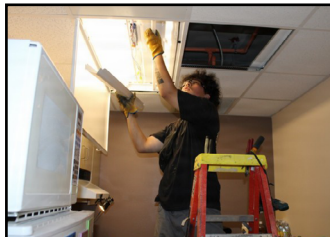
Army sustainment is shaping the future battlefield
