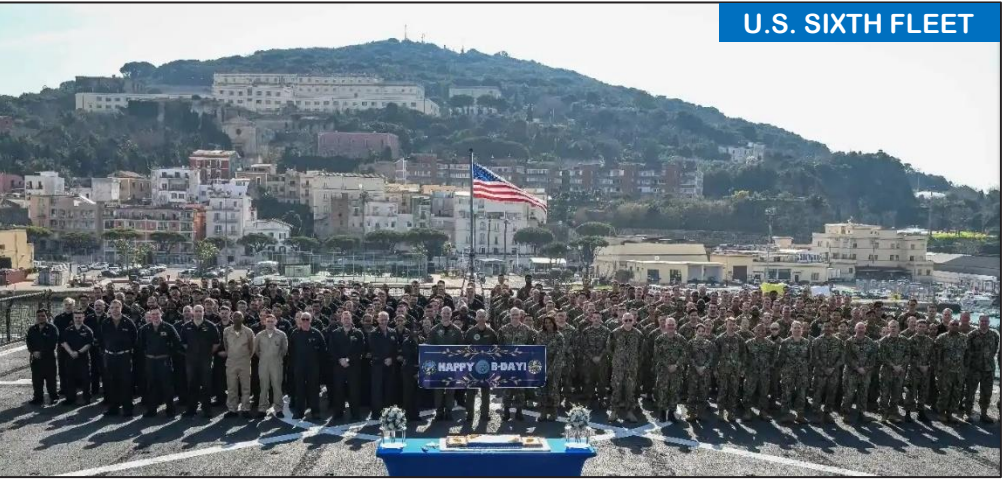
News in Brief: Around the Installation

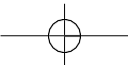

Off-Base Housing: Security Deposits Transitioning to Electronic Payments

This higher headquarter directed security deposit policy change aligns NSA Naples with all other DoD bases across the world and will enable personnel to experience the convenience of electronic payments.

At the direction of higher headquarters, Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (CNREURAFCENT), NSA Naples is transitioning to electronic fund transfer (EFT) for off-base housing security deposit to ensure that our personnel living off-base can expect the same processes and standards they would experience at all other DoD bases across the world.

If you're stationed in the Naples area, residing off-base, and paid your security deposit in cash, it will be returned to you electronically and you will pay it back to your landlord electronically. The housing office will contact you to sign two acknowledgement forms and a lease amendment to complete the process and go electronic.

This higher headquarter directed security deposit policy change aligns NSA Naples with all other DoD bases across the world and will enable our personnel to experience the convenience of electronic payments.

Electronic payment removes a layer of bureaucracy allowing tenants to receive their security deposit directly from the landlord instead of going through NSA Naples housing office. Quick and easy.

Furthermore, electronic payment is more convenient than taking a trip to the ATM to get cash and more secure than carrying cash around. Going electronic will also reduce and/or eliminate the potential for cash drain at installation ATMs.

In the modern era, electronic payments are the preferred method of monetary transactions for every other overseas station and keeps an electronic transaction history, vice dependence on paper payment receipts.

This change will ONLY affect tenant personnel residing off-base that have executed private lease agreements through the NSA Naples Housing Service Center (HSC) prior to 10 June 2024.

Personnel PCSing out of Italy by December 2025 will be grandfathered in and not be affected by this new policy.

The housing office will contact all concerned to sign two acknowledgement forms and a lease amendment to complete the process and go electronic.

Your Questions Answered

What if the landlord refuses to return the deposit?

A landlord who fails to return the deposit to a tenant would be subject to immediate removal from the NSA Naples housing program. It is an extremely rare occurrence to see a landlord who fails to return a security deposit back to tenant here in Naples. Per the lease agreement, and in rare instances where security deposit dispute between tenant and landlord cannot be resolved through informal meeting with the housing office, either party will have all remedies available to them under the law. As a DoD personnel, if you are not getting the legal help you need, you should always engage your chain of command to escalate the issue through appropriate channels.

Will the security deposit be returned in Euros?

Deposits are electronically returned in Euros if you provide account information that includes an IBAN number linked to a Euro bank account. If a tenant has a U.S. bank account, they will receive the money in dollars. Most personnel that own a community bank account have reported that it makes security deposit, rent, and bill payments to Italian landlords much easier. Other personnel are known to use the wire transfer service known as Wise. As for the exchange rate, this fluctuates on a daily basis and each tenant may realize a positive or negative difference between transactions depending on when the transaction occurs.

Is it my responsibility to inform my landlord about this policy change?

