HERE'S THE LOWDOWN ON . . .

FEDERAL INCOME TAXES AND YOUR POCKETBOOK

WASHINGTON (AFPS)---A BIGGER CHUNK OUT OF THE MONTHLY PAY CHECK CAN BE ANTICIPATED BY A LARGE SHARE OF ARMED FORCES PERSONNEL BECAUSE OF RECENTLY ENACTED LEGISLATION INCREASING INDIVIDUAL FEDERAL INCOME TAX LIABILITY.

THE REVENUE ACT OF 1950 (PUBLIC LAW 814, 81ST CON-

GRESS) RAISES INCOME TAXES, EFFECTIVE OCT. 1, 1950. THE ANNUAL RATE OF INCREASE FOR THE SAME INCOME (AND EXEMPTIONS) AS IN 1949 IS APPROXIMATELY 20 PER CENT. SINCE THE LAW BECAME EFFECTIVE AT THE BEGINNING OF THE LAST QUARTER OF 1950, THIS YEAR'S INCREASE IS APPROXIMATELY 5 PER CENT.

THREE MAJOR CHANGES AFFECTING SERVICE PERSONNEL INCLUDED IN THE REVENUE LAW ARE:

1. INCREASED TAXES. NEW WITHHOLDING TAX TABLES REQUIRE YOUR DISBURSING OR FINANCE OFFICER TO DEDUCT EACH MONTH AT THE NEW RATE INCREASE (15 TO 18 PER CENT) FROM ALL "WAGES" PAID ON AND AFTER OCT. 1.

2. TAX EXEMPTION FOR UNIFORMED PERSONNEL SERVING IN A "COMBAT ZONE." OTHER COMMISSIONED OFFICERS IN A "COMBAT ZONE" ARE ALLOWED \$200 MONTHLY EXEMPTION.

3. TAX LIABILITY FOR U. S. CITIZENS---MILITARY AND CIVILIAN---SERVING IN A "POSSESSION OF THE UNITED STATES." HERETOFORE, SUCH PERSONS HAD BEEN GENERALLY TAX-EXEMPTION THEIR SALARIES. THE NEW REVENUE ACT ELIMINATES THE EXEMPTION AND MAKES THE TAX LIABILITY RETROACTIVE TO JAN. 1, 1950.

AFTER NOV. 1 NO TAX WILL BE WITHHELD FROM ACTIVE SERVICE PAY FOR ANY MONTH OR ANY MONTH OR ANY PART OF WHICH WAS SERVED IN A "COMBAT ZONE."

ANSWER: IT WOULD BE A WONDERFUL CHRISTMAS PRESENT TO HAVE SUCH A HOLIDAY LEAVE. WE HAVE CHECKED AND FOUND OUT THAT THE VARIOUS NEWSPAPERS AND RADIO STATIONS HAVE CARRIED SUCH REPORTS. AS A RESULT WE CHECKED WITH POST S-1. THEY REPORT THAT THERE IS NOTHING OFFICIAL

TO THE RUMORED LEAVE. THE OFFICIAL LEAVE ANNOUNCEMENT IS THE SAME AS PUBLISHED LAST WEEK IN THE REAL MCCOY. TRAINING WILL BE SUSPENDED AT ARMY INSTALLATIONS IN THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES FOR THE OBSERVANCE OF ARMISTICE DAY, THANKSGIVING CHRISTMAS, AND NEW YEAR'S DAY, 1951. COMMANDERS ARE AUTHORIZED TO GRANT LEAVES TO PERSONNEL WHO CAN BE SPARED. SUCH LEAVE WILL BE GOVERNED BY APPROPRIATE LEAVE REGULATIONS.

REPORT from WASHINGTON AFPS AFPS

THE DEFENSE DEPARTMENT PERSONNEL POLICY BOARD IS STUDYING PROPOSED LEGISLATION WHICH WOULD AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL PAY FOR ARMED FORCES GROUND TROOPS FOR COMBAT OR OTHER HAZARDOUS DUTY.

THE ARMY HAS DEVISED A POINT SYSTEM TO DETERMINE WHICH ENLISTED RESERVISTS ON ACTIVE DUTY WILL BE SENT OVERSEAS, AND THE ORDER OF CALL TO FUTURE ACTIVE DUTY. UNDER THE "SERVICE CREDIT" SYSTEM, ONE CREDIT WILL BE GIVEN AN ENLISTED RESERVIST FOR EACH YEAR OF HIS AGE OVER 20; ONE FOR EACH YEAR OF RESERVE SERVICE; TWO FOR EACH COMBAT AWARD RECEIVED; FOUR FOR EACH YEAR OF ACTIVE FEDERAL SERVICE; FOUR FOR EACH YEAR OF OVERSEAS SERVICE, AND EIGHT FOR EACH DEPENDENT. THOSE WITH THE LOWEST POINT SCORES WITHIN DESIRED MCS'S WILL BE CHOSEN FIRST FOR FOREIGN DUTY.

