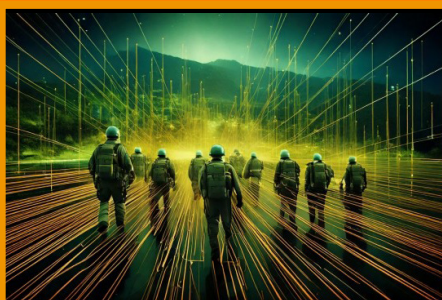

## **ARCYBER Enhances Data-Centric Operations with New Directorates**

As part of the ARCYBER transformation, the Technical Warfare Center was dissolved, leading to the creation of three new directorates: ArCTIC, Capability Development Directorate (G9), and Data Management and Analytics Directorate (DMA). The DMA, which centralizes data management and analysis, plays a key role in ARCYBER's shift towards data-centric operations, collaborating closely with NETCOM and other DoD data forums.



## **CPB Soldiers and Civilians Join Global Cyber Forces in Defense Cyber Marvel 4**

Defense Cyber Marvel 4 (DCM4) near Seoul, South Korea, is an international cyber defense exercise led by the British Army. With nearly 1,000 participants from 60 organizations across 15 countries, teams partnered with international counterparts to defend unfamiliar networks while simulating Army-led cyber operations. This collaborative effort strengthened global cybersecurity readiness and interoperability.
