Mahaffey Museum. Nine teams from around the world began competing March 28 at Fort Leonard Wood. The competition focuses on the 12Y military occupational specialty of geospatial engineer, which includes tasks such as topographic analysis, geospatial data collection and terrain visualization and tests Soldiers' physical, mental and technical skills.