AIR MAIL SERVICE TO KOREA IS BEING RESUMED IMMEDIATELY BY THE POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT. ALL MAIL SERVICE, EXCEPT THAT FOR THE ARMED FORCES, HAS BEEN SUSPENDED SINCE LAST JUNE. SURFACE MAIL SERVICE AND PARCEL POST FOR CIVILIANS

WILL REMAIN SUSPENDED FOR THE PRESENT, AND NO REGISTERED MAIL WILL BE CARRIED BY AIR.

THE DEFENSE DEPARTMENT IS PREPARING LEGISLATION AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL MILITARY HOUSING FOR PRESENTATION TO THE 82ND CONGRESS, WHICH CONVENES IN JANUARY, 1950.

INCOME TAXES

A "COMBAT ZONE" IS THAT AREA TO BE DEFINED BY THE PRESIDENT IN AN EXECUTIVE ORDER, NOW IN THE PROCESS OF PREPARATION. KOREA AND CERTAIN IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT WATERS ARE TO BE INCLUDED IN THE ZONE.

PERSONS SERVING--OR HAD SERVED DURING CERTAIN PORTIONS OF 1950--IN U. S. POSSESSIONS NOW ARE REQUIRED TO REPORT AND PAY TAXES ON SUCH COMPENSATION RECEIVED WHEN THEY FILE THEIR RETURNS WITH THE COLLECTOR OF INTERNAL REVENUE. WITHHOLDING OF TAXES ON CURRENT PAY WILL NOT COMMENCE UNTIL AFTER DEC. 31, 1950, HOWEVER.

AMERICAN POSSESSIONS INCLUDE AMERICAN SAMOA, BAKER, GUAM, HOWLAND, JARVIS, JOHNSON, MIDWAY, SAND, WAKE, AND SWAN ISLANDS; KINGMAN REEF; PANAMA CANAL ZONE, PUERTO RICO, NAVASSA, SERANILLA BANK, ALASKA AND THE HAWAIIAN ISLANDS, AS WELL AS CERTAIN LESSER GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATIONS.

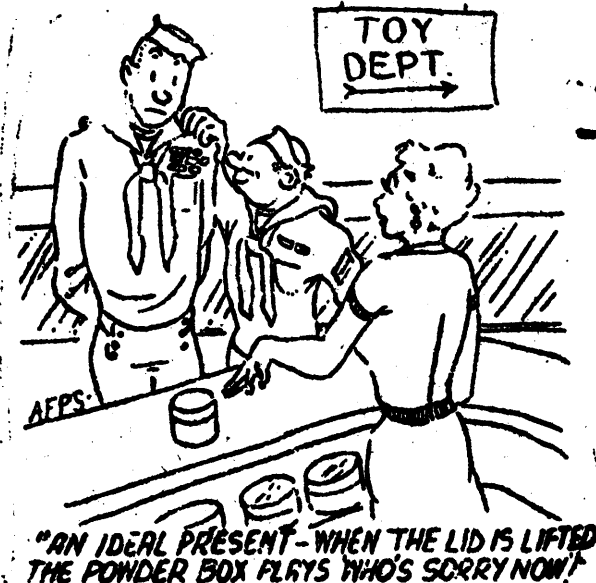

"NO LET HIM STAY ON"

