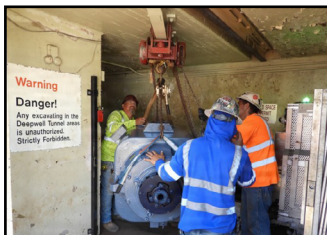
Operation Patriot Press trains Tennessee Guard unit

Fort Meade a part of Maryland's first IGSA

FORT MEADE, Md. – The University of Maryland and Fort Meade have formally entered into Maryland's first Intergovernmental Support Agreement, establishing a landmark umbrella partnership that enables UMD faculty, staff and students to support the installation's operations and workforce modernization. Under the agreement, UMD interdisciplinary teams will collaborate with Fort Meade staff on jointly defined objectives and tasks.



USAG Hawaii continues water system repairs

SCHOFIELD BARRACKS, Hawaii – U.S. Army Garrison Hawaii continues critical repairs to the deep-well pump system that supplies water to Area North, completing a major milestone this week when crews replaced one of the motors powering the installation's underground wells. The 450-horsepower motor was transported down a 1,150-foot access tunnel dug on a 30-degree slope to reach the pump house chamber 575 feet underground.



Army contracting support enables Marine operations