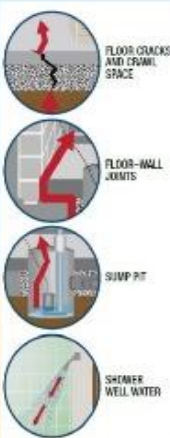
No. The housing service center will explain the policy change to each landlord.

Radon Awareness: How Radon Enters Homes

On-base residential and non-residential units, including off-base Government leased units are in compliance with the Navy Radon Management Program.

Radon can enter your home in many ways:

- Cracks in solid floors
- Construction joints
- Cracks in walls
- Gaps in suspended floors
- Gaps around service pipes
- Cavities inside walls
- The water supply

Radon is a naturally occurring, radioactive gas that is odorless, colorless, and tasteless. Radon gas is released from rocks and soil and can move to air, groundwater, and surface water. It is normally found at very low levels in outdoor air and can be found in water used for cooking and drinking.

In compliance with the Navy Radon Assessment and Mitigation Program (NAVRAMP), NSA Naples on-base residential and non-residential units, including off-base Government leased units are either tested or mitigated or currently being tested.

Personnel that live off-base have entered into a private contract with their landlord, therefore limiting the scope with which the U.S. government may intervene or have control over said contract. However, DoD personnel living off-base can work with their landlord to test for and mitigate radon, if desired, at their own expense. The lessee may work with the lessor to address any identified issues, as outlined in Section 19 of the NSA Naples housing lease.

While NSA Naples has a known overall potential for elevated radon levels, classifying the installation as a Radon Potential Category (RPC) 1 according to the NAVRAMP, the installation is complying with NAVRAMP testing and mitigation policies at government owned/controlled units. RPC1 is simply the level assigned when even one unit or building is found on the installation with a radon level over the minimum threshold of 4.0 picocuries per liter (pCi/L).

In-Focus: Air Quality in Naples

Checking Air Quality Outdoor

The website hyperlink below provides real-time data on Naples’ Air Quality Index (AQI) to help residents understand pollution levels and potential health implications. AQI is a measure of air pollution on a scale where higher numbers indicate poorer air quality. The AQI levels are divided into categories: Good (0-50), Moderate (51-100), Poor (101-200), Unhealthy (201-300), Severe (301-400), and Hazardous (401-500).

The dashboard displays AQI readings across various locations in Naples, showing areas with higher pollution. Additional insights like health recommendations (e.g., wearing masks, using air purifiers) and historical AQI trends are also included, helping residents make informed decisions about outdoor activities. This is not an endorsement of this website, but an effort to keep our community here in Naples informed on the environmental conditions where we live.

Air Quality in Naples – Sources

Vehicle emissions are among the primary contributors to Naples’ air pollution. The city’s dense traffic and reliance on cars and motorbikes result in high levels of NO₂ and other harmful pollutants that affect air quality, especially during peak travel times.

In addition, less frequent, natural events, like wildfires in Naples, contribute to air pollution and environmental damage.

Addressing these issues requires coordinated efforts between local authorities, industries, and the community to reduce pollution and to mitigate its long-term environmental impacts. It is also important to note the U.S. Naval Hospital Naples does not test or monitor the outdoor air quality across the region.

What Is Naples Public Health Evaluation (NPHE)?

The Naples Public Health Evaluation is a comprehensive study of the health risks associated with potential exposure to chemicals in the environment resulting from the area’s waste disposal practices. The Campania region of Italy has experienced numerous challenges associated with trash collection, open burning of uncollected trash and illegal waste disposal practices. In response to health concerns expressed by U.S. Navy personnel in 2007, the Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (CNREURAFCENT) contacted the Navy and Marine Corps Force Health Protection Command (NMCFHPC) to conduct a comprehensive public health evaluation to assess the potential health risks for U.S. personnel living in the Naples area. The NPHE was conducted from January 2008 to June 2011.

What did the Navy learn from NPHE?

Through the Public Health Evaluation, the Navy has been able to identify and address public health risks for U.S. personnel living in the Campania region. The Navy established new health-protective policies and took immediate action to protect the health of U.S. personnel and their families. **Many of these health-protective policies remain in place, as enduring processes, to ensure continued health protection beyond the life of the study.**

The U.S. Navy conducted a Public Health Evaluation from 2008-2011 to assess potential health risks for Navy personnel and their families while living in Naples, Italy. In line with our commitment to continually share important health information, we are providing the following information related to the Public Health Evaluation. Introduction

ARPAC, or Agenzia Regionale per la Protezione Ambientale della Campania, is the environmental protection agency for the Campania region. The U.S. Navy worked with ARPAC throughout the Naples Public Health Evaluation (Naples PHE) to share information and testing results. This fact sheet provides information on how to navigate ARPAC’s website to access the ambient air quality data the Italian agency has collected.

