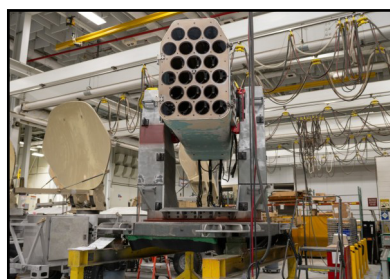
Polish service members train on APS-2 construction vehicles

POWIDZ, Poland – Properly maintaining a 32,000-pound horizontal heavy construction vehicle is one thing but moving it can be another. For the first time, Poland's 33rd Army Prepositioned Stocks Support Battalion received training on the loading and transporting of a U.S. Army D7 medium track-type bulldozer at the APS-2 worksite in Powidz. Since last year, personnel from Tank-automotive and Armaments Command, Communications-Electronics Command, Tobyhanna Army depot and other Army entities have conducted the training.



JMC tests approaches to demilitarization operations

The project was sponsored by the Product Director for Demilitarization with a goal to find cheaper, more readily available and environmentally friendly ammonium nitrate based alternative donor materials to replace or augment current TNT donor supplies for open burning and open detonation operations.
