What Employees Need to Know



Shore C2 - Stage 2 is fast approaching and many of you may be wondering what is happening.

Over the past several months, joint teams have been working hard to examine the functions and work processes that will move from Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC) to Commander, Navy Installations Command (CNIC) as part of the second stage of the Shore C2 (SC2) realignment.

During Stage 1, we transitioned Facilities Management Division (FMD) and Base Environmental (EV) services. We are now preparing for Stage 2, which will transfer production divisions and organizational-level maintenance capabilities, along with certain supporting positions.

As details become available, information will be provided through email and other communications channels.

As we approach the anticipated SC2 transfer dates, we plan to send regular SC2 update emails to share details about the upcoming transfer. Information will also be shared through *The Blueprint* (our weekly command newsletter sent by PAO), and various Q&A or Town Hall like events that will be scheduled and announced. Through each of these channels, our goal is to share relevant information to keep you informed and address questions as they arise.

Our first information session is planned for Thursday, July 30, 2026.

One of our first events will be a Shore C2 information and Q&A session on July 30 at 11 a.m. This will be a virtual event, so please be on the lookout for a meeting invite with instructions about how to join by Teams or phone to hear more about SC2.

Here is some important information I want you all to know about SC2:

- Your job is secure. This is a realignment, not a reduction. No positions are being eliminated as a result of this transition. We need your skills and expertise on the team.
- This administrative transition will not affect your pay, benefits, or leave. Your compensation and federal benefits remain the same if your position transfers. The NAVFAC and CNIC HR and financial teams are working to ensure this process is smooth and seamless.
- For most of you, your day-to-day work will not change, but this change isn't just about moving boxes on an org chart. This is about improving the command and control structure of the Navy shore enterprise to ensure that Installation Commanding Officers (ICO) are fully accountable for maintenance and public works operations on their respective installations. By reporting directly to the ICO, our team's expertise can be integrated into daily operations at the base more quickly, leading to faster installation maintenance and repair decisions.

What information you would like to know about SC2?

We are committed to open and transparent communication as we approach this change. We want to ensure everyone feels informed, prepared, and supported through this organizational transition. Please let me know your questions or concerns, and I will look for ways to include relevant information in future communications.

Thank you for all you do to support the warfighter through shore infrastructure. Until next time, have a safe week and I look forward to hearing from you.

From NAVFAC HI Energy Team**TRAFFIC ADVISORY: Pu'uloa Solar Construction on NAVFAC Hawaii compound (Site 5)**

As of 16 JUN, Ameresco has begun construction on the new Pu'uloa Solar facility at the NAVFAC HI Compound (Site 5), with an estimated completion date of December 2027. During this period, Ameresco contractors will access the construction site daily between approximately 0700 and 1500. Routine traffic and large equipment deliveries will be routed through the NAVFAC HI Main Gate, the Namur entrance, and the Salt Lake Blvd gate. As a result, NAVFAC HI personnel may experience intermittent delays when entering and exiting the compound. We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we execute this project. Get Real, Get Better (GRGB) Bravo Zulus**GRGB Behavior: Align on Standards and Goals (EUL Site 2 Energy Resilience):**

BZ to Reyn Kimura, Kevin Kuo (PW8), Christine Tamashiro (Legal), CNRH Legal, and the PWD JBPHH EL teams. Their efforts culminated in the July 7 signing of the EUL Site 2 Tri-Party Operating Agreement with Ameresco and HECO. This agreement secures a 103MW firm dispatchable generation plant, enabling JBPHH to isolate as a 100% self-sufficient microgrid for up to 14 days during island-wide grid outages, directly aligning municipal utility standards with critical Navy mission requirements.

GRGB Behavior: Fix or Elevate Barriers / Embrace the Red (Red Hill Groundwater Regulatory Engagement):

BZ to Caroline Rossi (OP4A Environment & Remediation). Caroline led a high-impact Special Purpose Meeting with HI DOH and EPA regulators. Her comprehensive technical justification for a groundwater monitoring frequency reduction demonstrated stable conditions and zero contaminant migration. This proactive, data-driven defense paves the way for a formal reduction in monitoring frequency, directly preserving dwindling DLA-provided Red Hill remediation funds.
