USASAC talks foreign military sales surge at AUSA Global

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. – The unprecedented surge in America's allies and partners purchasing U.S. military hardware was one of the first topics discussed March 25 to kick off AUSA Global Force Symposium and Exposition in Huntsville. The total value of transferred defense articles and services and security cooperation activities conducted under the FMS system in FY24 was \$117 billion, according to the U.S. State Department. That's a 45% increase from FY23 and the highest ever annual total of sales and assistance provided to our allies and partners.