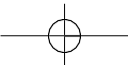

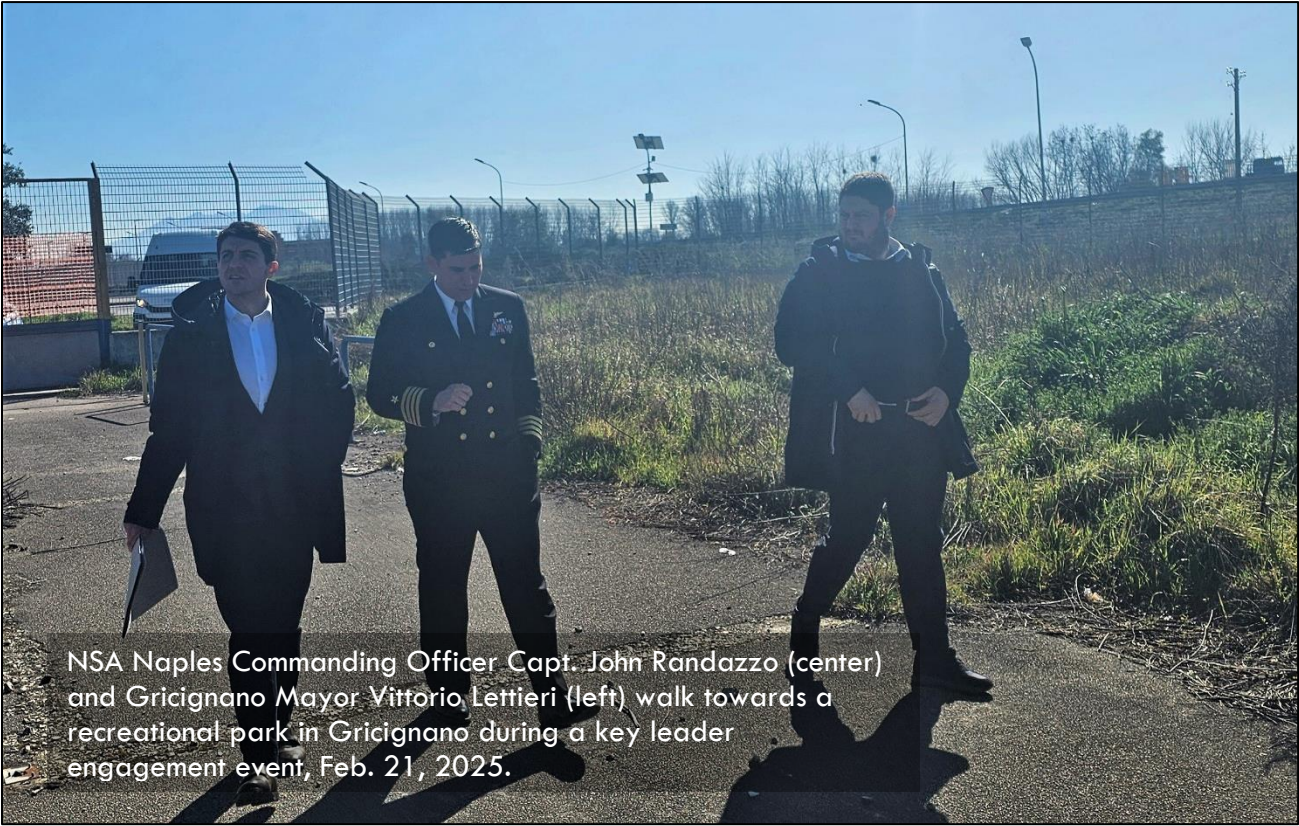

NAPLES, Italy — Leaders from U.S. Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples and the City of Gricignano di Aversa, Italy, met during a key leader engagement on February 21. The visit underscored the ongoing efforts to foster positive relations between the base and its Italian neighbors.

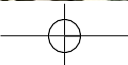
CNREURAFCENT Commander Recognizes Naples Area Sailors at Luncheon

Cleaning Your Oven Hood Grease Traps

Grease filters are designed to capture grease particles from the air and can become clogged depending on appliance usage. To reduce fire risk, filters should be cleaned at least every two months. This can be done manually using non-abrasive, neutral liquid detergents or in the dishwasher on low temperatures and short cycles. If you use acrylic anti-grease filters, they should be hand-washed every two months with neutral, non-abrasive detergents and replaced after every six washes. Please note that color changes may occur after multiple washes, but this does not qualify for replacement.