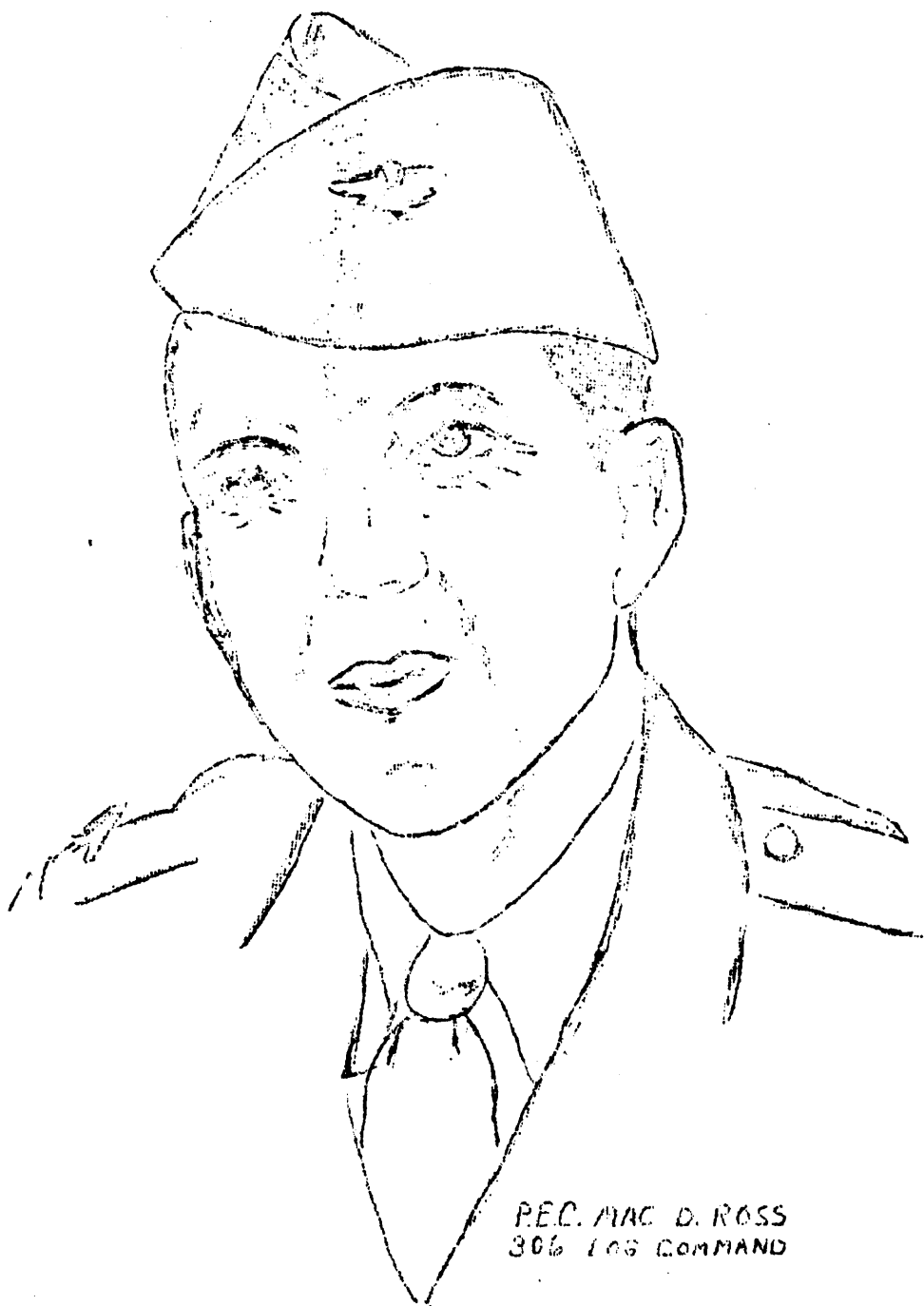

HOW THE ARMY IS PUT TOGETHER

NOW THAT THE ARMY IS EXPANDING THERE WILL BE A LOT OF STORIES ABOUT DIVISIONS, BATTALIONS, REGIMENTS, COMPANIES, PLATOONS AND SQUADS. BUT DO YOU KNOW HOW AN ARMY IS MADE UP?

LET'S HAVE A QUICK LOOK:

SQUAD: TEN OR TWELVE MEN, COMMANDED BY A SERGEANT.

PLATOON: FOUR SQUADS OR ABOUT 40 MEN, COMMANDED BY A FIRST OR SECOND LIEUTENANT.

COMPANY: FOUR PLATOONS WITH A CAPTAIN IN COMMAND. ABOUT 200 MEN.

BATTALION: FOUR COMPANIES, AROUND 1,000 MEN; THE EXTRA MEN OVER THE 800

TOTAL OF FOUR COMPANIES INCLUDE BATTALION HEADQUARTERS MEN, MEDICS AND AUTHORIZED OVER STRENGTH. A MAJOR OR LIEUTENANT-COLONEL IS USUALLY IN COMMAND.

REGIMENT: THREE BATTALIONS, ABOUT 3,000 MEN; COMMANDED BY A COLONEL.

DIVISION: COMMANDED BY A MAJOR GENERAL, ASSISTED BY A BRIGADIER GENERAL, A DIVISION IS MADE UP OF THREE REGIMENTS, PLUS A TANK BATTALION, A MEDICAL BATTALION, FIELD ARTILLERY AND A NUMBER OF COMPANIES OF SPECIAL TROOPS SUCH AS MILITARY POLICE, SIGNALMEN, AND SO ON. TOTAL STRENGTH ABOUT 18,000 MEN.

DESIGNED TO SIMULATE OPERATIONS OF A FIGHTER PLANE FOR ANTI-AIRCRAFT AND FLEXIBLE GUNNERY PRACTICE, THE CQ-19 IS CAPABLE OF REMOTELY-MANEUVORED HIGH SPEED DIVES AND STEEP TURNS.

A 150-FOOT LONG CABLE EXTENDING FROM A CENTER

POST TO THE CARRIAGE HOLDS THE PLANE ON THE GROUND UNTIL IT IS REMOTELY RELEASED BY THE OPERATOR.

AIRBORNE, THE CQ-19 IS GUIDED BY RADIO CONTROL DIALS IN THE HANDS OF THE OPERATOR.

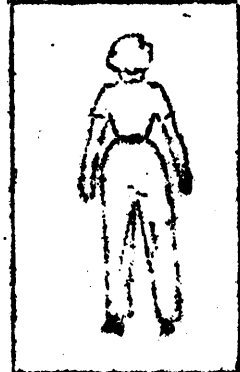
THEIR PANS AND PANTS
