

Dr. Edward Squibb (1819-1900)
 of Wilmington, Delaware, was commissioned an assistant surgeon in the Navy in April 1847.

Squibb reported to the Naval
Hospital Brooklyn in 1852. There
he played key role in establishing a
Navy pharmaceutical laboratory and
supply depot.

In 1853, Squibb began researching new methods for manufacturing and supplying ether. Ether was a much in demand anesthetic that many avoided due to the inconsistency of quality, and the crude and difficult means of distilling it. Squibb devised a groundbreaking method for distilling a very pure quality of ether by using steam.

After leaving the Navy in 1857,
Squibb founded the pharmaceutical
company E.R. Squibb and Sons.