Ensure the filters are completely dry before reinstalling them. Additionally, clean the hood regularly, both inside and outside, with a cloth dampened with denatured alcohol or non-abrasive liquid detergents.

Failure to follow these cleaning and replacement guidelines increases the risk of fire. Therefore, we highly recommend adhering to these instructions.

Please note that hood maintenance is the responsibility of residents, as it is not currently included in the semi-annual preventative maintenance inspections by Mirabella. However, filters will be replaced by Mirabella during changes in occupancy.

Terminating Your Lease in the Economy

Getting ready to check out of economy housing, whether it's for a move onto base, another economy home, or leaving Naples altogether, we've got your back. Understanding the guidelines is crucial. Remember, you're required to give your landlord at least a 15-day notice if you're PCSing with orders in hand or moving onto base.

Preparing To Check Out

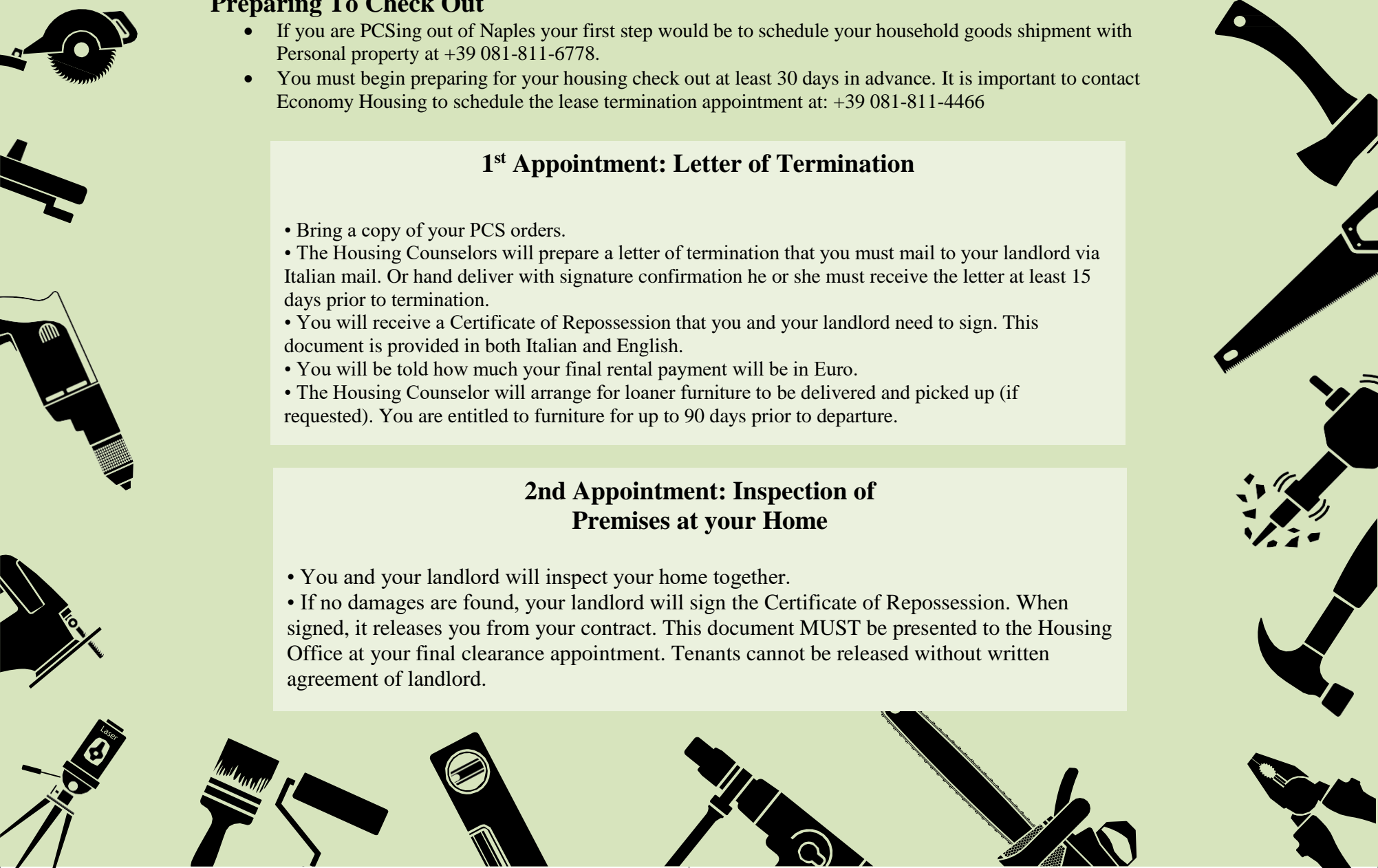
- If you are PCSing out of Naples your first step would be to schedule your household goods shipment with Personal property at +39 081-811-6778.
- You must begin preparing for your housing check out at least 30 days in advance. It is important to contact Economy Housing to schedule the lease termination appointment at: +39 081-811-4466

