The U.S. Army is assessing community interest in forming a Restoration Advisory Board to consult in the environmental restoration decision-making

process at Fort Leonard Wood. Decisions would apply to sites with hazardous substances, pollutants, contaminants and military munitions remaining from past activities at the installation. If established, the RAB would review and comment on plans and activities related to ongoing environmental studies and restoration. Members would be expected to serve as a voluntary liaison between the community and the RAB. Members would serve a one- to twoyear term and attend regular meetings.
