7th Fleet Band to Perform at 2025 Kanrin Maru Festival in Uraga

he U.S. Navy 7th Fleet Band Broadside Brass Band is scheduled to perform tomorrow, April 26, from noon to 1 p.m. during the annual Kanrin Maru Festival at Uraga Brick Dock.

The free two-day festival honors Kanrin Maru, Japan's first screw-driven steam warship and the first Japanese vessel to cross the Pacific Ocean. The family-friendly event includes carnival games, live performances and kitchen cars, alongside exhibitions commemorating Japan's maritime history and early international diplomacy.

Originally built in the Netherlands and later acquired by the Tokugawa shogunate, Kanrin Maru departed Uraga for San Francisco on Feb. 9, 1860. Following the signing of the Treaty of Amity and Commerce, the ship accompanied the USS Powhatan, which carried a Japanese diplomatic delegation to the United States as part of the nation's first formal embassy to America.

Uraga's Kanrin Maru Festival kicks off with an opening ceremony at 11 a.m. Saturday, followed by performances from local musicians, dance groups, martial artists and historical reenactments.

Visitors can participate in guided tours of the Uraga Brick Dock and a historical walking route through the surrounding neighborhood. Additional exhibits include a miniature lantern display created by students from Uraga Elementary School and ship model collections inside the Uraga Administrative Center.

Yokosuka's Uraga district has a long naval history, including its role during Commodore Matthew C. Perry's arrival with the Black Ships in 1853. The Kanrin Maru Festival is one of several annual events throughout Yokosuka commemorating Japan's opening to the world. Other events include Kurihama's Perry Festival and the William Adams Cherry Blossom Festival in Tsukayama Park.

Event organizers encourage use of public transportation, as parking is extremely limited. Keikyu Uraga Station is the nearest train stop. Vehicle and road restrictions are expected.

Please refer to the CRBA, first-time tourist passport, minor tourist passport renewal, and I-130 checklists using the QR codes below to ensure you meet the requirements and are able to submit complete applications for CRBAs, passports, and/or I-130s.

Note: At this time, the U.S. Embassy is not accepting adult passport renewals during this event. You are encouraged to renew by mail with an online payment if you meet all criteria to renew by mail. For more details please scan the QR code below.

- For I-130 Petitions, eligible petitioners are U.S. citizen, Active Duty Service Members assigned to a unit in Japan. Petitions must be for a spouse, child(ren), or parent(s) who is currently in Japan and able to remain in country for the time it normally takes to process the visa.
- For I-130 Petition screening, you must first attend the virtual I-130 info seminar. Email yokosukalegalassistance@us.navy.mil to sign up for the seminar link.

Individuals must have their applications screened by the RLSO WESTPAC Yokosuka Legal Assistance by Thursday, May 15 to obtain an appointment.

After your application is screened, the Legal Assistance team will schedule you for a time slot for the U.S. Embassy Outreach.

Starting Tuesday, April 1, walk-in hours to screen CRBA and Passport applications are Monday - Thursday, 12:30 to 3:30 p.m. at the Yokosuka Legal Assistance office located on the 2nd deck of building 1555.







EARLY CLOSURE OF TACO BELL AND BAYSIDE FOOD COURT

Taco Bell and Bayside Food Court will be closed at 6 p.m. on Saturday, April 26 for the scheduled NEX associate appreciation event. Business will resume on Sunday, April 27.

OFF BASE TRAFFIC CONTROL

Traffic restrictions will be introduced around Dobuita Street area on May 8 from 3 to 4:30 p.m. due to large-scale television filming from 12 to 4:30 p.m.

CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES

Yokosuka: Womble Gate full closure. Due to maintenance, all vehicular traffic at Womble Gate will be secured May 3, from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. Pedestrian traffic will not be affected. Please utilize Carney Gate for vehicular traffic.

• Howard Street partial closure from April 28 to Aug. 6. Five parking spots will be taken for the work. Pedestrian walkway will be set up around work area. Only one lane southbound will be affected, turning into a small merge. Exiting parking area onto Howard from Fleet Rec will not be affected.

- Carney Gate road closure. Due to construction, all vehicular traffic at Carney Gate will be secured from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. with the exception of Sundays. Gate open for daily operations from 5 a.m. to 8 p.m. Pedestrian traffic will not be affected. Please utilize Womble Gate for vehicular traffic.
- Carney Gate water line replacement. Construction period March 24 to Nov. 26. Expect detours and periodic closures for waterline replacement construction. Twoway trafficto be maintained. Most of the work will occur overnight.
- Nimitz Boulevard and Gridley Lane partial road closure. Closure period from March 24 to April 19 and Sept. 20 to Nov. 26, 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Two-way traffic will be maintained with flagmen.
- Vandegrift Lane full road closure until October 2025.
- The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.

Ikego: Yasakayato Street will be partially closed infront of Club Takemiya for underground electrical work from June 11 to Aug. 5. Flagmen will be posted on both sides to allow two-way traffic.

- Ikego CDC parking lot partial closure until Sept. 30. 14 additional parking spots and Five parallel spots will be closed for the new CDC construction area.
- A Government of Japan Contractor will perform excavation work on Shisagi Street until Aug. 31, 2025. Working hours will be between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Excavation site will be controlled as one-way alternating traffic control road during the daytime work. After daily working hours, road should be re-opened.