1st Appointment: Letter of Termination

- Bring a copy of your PCS orders.
- The Housing Counselors will prepare a letter of termination that you must mail to your landlord via Italian mail. Or hand deliver with signature confirmation he or she must receive the letter at least 15 days prior to termination.
- You will receive a Certificate of Repossession that you and your landlord need to sign. This document is provided in both Italian and English.
- You will be told how much your final rental payment will be in Euro.
- The Housing Counselor will arrange for loaner furniture to be delivered and picked up (if requested). You are entitled to furniture for up to 90 days prior to departure.

2nd Appointment: Inspection of Premises at your Home

- You and your landlord will inspect your home together.
- If no damages are found, your landlord will sign the Certificate of Repossession. When signed, it releases you from your contract. This document **MUST** be presented to the Housing Office at your final clearance appointment. Tenants cannot be released without written agreement of landlord.





3rd Appointment Final Clearance

- Bring the signed Certificate of Repossession. If the landlord did not sign the Certificate, he or she must come to this appointment.
- Your counselor will terminate your contract and negotiate damage reparation (if necessary). If you and your landlord cannot reach an agreement, Housing will arrange an inspection of the home.
- Ensure shut off of your electric is completed thru NEX or JFC effective your vacate date. Bring your final ENEL meter reading and all of your bills.
- Ensure termination of your Telecom contract is completed thru NEX or JFC effective your vacate date.
- Final utility consumption and damage costs, if any, can be deducted from your housing deposit. The balance will be refunded to you in Euro.
- If damages are determined to be the result of your tenancy, you are liable for the repair costs. If the costs exceed the amount of your deposit you are responsible for the difference.

Checklist to Terminate Lease

- Contact the Housing Service Center 45 days in advance and schedule an appointment for lease termination.
- Meet with the housing counselor who will write your lease termination.
- Deliver lease termination to your landlord. IMPORTANT: You MUST give your landlord 30 days’ notice to terminate the lease.
- Prior to moving out, shut off your electric through the Navy Exchange or JFC, effective your vacate date.
- Schedule a final clearance with your landlord.

4. Take the letter of intent to the Housing Service Center and receive a brief on economy housing.
5. Schedule a checkout Pre-Inspection at least 2 weeks prior to your move-out date. A final inspection will be scheduled for the move-out day, and an E-6 or above from your command will need to be present.

- E6 –E9. Exceptional E-4 and E-5 may be eligible with special approval.
- One year remaining on orders

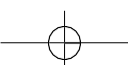

Local Lens: Unveiling Campania’s Hidden Gems



The Sansevero Chapel

Naples is a city of contrasts, where beauty and mystery intertwine. Two sculptures, often overlooked as a pair, embody this duality: the Veiled Christ and the Revealed Christ.

The Veiled Christ, housed in the Sansevero Chapel, is a masterpiece of illusion. Created in 1753 by Giuseppe Sanmartino, it depicts Christ’s lifeless body beneath a marble veil so delicate that legend attributes it to alchemy. The reality, however, lies in Sanmartino’s extraordinary skill, capable of transforming stone into something ethereal.

A short walk away, inside the Pappacoda Chapel, stands the Revealed Christ, a modern work by Domenico Sepe. Here, Christ emerges from stone in an act of resurrection, exuding strength and renewal. Where the Veiled Christ invites silent reflection, the Revealed Christ speaks of rebirth—two sides of the same spiritual journey.

Beyond the sculptures Naples hides and hidden itinerary, visiting both offers a unique perspective on Naples, but the journey doesn’t end there. Nearby, a few hidden gems reveal more of the city’s soul:

- Santa Luciella ai Librai – A tiny church home to a mysterious skull with ears, tied to ancient Neapolitan beliefs.
- The Hypogeum of Purgatorio ad Arco – An underground site linked to Naples’ devotion to abandoned souls.
- Palazzo Venezia – A Venetian-style palace with a hidden rooftop garden, perfect for a quiet pause.

The Veiled Christ and the Revealed Christ are more than sculptures—they reflect Naples itself: a city that unveils its secrets only to those who take the time to look deeper.

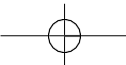

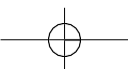


